Summary of Bills Introduced*Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Amendment*

This Bill seeks to amend the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934 and will enable—

- (a) Money judgments given by certain inferior Courts to be enforced in New Zealand; and
- (b) Non-money judgments of superior Courts and certain inferior Courts to be enforced in New Zealand; and
- (c) Judgments given in superior and inferior Courts of Australia under which tax or other similar charges are payable to be enforced in New Zealand.

Vehicle Recovery Services

Clause 2 abolishes the rule of law known as *distress damage feasant* so far as it applies to motor vehicles. It will no longer be lawful to detain a motor vehicle as a condition of the payment of damages for an injury alleged to have been caused by the vehicle. It will be open to owners of land to recover the towage fees, and any other expenses and damages they have suffered from illegal parking, by taking action in the District Court or the Disputes Tribunal.

Clause 3 provides for maximum fees to be prescribed in respect of towing. This will bring the fees charged for towing from private property under control in the way that fees charged for towing from roads are already controlled. The fee is payable by the owner of the vehicle to the owner of the land or building and may be recovered in the Small Claims Tribunal. The owner of the land or building cannot assign the right to recover the fee.

Clause 4 creates offences. The first relates to charging in excess of the prescribed towage fee. The second relates to detaining a motor vehicle which has been towed away from private property.

Clause 5 will require an individual authority for each separate tow undertaken by a vehicle recovery service in place of the present rules whereby a vehicle recovery service may be given a general authority by the owner of land to tow vehicles away from that land.

Clause 6 enables complaints about the operations of vehicle recovery services to be made to the Ministry of Transport which is required to record them and make them available for public inspection. This replaces the present system whereby complaints are made to the vehicle recovery service itself.

Exceptional Service Honour (Posthumous Recognition)

This Private Member's Bill seeks to enable the honouring of those New Zealanders who have shown exceptional service to their country but were not given due recognition for their achievements during their lifetime.

Berryfruit Levy Act 1967

Fixing Rates of the Berryfruit Levy (Notice No. 5119; Ag. 4/54/8)

1. Pursuant to section 4 of the Berryfruit Levy Act 1967, having regard to the recommendations of the New Zealand Berryfruit Growers Federation (Inc), I hereby fix the rates of annual levy to be paid by berryfruit growers in respect of their gardens, to the Federation.

<i>Area of Garden</i>	<i>Amount of Levy (\$) (including GST)</i>
Less than 250 square metres or 2,000 strawberry plants, whichever is smaller	Nil
250 square metres or 2,000 strawberry plants, whichever is smallest, to 8,000 square metres	191.25
Over 8,000 square metres	343.13

These rates of annual levy come into effect 14 days after the date of notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Pursuant to section 7 of the Berryfruit Levy Act 1967, having regard to the recommendations of the New Zealand Berryfruit Growers Federation (Inc), I hereby fix:

(a) a special levy equal to 2.25 cents per kilogram (including GST) of blackcurrants sold for export or processing purposes. This levy is to be paid by blackcurrant growers and is to be used for the purposes of promotion, research, and market development.

The manner of payment and collection of such levy shall be by deduction by exporters, processors, co-operatives, or dealers from the payments at the first point of sale of the blackcurrants being levied, and forwarded to:

The New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority, P.O. Box 1417, Wellington;

(b) a special levy equal to 22.5 cents per kilogram (including GST) on all blueberries sold for fresh export purposes and 4.5 cents per kilogram (including GST) on all blueberries sold for frozen export purposes. This levy is to be used for the administration, research and promotion of the blueberry

industry. Of these two levies, 16.875 cents of the fresh export levy and 3.375 cents of the frozen export levy is to be used by the Blueberry Export Council, and 5.625 cents of the fresh export levy and 1.125 cents of the frozen export levy is to be used by the New Zealand Blueberry Growers Association. (All levies are GST inclusive.)

The manner of payment and collection of the blueberry levies is to be by the exporter and forwarded to:

Electrical Wiring Regulations 1976

“Declared Articles” Under Regulation 18 (2) of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1976

I, Maurice John Belgrave, Secretary of Commerce, acting pursuant to regulation 18 (2) of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1976 (as amended by regulation 4 of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 6) hereby declare that the following types of electrical apparatus and materials are “declared articles” requiring approval before being offered for sale in New Zealand.

1. Electric Fence Energisers, being appliances that—

(a) Are intended for connection to a low or medium voltage supply; and

(b) Are designed to regulate and control the supply of electrical energy to an electric fence.

2. Portable Lighting fittings, being fittings that—

(a) Are intended for illuminating, decorative or advertising purposes;

(b) Are intended for connection by means of a flexible cord;

(c) Are not intended to be permanently fixed in position;

(d) May be placed on a horizontal surface, or attached by spring clamp or other means to any vertical or inclined surface; and

(e) Includes hand held units intended for photographic or video filming purposes—

but do not include—

(f) Portable lighting fittings of wood, glass, ceramic, marble or thermosetting insulating material that:

(i) May support the lampholder but that do not enclose the lamp;

(ii) Are each provided with one approved all insulated lampholder;

(iii) Have no exposed metal;

(iv) Are fitted with an approved flexible cord wired directly to the lampholder; and

(v) Have no switch other than that which may be in the lampholder or a cord in line switch.

3. Bayonet Lampholders, being devices that—

(a) Are designed to operate at low voltage;

(b) Are intended to accommodate a lamp having a bayonet cap of 15 mm or 22 mm nominal diameters—

but do not include lampholders that—

(c) Are manufactured specifically for and incorporated within an electrical appliance; or

(d) Are manufactured for incorporation within industrial equipment such as a switchboard or control panel.

4. Edison Screw Lampholders, being devices that—

(a) Are designed to operate at low voltage; and

(b) Are intended to accommodate a lamp having an Edison Screw cap of either 14 mm or 27 mm nominal outside diameters—

but do not include lampholders that—

(c) Are manufactured specifically for and incorporated within an electrical appliance; or

(d) Are manufactured for incorporating within industrial equipment such as a switchboard or control panel.

5. Flexible Cords, being cables that—

(a) Come within the scope of Australian Standard (AS) 3191;

(b) Have no conductor larger than 4 mm²;

(c) Have one, two, three, four or five cores assembled together with or without filler or protective covering; and

(d) The insulation and any fillings and coverings are such as to afford flexibility, and the conductors are stranded.

6. Cord-line Switches, being devices that—

(a) Are intended for connection in flexible cords; and

(b) Can be used to manually open or close an electrical circuit—

but do not include—

(c) Switches connected at the end of flexible cords, such as pendant switches or bell pushes.

7. Electric Room Heaters, being appliances that—

(a) Are intended for household and similar use;

(b) Incorporate a heating unit; and

(c) Are designed for heating the atmosphere in their immediate vicinity by the emission of heat by radiation, convection, or forced circulation of heated air, or any combination thereof—

but do not include—

(d) Air conditioning appliances that incorporate refrigeration devices with condensing units which may incorporate heating units;

(e) Heating systems that are intended to heat the atmosphere of rooms primarily by raising the temperature of any floor, wall, or ceiling area;

(f) Under carpet heating systems; or

(g) Special appliances that are used solely for the application of heat to specific materials or substances.

8. Portable Residual Current Devices, being devices that—

(a) Isolate the supply in the event of a current flow to earth in a protected circuit in excess of a predetermined level;

(b) Have a single facility for connection to low voltage supply by means of a plug; and

(c) Incorporate one or more socket-outlets.

9. Salt Water Electrolytic Pool Chlorinators, being devices that—

(a) Are intended for connection to a low voltage supply; and

(b) Are intended for the purification of pool water by electrolysis action on Sodium Chloride.

10. Touch Dimmers, being devices that—

(a) Are electrically operated switches for direct or indirect operation of lamp circuits;

(b) Utilise direct or indirect contact of a person with live parts for its operation; and

(c) Are for direct or indirect regulation of the brightness of lamps or the speed of motors.

11. Instantaneous Water Heaters for Household or similar use, being devices that—

(a) Are intended for heating water while it flows through the appliances, to a temperature below the boiling point of the water—

but do not include—

(b) Instantaneous water heaters designed exclusively for industrial purposes, or that are in locations where special conditions prevail, such as corrosive or explosive atmospheres; or

(c) Storage water heaters.

The List of Declared Articles, published in the *Gazette* of 28 September 1989 at pages 4578–4579, is hereby revoked.
