#### Fair Trading Act 1986

##### The Unsafe Goods (Disappearing and Fade-Away Ink) Notice 1989

Pursuant to section 31 of the Fair Trading Act 1986, the Minister of Consumer Affairs gives the following notice.

#### Notice

1. **Title**—This notice may be cited as the Unsafe Goods (Disappearing and Fade-away Ink) Notice 1989.

2. **Certain liquids intended for use by children during play declared to be unsafe goods**—The following goods are hereby declared to be unsafe goods—

(a) Plastic or other containers of liquid described as "Disappearing Ink":

(b) Plastic or other containers of liquid described as "Fade-away Ink":

(c) Any other plastic or other container of liquid having a pH less than pH3 or greater than pH10 and intended for squirting by children during play.

*Explanatory Note*—This note is not part of the notice but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice declares certain liquids intended for squirting by children during play to be unsafe goods under section 31 of the Fair Trading Act 1986. The notice applies to liquids known as "Disappearing Ink" and "Fade-away Ink" and to any other liquid having a pH less than pH3 or greater than pH10 and which is intended for squirting by children in play.

Under section 31 (2) of the Act, unless it is sooner revoked, the notice remains in force for a period of 18 months after the date of publication in the *Gazette*.

It is an offence under the Fair Trading Act 1986 to supply, or offer to supply, or advertise to supply, goods which are declared to be unsafe goods.

Section 33 of that Act prohibits the importation of such goods into New Zealand.

**Notes to the Financial Statements Year Ended 30 September 1988**

**1. Statement of Accounting Policies**

**General Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are based on the general principles of historical cost accounting, including the going concern concept and the accrual basis of accounting.

**Particular Accounting Policies**

**Valuation of Investments—**New Zealand public securities are valued at cost adjusted annually for the proportion of discount or premium on purchase so as to allow redemption value by maturity date.

Whilst in the ordinary course of business some realisation of New Zealand public securities may take place at prices below book

values, in the majority of cases these securities are held to, or close to maturity dates when they would be redeemed at face value. Accordingly, no provision is made for any difference between book value and market value of individual securities.

#### *Sale of Public Securities—*

Profit or losses realised on sale of public securities are reflected in the profit and loss statement in equal annual instalments over the unexpired period to maturity of the securities sold or 5 years, whichever is the shorter.

*Taxation—*The company adopts tax effect accounting whereby income tax expense is calculated on pre-tax accounting profits after adjustment for permanent taxation differences. The tax effect of timing differences which occur where items are included or allowed for income tax purposes in a period different to that for accounting is shown in provision for deferred income tax and future income tax benefits, as applicable, at current taxation rates.

The liability method of inter-period allocation of income tax has been applied.

*Changes in Accounting Policies—*There have been no significant changes in the accounting policies applied during the period covered by these financial statements. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.
