### Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Notice 1990

Pursuant to section 168 of the Education Amendment Act 1990, the Minister of Education gives the following notice.

### Notice

1. (a) This notice may be cited as the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Notice 1990.

- (b) This notice shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette.
- 2. There shall be a Council to be known as the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council which shall control the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic.
- 3. The Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council shall be constituted as follows:
  - (a) Four members appointed by the Minister of Education.
- (b) The Chief Executive Officer of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic.
- (c) One member appointed by the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council after consultation with the NZ Council of Trade Unions.

- (e) One permanent member of the academic staff of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic elected by the permanent members of that staff
- (f) One permanent member of the general staff of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic elected by the permanent members of that staff.
- (g) One member who is or has been a student of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic, who shall represent the students of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic and who shall be elected by the students of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic.
- (h) One member representing Maori communities and who shall be appointed by the Tauranga Moana District Maori Council.
- (i) One member appointed by the National Council of Women, Tauranga Branch.
- (j) One member representing the Bay of Plenty Fruitgrowers Associations and appointed by their Fruit Advisory Committee
- (k) One member representing the farming communities and appointed by Federated Farmers NZ (Bay of Plenty Province Inc).
- (I) One member appointed by the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council after consultation with the legal fraternity as listed in the First Schedule of this notice.
- (m) One member appointed by the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council after consultation with the financial community as listed in the Second Schedule to this notice.
- (n) Up to two members may be co-opted by the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council if and when it thinks fit, taking into account the specific needs of Bay of Plenty Polytechnic.
- 4. The terms of office of members of the Council, vacation of office, disclosure of members' interest and casual vacancies are covered in sections 173–176 of the Education Amendment Act 1990.

Subject to section 173, the maximum term for any member, other than the Chief Executive Officer, shall be three consecutive 4 year terms.

5. The powers of the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic Council shall not be affected by vacancy in the membership thereof.

- (h) One member appointed by an electoral college comprising the local branches of Federated Farmers of New Zealand, Country Women's Institute, Women's Division of Federated Farmers, Young Farmers Clubs, and the Fruitgrowers Federation of New Zealand.
- (i) One member, being a resident in the region serviced by the Whangarei District Council, appointed by that Council.
- (j) One member, being a resident in the region serviced by the Far North District Council appointed by that Council.
- (k) One member, being a resident in the region serviced by the Kaipara District Council, appointed by that Council.
- (I) One member, appointed by the Tai Tokerau District Maori Council in consultation with Tai Tokerau Iwi Transition
- (m) One member, appointed by the Tai Tokerau Maori Women's Welfare League.
- (n) Up to 4 members to be co-opted by the Northland Polytechnic Council if and when it thinks fit taking into account the specific needs of the Northland Polytechnic, its unique character, and the gender, ethnic and social-economic composition of the Northland community.
- 4. The terms of office of members of the Council, vacation of office, disclosure of members' interest and casual vacancies are covered in sections 173–176 of the Education Amendment Act 1990.

Subject to section 173, the maximum term for any member, other than the Chief Executive Officer, shall be three consecutive 4-year terms.

5. The powers of the Northland Polytechnic Council shall not be affected by vacancy in the membership thereof.

- (j) Not more than 4 members co-opted by the Council, if and when it thinks fit.
- 4. The terms of office of members of the Council, vacation of office, disclosure of members' interest and casual vacancies are covered in sections 173–176 of the Education Amendment Act 1990.

Subject to section 173, the maximum term for any member, other than the Chief Executive Officer, shall be three consecutive 4-year terms.

5. The powers of the Aoraki Polytechnic Council shall not be affected by vacancy in the membership thereof.

- (f) One member appointed by the Iwi of the Tangatawhenua in the region served by the Polytechnic.
- (g) One member appointed by the Manawatu Employers' Association.
- (h) One member appointed by the Manawatu District Council of Trade Unions.
- (i) Three members nominated by any member of the public following advertisements in the local newspapers. These will be elected by a College of Electors as listed in the First Schedule to this notice, each of whom shall have the right of one vote for each of the three vacancies. The Council shall have the power to amend the membership of the College of Electors as it sees fit.
- (j) Not more than four members to be co-opted by the Manawatu Polytechnic Council if and when it sees fit.
- 4. Permanent employees of the Manawatu Polytechnic may not be appointed, elected or co-opted as members of the Council under paragraphs (e), (f), (g), (h), (i) and (j) of clause 3
- 5. The term of office of members of the Council, vacation of office, disclosure of members' interest and casual vacancies are covered in sections 173–176 of the Education Amendment Act 1990.

Subject to section 173, the maximum term for any member, other than the Chief Executive Officer, shall be four consecutive four year terms, provided that the Council may coopt a member who has served under paragraphs (a) (f) (g) (h) or (i) of clause 3 for a further single term of 4 years.

6. The powers of the Manawatu Polytechnic Council shall not be affected by vacancy in the membership thereof.

  - (d) One permanent member of the general staff of

Carrington Polytechnic elected by the permanent members of that staff.

- (e) One member who is or has been a student of Carrington Polytechnic who shall represent the students of Carrington Polytechnic and who shall be elected by the students of Carrington Polytechnic.
- (f) One member appointed by the Carrington Polytechnic Council, after consultation with the central organisation of employers, from nominations from those employer organisations listed in the First Schedule of this notice.
- (g) One member appointed by the Carrington Polytechnic Council, after consultation with the central organisation of workers, from nominations from those employee organisations listed in the Second Schedule of this notice.
- (h) Five members appointed by five separate electoral colleges which will be reflective of the disciplines taught in each of the five major academic groupings of Carrington Polytechnic, as listed in the Third Schedule to this notice.
- (i) One member who shall represent the West Auckland Maori Community and who shall be appointed by the Whanau O Waipareira.
- (j) One member who shall be appointed by the Maori Runanga of Carrington Polytechnic.
- (k) One member who shall be the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Auckland, or his/her nominee.
- (I) No more than two members to be co-opted by the Carrington Polytechnic Council, and who shall be annual appointments to the Council.

To ensure continuity during the transition period, the initial two co-opted positions on the new Council shall be made by the 1990 Council from its own membership.

- 4. - (j) Having regard to the courses provided by the university, one member appointed by the Massey University Council on the nomination of the Chancellor after consultation with the central organisation of workers within the meaning of the Labour Relations Act 1987.
- (k) Two members of the Court of Convocation of Massey University elected by all those on the roll of that Court voting for two lists of candidates, one of women who have been nominated and one of men who have been nominated. It then follows SH 1 in a southerly direction to Hydro Road and the Karapiro Dam. From Karapiro Dam the boundary runs in a straight line to the Allen Road junction with SH 3 just south of Kihikihi, then along SH 3 to the Otorohanga Road Bridge.
