#### **Electricity Act 1968**

#### Proposed Electromedical Safety Standards

The Secretary of Commerce invites submissions on the technical aspects of the 16 Australian Electromedical Safety Standards listed in the Schedule to this notice.

It is proposed that the standards be inserted into New Zealand Electrical Code of Practice for the Electrical Safety of Apparatus and Materials (NZECP3:1989) by amendment to the Code pursuant to Part IIIA of the Electricity Act 1968 (as inserted by section 6 of the Electricity Amendment Act 1983).

After consideration of submissions, and after the outcome of consultations with such persons as may be affected by the amendment, the Secretary intends to apply for the approval of the Minister of Energy to the resulting amendment to NZECP3:1989.

# **Consumer Affairs**

#### Fair Trading Act 1986

#### Notice Prohibiting Supply of Glitter Bangles

Pursuant to section 31 (3) of the Fair Trading Act 1986, I, the Honourable Margaret Kerslake Shields, the Minister of Consumer Affairs, by this notice, which shall come into force the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*, prohibit indefinitely the supply of the goods specified in the Schedule to this notice.

#### Schedule

Tubular plastic arm bangles, containing silver-coloured metallic flakes or glitter suspended in liquid, intended for use

as jewellery for children, and commonly known as "Glitter Bangles".

Explanatory Note

This note is not part of the notice but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice prohibits indefinitely the supply of certain tubular plastic arm bangles containing silver-coloured metallic flakes or glitter suspended in liquid, intended for use as jewellery by children. These bangles are commonly known as "Glitter Bangles".

These bangles were declared by the Unsafe Goods (Glitter Bangles) Notice 1989\* to be unsafe goods under section 31 of the Fair Trading Act 1986. By virtue of section 31 (2) of that Act that notice expired on 24 September 1990.

Section 31 (3) of the Fair Trading Act 1986 authorises the Minister of Consumer Affairs, if a period of 18 months has elapsed since goods were declared to be unsafe goods and if no product safety standard has been declared in respect of those goods under section 29 of that Act, to prohibit the supply of the goods indefinitely or for a specified period.

It is an offence under the Fair Trading Act 1986 to supply, or offer to supply, or advertise to supply, goods, the supply of which is prohibited under the Act.

Section 33 of that Act also prohibits the importation of such goods into New Zealand.

#### Education Act 1989

#### Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata 1990

Pursuant to sections 146 and 155 of the Education Act 1989 (as inserted by section 14 of the Education Amendment Act 1989), the Minister of Education hereby gives the following notice:

#### Notice

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day of its publication in the *Gazette*.
- 3. I hereby establish at Ruamata Marae, Te Ngae Road, Rotorua, a primary school called Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata and I hereby designate the school Kura Kaupapa Maori.
- 4. Aims, purposes and objectives of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata.

Together with the use of Te Reo Maori as the principal language of instruction the following aims, purposes and objectives constitute the character of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata.

- (i) To provide an education in Maori for Maori children.
- (ii) The school will aim to produce fully bilingual and bicultural children.
- (iii) The school will embrace Te Aho Matua O Nga Kura Kaupapa Maori.
- (iv) The school will encourage relationships with local marae and tribes
- (v) All staff of the school will have an acceptable level of fluency in the Maori language and must be able to uphold the character of the school.

- (vi) The Whanau in co-operation with the Board of Trustees will participate in the operation of the school.
- (vii) The Whanau, parents and caregivers will involve themselves in the school and all of its activities.
- 5. Consitution of the Board of Trustees-The Board of Trustees of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori O Ruamata shall comprise:
  - (a) Five people appointed by the Minister; and
  - (b) The principal or principal designate; and
  - (c) Not more than four persons co-opted by the Board.

#### **British Settlements Act 1887**

#### Officer of Government of Ross Dependency **Appointed**

PAUL REEVES, Governor-General

WHEREAS, by an Order in Council dated the 30th day of July 1923\*, made under the British Settlements Act 1887 of the United Kingdom Parliament, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of New Zealand for the time being (hereinafter called the Governor) was appointed to be the Governor of the Ross Dependency, and all the powers and authorities which by the said order were given and granted to the Governor for the time being of the Dependency were thereby vested in him:

And whereas the Governor was thereby further authorised and empowered to make all such rules and regulations as might lawfully be made by Her Majesty's authority for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency:

And whereas, by regulations made by the Governor on the 14th day of November 1923t, it was enacted that all persons appointed by the Governor for the time being of the

Dependency should have such power and authority as might be granted them in due course of law, and might be empowered to do such things as might be necessary or desirable to ensure that the laws in force in the Dependency are duly observed and complied with in every respect, and to do all things necessary or expedient for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency, and to safeguard and preserve Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty over and in respect of the Dependency:

And whereas it is expedient that the person hereinafter named be appointed an officer of the Government of the Dependency:

Now, therefore, I, The Most Reverend Sir Paul Alfred Reeves, the Governor-General of New Zealand, and as such the Governor of the Ross Dependency, hereby appoint

Charles Ross McDonald, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency for the period beginning with the 1st day of October 1990 and ending with the close of the 31st day of October 1991 or such earlier date as he shall leave the Dependency:

And I hereby confer on the said Charles Ross McDonald while he holds office all the powers and authorities that may be exercised in New Zealand by a Justice of the Peace, and also all the powers and authorities that may be exercised by a Coroner:

The said Charles Ross McDonald to exercise his functions at such places within the Dependency as may be directed by the officer for the time being appointed as an officer of the Government of the Dependency in whom is vested the general executive and administrative authority in preserving Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty and the laws and regulations in force in the Dependency.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General as the Governor of the Ross Dependency, this 26th day of September 1990.

# The Transport (Driver Logbooks Exemption) Notice 1990

Pursuant to section 70c (10) of the Transport Act 1962, the Secretary for Transport hereby gives the following notice.

#### Notice

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Transport (Driver Logbooks Exemption) Notice 1990.
- (2) This notice shall come into effect on the day after its notification in the *Gazette*.
- **2.** Interpretation—In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires, "the Act" means the Transport Act 1962.
- **3. Exemption from driver logbook requirements**—The vehicles and classes of vehicles specified in Part A of the Schedule to this notice, and the services specified in Part B of the Schedule, are hereby declared to be exempt from the provisions of subsections (1) to (9) of section 70c of the Act.

#### Schedule

#### Part A

2

Vehicles and Classes of Vehicles Declared to be Exempt from Section 70c of the Act

- 1. Every vehicle (other than a passenger service vehicle) owned and operated by a territorial authority, a telecommunication authority, an electrical supply authority, or an energy supply authority, and driven by an employee for whom driving is secondary to their principal employment.
- 2. Every harvesting machine travelling between harvesting sites a distance not exceeding 10 kilometres.
- 3. Every vehicle owned by the owner or manager of a farm and used in an agricultural related directly to the management of that farm within a 50 kilometre radius of that farm; including a vehicle used on a road to transport farm products, farm implements, stock or farm requisites of any kind within such a distance.
- 4. Every vehicle driven for the purpose of obtaining a certificate of fitness, warrant of fitness or a permit under section 79 (3) of the Act, when the vehicle is being driven to the nearest place at which such a certificate, warrant or permit is obtainable; and every vehicle driven from that place to the operators normal business location.
- 5. Every goods service vehicle that has 2 axles and is towing a trailer having more than 1 axle, where, on journeys not exceeding 100 kilometres, the total combined gross laden weight of the vehicle and trailer does not exceed 3,500 kilogrammes.
- 6. Every logstacker, forklift, and straddle carrier used

exclusively in off road areas to which the public does not have access as of right.

- 7. Every aircraft refuelling vehicle operating within a 3 kilometre radius of the control tower of the international airport at Auckland or Wellington or Christchurch.
- 8. Every vehicle operated by any person recognised by the Secretary for Transport as a person who suffers from a medical condition that results in a physical inability to keep logbooks.
- 9. Every vehicle operated by any person recognised by the Secretary for Transport as a person whose principal employment does not involve the driving of vehicles to which section 70B of the Act applies used within a 50 kilometre radius of that person's principal place of work.
- 10. Every vehicle operated by any person operating solely as a domestic rubbish collection service on contract to a local authority for collections between 0500 and 1900 Monday to Friday.
- 11. Every goods service vehicle with a manufacturers gross vehicle weight of 6,000 kilogrammes or less operated within a 50 kilometre radius of the owners business location.
- 12. Every goods service vehicle operated on a service within a 50 kilometre radius of the operator's business location where the timetable and driver roster has been approved by the Secretary for Transport.

#### Part B

Services Declared to be Exempt from Section 70c of the Act

- 1. Every service not being a vehicle recovery service licensee engaged solely in the manufacture, mechanical repair, road testing, sales, servicing or demonstration of new or used vehicles within a 50 kilometre radius of the service organisations business location.
- 2. Every vehicle recovery service, in as much as the recovery of vehicles is carried out solely by a vehicle that is, apart from the fitting of a tow hitch or ringfeeder, not otherwise adapted to lift or carry a disabled vehicle, and where the vehicle under tow is in a roadworthy condition apart from a mechanical or electrical defect and when the towing takes place between 0700 and 1800.
- 3. Every service engaged solely in the refuelling and reloading of agricultural aircraft when operating from an airfield or airstrip, but not whilst operating on the public highway.
- 4. Every transport service operated on Chatham Islands, Great Barrier Island and Stewart Island.

#### 1. Statement of Accounting Policies

#### General Accounting Policies

The general accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

- The measurement base adopted is the historical cost basis.

For taxation purposes the trust is deemed to be a charitable organisation. Its income is not subject to taxation.

#### 4. Goods and Services Tax

The trust is not registered for Goods and Services Tax purposes. Accordingly these financial statements are stated on a G.S.T. inclusive basis.

#### 5. Incorporation

The Trust Bank Waikato Community Trust was incorporated on 5 August 1988.
