The applicant is wholly owned by shareholders of Instant Music Ltd., a company that compiles background music tapes and makes them available to subscribers nationwide through Telecom landline circuits. In Christchurch, Instant Music Ltd. operates the service to subscribers itself. In other centres it offers the programmes through franchise agreements with local business concerns associated with the electronics field. Instant Music Ltd. is also involved in other business activities.

In Christchurch, Instant Music Ltd., proposes to transfer its Christchurch subscribers to the applicant company. Instant Music Ltd., will continue to supply the background music tapes.

The applicant intends to distribute the programme in Christchurch by broadcasting a high quality stereophonic signal on an unpublished frequency in the ultra high frequency (UHF) band which is not used for sound-radio broadcasting. It will be received by a special receiving apparatus which will remain the property of the applicant. The band chosen would not be receivable by members of the public using conventional radio receiving sets. It would however be possible for those with technical knowledge to tune a receiver to receive the music service. The applicant believes there are legal remedies to prevent the music being used for any illegal public performance.

The music service is at present delivered by means of Telecom landlines which are monophonic and the programme circuits are said to have very limited frequency responses—some less than 5kHz. The applicant has encountered distortion, crosstalk, frequent losses of level, long waiting times to have breakdowns restored and a rapid deterioration of service because of increases in other telephone activity.

The applicant is concerned about meeting competition from compact disc players which provide a high quality background music for such customers as hotels and restaurants. Overseas, quality satellite channels and cable are the preferred carriers for background music services. The applicant made an application for a sound-radio warrant not because it wished to broadcast to members of the public or because it wished to carry advertising programmes but because it believed that the service offered constituted broadcasting within the meaning of the Broadcasting Act 1976.

The Broadcasting Act section 2 reads:

- "Broadcasting" means----
 - (a) The dissemination of any form of communication by the wireless transmission of writing, signs, signals, pictures, images, and sounds of all kinds by means of Hertzian waves intended to be received by the public either directly or through the medium of relay stations; and
- (b) Includes the dissemination of any form of communication by the wireless transmission, by means of Hertzian waves, of an encoded signal that is intended to be received by members of the public or of a section of the public but which can be received in an intelligible form only by those members of the public or of that section of the public whose receiving sets are equipped with a decoding device;
- "Diffusion Service" means a service whereby sounds or visual images are transmitted by the person operating the service to subscribers of the service over wires or other material substance for reception by apparatus designed to receive the transmissions."

Broadcasting Act, section 70 (2) provides that, subject to the Act, no person shall establish or operate a broadcasting station otherwise that in conformity with the terms and conditions of a warrant or authorisation issued by the Tribunal under the Act and for the time being in force. A diffusion service does not require a warrant.

The applicant would cease using a diffusion service using Telecom lines but is not endeavouring to avoid any payment at all. The company is prepared to undertake to pay levies on its revenue at the same rate as those payable by private broadcasting stations.

The New Zealand Government is considering its policy about multi-point distribution service.

Section 78 provides that no application for a warrant should be granted until the application has been certified as complying with the technical requirements of the New Zealand Radio Frequency Service and the Radio Regulations.

The New Zealand Radio Frequency Service has not certified the application yet, stating that it is carrying out planning regarding the frequency.

Nevertheless the Tribunal considers that it is appropriate that it indicate its present position.

Decision

The Tribunal is prepared to grant the application on conditions when it has been certified.

The Broadcasting Corporation has raised the question of whether the signal is to be "encrypted". As the applicant has pointed out, it is not intended to scramble the signal in the sense that special equipment would be required to unscramble it for use. It is, however, intended to broadcast the signal on a frequency which is not generally used for the reception of broadcast programmes by members of the public.

Nevertheless it would appear that the application may be covered by the definition set out in the Broadcasting Act because members of the public would receive the service when using the premises to which the service is provided.

The second more particular definition relating to encoded signals may not apply in this case since it is not intended to encode the signal.

We have not had the benefit of legal argument on the definition under the Act as the applicant has been prepared to

submit the application to the Tribunal and the BCNZ had decided to make no submission or jurisdiction.

If the Instant Music Service was being provided only to enclosed premises to which members of the public or a section of the public did not have access, it could be argued that the service did not constitute broadcasting. However, some of the places supplied with the service appeared to be those to which members of the public have access and they would therefore receive the service.

On the other hand it can also be argued that ".... intended to be received by the public...." in the definition (a) of broadcasting contemplates the programme being received by members of the public through their radio receivers, not by the applicant's supplied receiving sets from which the music is diffused to members of the public within the building served.

The Tribunal observes that it may not necessarily be appropriate that the Broadcasting Tribunal should deal with such applications. That is a matter for communications policy. However, under the Act it appears that the jurisdiction is at present with the Tribunal and it has to consider the issues involved without the benefit of any statement of Government policy.

In doing so, it does have regard to the particular circumstances of the applicant and Instant Music Ltd., the unavailability of any alternative distribution system of sufficiently high calibre, the willingness to pay a royalty, and the wish to be able to compete with delivery methods referred to in the evidence.

The Tribunal is satisfied that the proposed service does not have any effect on any other broadcast service. We are satisfied that the applicant will carry on the service satisfactorily and has the financial and commercial ability to do so.

The Tribunal would impose conditions that-

(a) the service be encrypted if required by the Tribunal;

- (b) the applicant give an undertaking to pay levies in accordance with the regulations on the basis of revenue rather than on the basis of advertising revenue;
- (c) the feasibility of alternative distribution systems be reviewed before the expiry of each term of the warrant;
- (d) the initial term of the warrant be three years;
- (e) the warrant holder undertake to surrender the warrant if an alternative distribution method is economic and it is in the best utilisation of frequencies that the warrant be so surrendered.

The Tribunal can only at this stage give an indication of the basis on which it would grant the application.

This decision is therefore only an interim decision and a formal grant cannot be considered until certification of the application. The Tribunal is prepared to consider any submissions as to the conditions to be imposed.

Co-opted Member

The co-opted member of the Tribunal took part in the deliberations of the Tribunal, but the decision, in accordance with the Act, is that of the permanent members.

Decision

These publications are part of a commercial shipment imported at Hamilton in July 1987. The magazines were seized by the Collector of Customs, Hamilton and because the importer has disputed forfeiture, they were referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Razzle

This is a very cheaply produced British publication that retails for approximately NZ\$1.50 in the United Kingdom. It is a magazine on almost newspaper quality paper and includes a considerable number of photographic sequences of nude or semi-nude female models, advertisements of sexual aids and persons for contact for sexual activity and the usual collection of stories, jokes and readers' letters and accounts, all of which are directed towards sexual activity of one kind or another.

The Tribunal has previously found an earlier edition of this publication as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years—Decision No. 13/86 of 13 November 1986.

The Tribunal is satisfied that this publication would be injurious to younger readers and classifies each of these editions as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

The Tribunal has seen sufficient copies of this particular publication to reach a conclusion that the format is almost identical from issue to issue and, after discussing the matter with Mr Wotherspoon during the hearing, the Tribunal confirms that this publication will now be the subject of a serial order in terms of section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act 1963.

Derriere, Martinet

These publications deal with the topic of sexual gratification from corporal punishment. In both text and photographs they feature young females being spanked and caned, either by males or other females.

The Tribunal has expressed its concern on many occasions about magazines depicting violence towards young females. In Decision No. 12/86 of November 1986, the Tribunal found the publication *Victorian Erotica*, Volume 1, No. 1, Spanking Special, to be unconditionally indecent and we deem it important that we once again restate that which was set out in that decision as the reason for the unconditional indecent classification.

Any publications containing significant elements of violence

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against any persons as a means of sexual gratification or for any other purpose are clearly in the Tribunal's view injurious to the public good. When such elements of violence are displayed against females, and particularly young females, as portrayed in these two publications, the risk of injury to the public good is far greater.

The Tribunal classifies both of these publications *Derriere* and *Martinet* as unconditionally indecent.

Decision

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These publications were commercially imported at Dunedin in 2 shipments in May and June 1987 and were subsequently seized by the Collector of Customs, Dunedin.

The importer, Exchange Traders of Dunedin, a business operated by Mr Highly, have disputed forfeiture of the goods and therefore they have been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

As the Tribunal has mentioned in earlier decisions, Mr Highly operates a direct sale and mail order business mainly dealing, as we understand it, in books and magazines including heterosexual and homosexual orientated publications. On this occasion Mr Highly was unable to stay over for the second day of the Tribunal hearing but he very kindly indicated his faith in and acceptance of the Tribunal's decisions and reminded the Chairman that many of these publications are already freely available on the New Zealand market. At a previous sitting of the Tribunal in respect of earlier publications imported by Exchange Traders, Mr Highly informed the Tribunal that a considerable amount of the material sent to him from overseas was in fact unsolicited, although it was selected by his agents in those overseas countries, particularly Australia on the basis that the material would be likely to receive at least a restricted classification from the Tribunal.

Mr Ireland, counsel for Lawrence Publishing had prepared and presented to the Tribunal a memorandum and submissions in

respect of the publication *Drummer*, and that memorandum and those submissions were supported by Mr Logan.

Drummer

This is a paper-back magazine. The whole of the contents of which is clearly aimed at the male homosexual market, and it consists of photographs and text which is almost entirely directed towards male homosexual activity. Appearing throughout these magazines is the theme of bondage and sado-masochism. In a number of its earlier decisions, the Tribunal has found the combination of bondage and sado-masochism to be unacceptable and clearly material which would be injurious to the public good. Such a finding is set out in Decision No. 14/87, a decision of the Tribunal delivered on 1 September 1987 in respect of "The Zeus Collection" and "Mandate" October 1985.

As Mr Ireland points out in his memorandum of submissions the last issue of *Drummer* considered by the Tribunal was Issue 104, which the Tribunal found to be unconditionally indecent because of the emphasis in the magazine on "bondage and sado-masochism". Decision No. 20/87. Mr Ireland informed the Tribunal that Lawrence Publishing has appealed that decision which has yet to be heard by the High Court.

In the memorandum of submissions presented by Mr Ireland, he informed the Tribunal that Lawrence Publishing has appealed that earlier decision, because in its opinion, the Tribunal has not given full and proper consideration as to how representations of sado-masochism or bondage are injurious to the public good. Mr Ireland pointed out that to his knowledge no evidence has been tendered to the Tribunal to establish this. Mr Ireland submitted that the question is not one of "judgmental or legislative facts" as referred to in Jefferies J's judgment in *Comptroller of Customs* v. *Gordon and Gotch*. In addition Mr Ireland drew to the attention of the Tribunal the decision of Holland J, in *Collector of Customs* v. *Hewitt* and referred the Tribunal in particular to three passages from His Honour's decision. We set out that part of Mr Ireland's submission in full hereunder:

- "4. In the High Court case of *Collector of Customs* v. *Hewitt*, Holland J heard an appeal from the District Court concerning some video tapes imported from Australia. The case was heard before the passage of the Video Recordings Act 1987 and accordingly the question of whether the tapes were indecent or not fell to be decided under the provisions of the Indecent Publications Act. District Court Judge Willy described the tapes as containing (inter alia) scenes of "a limited amount of violence and forced sex ... one or more of the participants is under physical restraint". It was accepted by the Judge that the videos would be used in the importer's own home. On page 27 the Judge summarised his decision as follows:
- "These are four video tapes purchased by a mature couple openly in a country which has a social make-up not very different from that of our own. They are manufactured for the purpose of being displayed on a video machine which in turn is capable of being used in conjunction with a television set in a private home. There is no evidence other than these videos will be watched by the owners of them and I infer their invited guests. There is no evidence one way or the other of the sort which was presented in the Lawrence Publishing Co. case that anybody who is likely to view these videos will be or is likely to be corrupted by that exercise."

and on page 28:

"In my view the inquiry in this case is a narrow one which I express as follows: is it injurious to the public good for adults to view explicit sexual material in the privacy of their own home? On the evidence before me I am not satisfied that the prosecution has proved on the balance of probabilities that such is so. Accordingly I decline to make the order for condemnation of the documents prayed for in the information."

Holland J upheld the District Court Judge's .cision on appeal. At page 17 his Honour said:

'My conclusion as to the content of the video tapes does not differ from the conclusions of the District Court Judge earlier set out. If the matter was one solely for my personal view to prevail I should have no hesitation in stating that the importation of these video tapes was an importation of documents which were indecent and injurious to the public good. It is not, however, a matter for my personal view and rightly so. If asked I should declare a large number of television programmes exhibited today to be injurious to the public good. I believe that the impact of audio visual film or video is so great that quite different standards should apply to them from those which may be appropriate to books. My views may well be quite different from the views of other Judges. Those differences become irrelevant if a Judge decides a matter on evidence before him and not on his purely personal impression.

- Hence I substantially discount my purely personal views obtained from viewing the video tapes. I am simply unaware as to whether these tapes or any of them describe, depict, express or otherwise deal with matters of sex, horror, crime, cruelty or violence in a manner that is injurious to the public good. This onus of proof was on the Collector of Customs. It may well be that evidence could have been produced persuading me of the view but it has not been done."
- 5. Decisions of the High Court are of course, binding upon the Tribunal. The ratio of this case is that depictions of explicit sex, including those depicting some elements of bondage, are not *necessarily* indecent, ie, they are not necessarily injurious to the public good.
- 6. I can advise the Tribunal that Lawrence Publishing does not import "Drummer" in commercial quantities. In fact the company would dispute that it "imports" the magazine in a technical sense at all. Lawrence has a reciprocal arrangement with overseas publishers whereby each publisher swaps a copy of their own magazine in return for a copy of the others. This is how the company obtains its copy of "Drummer". Nevertheless the company does not regard the publication as being injurious to the public good. The magazine deals with and depicts acts between consenting adults and the company would uphold the rights of such people to gain information from others similarly inclined. The market in New Zealand for such publications would be extremely small. It is difficult to see how a small number of such publications can be injurious to the public good in general."

The Tribunal has given very careful consideration to the submission made by Mr Ireland and we have read the additional material which he presented for the Tribunal's consideration.

After reviewing its earlier decisions and measuring those against those submissions made by Mr Ireland and the evidence earlier presented to the Tribunal by Mr Logan, the Tribunal's view of this type of material remains unchanged. The Tribunal is satisfied that the presentation of the theme of bondage and sado-masochism in the way that it is done in the magazine *Drummer* before the Tribunal is plainly injurious to the public good. The Tribunal accordingly classifies both of these volumes as unconditionally indecent.

Mach

The Tribunal had before it four copies of this magazine, which is very much along the same lines as *Drummer*.

For the same reasons as stated by the Tribunal in this decision

in relation to the publication *Drummer*, the Tribunal finds each of these editions of *Mach* to be unconditionally indecent.

New Directions, Lovebirds, Playbirds and Companion

These are all glossy girly type publications with photographs, stories, articles, jokes, cartoons, letters and advertisements. The bulk of the material deals with the female nude and/or sexual activity.

Each of the magazines places particular emphasis in the photographic sections of the female nude on the genilitia which although falling just short of justifying an indecent classification are indicative of the rather sexually tawdry nature of these magazines. Those features which bring about an unconditionally indecent classification, are that in each of the magazines various lesbian acts and/or heterosexual scenarios are depicted in which there is a high degree of sexual intimacy. The magazines have nothing to commend them by way of literary, artistic or social merit which might otherwise balance the tawdry content and the Tribunal classifies each of these magazines as unconditionally indecent.

For the reasons expressed in Decision No. 19/ 88 the Tribunal finds this issue of *Drummer* to be injurious to the public good and classifies it as unconditionally indecent.

Decision

These five magazines were submitted to the Tribunal at the request of the distributor Gordon & Gotch. Following the original hearing in respect of these publications a majority of three of the members of the Tribunal were prepared to find that the publications *Adult Fantasy* and *Parade* were unconditionally indecent. And all members of the Tribunal were prepared to find that the publications *Model Celebrities, Glamour Girls* and *Park Lane* should be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. A final decision in respect of all publications was deferred however until the outcome of an appeal to the High Court by the Comptroller of Customs in respect of decisions made by the Tribunal relating to *Knave* and *Fiesta* magazines had been reached and advised to the Tribunal.

Unfortunately this particular file was overlooked by the Tribunal after the decision of the full court of the High Court was made available to the Tribunal in respect of the *Knave* and *Fiesta* appeal thus the reason for the late determination in respect of these particular publications. Those members of the Tribunal who were present at the hearing on 24 October 1986 are now unanimous in their decision that each of these publications should receive a restricted age classification.

The Tribunal has previously expressed its concern and repeats it here that the publications *Park Lane, Adult Fantasy* and *Parade* place undue emphasis on the female genitalia with many of the models being posed in what are clearly contrived positions to accentuate the genitalia. The publications *Model Celebrities* and *Glamour Girls* consist almost entirely of photographs of naked and semi-naked women but the objectionable concentration on the genitalia is less evident in these particular publications.

As indicated each of these publications is classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

- (d) From and after the 1st day of August 1988 the wholesaler's contribution will be at the rate of 0.367 percent of the primary value of those fish, and at the rate of 0.334 percent of the primary value of those rock lobster, and
- (e) From and after the 1st day of August 1987 the retailer's contribution will be at the rate of 0.366 percent of the primary value of those fish, and at the rate of 0.332 percent of the primary value of those rock lobster.
- (f) Notice published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 8 October 1987, No. 174, page 4638, is consequently revoked.
