Customs Act 1966

Termination Notice: Countervailing Investigation Edible Rapeseed Oil

Notice was given in the New Zealand Gazette of 24 May 1988 of the initiation by the Comptroller of Customs of an investigation under section 186H of the Customs Act 1966 in respect of a complaint from South Oil Ltd. that edible rapeseed oil exported or intended to be exported to New Zealand from the Federal Republic of Germany, Canada and the Netherlands was being subsidised.

South Oil Ltd. had claimed that the allegedly subsidised imports had caused material injury in the form of; loss of sales and marketshare, under-utilisation of production capacity, actual and potential decline in profits, price suppression and depression and loss of employment.

Interested parties were invited to make written submissions to Customs.

Information and evidence was submitted by the Governments of Canada, the Federal Republic of Germany, the Commission of the European Communities, several overseas exporters, New Zealand importers and various end users of the product.

Section 1861 of the Customs Act 1966 and Article 2 (12) of the GATT Code on Subsidies and Countervailing require that an investigation shall be terminated where the Comptroller is satisfied that—

- (a) there is insufficient evidence of subsidising to justify proceeding with the investigation; or
- (b) there is insufficient evidence that material injury to a New Zealand industry has been or is being caused or threatened by means of the subsidising.

The Comptroller is satisfied, on the information available, that subsidies are paid to the vegetable oil industry in Canada, the Federal Republic of Germany and the Netherlands (the latter two by virtue of the European Economic Community Common Agricultural Policy).

However after analysis of all the relevant information the Comptroller considers that no causal link exists between the subsidised imports and the injury being experienced by the New Zealand industry.

Accordingly the Comptroller has terminated investigations into the complaint.

Decision

These publications were commercially imported through the port of Auckland in November 1987 and were seized by the Collector of Customs at Auckland. The importer subsequently disputed forfeiture of the publications and they were referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Honcho, Men of Advocate Men

These are male homosexual magazines which feature photographs of nude males. The Tribunal is satisfied that the photographs and some of the written material in the magazines is of a nature which would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies both as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Jock and Uncut

Both of these publications are aimed at the male homosexual market and the Tribunal has found in respect of both that they contain a significant number of photographs which show sexual intimacy between the models of a kind which is clearly in breach of the guidelines set by the Tribunal in the tri partate post. The Tribunal is satisfied that the presentation of those photographs in these publications is of a kind which would be injurious to the public good and classifies both publications as unconditionally indecent.

Playboy's 1987 Book of Lingerie

This publication consists largely of photographs of single female models with a minimal text. The nature of the pictorial displays is such that the Tribunal is satisfied that the publication would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies this publication as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

Players Girls Pictorial, June 1987 and May 1987

These publications consist essentially of photographs of single female models with minimal text. Many of the pictures are concentrated on the female genitalia and are of such a nature as would in the Tribunal's view be injurious to younger readers. Each of the publications is accordingly classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Cavalier, March 1987

This magazine is designed for the heterosexual market but contains a number of aspects which caused concern to the Tribunal. The Tribunal agrees with the Comptroller of Customs in the submission made by Mr Wotherspoon that the publication has a textual theme of violence in the form of female wrestling and that many of the photographic sequences feature single female models manipulating their genitalia. In addition to those matters there is also concern for a number of the advertisements in the magazine which portray spanking and wrestling scenes of a kind which are injurious to the public good. This publication is classified by the Tribunal as unconditionally indecent.

Cheri and The Best of Cheri

These publications are magazines mainly of single female nudes but containing a significant number of multiple models scenes of female nudes in acts of intimacy. Many of the photographs of single models display a concentration on the genitalia which in a number of the photographs is the subject of manipulation by the models displayed. Such small amount of text as is contained in the publications is of a basic sexual nature and there is very little about the magazines which could be considered of a positive nature. The Tribunal is satisfied that these publications would be injurious to the public good and classifies each as unconditionally indecent.

Gallery, May 1987 and June 1987

Gallery is a heterosexual magazine that has previously been the subject of a decision 1080 in which the magazine was classified as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age and a two year serial restriction order issued. The magazine is consistent in its quality and more restrained than many similar publications and the Tribunal is satisfied that the earlier classification is justified. Accordingly each of these publications is classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. Mr Ellis on behalf of the importer seeks an interim restriction order in terms of section 14A of the Indecent Publications Act and such is granted.

Decision

These magazines were commercially imported at Auckland on 24 December 1987 and were seized by the Collector of Customs at Auckland. The importer has disputed forfeiture and the publications have been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Australian Golden Boys, Vol. 1, No. 2

This magazine publication contains a series of photographs of nude males with text and cartoon material. The Tribunal was satisfied that some aspects of the presentation of the material would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies this particular publication as injurious in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

Stallion's 50 Best and Stallion

Both of these publications are male homosexual magazines and both in the clear finding of the Tribunal are of a kind which could be injurious to the public good. *Stallion*, January 1986 contains one particular series of photographs at pages 73, 75 and 76 where there is excessive sexual intimacy between the male models depicted. *Stallion's 50 Best* is an illustrated review of homosexual films and it contains numerous photographs of males engaging in homosexual acts. The Tribunal classifies both of these publications as unconditionally indecent.

Blueboy

In decision 23/87 the Tribunal classified the January and February 1981 issues of this male homosexual magazine as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age. In respect of all of the publications of *Blueboy* before the Tribunal other than the November 1986 issue the Tribunal is satisfied that there are features of the publication which would be injurious for the younger reader and classifies those particular publications as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

The publication *Blueboy*, November 1986 is quite different from the other magazines in the series which we had to consider and it contains numerous photographs portraying sexual activity between the models portrayed. The Tribunal is satisfied that the November 1986 issue of *Blueboy* would be injurious to the public good and classifies that particular edition as unconditionally indecent.

Playguy

This particular magazine is produced for the male homosexual market and is generally restrained in its presentation although there is some content which causes concern. The Tribunal is satisfied that the presentation of the material is likely to be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies each of these publications as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Mister Quorum

This is a homosexual lifestyle magazine of a relatively poor standard of reproduction and containing material which in the Tribunal's view would be injurious to younger readers. The Tribunal accordingly classifies this publication as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Mandate

These magazines are male homosexual magazines and the publication has previously received a conditionally indecent restriction and on one occasion an unconditionally indecent classification. These three editions contain material which the Tribunal is satisfied would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies each of these as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Men Only and Best of Men Only

These publications are magazines of a heterosexual nature which largely feature single female models. The magazines have been freely available on the New Zealand market with an age restriction, in fact in decision 28/84 the Tribunal granted a two year serial restriction order but that expired in December 1986. The Tribunal is satisfied that the publications contain material which would be injurious to the younger reader and classifies each of these editions as injurious in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. The Tribunal is further satisfied that the magazines present an even format and that they justify the granting of a further serial restriction order in terms of section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and such order is issued accordingly.

Decision

These publications were seized from the home of a private individual on 2 October 1986 as being forfeit on account of breach of section 48 of the Customs Act 1966. The owner of the magazines has requested that the Minister of Customs waive forfeiture of the goods under section 287 of the Customs Act 1966. The Minister of Customs has agreed to waive forfeiture provided that the publications would not be classified as unconditionally indecent by the Tribunal. Accordingly the magazines were referred to the Tribunal for classification and decision. The August 1986 issue of *Advocate Men* was considered by the Tribunal and classified as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age in decision 8/87 of 31 August 1987. In that decision the Tribunal stated:

"The Tribunal wishes to make known to the publisher and distributors of *Advocate Men* that it was concerned with the bondage aspects of the photographic displays in the August issue and that issue for that reason was very close to having an unconditionally indecent classification passed upon it."

The Tribunal noted with some concern that the bondage theme is continued in the issues of *Advocate Men* currently before it for consideration.

The Tribunal was greatly assisted in reaching its final decision in respect of these publications by the evidence of Mr Parkinson. Mr Parkinson provided for the Tribunal a very carefully and profesionally researched paper of 15 pages supplemented by oral evidence and submissions. The Tribunal is satisfied that Mr Parkinson is a very experienced researcher in respect of homosexual literature and that his academic qualifications, his professional standing and his research qualify him as an expert in this area. The Tribunal both commends Mr Parkinson for the depth of his research and thanks him for the very valuable contribution which he made to the work of the Tribunal in this area. The Tribunal was also much assisted by the submissions of Mr Ireland and Mr Wotherspoon and by a written submission in support of these publications by Mr Warren Linberk, the Director of the New Zealand Aids Foundation.

Following the hearing before the Tribunal the members met and considered in depth the material presented and as a consequence of that the Tribunal is satisfied that the publication *Advocate Men* and *Men of Advocate Men* should be available to older readers. There are aspects of these publications which the Tribunal is satisfied would make them injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies each of these publications as injurious in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. The Tribunal also agrees with the submissions made by all parties that this particular publication is one which justifies the issue of a serial order and such an order is issued in respect of these publications in terms of section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act 1963.

Decision

This publication was privately imported at Auckland in September 1987. The book was seized by the Collector of Customs at Auckland and the importer subsequently disputed forfeiture. The publication has therefore been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

The back cover of Hot Acts described its content an "an

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anthology of true sexual accounts: spanking, body shaving, SM, coming out, anal intercourse, water sports, etc, taken from the best selling magazine *First Hand*. Included are such pieces as "the thrill of discovery". rob, my brother-in-law, the cop, coming out in the scouts, a dark haired sailor, and 2 hunky marines, encounters with foreskin at junior high, ...".

The stories which are indeed taken from *First Hand* magazine, deal in explicit detail with male homosexual experiences and acts. In addition the book is interspersed with cartoons, drawings and black and white photographs of nude or seminude males. The publication is quite well produced and presented but it contains a considerable amount of material which the Tribunal unanimously finds requires an unconditionally indecent classification. The Tribunal is satisfied that whether such material appears in heterosexual or homosexual orientated publications, such writings are injurious to the public good.

As indicated, the Tribunal classifies this publication as unconditionally indecent.

Sale of Liquor Act 1962

Notice of Intention to Vary Hours of Sale of Liquor at Licensed Premises—Auckland Licensing Committee

Pursuant to section 221A (14) of the Sale of Liquor Act 1962, as amended by section 22 (1) of the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976, I, David Oughton, Secretary for Justice, hereby give notice that the Auckland Licensing Committee on 30 June 1988 made an order authorising variations of the usual hours of trading for the licensed premises known as the Orewa Trust Tavern, Centreway Road, Orewa.

To the intent that on days other than those on which licensed premises are required to be closed for the sale of liquor to the general public the hours for the opening and closing of the said premises shall be as follows:

(a) On any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday: Opening at 11 o'clock in the morning and closing at 10 o'clock in the evening.

Reserve Bank of New Zealand Annual Accounts

Notes:

1. Statement of Accounting Policies—The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the following accounting policies. These policies have been applied on a basis consistant with last year except as otherwise noted.

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General Accounting Policies—The going concern concept has been applied. Historical cost has been used as a measurement base except for land, buildings and investments (including gold), which have been revalued. Accrual accounting has been used to match expenses and revenue.

Particular Accounting Policies—The following particular accounting policies which significantly affect the measurement of the results and financial position have been applied:

- (a) Foreign Currency Conversions: Overseas assets and liabilities have been converted to New Zealand currency using the midmarket exchange rates at balance date.
- (b) *Investments*: New Zealand investments, excluding Government stock held under sellback arrangements, have been valued at market value at balance date. Realised profits have been taken into the profit and loss account. Unrealised profits have been recorded in the investment fluctuation account.
- (c) Fixed Assets and Depreciation:
 - (i) Land and buildings held at Christchurch, Auckland and Wellington have been valued at the latest Government valuations. Increases in value have been recorded in the properties revaluation reserve. This is a change in accounting policy in respect of buildings. The bank's buildings at Christchurch, Auckland and Wellington have been depreciated at a rate of 1 percent per annum.
 - (ii) Plant, equipment and vehicles have been valued at cost, less depreciation. Details are:

- (iii) All software costs previously capitalised (and having a depreciated value of \$949,000) have now been written off following the completion of development projects.
- 2. Changes in Accounting Policy—The changes made in accounting policy have been as follows:
 - (a) Buildings in Christchurch, Auckland and Wellington have been valued at the most recent Government valuation. Previously buildings had been carried at cost less depreciation.
 - (b) Software costs have been written off in full. In the past these costs were written off over 2 or 4 years (depending on the type of software).
 - (c) Gold has been valued at market value. Previously gold was recorded at cost.

The effects of these changes in policy have been as follows:

- (a) The properties revaluation reserve has been increased by \$10,960,000 due to the revaluation of buildings.
- (b) The change in policy relating to software has resulted in a reduction to profit for the year under review of \$949,000.
- (c) The investment fluctuation account is \$15,020,000 higher because of the change in the method of valuing gold.

Previous year's figures have been adjusted in the statements to reflect the changes in accounting policy.

- 3. Balance Sheet—
 - (a) Liabilities Held Domestically: these are foreign currency deposits placed by the Treasury.
 - (b) Notes in Circulation: All bank notes in circulation represent a charge on the Reserve Bank in favour of the holder.
 - (c) Investment Fluctuation Account: The investment fluctuation account recognises the unrealised surplus of market value over cost as at balance date.

- (d) General Reserves: The general reserves include an insurance reserve which is maintained as the bank carries its own insurance. The balance of the insurance reserve currently stands at \$37,000,000.
- (e) Properties Revaluation Reserve: The properties revaluation reserve recognises the surplus arising from the latest Government valuation over cost of land and buildings held.

This is a change in accounting policy in respect of buildings. Previously buildings had been carried at cost, less depreciation.

- (f) Government Stock Sellbacks: These are short-term holdings of Government stock whereby there are contracts to sell back the stock to financial institutions at future dates.
- (g) Gold: Gold is valued in the accounts at market value. (Its cost value is \$699,000). The surplus of market value over cost has been included in the investment fluctuation account. This represents a change in accounting policy. Previously gold had been valued at cost.
- 4. Profit and Loss Account—
 - (a) Other Expenses: Included in this item are audit fees of \$215,000 (\$210,000 in 1986-87) and directors' fees of \$49,000 (\$42,000 in 1986-87).
 - (b) Income From New Zealand Investments: Total income from New Zealand Government securities amounted to \$236,396,000 (\$197,467,000 in 1986–87); income from other securities totalled \$6,803,000 (\$2,956,000 in 1986–87).
- 5. Contingent Liabilities-
 - (a) In respect of exchange contracts entered into for the future purchase and sale of overseas currency if this is less than \$500,000. The profit or loss arising from appreciation or depreciation of the bank's overseas assets and liabilities (including contracts for the future purchase and sale of overseas currency) due to movements in basic exchange rates is settled with the Government in terms of section 26 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964. This year, the Government met the loss of \$9,070,000 claimed under the above section. Last year the settlement for losses amounted to \$31,858,000.
 - (b) In respect of the Reserve Bank participating in the Bank for International Settlements Facility in favour of the International Monetary Fund. The facility is due to expire on 30 June 1988. The Reserve Bank's share amounts to SDR25 million (NZ\$53,100,000; last year NZ\$53,400,000).

6. Taxation—The Reserve Bank is not subject to taxation on its income. Section 46 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act exempts the Reserve Bank from taxation on income to the same extent as the Crown. The bank is liable for goods and services tax and fringe benefit tax.

7. Capital Commitments—As at 31 March 1988, the Reserve Bank had capital commitments of \$3,886,000.

Report of the Auditors to the Reserve Bank of New Zealand

We have audited the accounts of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand for the year ended 31 March 1988 and have obtained all the information and explanations we have required.

In our opinion the financial statements on these pages are properly drawn up so as to give, using the historical cost method as modified by the revaluation of certain assets, a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the bank as at 31 March 1988 and of its results for the year then ended.
