Special Address from the House of Representatives to The Queen, and Her Majesty's Reply

On Wednesday, the 14th day of February 1990, the House of Representatives adopted a respectful address to The Queen on the occasion of Her Majesty's presence in New Zealand in this Anniversary Year of 1990. The address was presented to Her Majesty by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Hon. Sir Kerry Burke, accompanied by members of the House

on Thursday, the 15th day of February 1990 at Government House, Wellington.

The text of the address is as follows:

TO THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY
MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY:

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the members of the House of Representatives in Parliament assembled, beg leave to offer our humble thanks to Your Majesty, and our heartfelt gladness, for Your Majesty's presence among Your people of New Zealand in this Anniversary Year of 1990.

As representatives of the people of New Zealand, we express our great pleasure that Your Majesty, with His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh, has come to reside in Your Realm of New Zealand to join with your people in their commemoration and celebration of their heritage and national identity, while looking to the challenges and opportunities of the years ahead.

We recall especially the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi 150 years ago, during the reign of Your Majesty's illustrious great-great-grandmother, Queen Victoria. We are happy to affirm the bonds with the Crown established at that period of our history. We acknowledge the trust that falls to us to honour the Treaty, and we dedicate ourselves anew to making its principles an enduring reality.

In commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the landing of the Anzac Forces at Gallipoli, we recall the sacrifices made there, and in other fields of combat, for Sovereign and country. This House asks Your Majesty to attest the devotion of Your people of New Zealand to the principles of freedom and democracy, and to the other fundamental values that we cherish. We assure Your Majesty that New Zealanders look forward to being joined by Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal during the Anzac Day observances.

Mindful of New Zealand's membership of the Commonwealth, whose Head is Your Majesty, we affirm our adherence to the common tradition from which that association of nations has evolved, and declare our commitment to the spirit and forms of co-operation contributing to concord and understanding among peoples and their wellbeing. New Zealanders have been delighted to welcome the return of His Royal Highness The Prince Edward, to open the XIVth Commonwealth Games.

It is the fervent hope of this House that Your Majesty and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh have found your time in New Zealand enjoyable and interesting, and we

wish Your Majesty a safe and pleasant journey to your other realms.

Her Majesty replied in the following terms:

MR SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

I have much pleasure in receiving the address adopted by the House of Representatives on the occasion of my period of residence in this realm during the New Zealand 1990 Commemoration. I am most appreciative of the sentiments expressed.

The Duke of Edinburgh and I are very happy to be here at this time of celebration and renewed commitment, and have enjoyed being among the people of New Zealand.

I am grateful for your expressions of loyalty, and for the kind references to members of my family associated with events in New Zealand this year.

May every success attend your endeavours for the best interests of New Zealand in the years ahead.

Pursuant to section 63 of the Local Government Amendment Act (No. 2) 1989, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

Order

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Local Government (Otago Region) Reorganisation Amendment Order 1990 and shall be read together with the deemed part of the Local Government (Otago Region)

Reorganisation Order 1989* (hereinafter referred to as "the principal order").

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. Otago Museum Trust Board—The principal order is hereby amended by inserting, after Part IX, the following Part:

"PART X OTAGO MUSEUM TRUST BOARD

178 MEMBERSHIP OF OTAGO MUSEUM

The Otago Museum Trust Board Act 1955 (hereinafter referred to in this Part of this Order as "the Act") is hereby modified by deleting section 3 (2) and substituting the following subsection:

"(2) The Board shall consist of:

- (a) Four members to be appointed by the Dunedin City Council;
- (b) One member to be appointed by the Central Otago District Council;
- (c) One member to be appointed by the Clutha District Council;
- (d) One member to be appointed by the Waitaki District Council;
- (e) Two members to be appointed by the Council of the University of Otago;
- (f) One member to be appointed by the Otago Branch of the Royal Society of New Zealand;
- (g) One member to be appointed by the Association of Friends of the Otago Museum, Incorporated;
- (h) One member, with a knowledge of primary or secondary education, who shall be appointed by the Board on the recommendation of the Otago District Manager of the Ministry of Education."

179 APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF BOARD

The Act is hereby further modified by deleting section 5 and substituting the following section:

"5. (1) After the first and each subsequent triennial general election of members of the city and distribution councils referred to in section 3 (2) of this Act, but not later than the 31st day of March 1990, following each such election:

- (a) The Dunedin City Council shall appoint 4 persons to be members of the Board; and
 - (b) (i) The Central Otago District Council, and
(ii) The Clutha District Council; and
(iii) The Waitaki District Council
- shall each appoint 1 person to be a member of the Board; and
- (c) The bodies referred to in paragraphs (e), (f), (g) and (h) of section 3 (2) of this Act shall each appoint the appropriate number of persons to be members of the Board.

(2) Every member of the Board appointed under this section shall come into office on the day following such appointment.

(3) Every member of the Board, unless he or she sooner vacates that office, shall vacate his or her office on the appointment of his or her successor or at the close of the 31st day of March 1990, next following the last triennial general election of members of city and district councils referred to in section 3 (2) of this Act, whichever shall first occur."

180 BUDGETARY COMMITTEE

Section 15A of the Act is hereby further modified by deleting subsections (1) and (2) and substituting the following subsection:

"(1) Those persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs (a) to (d) of section 3 (2) of this Act, together with 1 other person appointed by the Otago Museum Trust Board, shall each be a member of a committee of the Board to be known as the Budgetary Committee."

181 CONTRIBUTING AUTHORITIES

The Act is hereby further modified by deleting the First Schedule to the Act and substituting the following Schedule:

"First Schedule

The contributing authorities shall be those named in column 1 and the differential factor appropriate to each contributing authority shall be that set opposite its name in column 2.

Pursuant to section 63 of the Local Government Amendment Act (No. 2) 1989, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

Order

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Local Government (Canterbury Region) Reorganisation Amendment Order 1990 and shall be read together with the deemed part of the Local Government (Canterbury Region) Reorganisation Order 1989* (hereinafter referred to as "the principal order").

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. Canterbury Museum Trust Board—The principal order is hereby amended by inserting, after Part XIII, the following Part:

"PART XIV CANTERBURY MUSEUM TRUST BOARD 178 MEMBERSHIP OF CANTERBURY MUSEUM TRUST BOARD

The Canterbury Museum Trust Board Act 1983 (hereinafter referred to in this Part of this Order as "the Act") is hereby modified by deleting section 3 (2) and substituting the following subsection:

"(2) The Board shall consist of:

- Four members to be appointed by the Christchurch City Council;
- One member to be appointed by the Hurunui District Council and the Waimakariri District Council;
- One member to be appointed jointly by the Selwyn District Council and the Banks Peninsula District Council;
- One member appointed by the University of Canterbury;
- One member appointed by the Canterbury Branch of the Royal Society of New Zealand;
- One member appointed by the Ngai Tahu Trust Board;
- One member appointed by the Canterbury Pilgrims' and Early Settlers' Association; and
- One member appointed by the Association of Friends of the Canterbury Museum."

266 APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF BOARD

The Act is hereby further modified by deleting section 5 and substituting the following section:

"5. **Election and Appointment of Members of Board**—

(1) Not later than the 15th day of March 1990, and then within 3 months after each triennial general election held pursuant to the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976, those territorial authorities and other bodies referred to in section 3 (2) of this Act shall each appoint the appropriate person or persons to be members of the Board.

(2) Every member of the Board appointed under this section shall come into office on the day following that on which he or she is appointed."

267 CALCULATION OF LEVY

The Act is hereby further modified by deleting section 15 and substituting the following section:

"15. **Calculation of levy**—(1) For the purpose of apportioning levies the population of the district of each contributing authority shall be the population of that district as at the 31st day of March 1990, immediately preceding the previous financial year as certified by the Government Statistician whose certificate shall be conclusive evidence as to that population.

(2) The population computed as provided for in subsection (1) of this section shall be calculated as a percentage of the total population of the districts of all contributing authorities.

(3) The levy made in each financial year against each contributing authority shall be an amount equal to a percentage of the total levies payable by all the contributing authorities computed by multiplying the percentages of population of the district of each contributing authority, as calculated in subsection (2) of this section, by the relevant differential shown in the Schedule to this Act."
