Decision

Mr Fenemor who appeared on behalf of the importer and Australian publisher also presented for the consideration of the Tribunal a memorandum of submissions prepared and presented by B. W. Morley, solicitor of Auckland, and that memorandum of submissions has been considered by the Tribunal in reaching its determination on the matters in question. The Tribunal found that memorandum of submissions most helpful as it also found the formal evidence presented by Michael Brian Shirley, the Managing Director of Magman International Pty Ltd.

These publications were commercially imported at Auckland in July 1988 with the intention that they should be placed before the Tribunal for classification and determination. In terms of that action the publications were presented to the Tribunal by the Collector of Customs as on a seizure basis and the importer having disputed forfeiture they have been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966. Mr Wotherspoon on behalf of the Comptroller supports an age restriction in respect of these publications other than *38 Plus* (International) and he also advised the Tribunal that he supported a serial restriction order in respect of the publications other than *38 Plus* (International) and such a restriction order is requested by the importer.

The Tribunal reserves its decision in respect of the publication *38 Plus* (International) and notes that neither the New Zealand importer nor the Australian publisher asked that that particular publication be before the Tribunal for consideration and determination.

After considering the evidence of Mr Shirley and the submission by Mr Morley, and having read each of the magazines in question, the Tribunal has reached a determination that there is material in these publications which would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies each as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years. These other publications are in fact a serial publication within the terms of section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act, although each is given a different title. The Tribunal is satisfied that although there are different titles it is possible for the Customs Department and the other authorities which will be concerned with the administering of the Tribunal's decision to identify the publications which, from henceforth, will contain on the cover the distinctive logo of Presurn Pty Ltd. (New South Wales). Each of the publications

will also be clearly identified as being published by that company and accordingly the Tribunal makes a serial restriction order in respect of this series of publications classifying them as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

Decision

This publication was imported at Christchurch in June 1988 and the Collector of Customs having seized the magazine the importer has disputed forfeiture. The publication has been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Earlier copies of this particular publication have been considered by the Tribunal and in Decision 15/87 the Winter 1984 edition of the publication was classified by the Tribunal as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age. The Comptroller of Customs submits that a similar classification would be appropriate in this instance and that is supported by Mr Ellis on behalf of the importer.

The publication purports to present letters from readers of *Genesis* magazine interspersed with pictorial sequences of nude or semi-nude single female models. The Tribunal is satisfied that some of the material contained in the publication would be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies it as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

This magazine was commercially imported through parcel post at Auckland on or about 24 June 1988 and was seized by the Collector of Customs. The importer having subsequently

disputed forfeiture the publication has been referred to the Tribunal for classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

This publication is similar to a large number of publications coming before the Tribunal and consists almost entirely of photographs which utilise large breasts as a theme. The photographs are of the single female model and in some of the photographs there is an emphasis on the genital area. There is also in the publication a considerable amount of written material consisting of letters, short stories and articles, most of which are of a sexual nature.

The Tribunal has previously considered an earlier volume of this publication and in Decision No. 6/86 classified *Gem* Vol. 27, No. 4 of December 1985 as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. The Tribunal is satisfied that the material in this particular publication would be injurious to younger readers and classifies this issue as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Decision

Although there was no appearance by or on behalf of the importer the Tribunal received and considered a memorandum of submissions presented by counsel for Lawrence Publishing, G. A. Ireland. Mr Ireland in his submission requested that the magazine be given an R18 classification and also sought a serial restriction order pursuant to section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act. The publications were imported through the port of Auckland in May 1988. The Collector of Customs having seized the magazines in question the importer has disputed forfeiture and they have been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

The magazines are lifestyle publications aimed at the male homosexual market and they consist principally of articles, letters, cartoons and photographic sequences of nude or near nude males.

The Tribunal has considered earlier issues of this publication and in Decisions 5/87 and 13/88 classified those earlier editions as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age. The Tribunal is satisfied that that classification is appropriate in respect of these particular issues and classifies each as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

The Tribunal would have been prepared to make a serial restriction order had it not been for the content of the January 1986 issue which came close to receiving an unconditionally indecent classification from the Tribunal. The reason for the Tribunal's concern in respect of that particular issue was its depictions of oral and anal sex on pages 35 to 38. The Tribunal wishes to indicate to the importer and distributor that

it will consider a section 15A serial order in respect of future editions of the magazine provided that their content is consistent with the May, June and October 1986 editions and lacks the type of material which caused the Tribunal to have concern over the January 1986 issue.

This publication was first produced in 1976 in the United States of America and has been the subject of reprints over a period of years. The publication purports to be a guide on sexual fulfilment and sets out to show the reader by various exercises how to be his or her own sex therapist and to identify the reasons for his or her likes or dislikes in matters of sexuality. The Tribunal agrees with the Comptroller of Customs that the publication is presented in a reasonable manner with no undue emphasis placed on the prurient aspects of sex. The Tribunal is satisfied that it is a genuine publication and would be of

considerable interest to many readers. The publication includes matters relating to contraception, sterilisation and abortion and accordingly the Tribunal is satisfied that it would be indecent in the hands of younger readers. The Tribunal accordingly classifies this publication as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

Decision

Although there was no appearance by or on behalf of the importer the Tribunal had before it a letter from the importer in which he pointed out to the Tribunal that these were forwarded to him as personal mail from a friend overseas and

that they were for his own personal use and not for circulation. The importer demanded the return of the items to him.

As indicated these publications were privately imported through Parcels Post Whangarei in April 1988. The magazines were seized by the Collector of Customs and the importer having disputed forfeiture they had been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

The Tribunal has had occasion to consider earlier editions of Hustler magazines and on each occasion they have been classified an unconditionally indecent in Decision 18/87 and 13/86. In its Decision 18/87 the Tribunal noted that "the magazines are well produced and contain a mixture of articles reviews, humour and fiction. Some of this material is of a very high standard and certainly unobjectionable in terms of the Indecent Publications Legislation. Much of the content is obviously well researched and certainly well written, and makes for interesting reading. The Tribunal is unanimous in its finding, however, that a significant amount of material in these publications is clearly indecent in terms of the Indecent Publications Act. There are photographs of many persons engaged in a variety of sexual activity, and of female models engaged in lesbian sexual acts. In addition, there are numerous photographs of a single female model where the poses are clearly designed to emphasise the genitalia, and in many of those photographs those depictions themselves have caused some of the members of the Tribunal at least to consider whether they would justify an indecent classification for the publication."

The Tribunal finds that the same comments apply to the present volume of Hustler which is before it for determination and accordingly classifies that particular addition as unconditionally indecent.

The publication Swank is a magazine which contains pictorial portrayls of sexual intercourse, sodomy, oral sex and a variety of other sexual acts. There is a limited amount of text in the publication and that text is almost entirely related to matters of sex.

The book is entirely lacking in literary or artistic merit and the Tribunal is satisfied that it is predominantly concerned with the prurient and lewd aspect of sex. The Tribunal finds that this publication would be injurious to the public good in terms of the legislation and classifies it as unconditionally indecent.

Decision

Although there was no appearance by or on behalf of the importer the Tribunal received a memorandum of submissions by G. A. Ireland, counsel for Lawrence Publishing, and it gave

consideration to those submissions when considering the classification to be given to these various publications.

These publications were commercially imported in June 1988 at Auckland Parcels Post and having been seized by the Collector of Customs the importer disputed forfeiture. The publications have been referred to the tribunal for classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Colt Men, Issue No. 5 and 6

This publication is now the subject of a serial restriction order classifying it as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years and both of these issues are covered by that classification.

Drummer, Issue 117

An earlier edition of *Drummer* has been the subject of an unconditionally indecent classification and that decision is now the subject of an appeal to the High Court. A subsequent edition has been given the same classification of unconditionally indecent and the Tribunal is satisfied that the present issue must receive a classification of unconditionally indecent and so classifies it.

In his written submission in respect of this particular publication Mr Ireland suggested that Tribunal may feel that circulation restriction might be appropriate with, for example, a condition that the magazine not be displayed for sale or distribution or alternatively that it be available by mail order only. The Tribunal was unanimous that it was unable to give effect to Mr Ireland's submission in that regard.

Friction, August, September and October 1988

At its July meeting the Tribunal considered the July 1988 issue of *Friction* and classified it as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. In his written submission Mr Ireland asked the Tribunal to consider an R18 classification and also an R18 serial restriction order pursuant to section 15A of the Indecent Publications Act. The Tribunal agrees that the age restriction is justified and accordingly classifies each of these issues as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. In the September issue of *Friction* there is a photograph content at pages 26 and 27 which caused concern because of some aspects of sadomasochism displayed in the photographs. Because of its concern in relation to that particular depiction the Tribunal is not at this particular stage prepared to issue a serial restriction order in respect of this publication.

Accordingly, in respect of the remaining editions of these publications the Tribunal classifies each as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

All remaining publications as per the schedule above

All of these magazines predominantly feature single female models with very little, if any, text. The larger female breast is the major feature of all of these publications and the Tribunal is satisfied that they contain material which is likely to be injurious to younger readers. Each of these publications is accordingly classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Pursuant to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

Order

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Tauhara Rural Fire District Order 1988.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires, the "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977; the "Committee" means the Tauhara Rural Fire Committee; "the District" means the Tauhara Rural Fire District.

Part 1—Constitution of the Tauhara Rural Fire District

3. The area specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district to be known as the Tauhara Rural Fire District.

4. The Tauhara Rural Fire District shall be administered for the purposes of the Act by a rural fire committee which shall be known as the Tauhara Rural Fire Committee.

5. The Committee shall consist of seven members as follows:

(a) Four persons appointed by Tasman Forestry Limited by writing signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof;

(b) Two persons appointed by and representing the Taupo County Council;

(c) One person having territorial interests in the District appointed by the Federated Farmers of New Zealand Incorporated (Rotorua/Taupo Province).

South Auckland Land District—Tauhara Rural Fire District

THE RIGHT HON. DAVID LANGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

Order

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Wairiki Rural Fire District Order 1988.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires the "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977; the "Committee" means the Wairiki Rural Fire Committee; "District" means the Wairiki Rural Fire District.
3. This order revokes and is in substitution for the Matahina Rural Fire District Order 1949 (a) and all amendments thereto.

Constitution of the Wairiki Rural Fire District

4. The areas specified in the Schedule to this order are hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district to be known as the Wairiki Rural Fire District.
5. The Wairiki Rural Fire District shall, for the purposes of the Act, be administered by a rural fire committee which shall be known as the Wairiki Rural Fire Committee.
5. The Committee shall consist of twelve members as follows:
 - (a) Six persons appointed by Tasman Forestry Limited by writing signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof;
 - (b) One person appointed by Caxton Paper Mills Limited by writing signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof;
 - (c) One person appointed by the Bay of Plenty United Council;
 - (d) One person appointed by New Zealand Timberlands Limited by writing signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof;
 - (e) One person appointed by the Director-General of the Department of Conservation;
 - (f) One person appointed by the Trustees of the Tuhoe Waikaremoana Trust Board; and
 - (g) One person appointed by the Federated Farmers of New Zealand Incorporated (Bay of Plenty Province).

Schedule**South Auckland and Gisborne Land Districts—
Wairiki Rural Fire District**

All those areas in the South Auckland Land District, Matamata, Waiapu, Tauranga and Opotiki Counties and Rotorua and Whakatane Districts, and described generally as follows:

“First”:

All of Rotoiti 5B1, in Blocks VII and VIII Rotoiti S.D.

“Seventh”:

All of the block known as Akaroa Downs, PT Section 21, Block XII Maketu S.D.

“Eighth”:
