#### Customs Act 1966

#### Customs Exchange Rates Notice (No. 10) 1988

Pursuant to section 143 of the Customs Act 1966, the Comptroller of Customs, in accordance with the power delegated to him by the Minister of Customs under section 9 of that Act, hereby gives the following notice.

#### Notice

**1. Short title and commencement**—(1) This notice may be cited as the Customs Exchange Rates Notice (No. 10) 1988.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 9th day of May 1988.

2. Exchange rates—Where under any provisions of the Customs Act 1966 any amount which is required to be taken into account for the purpose of assessing duty or any other purpose is not an amount in New Zealand currency, the amount to be so taken into account shall be the equivalent in New Zealand currency of that amount ascertained in accordance with the rate of exchange set out in the Schedule to this notice.

**3. Revocation**—The Customs Exchange Rates Notice (No. 9) 1988, published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 62, dated the 14th day of April 1988, on page 1464 is hereby revoked.

#### Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act 1968

Privileges and Immunities of Representatives and their Staffs Attending the Final Session of the Fourth Special Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting on Antarctic Mineral Resources, 2 May-2 June 1988

Whereas the final session of the Fourth Special Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting on Antarctic Mineral Resources is to be held in Wellington from 2 May to 2 June 1988;

And whereas the session will be attended by representatives of

the Government of New Zealand and representatives of the Governments of other States;

And whereas it appears that doubts may arise as to the privileges and immunities which may be enjoyed by representatives and members of their official staffs attending the said session;

Now therefore pursuant to section 11 of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act 1968, the Minister of Foreign Affairs hereby directs that every representative of the said Governments (other than the Government of New Zealand) and the members of their official staffs attending the said session shall be accorded the following privileges and immunities:

- (a) Every representative of the said Governments (other than the Government of New Zealand) shall be accorded the privileges and immunities conferred by or by virtue of Part I of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act 1968 on a diplomatic agent, and
- (b) All the members of the official staff of any such representative shall be accorded the privileges and immunities conferred by or by virtue of Part I of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act 1968 on members of the diplomatic staff of a diplomatic mission.

That the Auckland Regional Authority in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Auckland Regional Authority Act 1963 section 24 and in pursuance of the authority conferred upon it under the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956 and in exercise of all other powers enabling it on that behalf doth hereby resolve by special resolution intended to operate as a special order to borrow the sum of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000.00) as a special loan to be known as Regional House Loan No. 1 1988, \$50,000,000 for the purposes of purchasing land and the erection of a building for office accommodation.
