Summary of Bills Introduced

Immigration Amendment

This Bill amends the Immigration Act 1987, which provides the legal framework for the operation of the Government's immigration policy. The Bill proposes a number of specific amendments in major areas including:

- (a) The promulgation of Government policy in relation to residence visas and permits, and the right to appeal to an independent Resident Appeal Authority where a decision to refuse a residence visa or permit is not in accordance with that policy;
- (b) A new removal order procedure to replace the current removal warrants, with the right of appeal to an independent Removal Review Authority to cancel a removal order;
- (c) The introduction of the new categories of limited visa and limited permit for persons coming to New Zealand for a limited short term purpose, and a new transit visa for transit passengers; and
- (d) Special procedures for persons whose security status cannot be immediately ascertained on their arrival in New Zealand.

There are also many general amendments to ensure that persons who have not complied with the basic requirements of the Act, cannot use legal proceedings provided under the Act for the purpose of delay rather than for the purpose of substantive consideration of their case.

Companies (Ancillary Provisions)

This Bill contains a number of measures relating to the reform of company law.

(a) It seeks to amend the Companies Act 1955 and to apply a number of the reforms contained in the Companies Bill (such as those relating to directors' duties, liquidations and shareholder remedies) to existing companies and to align the provisions

of both the Companies Bill and the 1955 Act on a number of matters such as name changes, the "indoor management rule", the formation of contracts, and the penalties for offences.

- (b) The Bill will require all existing companies to reregister under Part II of the Companies Bill by the end of the 3 year transition period and sets out the procedure to be followed in doing so.
- (c) The Bill contains a number of provisions dealing with receiverships and will apply to receiverships of existing companies, companies incorporated or registered under the new Companies Bill as well as to receiverships to other persons.
- (d) The Bill seeks to re-enact, with modifications, the present Part XIII of the 1955 Act relating to insurance companies. These provisions relate to minimum capital requirements, insurance proposals that contain applications for shares, the investigation of the affairs of insurance companies, and liquidation.
- (e) The Bill seeks to re-enact the provisions of the Companies Amendment Act 1964 relating to flat and office owning companies as an amendment to the Land Transfer Act 1952 and extends those provisions to companies incorporated or registered under the new Companies Bill.
- (f) It also seeks to re-enact the provisions of Part IV of the 1955 Act relating to the registration of company charges to companies incorporated or registered under the Companies Bill 1990.
- (g) Finally, the Bill provides for the repeal of the 1955 Act with effect from 31 December 1994. The 1955 Act will, however, continue to apply in respect of existing windings up and liquidations and to existing companies that have applied to be reregistered or that have had the time for applying to be reregistered extended.

Income Tax Act 1976

Accrual Determinations—Fee Setting

Background

Regulations 3 (1) and 11 (1) of the Income Tax (Determinations) Regulations 1987 require that fees be charged for accrual regime determinations made in terms of section 64E (1) of the Income Tax Act 1976. Under section 64E (1) the Commissioner is empowered to determine certain matters relating to financial arrangements. A taxpayer may wish to apply for a determination in order to ascertain the tax treatment for a particular financial arrangement.

The criteria for setting these fees are set out in Regulations 11 (2) and 11 (3). The Commissioner was not obliged to set fees for the first two years that the Regulations were in force. That time has now lapsed.

Policy—Announcement

For the year beginning 1 July 1991 the fees are as follows:

Application Fee (non-refundable) \$100.

Processing Fee (per hour) (that is per hour spent directly processing the application) \$90.

These fees are stated on a GST inclusive basis.

Regulation 13 does allow the Commissioner to waive fees, in exceptional circumstances, either in full or in part.

Traffic Regulations 1976

Approval of Green Lights on Rescue Vehicles

Pursuant to regulation 88 of the Traffic Regulations 1976, approval is hereby granted, for the purpose of subclause (8) of Regulation 67 of the Traffic Regulations 1976, for the use of not more than two green flashing or revolving lights, on specified vehicles, as described in the Schedule of this notice, provided those vehicles comply with the conditions below. This approval expires on the 31st day of August 1992.

Schedule

Specified vehicles that are owned by The Life Flight Trust, Wellington and Auckland Regional Rescue Helicopter Trust, and are equipped and dedicated for emergency rescue operations as listed in this schedule:

The Life Flight Trust, Wellington

Vehicle make: Toyota; Registration number: PU5968

Auckland Regional Rescue Helicopter Trust

Vehicle make: Mazda 4x4; Registration number: NI8384 Vehicle make: Ford 4x4; Registration number: 4BYE4

Conditions:

- 1. The use of these lights DO NOT entitle the driver to disregard existing Traffic Regulations. The intention of this equipment is to inform motorists that this is an emergency vehicle, responding to an emergency.
- 2. Shall prominently display the words RESCUE, both sides and across the rear, in letters not less than 100mm high. With the word RESCUE alongside its mirror image, displayed to the front, in letters not less than 100mm high and the spread of each word not be less than 500mm.
- 3. This approval is for a trial period only, which will expire on the 31st August 1992. Any permanent approval may vary, including the requirement for standard vehicle colours, and drivers to attend an advanced driving course, approved for this purpose.
- 4. This approval is only valid while the above vehicles are owned by The Life Flight Trust, Wellington or the Auckland Regional Rescue Helicopter Trust, as listed in the above schedule, and are equipped and dedicated for emergency rescue work.
- 5. A copy of this approval must be carried in the vehicle at all times.

- 3. This system *shall incorporate* an override system, that will immediately de-activate the headlamp flashing system as soon as the standard vehicle headlamp switch is activated.
- 4. When this system is in operation the headlamps *shall* alternately flash at a rate of not less than 60 or more than 120 flashes per minute.
- 5. This system is approved for emergency response vehicles only, and *must* be removed from the vehicle when the vehicle is withdrawn from this service.

Hazardous Substances—Modifications to Prescribed Standard Notice

Notice

The "prescribed standard" referred to in section 70F (3) (b) (c) and (d) of the Transport Act 1962, shall be the standard described in the First Schedule as modified by the Second Schedule.

First Schedule

Prescribed Standard

New Zealand Standard 5433:1988 entitled Code Of Practice For The Transport Of Hazardous Substances On Land, as modified by the Hazardous Substances-Modifications to Prescribed Standard Notice, signed on the 22nd day of January 1991*.

Second Schedule

The prescribed standard shall be modified in section 4.2.1.1 by adding the words after subclause (c):

"(d) Any container of a capacity less than 5 kg or 5 litres containing class 9 substances."

The prescribed standard shall be modified in Table 3 by deleting the line beginning with "Class 9", and by inserting a line before the line beginning with "Class 8":

"Class 9-Miscellaneous dangerous substances"

The prescribed standard shall be modified in section 8.1 by deleting the words "6 and 8" and replacing with the words "6, 8 and 9".

The prescribed standard shall be modified in section 10.1 by deleting the line beginning with "Calcium oxide". The prescribed standard shall be modified in section 10.2 by deleting the line beginning with "1910".

Trustees' Report for the Period Ended 31 March 1991

Objectives of the Trust: To receive income and allocate such income for charitable, cultural, philanthropic, recreational and other purposes, being purposes beneficial to the community principally in the Bay of Plenty area.

Policies and Structure of the Trust: A charitable trust designed to administer capital and distribute income for charitable purposes in the Bay of Plenty area.

Activities of the Trust: Increased dividends resulting from the improved profit of Trust Bank New Zealand Ltd. enabled the trust to make a substantial increase in the number and value of donations to community organisations. For the first time a number of organisations involved in special projects were identified as being worthy of extra attention, and these received major grants. In all, a total of \$397,192 was distributed.

The Ray Dillon Memorial Scholarship was also established by the trust during the year. This project provides financial assistance each year to persons with disabilities or handicaps and who are engaged in some form of tertiary education. The first scholarships were awarded in December 1990.

Review of Results and Financial Position of the Trust: Dividends of \$635,100 were received from Trust Bank New Zealand Ltd. during the year, of which \$397,192 was distributed by way of donations. The remainder has been invested for the time being, thus consolidating the trust's position and providing an operating income. Operating costs amounted to \$43,447, and the net profit of \$240,557 was transferred to the accumulated trust fund. At 31 March 1991 this stood at \$9,400,777.

Assets of the trust include 7.5 million shares in Trust Bank New Zealand Ltd. valued at their cost of \$9,026,000, plus term deposits and Government stock amounting to \$350,797.
