##### Exemption from Permit Requirements Under the Animals Act 1967 (Notice No. 4478; Qual 1032-AUS-132)

Pursuant to Section 13 (4B) of the Animals Act 1967

I hereby give notice

1. That I exempt all persons from the necessity of obtaining a permit under section 13 (1) (a) of the Animals Act 1967 in respect of the importation into New Zealand of pasteurised dairy products containing vegetable or dairy components, originating in Australia. This exemption does not include products containing any meat product or the flesh of any species of salmonid fish.

2. That the dairy component of any pasteurised dairy products imported into New Zealand under the authority of this notice (No. 4478), must have originated in Australia and must have been pasteurised for a time and at a temperature internationally recognised as effective for the destruction of pathogenic organisms.

3. That bulk consignments must be accompanied by a certificate indicating compliance with paragraph 2, issued by the manufacturer or appropriate governmental authority in Australia.

4. That individually packaged items must either:

(a) be clearly labelled as being manufactured from pasteurised milk or;

(b) be accompanied by a certificate as per bulk consignments.

5. That the requirements of this notice (No. 4478) shall come into effect on the 1st day of February 1989.

## Commerce

### Industry Assistance Policy Tariff Concessions Review Notice

1. I, David Butcher, Minister of Commerce, give notice that a review of Tariff concessions is being conducted jointly by the Ministry of Commerce and the Customs Department.

2. The aim of the review is to simplify the Tariff and to restore the pre-eminence of Part I of the Tariff in setting out tariff rates applied to imports. In future, changes to tariff rates will be effected primarily by changing Part I of the Tariff and not through the granting of concessional rates under Part II, as has happened previously.

3. A project team made up of officials from the Ministry of Commerce and the Customs Department will redraft affected tariff items focusing on current Reference 25, 26 and 99 concessions.

4. Concessions failing to meet the following criteria will not be included in the review and on completion of the exercise will be revoked:

“the goods must be legally definable in terms of the Customs Tariff: for example, no model numbers, brand names or end-use descriptions will be accepted as part of descriptions;

the value of duty of goods brought in under the concession must exceed \$10,000 in the 1987–88 trade year.”

5. Prior to being revoked, these concessions, together with any other concessions that have not been translated into Part I, will be notified in the *New Zealand Gazette* and users of these concessions invited to apply for removal of the Part I tariff rate under the new policy.

6. The existing Reference 25, 26 and 99 concessions have been frozen. However, a Reference category 99 will be retained, not as the instrument to administer the Government's policy that goods not made in New Zealand be free of duty, but to provide flexibility through temporary suspension of the substantive duty rate in special cases, for example, if a domestic manufacturer ceases production temporarily for seasonal reasons.

7. A new Part II Reference category will be established to maintain the flexibility to grant concessions for domestic shortfalls where there is domestic manufacture. Concessions granted under this category will have a strict time limit of three months.

8. Redrafting of the Tariff will take place Chapter by Chapter, the timetable for the exercise being set out in the Schedule below. Interested parties may make submissions which should be addressed to The Comptroller of Customs, (Attention: Concessions Project Team), P.O. Box 2218, Wellington. Domestic producers are invited to supply information about the goods they produce and forms for this purpose are held by Customs Ports.

9. The tariff items affected will be redrafted to reflect accurately the products produced locally and will, as far as possible, cover the true market in which the local products compete. The market in which goods compete is to be assessed as it would be under competition law, that is with reference to the provisions of the Commerce Act and decisions made under that Act.

10. The present level of 25 percent of ex-factory cost will be retained as the domestic content benchmark to be used in the review. It will also be used when applications for lower tariff treatment under Part I are considered under the new policy. The benchmark will be reviewed, however, as part of the long-term tariff programme to apply after 1 July 1992, the date of the last tariff reduction under the present programme.

11. As tariff assistance will apply only to goods made in New Zealand it is essential that manufacturers are aware of this exercise and notify their activities to the Customs Department to ensure that existing protective tariff rates continue to apply.

#### Termination Notice: Dumping Investigation Aluminium Sheet

Notice was given in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 13 October 1988 of the initiation by the Comptroller of Customs of an investigation under section 186H of the Customs Act 1966 in respect of a complaint from Alcan (NZ) Ltd. that aluminium sheet exported or intended to be exported to New Zealand from Indonesia was being dumped.

Alcan (NZ) Ltd. had claimed the allegedly dumped product had caused them material injury in the form of loss of profits, loss of market share and staff reductions.

Interested parties were invited to make written submissions to Customs.

Information and evidence was submitted by the complainant, the overseas exporter, the New Zealand importer and their respective agents.

On 5 December 1988 the Minister of Customs granted an extension of the preliminary investigation period to 90 days under the provisions of section 186J (2) of the Customs Act 1966 on the grounds of:

(a) the complexity of the issues presented by the investigation, and

(b) the difficulty in obtaining satisfactory evidence in the investigation.

Section 186J (1) of the Customs Act 1966 and Article 5 (3) of the GATT Anti-Dumping Code require that an investigation be terminated where the Comptroller is satisfied that:

(a) There is insufficient evidence of dumping to justify proceeding with the investigation; or

(b) there is insufficient evidence that material injury to a

New Zealand industry has been or is being caused or threatened by means of the dumping.

The Comptroller considers that from the information available there is prima facie evidence that dumping of aluminium sheet from Indonesia is occurring.

However, no evidence has been provided which on analysis either directly or indirectly relates the injury being claimed to the imports of aluminium from Indonesia.

Accordingly the Comptroller has terminated investigations into the complaint.

## Health

### Area Health Boards Act 1983

#### Delegation of Functions of Department of Health to Auckland Area Health Board

Pursuant to section 36 (2) of the Area Health Boards Act 1983, I, George Cockburn Salmond, Director-General of Health, hereby delegate, with the consent of the Minister of Health, to the Auckland Area Health Board the functions of the Department of Health specified in Part A of the Schedule to this delegation, subject to the conditions set out in Part B of the Schedule to this delegation.

#### Schedule

##### Part A—Delegated Functions—Health Act 1956

##### Dental Health

Functions—The organisation and control of dental services so far as such services are paid for out of public money, in the following respects:

Management and maintenance of the School Dental Service, including consultation with education boards, in accordance with Government policy;

Having epidemiological surveys made for the purpose of identifying and analysing local dental health needs, measuring the extent to which needs are being met, and developing local dental health objectives and plans to meet those objectives within Government policy guidelines;

Consultation with the dental profession;

The provision and maintenance of dental services in hospitals;

Co-ordinating dental services to ensure the availability and

provision of dental care of a high standard throughout the area health district;

Providing public health dentistry and preventive dentistry components in the training programmes at schools of nursing and health inspectors' courses;

Planning and co-ordinating study programmes and observation programmes for international aid students.

##### Public Health

Functions—The provision of advice to local authorities in matters relating to public health; the prevention, limitation, and suppression of infectious and other diseases; and promotion and carrying out of researches and investigations of matters concerning public health and the prevention and treatment of disease; the organisation and control of medical services so far as such services are paid for out of public money; the taking of all such steps as may be desirable to secure the preparation, effective carrying out, and co-ordination of measures conducive to the public health; all in the following respects:

##### Environmental Health

The promotion, surveillance, and evaluation of public water supplies and community water supplies; the preparation of reports for loan and subsidy applications for waterworks; the promotion of improved standards of treatment and operation of water supplies; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities on water supplies; the investigation of complaints concerning water supplies;

The promotion, surveillance, and evaluation of sewerage and of sewage disposal systems, and other methods of human waste disposal; the preparation of reports for loan and subsidy applications for sewage disposal works; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities concerning sewerage and sewage disposal systems; the promotion of improved standards of treatment and operation of sewerage and sewage disposal systems; the investigation of complaints concerning sewerage and sewage disposal systems;

The promotion, surveillance, and evaluation of solid waste collection and disposal systems; the preparation of reports for loan subsidy applications for solid waste management; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities concerning solid waste collection and disposal; the investigation of complaints concerning solid waste collection and disposal;

The promotion, surveillance, and evaluation of hazardous waste disposal systems; the preparation of reports for loan and subsidy applications for hazardous waste management; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities concerning hazardous waste disposal; the promotion of improved standards of operation and management concerning hazardous waste disposal; the investigation of complaints concerning hazardous waste disposal;

The surveillance and evaluation of swimming pool sanitation; the promotion of adequate standards of swimming pool sanitation;

The surveillance and evaluation of the effectiveness of pest control; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities and harbour boards on the control of rats, vermin, and insect pests;

The periodic review of the sanitary condition of dwellings, boarding houses, hostels, motels, old people's homes, and camping grounds;

The provision of advice to local authorities on public health needs with respect to public health issues of regional planning schemes and district planning schemes;

The investigation of odour emission, and other undesirable emissions, to the atmosphere; consultation, where appropriate, with the regional air pollution control officer and the local authority concerned;

The establishment and operation of monitoring programmes to measure air pollution in the area health district or any part thereof;

The surveillance and periodic evaluation of the noise climate; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities on environmental noise; undertaking environmental noise surveys;

The provision of advice and assistance to local authorities, Government departments, public hospitals, and private hospitals, with respect to public health matters and health protection matters, as may be required;

The provision of advice and assistance to local authorities, regional councils and united councils, with respect to public health aspects of civil defence;

The investigation of applications for the establishment of offensive trades; the investigation of any proposal for the erection or extension of any premises for the purposes of or in connection with any offensive trade; granting or refusing consent to applications for the establishment or extension of any offensive trade;

The provision of health inspection services to local authorities;

The surveillance and evaluation of crematoria; the provision of advice and assistance to local authorities concerning crematoria; the investigation of complaints concerning crematoria; ensuring compliance with the Cremation Regulations 1973;

Ensuring compliance with Part IV of the Health Act 1956, and the Health (Quarantine) Regulations 1983;

Having regular sanitation inspections made of coastal shipping vessels;

The inspection and evaluation of port sanitation, including passenger terminal facilities, cargo workers' canteens and all wharves and related buildings; having samples taken of the water supply at ports to enable assessments of bacteriological and chemical content of the water; making recommendations with respect to port sanitation and water quality to relevant authorities;

The inspection of the following classes of premises for the purpose of the evaluation of and, where appropriate, the reporting on public health standards at the premises, and for the purpose of ensuring compliance with the requirements of the Health Act 1956, and any regulations made thereunder, relevant to the said premises:

Schools.

Old People's Homes.

Swimming pools.

Hairdressers' premises.

The inspection of, and reporting on, child care centres and residential homes for the purpose of the evaluation of the physical environmental standards, sanitary condition, and any adverse conditions;

The inspection of chartered clubs and other licensed premises for the purpose of the evaluation of health standards maintained at such clubs or premises, and reporting thereon;

Providing information as requested for the purpose of FAO and World Health Organisation food contamination monitoring programmes.

#### *Occupational Health*

Providing medical, nursing, and scientific advice about occupational health hazards and diseases to Government departments, employer organisations, employee organisations, Accident Compensation Corporation, voluntary organisations, and other relevant organisations;

Providing assistance in establishing occupational health services to relevant organisations, industry, Government departments;

Providing services for the investigation of, the reporting on, and, where possible, the improvement of environmental working conditions and the health of workers;

Providing occupational health services in priority areas, through occupational health centres, or in accordance with Government policy;

Ensuring, and promoting, the control of hazards at work;

Ensuring, and promoting, the safe use of chemicals in agriculture and industry;

Investigating occupational diseases;

The undertaking and assessment of noise surveys in workplaces;

Carrying out assessments and measurements on behalf of the National Radiation Laboratory pursuant to the Radiation Protection Act 1965 and the Radiation Protection Regulations 1982;

Investigation, evaluation, and reporting on occupational deafness, and promoting its prevention;

Giving appropriate advice and technical assistance on health issues in industrial disputes;

Investigation of problems and complaints relating to occupational health;

Undertaking special surveys or investigations on a regional basis or as part of a national programme;

Providing appropriate training of occupational health staff;

Promoting awareness of occupational health hazards by appropriate education programmes for schools, tertiary institutions, industry, Government departments;

Ensuring that all persons on whom obligations are imposed by the following regulations meet those obligations, and otherwise comply with those regulations:

Asbestos Regulations 1983.

Electroplating Regulations 1955.

Fumigation Regulations 1967.

Lead Process Regulations 1950.

Spray Coating Regulations 1962.

#### *Health Promotion*

Arranging for medical and developmental examinations of children from specific groups;

Arranging for medical examination and assessment of school children referred by parents, teachers, psychologists, general practitioners, nurses and others;

Arranging for immunisations, including BCG vaccination and Rubella immunisation for selected groups;

Health surveillance and advice and support for selected age groups;

The provision of support for Plunket nurses, and for staff of the area health board;

The provision of advice on, and participation in, health promotion and health education programmes;

The provision of support and advisory services for community health development;

Arranging for hearing and vision tests on children, including follow up tests; referral of children with suspected defects; consulting with parents, and schools with respect to children with suspected defects;

Implementation of health education programmes within the area health district, whether of a regional or national nature;

The planning, co-ordination and evaluation of health promotion and health education programmes;

The provision of in-service training for area health board staff in health promotion and health education;

Preparation and provision of statistics on:



Infectious and notifiable diseases notifications

Clinical attendances for venereal diseases

Immunisations

X-ray surveillance of immigrants

Medical requirements of South Pacific immigrants

Child Health

Arranging for measures to control and prevent the incidence of non-communicable diseases;

Promotion of health through good nutrition;

Undertaking measures to investigate, and control or prevent, the spread of infectious diseases; ensuring the isolation of persons likely to spread any infectious disease;

Ensuring compliance with the Venereal Diseases Regulations 1982.

#### *Public Health Nursing*

Functions—The organisation and control of public health nursing services so far as such services are paid for out of public money, in the following respects:

The promotion of primary health care by developing community profiles in consultation with the local community for the purpose of identifying health needs;

The provision of a family-centred nursing service that identifies family health needs and meets those needs by providing appropriate health surveillance, advice and support for "at risk" groups;

The supervision of infants and children in conjunction with the Plunket Society, and in accord with Government policy;

The provision of health surveillance of children in primary, intermediate and secondary schools, including correspondence schools;

The provision of health promotion services to post-school adolescents;

Carrying out immunisation programmes, and undertaking measures to assist in disease prevention and control;

The provision of a health surveillance support service for the well-elderly in the community, including visits to the elderly, and consultation with other agencies in the planning and provision of services for the well-elderly;

Assessment of standards of care for the elderly in licensed old people's homes, together with advice to managers of old people's homes on health aspects of the standards of care, and making reports on the standards of care;

Assessment of standards of care for patients in private hospitals, and ensuring appropriate standards are maintained;

The provision of occupational health nursing services to assist in ensuring high standards of occupational health, inducing consultation with industry and Government departments;

The provision of domiciliary nursing services in rural areas;

Participating in orientation, staff training, and on-going education programmes; contributing to the education of nursing students and medical students, and other trainees in health fields; speaking in public groups on the role of the public health nursing service in the community;

The provision of support services for civil defence agencies;

Promotion of public health through prevention work, the education of the public, and consultation with community groups, Government departments, and other relevant agencies;

Ensuring appropriate planning and management of public health nursing services (including services performed by health assistants) in accordance with Government policy.

#### *Food Act 1981*

Functions—The promotion and conservation of health in relation to food by the supervision of compliance with the Food Act 1981, the Food Hygiene Regulations 1974, the Food Regulations 1984, and the Dietary Supplements Regulations 1985, insofar as it is carried out by employees of an area health board, by ensuring that all persons on whom obligations are imposed by the said Act and regulations meet those obligations, and otherwise comply with the said Act and regulations.

#### *Social Security Act 1964—Part II*

Functions—The promotion and conservation of health, in the following respects:

Routine management of the dental benefits programme in accordance with the Social Security Act 1964, Part II, and the Social Security (Dental Benefits) Regulations 1983;

The provision of advice and assistance to members of the public with respect to the benefits provided under the Social Security Act 1964, Part II, and the regulations made thereunder.

#### *Toxic Substances Act 1979*

Functions—The promotion and conservation of health in relation to toxic substances by the supervision of compliance with the Toxic Substances Act 1979 and the Toxic Substances Regulations 1983, insofar as it is carried out by employees of an area health board, by ensuring that all persons on whom obligations are imposed by the said Act and regulations meet those obligations and otherwise comply with the said Act and regulations.

#### **Part B—Delegation Conditions**

1. Except as provided in clause 2 of these conditions, nothing in this delegation shall confer on the Auckland Area Health Board (in this part called "the board") the function of instituting proceedings for alleged offences against any of the Acts or regulations referred to in Part A of the Schedule in this delegation.

2. The board shall have the function of instituting proceedings for alleged offences against the Food Act 1981, the Food Hygiene Regulations 1974, the Food Regulations 1984, and the Dietary Supplements Regulations 1985. Where the board requires the services of counsel with respect to any proceedings so instituted, it shall instruct the Crown Solicitor in the area health district to represent the board in the proceedings.

3. Where, in the view of the board, offences against any of the Acts or regulations referred to in Part A of the Schedule to this delegation (other than the Food Act 1981, the Food Hygiene Regulations 1974, the Food Regulations 1984) have occurred, the board shall inform the Department of Health, to enable prosecution of the alleged offender at the instance of an officer of the department to be considered.

## Video Recordings Act 1987

### Decision of the Video Recordings Board of Review

1. The distributor, Blue Diamond Movies Ltd., sought a review of the video *Fresh Kill*.

2. The Video Recordings Board of Review (the Board) has re-examined the video in accordance with section 38 of the Video Recordings Act 1987 (the Act).

3. The video tells the story of Alan Chester who leaves a happy family life to go to Hollywood where he believes he will be a successful film star and live a life of luxury in California. Within a few days of arriving in Hollywood his dreams and life are shattered.

Alan is induced into helping an attractive young woman, Leona, with whom he quickly becomes infatuated. He learns that Leona has stolen \$2 million from the local ganglord, Manny, who was her lover.

This sets the scene for the chain of violence that follows as Manny attempts to recover his stolen money which he has accumulated through drug dealing. Leona and Alan are pursued by Manny and his gang. In the course of the video family, friends and associates of Leona and Alan are murdered in cruel, horrific and violent ways. In the space of a few days Alan changes from a stable and principled young man to a criminal who is totally without scruples or remorse and who by the end of the video, shortly before he is himself killed, wants to establish a "drug empire" over which he will be the "God-damn king".

4. The board in determining the classification of the video

addressed matters which it is required to take into consideration pursuant to section 21 of the Act and concluded:

(a) The dominant effect of the video is the depiction of crime and violence.

(b) The video has no artistic, social or cultural merit. The story is implausible and unbelievable, difficult to follow and the acting extremely bad.

(c) The video is likely to be viewed predominantly by teenagers.

(d) An extensive amount of anti-social behaviour is depicted. At best twenty slayings by cruel and violent means are shown. Many are filmed in close-up and are protracted. There is a total lack of remorse and a casual reaction to the violence and endless slayings. Drug dealing, drug taking, power and corruption are also incorporated into the video but these anti-social activities do not dominate the video.

(e) No particular class of the general public are denigrated.

(f) The video is intended for home viewing by a predominantly teenage audience.

(g) The dialogue is simplistic, predictable and badly written. It was not excessively offensive.

5. The board considers that the manner in which the anti-social activity is portrayed with the total lack of remorse, the taking of the law into the principal characters own hands and the casual response to the violence would be injurious to the young audience to whom the video is principally directed. The majority of members consider however that an older age group would see it as an implausible trite story with the antisocial activity not having the injurious effect and impact that it may have on a younger audience.

By a majority of 3 to 1 the board has determined that the video *Fresh Kill* be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years with the description **CONTENT MAY DISTURB**. One member of the board is of the view that it be classified as indecent.

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### Decision of the Video Recordings Board of Review

1. A review of the video *Cousins* was sought by the Society for Promotion of Community Standards (the applicant) pursuant to section 36 of the Video Recordings Act 1987 (the Act).

2. The Video Recordings Board of Review (the Board) re-examined the video in accordance with section 38 of the Act and reached its decision without having to consult the Video Recordings Authority or the applicant.

3. The video comprises a series of unrelated scenes each of approximately 15-20 minutes and each depicting a range of explicit homosexual sexual activities.

After a brief introductory family scene, which is the only time women are seen in the video, two cousins meet after a long absence. They are later seen sharing the same bedroom which provides the setting for the first depiction of the homosexual activities which dominate the rest of the video. In the series of unrelated scenes which follow two or three and, in one scene, four young males are shown performing a wide range of explicit and multiple sexual activities which includes masturbation, ejaculation, fellatio, anal exploration and intercourse. Many of the scenes are shot at very close range.

The majority of the scenes involves young males who are friends but in one scene two young males are paid to perform sexual acts with another male.

4. The Board considered the matters that it is required to address pursuant to section 21 of the Act and concluded that:

(a) The dominant effect of the video is the depiction of homosexual activities for viewing predominantly by male homosexuals.

(b) The video has no artistic, social or cultural merit. It has no storyline and is repititious. Variety is obtained only by varying the setting in which the sexual activities take place and the number of young males in each scene.

(c) The video would be viewed predominantly by adult homosexual males.

(d) No cruelty, violence, intimidation, sadism is shown in the video. All the sexual activities are participated in by willing, consenting males. Little sensitivity is portrayed in the relationships and the overall impression is one of casual relationships purely for sexual gratification.

(e) No denigration of any class of people is depicted.

(f) The video would be used for home viewing principally by a male homosexual audience. It would have little relevance or interest to a heterosexual audience.

(g) The soundtrack was not an integral part of the video. Coarse dialogue, comprising short trite sentences and which was frequently difficult to hear contributed nothing to the video. There were long silences and at times a repititious musical background accompanied the sexual acts which, like the dialogue, did not enhance the video.

5. The Board is concerned at the manner in which the homosexual activities are depicted. They could give the impression that such activities are the norm for all young males because of the matter of fact manner in which they are portrayed. Young immature males could gain a wrong impression from the video.

It is most regrettable that no warning accompanies the video that it portrays unsafe sexual activities or that the use of condoms is recommended when such activities are practised. The Board recognises however that it only has power to require deletions, not additions, to a video. It regards this as a serious omission in the Act.

6. The Board unanimously agrees that for the reasons outlined above, the video be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years with the description **CONTAINS EXPLICIT SEXUAL MATERIAL**.

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## Justice

### Broadcasting Act 1976

Decision No. 46/88

#### Decision

Dated the 23rd day of December 1988.

On 2 October 1987, Mr Baker referred his complaint to the Tribunal when the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand failed to uphold it.

#### The Complaint:

His complaint concerned Steinlager sponsored promotional advertisements for World Cup Rugby which featured All

Blacks in close-ups produced in the studio but simulating real Rugby situations from the dressing room to play on the field.

There are several All Blacks being tackled and in one case Mr Baker alleges the advertisement clearly shows a player being tackled after he had kicked the ball which was clearly a late tackle in breach of the rules of Rugby. He added that he did not think that the commercial was in good taste. He later made it clear however that he had not intended to complain on the grounds that it was an advertisement associated with alcohol or on the grounds of good taste.

Later, in referring his complaint to the Tribunal, he claimed that the promotion breached certain rules in that the Corporation failed to take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste in language and behaviour, bearing in mind the context in which any language and behaviour occurs, to be mindful of the effect any programme may have on children during the general accepted listening periods, to respecting the principles of law which sustain our society, and that advertisements must conform to standards of good taste and decency.

*Consideration by the Corporation:*

The Corporation took the complaint seriously. It pointed out that the quick cutting of the commercial may have given the impression of a later tackle but the Corporation noted that the rules of Rugby allow that a tackle may begin before the player releases the ball. In this case, the launching into the tackle could well have begun before the kick occurred but, as the launching into the tackle was out of sight, it was not possible to determine the point one way or another. Notwithstanding, it was not considered a factor which could have contributed to any breach of Broadcasting Rules.

The Corporation also declined to uphold the complaint on the grounds of a breach of standards of good taste and decency or a breach of the rules related to alcohol.

*Decision:*

The Tribunal has seen the commercials and has rejected the complaint on both grounds.

First, they were intended to promote Rugby and doubtless would not have been presented by All Blacks if they had been considered detrimental to Rugby.

Secondly, the Corporation's point about the whole scene not being visible is valid. Furthermore the whole commercial presentation is totally artificial and is seen by all to be a stylised presentation in slow motion not a depiction of an actual incident.

If the depiction of a late tackle on television was considered to be in breach of the above-named general programme rules then it would make the presentation of live rugby coverage somewhat difficult.

The Tribunal does not regard the matter as a serious one, does not consider in any case that the complainant has made out the factual basis of the complaint and is not satisfied that even if he had, that it is a basis for either a breach of the general programme rules or a breach of the standards of good taste and decency in advertising.

Mr Baker changed the basis of his complaint after the Corporation declined to uphold it. He extended the number of rules alleged to have been breach as we have mentioned earlier.

He then said he did not complain about the use of the word Steinlager and his original reference to good taste was an observation not a complaint.

However he reintroduced good taste in his extended citing of rules.

The Tribunal is satisfied that there is no substance at all in his principal complaints and that the complaint as varied merely attempts to cite further rules which he could have raised in his original complaint which showed a familiarity with them.

In any event we found there was no ground for extending the inquiry to the other rules as the central issues were raised by and considered properly by the Corporation.

The late tackle issue is without merit and the complaint properly rejected in all respects by the Corporation.

The Tribunal declines to uphold the complaint.

*Co-opted Members*

The Tribunal co-opted Messrs Sheehan and Stevenson as persons whose qualifications or experience were likely to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the complaint. They took part in the consideration of the complaint and the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

#### Decision

These publications are a part of a substantial commercial importation by Exchange Traders Dunedin in March of 1988. The Collector of Customs seized these particular issues from that consignment and the importer has subsequently disputed forfeiture of them. The publications in question have therefore been referred to the Tribunal prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

In his submission to the Tribunal on behalf of the Comptroller of Customs, Mr Wotherspoon states:

"The publications submitted to the Tribunal in this submission are primarily concerned with female domination, bondage and elements of transvestism. All of these publications rely heavily on photographs to appeal to the prurient interests and it is considered that none of the magazines display sufficient artistic merit to offset their sexual content. Much of the written material is of a coarse and lewd fashion which includes letters from readers, stories and commentaries on sexual techniques."

*Drag Queens*, Vol. 4, No. 2 & *TV Queens*, Vol. 2, No. 2

A previous issue of *Drag Queens* being, Vol. 4, No. 3, was submitted to the Tribunal in December 1986 and in Decision

3/87 it was classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. The Tribunal also placed a further restriction on that publication in that it was not to be publicly displayed for sale. Were it not for the final ten pages of this particular issue a similar classification and a similar restriction would have been given to the publication by the Tribunal. Those final ten pages contain a number of displays of sexual intimacy between the models displayed of such a nature that the Tribunal is satisfied that the whole publication would be injurious to the public good. The publication can not claim for itself any literary or artistic merit and the Tribunal classifies that publication as unconditionally indecent.

*TV Queens* Vol. 2, No. 2, is a volume of a magazine which is published quarterly by Holly Enterprises (USA). This particular publication contains numerous photographs portraying sexual activity including both oral and anal sex between the models portrayed. The Tribunal is satisfied that there is nothing which was otherwise of a balancing nature in the material presented and that which is presented can only be termed as coarse in the extreme. The Tribunal is satisfied that the overall tenor of the publication is such as to make it injurious to the public good and classifies it as unconditionally indecent.

*Queens of Drag*, Vol. 2, No. 2 and *Queens Night in Vol. 1*, No. 1

These two publications consist principally of photographs of a single male model partly dressed in female attire. There is a small amount of text with most of that being a description of the person depicted in the photographs. The nature of the presentation is such that the Tribunal is satisfied that it is likely to be injurious to younger readers and accordingly classifies each of these publications as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

*Transvestite Transformed*, Vol. 1, No. 4

A previous issue of this publication was submitted to the Tribunal in March 1983, when issue Vol. 2, No. 2, was classified as unconditionally indecent in Decision 1070. Those aspects of the publication which have caused great concern to the Tribunal are the depictions of bondage which are evident throughout most of the early part of the magazine. In addition there is a treatment of topics such as incest and rape of a nature which causes grave concern to the Tribunal. The Tribunal is satisfied that these publications contain a significant amount of material which would be injurious to the public good and accordingly classifies this publication as unconditionally indecent.

*Bizarre Review* No. 16, *Command*, Vol. 4, No. 3

Both of these publications contain significant depictions and treatment of the topics of violence and spanking of such a nature that those matters alone would require in the Tribunal's view a classification of unconditionally indecent. There are additional features however which cause the Tribunal concern including the topic of letters from readers in which those readers deal in an explicit and repetitious way with a great variety of sexual episodes. As indicated the Tribunal is satisfied that these publications are injurious to the public good and classifies each as unconditionally indecent.

#### *Shiny* Publications

These magazines are published by G & M Fashions (Leisure) Ltd. of the United Kingdom and consist of photographic material and text. The theme of the publications is the use of rubber clothing and accessories in a variety of sexual activities. The text of these publications include letters from readers in which they relate their experiences of sexual activity and the short stories which are contained in the publication are of a similar nature. The publication is well presented and is obviously of high quality in terms of the actual presentation but it contains material which the Tribunal is satisfied is injurious to the public good. Throughout the publications



there are explicit photographic portrayals of both bondage and corporal punishment. The Tribunal has been at pains to draw to the attention of publishers and importers that this type of material in its view is clearly injurious to the public good in terms of the legislation. Accordingly each of these publications is classified by the Tribunal as unconditionally indecent.

(2) All money received by the council in the performance or exercise of the functions, duties or powers conferred on it by this order in respect of the foreshore to which this order applies, shall after the deduction of any expenditure incurred by the council in the performance or exercise of those functions, duties or powers, be applied to the construction, repair or improvement of facilities in respect of that foreshore and not otherwise.
