Summary of Bills Introduced

Chatham Islands County Council (Rates and County Dues Validation)

The bill seeks to:

- (1) validate the general rates, uniform annual charges and county dues made and levied by the Chatham Islands County Council in respect of the rating years ended 31 March 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987;
- (2) validate rating inconsistencies in that a different level of rates was collected to that which was levied, for the rating years 1985 and 1986;
- (3) validate a breach of section 4 (2) of the Chatham Islands County Council Empowering Act 1980, which requires scales of county dues to be fixed by special order. The Council purported to have fixed these by resolution and not by special order as required and has continued to levy county dues in respect of items not expressly referred to in subsequent resolutions;
- (4) repeal section 6 of the Chatham Island County Council Empowering Act 1980.

Invercargill Reserves Vesting and Empowering

The objects of the bill are to:

- (1) free land from trusts, reservations and restrictions imposed by the Invercargill Reserves Vesting Act 1911;
- (2) empower the Invercargill City Council to sell land;
- (3) empower the Council to distribute the net proceeds from the sale of land for specified purposes equally between the Council, the Southland Agricultural and Pastoral Association, and the Southland Racing Club.

Kumeu District Agricultural and Horticultural Society

This Private Bill provides for the reincorporation of the Kumeu District Agricultural and Horticultural Society and for the extension of the Society's powers over the use of its land.

Fisheries Act 1983

Fisheries (Foveaux Strait Dredge Oyster Fishery Suspension) Notice 1991, No. 5069

Pursuant to section 47 of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Minister of Fisheries (acting on the recommendation of the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries, and after informing the Fisheries Authority) hereby gives the following notice:

Notice

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Foveaux Strait Dredge Oyster Fishery Suspension) Notice 1991.

(2) This notice shall come into effect on the 1st day of March 1991.

2. Interpretation—In this notice:

(a) the term "Foveaux Strait dredge oyster fishery" means the oyster fishery in Foveaux Strait as defined and declared to be a controlled fishery in the Controlled Fisheries (Foveaux Strait Dredge Oyster Fishery) Notice 1979*.

(b) any reference to licences means licences granted by the Fisheries Authority pursuant to section 33 of the Fisheries Act 1983 in respect of the Foveaux Strait dredge oyster fishery.

3. Restriction on licences—(1) All licences are hereby subject to the restriction set out in subclause (2) of this clause.

(2) All fishing pursuant to any licence shall be suspended in those waters of Foveaux Strait lying inside a line commencing at 46° 47.90'S and 168° 23.3'E; then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to 46° 39.60'S and 167° 55.50'E; then in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to 46° 36.20'S and 168° 02.70'E; then in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to 46° 43.70'S and 168° 24.00'E; then in a straight line in a southerly direction to the point of commencement.

4. Purpose—The closure of the western and central beds of the Foveaux Strait dredge oyster fishery is necessary to minimise the possibility of the oyster infection, *Bonamia*, being spread by oyster dredges from highly infected areas of the fishery to areas of the fishery that are not infected or which are least infected.

Indecent Publications Act 1963

Decision No. 48/90

Reference No.: IND 20/90 and 25/90

Before the Indecent Publications Tribunal

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by the Comptroller of Customs for a decision in respect of the publications contained in application No. IND 20/90 and 25/90. These publications are more particularly referred to by title and publisher in the categories specified in the decision which follows:

Chairperson: P. J. Cartwright.

Members: R. E. Barrington, W. K. Hastings and S. C. Middleton.

Hearing at Wellington on the 28th day of June 1990.

Appearances: No appearance by or on behalf of the importer. M. J. Wotherspoon on behalf of the Comptroller of Customs.

Decision

The publications in IND 20/90 and IND 25/90 were commercially imported through Auckland air freight on 12 March 1990 and 19 February 1990 respectively and seized by the Collector of Customs. The importer having

subsequently disputed forfeiture of the publications they were referred to the Tribunal for classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Although there was no appearance by or on behalf of the importer a detailed written submission was received from Brian Cheeseman on behalf of the importer and intended distributor, Waverley International 1988 Limited of Auckland. In his submission, while conceding that the magazines in these 2 applications primarily contain single and multiple model scenes, with what he described as "a suggestion of sexual intimacy", Mr Cheeseman argued nevertheless that they should all be given an R18 classification. Mr Cheeseman pointed to the non-violent nature of these publications and that in the great majority of them, that there was no actual explicit sexual connection, whether genital or oral. In the very few magazines where it was obvious that manual, oral or genital connection was occurring, Mr Cheeseman submitted that the offending areas had been blanked out. In addition to seeking an R18 classification for all the magazines in these 2 applications Mr Cheeseman requested, where there were sufficient issues, that a serial restriction order under section 15A of the Act be made.

The publications before the Tribunal in these 2 applications are many and varied with the principal common link being that they are all to a greater or lesser degree sexually explicit and focused at the heterosexual market. In the Tribunal's finding 3 magazines justified an age restriction of 16 years, another 3 justified an age restriction of 18 years with the remainder, the greater majority, justifying an unconditionally indecent classification. Accordingly the magazines are sublisted below in respect of those particular classifications.

Category A

The Tribunal finds that the following publications contain material which would be injurious to younger readers and classifies each as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years:

Category C

The Tribunal classifies the following publications as unconditionally indecent. A significant number of the magazines justify an unconditionally indecent classification because of the totality of their indecent content, others because they contain a significant number of photographs which clearly justify the classification, others because they contain a mixture of various types of material, all of which are clearly in the view of the Tribunal injurious to the public good, while others are so classified because of perhaps only 1 or 2 sequences.

Although references are made but infrequently by the Tribunal to the "matters to be taken into consideration by a Tribunal or Court" being the matters referred to under section 11 of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, the provisions of that section are nevertheless constantly before the Tribunal during its consideration of all the material which comes before it. In so far as the category C magazines are concerned the Tribunal has certainly looked at:

A The dominant effect of the book.

- B The literary or artistic merit or other special characteristics of the book.
- C The classes of persons or age groups to or amongst whom the book is intended or is likely to be published, etc.
- D The price of the publication.
- E Whether any person is likely to be corrupted by reading the book.
- F Whether there is an honest purpose and an honest thread of thought in the publication.

The publications under category C do not measure well when it comes to applying those matters of consideration to them. We do not propose setting out detail by detail the reasons why each of these publications is in the Tribunal's findings injurious to the public good.

Suffice to say that all the magazines in category C, to a greater or lesser extent, contain one or more of the following elements:

- multiple model scenes showing acts of sexual intimacy between the model involved
- nude or mainly nude females with an overly explicit display of the open vagina of the models; an almost total concentration in the pictorial sequences on the genitalia
- explicit photographs of female models engaging in explicit sexual activities
- genital manipulation and masturbation
- oral sex and lesbian activity.

In past decisions of the Tribunal, too numerous to require mention, the inclusion of any one alone (to a significant degree) of the above elements resulted in a classification of unconditional indecency.

Local Water Conservation (Makuri River) Notice 1990

Pursuant to section 20H (c) of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 and the direction from the Planning Tribunal to make a local conservation notice in respect of the Makuri River, the council hereby makes a notice as directed by the Planning Tribunal as follows:

1. Title and Commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Local Water Conservation (Makuri River) Notice 1990.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—

“Act” means the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967.

“River” means the Makuri River itself from its source (approximate map reference NZMS 260 Sheet U24 737804 and 734804) to its confluence with the Tiraumea River (approximate map reference NZMS 260 Sheet T24 568772), together with all of its tributaries, including the Makuri-iti River.

“River flow” means for any given point on the river:

- the instantaneous flow occurring at that point; plus
- the sum of abstractions from the river and its tributaries upstream of that given point expressed as an instantaneous flow.

3. Characteristics and Features to be Protected—It is hereby declared that the river includes:

- scenic characteristics of regional significance; and
- recreational, fisheries, and wildlife habitat features of regional significance.

4. Rate of Flow of Natural Water—Because of the characteristic and features specified in clause 3 of this order, the rate of flow of natural water to be retained at any point in the river shall be not less than 95 percent of the river flow at that point.

5. Right to Dam not to be Granted—A right to dam the main stem of the Makuri River or the Makuri-iti Stream shall not be granted under section 21 of the Act, nor shall any right be granted which has the effect of impounding water in them or altering their natural flow regime.

6. Water Rights—(1) A water right under section 21 of the Act may not be granted by the Regional Water Board and a general authorisation under section 22 of the Act may not be made by the Regional Water Board in respect of the river if the combined effect of the grant or authorisation and of existing rights would be that the provisions of this order cannot remain without change or variation.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in this order, it shall be lawful for water rights to be granted, and general authorisations to be made, in respect of the river for the purposes of:

- research into, and enhancement of, fisheries and wildlife habitats; or
- mitigation of the effects of flooding and erosion throughout the catchment under the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941; or
- the maintenance of roads, bridges, and other public utilities; or
- the extraction of gravel, provided no such extraction takes place in the channel of the river, and the water quality requirements of clause 6 (4) are met.

(3) Nothing in this order shall limit the effect of the second proviso to section 21 (1) of the Act relating to the use of water for domestic needs, for the needs of animals, and for or in connection with fire fighting purposes.

(4) In granting any rights under section 21 of the Act or making a general authorisation under section 22 of the Act, the Regional Water Board shall ensure that after reasonable mixing:

(a) the natural water temperature of the river shall not be changed by more than 3 degrees Celsius;

(b) the acidity or alkalinity of the water as measured by the pH shall be within the natural range and shall not be changed by more than 1.0 unit;

(c) the water shall not be so tainted or contain toxic substances so as to be unsuitable for consumption by farm animals;

(d) the water shall not emit an objectionable odour;

(e) there shall be no adverse effect on the aquatic community attributable to pollutants;

(f) aquatic organisms shall not be rendered unsuitable for

human consumption by accumulation of excessive concentrations of pollutants;

(g) the natural colour and clarity of the waters shall not be changed to a conspicuous extent;

(h) there shall be no visible oil or grease films or conspicuous floating or suspended waste materials;

(i) the oxygen content in solution in the river shall not be reduced below 6 milligrams per litre;

(j) there shall be no undesirable biological growths attributable to pollutants.

(5) Nothing in this order shall prevent the renewal of any water right or general authorisation which is current on the commencement of this order.
