#### Business Development Boards Act 1991

##### The Business Development Boards Order 1991

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 16th day of December 1991

THE HON. W. F. BIRCH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 4 of the Business Development Boards Act 1991, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### Order

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Business Development Boards Order 1991.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of February 1992.

**2. Establishment of Aorangi Business Development Board**—(1) There is hereby established a Board called the Aorangi Business Development Board.

(2) The region for which the Aorangi Business Development Board is established comprises—

(a) The district known as "The Ashburton District", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18088 deposited

with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(b) The district known as "The Mackenzie District", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18101 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(c) The district known as "The Timaru District", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18094 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(d) The district known as "The Waimate District", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18106 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(e) That part of the district known as "The Waitaki District", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 23106 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Otago Land District, that falls within the region known as "The Canterbury Region", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18043 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District.

**3. Establishment of Auckland Business Development Board**—(1) There is hereby established a Board called the Auckland Business Development Board.

(2) The region for which the Auckland Business Development Board is established comprises the region known as "The Auckland Region", being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 63484 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the North Auckland Land District.

**4. Establishment of Bay of Plenty Business Development Board**—(1) There is hereby established a Board called the Bay of Plenty Business Development Board.

(2) The region for which the Bay of Plenty Business Development Board is established comprises—

(a) The region known as “The Bay of Plenty Region”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 58080 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the South Auckland Land District excluding The Waihi Beach Ward, being the area delineated on S.O. (b) That part of the district known as “The Rotorua District”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 58044 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the South Auckland Land District, that falls outside the region specified in paragraph (a) of this subclause.

**5. Establishment of Canterbury Business Development Board**—(1) There is hereby established a Board called the Canterbury Business Development Board.

(2) The region for which the Canterbury Business Development Board is established comprises—

(a) The district known as “The Banks Peninsula District”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18084 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(b) The district known as “The Christchurch City”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18071 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(c) That part of the district known as “The Hurunui District”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18052 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District, that falls within the region known as “The Canterbury Region”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18043 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(d) The district known as “The Selwyn District”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18064 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District; and

(e) The district known as “The Waimakariri District”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 18059 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Canterbury Land District.

**6. Establishment of East Coast Business Development Board**—(1) There is hereby established a Board called the East Coast Business Development Board.

(2) The region for which the East Coast Business Development Board is established comprises the region known as “The Gisborne Region”, being the area delineated on S.O. Plan No. 8378 deposited with the Chief Surveyor of the Gisborne Land District.

## Research, Science and Technology

### Foundation for Research Science and Technology Act 1990

#### Statement of Science Priorities for the 1992/93 Financial Year

To the Chairman of the Foundation for Research Science and Technology.

I am required under the Foundation Act 1990 to "... advise the Foundation of the priorities that the Foundation shall adhere to in carrying out its functions..." in the allocation of funds for the production of public good science outputs.

I am conveying preliminary advice to you on science priorities by means of this letter and its 7 annexes.

#### Allocation of Funds Across Outputs

That part of the Public Good Science Fund (PGSF) allocated by the Foundation has been divided into 40 categories or "outputs". The Foundation is required to allocate funding to research providers in accordance with this output framework.

Annex 1 lists the 40 outputs and shows the indicative funding the Government wishes to allocate to each output in the 1992/93 financial year. Funding levels are expressed as a percentage of that part of the total PGSF allocated by the Foundation. As further guidance these have been multiplied by the level of the PGSF for the 1991/92 financial year, after technical adjustments and removal of Non-Specific Output Funding. The total amount of that part of the PGSF to be allocated by the Foundation for the 1992/93 financial year is

not yet known but will not be less than the adjusted figure for 1991/92.

The Foundation will be allowed discretion in the allocation of funding to outputs, so that you will be able to take account of the quality of research proposals in your deliberations. The degree of this discretion is identified in Annex 2. The intention of the Nil lower bound is to ensure that the Foundation has full discretion to fund only those proposals which it consider to be of adequate quality. The principal intention of the upper bound of 105% is to enable full programmes to be funded at the margin ie to avoid having to fund parts of programmes because of the funding limit.

#### Priority Research Themes

I wish to nominate priority research themes within single outputs and across several outputs. Themes have been nominated for all but outputs 36, 37, 38, 39 and 40, and are shown in Annex 3.

Themes in two broad areas of Government concern are also listed. These relate to Climate Change and the Control of Possums and the Threat of Bovine Tuberculosis.

These cross-output themes are also the subject of National Science Strategies which are currently being considered by Committees which I have appointed for this purpose. I invite the Foundation to consider any future relevant material produced by the National Science Strategy Committees, and take this information into account during the selection of programmes.

The Government is nominating themes to indicate areas of high research relevance. Themes do not, however encompass everything that should be funded in an output and neither should themes be allowed to override the quality measure of individual research proposals.

#### Long-Term Programme Funding

I wish to emphasize the Government's recognition of the long term nature of science and the necessity to fund appropriate programmes on a longer term basis. Therefore I am allowing greater discretion to the Foundation in the proportion of that part of the PGSF allocated by the Foundation that can be committed to funding programmes for more than one year. These guidelines are shown in Annex 4.

#### Criteria for the Selection of Research Proposals

The selection of programmes must show a balance between the strategic importance of the research and its scientific quality. To achieve this, I invite the Foundation to apply the selection criteria set out in Annex 5.

#### Technology Transfer

I consider the transfer of technology derived from the research and development funded through the Public Good Science Fund to be an important consideration in every research proposal. It is only through the effective transfer, adoption and exploitation of the results of research and development that the outcomes desired by the Government for New Zealand can be achieved.

The method I wish the Foundation to apply to the treatment of technology transfer is identified in Annex 6. It is proposed that the decisions on technology transfer should be applied on a case by case basis by the Foundation without quantitative guidelines.

#### Outcomes Desired by Government

The Government also wishes to restate previously agreed outcomes which it wishes its research expenditure in that part of the Public Good Science Fund allocated by the Foundation, to contribute to. These outcomes form an important framework within which various science related decisions can be made, including the selection of programmes for funding. The list of outcomes is shown in Annex 7.

Please ensure that this statement of science priorities is

conveyed to potential research programme proposers so that it is given maximum effect in the funding round.

- a The nutritional, physiological and genetic bases for, and manipulation of, the synthesis of milk constituents; emphasising aspects that enhance overseas earnings through meeting the needs of the processing sector and consumers.
- b The nutritional, physiological, and genetic bases for pest and disease control of particular or unique importance to dairy cattle in New Zealand; emphasising genetic, biological and integrated control solutions and areas that impact on overseas earnings.
- c The nutritional, physiological and genetic bases of dairy cattle reproduction and methods of manipulation, including herd management, that enhance the rate of dissemination and genetic gain of productivity related traits.
- d Strategic research into development of methods for measuring, harvesting and transporting high quality milk and milk constituents.
- e The development of dairy production systems which are biologically and physically sustainable, minimise adverse effects on the environment and maximise quality/consumer acceptance of dairy products.

*Output Class 4: Alternative Animal Species, Animal Products and Systems*

- a Product diversification through new animal species or animal products including the introduction, evaluation, production, market assessment and industry infrastructure requirements; identification of limitations to production and integration into existing systems.
- b The investigation of protocols and development of pest and disease control strategies for alternative animal species or new products from existing alternative species.
- c The nutritional, physiological and genetic bases for, and manipulation of, reproduction to enhance the rate of increase in numbers and desired genetic traits of new animal species.
- d The comparison of the nutrition, physiology, and animal health requirements of alternative animal species against existing animals, using the knowledge to develop techniques for manipulating the productive parameters of both classes of animal.

*Output Class 5: Generic Animals and Animal Production Systems*

- a The physiological and genetic bases of ruminant digestive processes and their manipulation, to improve efficiency of feed intake and utilisation, animal health and quality of animal products.
- b The physiological, genetic, aetiological, pathological and epidemiological bases for the control of pan ruminant species pests and diseases; emphasising those of particular or unique importance to New Zealand, including their impact on the health of New Zealand citizens and the acceptability of animal products.
- c Ruminant reproduction and methods of manipulation that enhance the rate of dissemination and genetic gain of productivity related traits; including the development of integrated systems for the genetic improvement of animals incorporating genetic typing and phenotypic performance, emphasising aspects and traits that will enhance overseas earnings.
- d The physiological, genetic and behavioural bases of animal stress and welfare in relation to livestock management, and its impact on animal productivity and product quality.
- e The development of integrated animal production systems which are biologically and physically sustainable, minimise adverse effects on the environment and maximise quality/consumer acceptance of animal products.

*Output Class 6: Forages and Forage Management Practices*

- a The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for, and manipulation of, forage plants for ruminants; emphasising methods of manipulation of plant genetic traits that improve efficiency of foraging strategy, utilisation, intake and the consequent quality of animal products.
- b The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for weed, pest and disease control; emphasising genetic, biological and integrated control solutions that are environmentally compatible and produce residue free products.
- c The development of environmentally compatible methods of improvement and protection of the pastoral soil resource and nutrient status, to promote sustainable forage growth, forage quality, animal performance and health.
- d The ecological bases of forage production systems particularly in stressed environments; emphasising biologically and physically sustainable management strategies.
- e The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for, and manipulation of, forage plant development and growth; emphasising responses to climatic stresses.

*Output Class 7: Horticultural Crops and Management Practices.*

- a Product differentiation by development of fruit and vegetable products and food ingredients through genetic means; emphasising consumer needs for high quality fresh or processed products which give New Zealand industry a competitive advantage.
- b The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for pre-harvest weed, pest and disease prediction, prevention, resistance and management; emphasising genetic, biological and integrated control solutions and areas that impact on overseas earnings.
- c Product diversification by the introduction, evaluation, production and market assessment of new crops which provide new export opportunities for New Zealand.
- d The physiological and genetic bases of pre-harvest fruit and vegetable plant growth and development, and interactions with the environment; emphasising processes which influence yield stability and product quality.
- e The development of horticultural and vegetable production systems which are biologically and physically sustainable, minimise adverse effects on the environment and maximise quality/consumer acceptance of products.

*Output Class 8: Arable Crops, Other Plants and Management Practices*

- a The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for weed, pest and disease prediction, prevention, resistance and management; emphasising genetic, biological and integrated control solutions which impact on overseas earnings and environmental and health issues.
- b The development, through genetic manipulation, of plants with new characteristics that provide novel and distinctive quality products for domestic and overseas markets.
- c The development, evaluation and management of plants suitable for soil conservation and land rehabilitation in depleted and degraded lands; emphasising multipurpose utilisation options and sustainable management.
- d The physiological, ecological and genetic bases of plant growth and development, and interactions with the climate and within stressed environments; emphasising processes which influence yield stability and/or product quality.
- e The development of environmentally sustainable methods for improvement and protection of the soil resource and its nutrient status; including land use diversification through the introduction and production of new plants and their products for domestic and international markets.

*Output Class 9: Trees and Plantation Management Systems*

- a The physiological, ecological and genetic bases for weed, pest and disease prediction, management and prevention of particular or unique importance to plantation forestry; emphasising genetic, biological and integrated control solutions.
- b The impacts of plantation forestry on the on-site and off-site environment; emphasising harvesting impacts and sustainable land management.
- c The nutritional, physiological and genetic bases for, and manipulation of, tree and wood characteristics, including propagation and early tree growth; emphasising aspects that enhance overseas earnings through meeting the needs of the processing sector and consumers.
- d The assessment of targeted special purpose tree species, and species alternative to radiata pine, to meet market needs.
- e The understanding of human and social factors that impact on the recruitment, skill base and retention of people in forestry; emphasising harvesting needs.

*Output Class 10: Fisheries*

- a Identification and description of the relevant biological parameters of aquatic species having newly identified potential for commercial exploitation.
- b Evaluation of the interaction between fish stocks, other species and biological and physical/chemical environments.
- c Evaluation and prediction of the impacts of human activity on aquatic habitats and communities of commercial significance, including the effects of introducing exotic and genetically modified species.
- d Evaluation and development of improved systems and processes for the aquaculture of species not yet under commercial cultivation.
- e Enhancement of the natural populations of harvested species through aquaculture and reseedling, including the use of biotechnology, genetic manipulation and selective breeding.
- f Identification and control of toxic aquatic organisms, diseases and parasites of commercial species, including the decontamination of harvested fish and shellfish.

Note: These themes refer only to the public good science fund component of Fisheries research. Significant amounts of operational research on the description and management of known marine species of commercial significance is carried out by MAF Fisheries, in support of the Quota Management System.

*Output Class 11: Meat, Meat Processing and Products*

- a The functional properties of meat and meat components, their interactions and performance as food and non-food ingredients for industrial and consumer use.
- b Seafood storage, handling, transport and processing that enhance fish species and products specific to New Zealand.
- c Meat and fish products in human health and nutrition, including therapeutic foods and food safety.
- d Strategic research to improve processing technologies for enhancing product quality and productivity to improve the viability of the meat industry.
- e The development of technologies to improve the efficiency and cost of storage, refrigeration and transport systems, emphasising energy efficiency.
- f By-product utilisation and waste recovery from meat and fish processing that enhances New Zealand's overseas earnings and develops sustainable waste management practices.

*Output Class 12: Dairy Processing, Storage Techniques and Products*

- a Strategic research into advanced processing technologies for modifying, processing, extracting and refining the components of milk.
- b The properties of, and factors that influence, dairy product and component composition and characteristics and their interaction in food systems; including flavour, functionality, colour and texture and other factors desired by consumers.
- c Human health and food safety aspects of dairy products; emphasising milkfat nutrition, the therapeutic and prophylactic uses of dairy products and milk components.
- d Strategic research into the development of new analytical techniques for quantifying the functional, nutritional and therapeutic properties and components of dairy products.
- e By-product utilisation and waste recovery from dairy processing that enhances New Zealand's overseas earnings and develops sustainable waste management practices.

*Output Class 13: Fruit, Crops and other Food and Beverage Processing and Products*

- a Post-harvest factors and their manipulation influencing ripening, senescence and quality of fresh fruit and vegetables in storage and under transportation.
- b Post-harvest disinfestation systems that are of quarantine importance for crops, horticultural and food exports and enhance the image of New Zealand products.
- c Underutilised raw material and waste utilisation that enhances New Zealand's overseas earnings and develops sustainable waste management practices.
- d Improved understanding of plant food components and their interaction in food and non-food systems so they may be manipulated to advantage; horticultural and food products in human health and nutrition, including food safety, emphasising export products.
- e Strategic research into the adaptation and exploitation of advanced processing technologies (eg flexible computer integrated manufacturing, intelligent processing equipment, systems management technologies) that add value and extend end uses which can be uniquely exploited by the New Zealand food and beverage processing sectors.

*Output Class 14: Fibre, Textile and Skin Processing and Products*

- a Strategic research into the physical and chemical properties of skins and natural fibres to better meet processing and consumer needs.
- b The development and application of advanced processing technologies which can be uniquely exploited by the New Zealand fibre, textile and skin sectors to add value and extend end uses.
- c The development of process technologies and products that are environmentally friendly and consumer acceptable; emphasising environmental protection, energy conservation, worker and consumer safety and minimum waste production.
- d Strategic research into the development of new measurement concepts and standards critical to improved product and process quality, production and marketing.

*Output Class 15: Wood and Paper Processing and Products*

- a Strategic research into the present and future quality and composition of the forest resource to identify likely processing options.
- b Strategic research into the development of new and improved solid wood products and processes, for radiata pine, that add value in New Zealand.
- c Strategic research into the development of new and improved pulp and paper products and processes, for radiata pine, that add value in New Zealand.
- d The development of processing technologies that minimise waste, energy usage and impact on the environment and produce environmentally acceptable products.
- e The development of new and improved technologies for higher value products from wood residues.

*Output Class 16: Materials, Industrial Processes and Products*

- a Development of processes for adding value to products from local feedstocks, including waste and minerals (excluding primary processing sector feedstocks).
- b New coating and surface treatment technologies to extend the service life of materials, components, plant and structures.

*Output Class 17: Engineering Processes, Systems and Products*

- a The development of flexible manufacturing processes, systems and products, appropriate to the scale of New Zealand industry, which allow quick cost-effective adaptation to changing inputs and consumer needs.
- b The development of processes, systems and products to improve reliability, availability (up time) and the productive life of products and processing plant.
- c Processes and systems for improving productivity, including appropriate quantitative quality measurements.

*Output Class 18: Computing and Electronic, Communication and Instrumentation Processes, Systems and Products.*

- a New and improved sensors and sensing technologies including biosensors; especially for use in manufacturing, processing and environmental monitoring.
- b New and improved signal processing for industrial control and automation.
- c New and improved processes, systems, and products for automated or precise inspection.
- d New and improved processes, systems and products for the moderation of energy consumption in industry.

*Output Class 19: Construction*

- a New and improved products, processes and systems that minimise the lifetime cost of building and construction in New Zealand.
- b Architecture which minimises the use of energy in both the construction and use of buildings.
- c Products, processes and systems which improve indoor environments for living and working to enhance the health and efficiency of the buildings' occupants.
- d Products, processes and systems that improve building safety for occupants, including safety in the face of seismic hazards.
- e Identification of the factors the building and construction industry must consider when building for the changing population mix and distribution in New Zealand.
- f Improved management systems for building and construction processes.

*Output Class 20: Commercial and Trade Services*

- a Development of new information about international trading patterns and opportunities (including in services and tourism) and cultural and economic conditions relating to markets in countries of existing and potential new trading partners.
- b New and improved technologies and processes for improved managerial communication, problem solving and decision making in both quantitative and qualitative dimensions.
- c Development and implementation of new and improved processes, systems and products for measurement related to quality conformance and competitiveness in products and services.
- d Identification of economic, social and cultural factors which limit or enhance successful participation of identifiable groups in commerce and trade, particularly for groups which are currently under-represented.

*Output Class 21: Energy*

- a Investigation and development of energy sources, including waste products, which are safe and environmentally sustainable alternatives to traditional sources.
- b New and improved processes, systems and products for increased efficiency in the production, storage, conservation and use of energy, emphasising research into energy planning and the allocation of resources, and the reduction or mitigation of the environmental consequences of energy production and use.
- c Investigation, specification, quantification and development of information bases of indigenous energy reserves; efficient processes for accessing this information.

*Output Class 22: Transport*

- a Efficient and effective integration of the management of all modes of transport, both nationally and internationally.
- b Enhancement of safety in transport of people and goods.
- c Integration of transport planning into social, environmental and economic planning and processes in a changing society.
- d Development and adaptation of transport technologies specifically suited to New Zealand's unique transport features and requirements.
- e Accessible description and analysis of patterns and trends in New Zealand transport.

*Output Class 23: Information and Communication Services*

- a The adaptation and exploitation of existing and emerging information and communication technologies of particular relevance to New Zealand.
- b Development of new and improved processes, systems and products for maintaining privacy, security and confidentiality of information transmitted via electronic networks.

*Output Class 24: Urban and Rural Planning*

- a Integrated planning and resource management systems for social, economic and environmental conditions to ensure the sustainable development of human settlements.
- b Planning methodologies which both enable and respond to the adaptation of communities to environmental, economic and technological change; improved processes appropriate to New Zealand for participation by individuals and groups in planning and resource management.
- c Identification of natural and physical resources and their sustainable use within rural and urban areas.
- d Hazard mitigation in rural and urban areas, in both new and existing developments.

*Output Class 25: History, Society and Culture*

- a Description and analysis of the origins and relationship to Iwi development of Maori social, cultural, political and economic issues through to present times.
- b Description and analysis of the origins and development of the distinctive features of New Zealand society and culture, including those of its sub-groups and communities.
- c Description and analysis of the history and likely future of human settlement in New Zealand including the role of various groups in society and their interaction with each other, the natural environment, economic development and social change.
- d Description and analysis of demographic and social trends showing the changing nature of the New Zealand family and society as a whole.

*Output Class 26: Relationships and Wellbeing*

- a The inter-relationships between economic and social policy, with a particular focus on the impact of policy measures on the well-being of individuals, families and other social groups.
- b Description and analysis of present and likely future relationships between groups of different gender or cultural or ethnic origin.
- c Description and analysis of present and likely future patterns of income, work and leisure in a changing society, and their effect on relationships and well being.
- d Description and analysis of present and likely future factors contributing to the growth, development and integration into society of individuals, families and groups, emphasising those who are disabled or otherwise currently marginalised in New Zealand.
- e Models for improved social service provision in a changing society, and the socio-economic factors of importance to providing organisations.

*Output Class 27: Political and Economic Relationships*

- a Description and analysis of New Zealand labour force dynamics and workplace culture in their national and international context, with specific attention to structural adjustment, technological change, employment generation, industrial relations, changing workforce structure, immigration, quality of working life and equity of employment opportunity; the development and respective roles of the formal and informal economies, including the relationships between paid and unpaid work.
- b Description and analysis of New Zealand trade and investment patterns, market problems and opportunities within the framework of a rapidly-changing regional and global economy, with particular emphasis on emerging relationships with Asia.
- c Description and analysis of the characteristics and role of different public and private sector institutions including local, regional and national government, courts and the law, small business and transnational corporations, and their impact on economic development and performance and employment at local, regional and national levels.
- d Development of methodologies and systems for the accurate measurement of economic and social conditions and transactions; updated standards incorporating principles of performance and compliance, including integration with international standards.
- e Description and analysis of factors contributing to the development of an enterprise culture and competitive economy through New Zealand business.
- f Description and analysis of factors which limit or enhance representation and participation in democratic processes, including constitutional and accountability issues, by different ethnic, income and gender groups and the public at large, and human rights in principle and practice.

*Output Class 28: Education, Knowledge and Training*

- a Description and analysis of the process of skills formation in New Zealand (including analysis of the barriers to and opportunities for developing a highly skilled workforce) and development of training systems in the context of continuing economic and social change.
- b Development and evaluation of different models and the use of new technologies for the delivery of education and training leading to more effective learning and educational achievement among different groups in New Zealand.
- c Development of models for effective communication between different groups in New Zealand about the social, economic and cultural implications of science and technology, emphasising transfer of science and technology to sectors of primary application.

*Output Class 29: Environmental Protection*

- a Development of cross-linked systems integrating information on environmental quality and pollution, facilitating assessment of human impact on natural systems and processes and assisting the management and amelioration of such impacts.
- b Development of processes and systems for supporting decision-making incorporating economic (monetary and non-monetary) and social values, for environmental management, including sustainable management of New Zealand ecosystems at differing stages of artificial modification.
- c The identification, management and control of all forms of pollutants, waste products and other impacts of human activity not able to be attributed to specific other Output Classes, to reduce their negative effects on the environment using culturally appropriate methods.
- d Environmentally sensitive management and control of introduced pan-sectoral weeds, pests and diseases emphasising biotechnological, genetic, biological and integrated solutions.
- e Description and analysis of the economic, social and cultural aspects of environmental issues, including assessment of the changing environment and the impact of environmental policies and management.

*Output Class 30: Geological Structures, Processes and Resources*

- a Description and analysis of the structure and development of the New Zealand lithosphere and studies of crustal change, earth deformation, earthquakes and volcanism as manifestations of the plate boundary through New Zealand; emphasising the understanding of underlying processes and mechanisms.
- b Monitoring, characterisation and prediction of potentially hazardous natural environments and processes, to identify changes and their consequences for the purpose of minimising economic and social risks from natural hazards.
- c Improved understanding of the geological, geophysical and geochemical parameters that control the formation and distribution of potential resources, both onshore and offshore, to enable more effective and environmentally acceptable exploration and evaluation of the Earth's natural resources.
- d Description and analysis of the origins and evolutionary development of New Zealand's fossil flora and fauna emphasising their usefulness in determining age, environment and correlation of geological strata, and the timing of geological events.

*Output Class 31: Land Use, Flora and Fauna*

- a Development of integrated information bases on the properties, potentials and limitations of natural land resources and on the ecological, physiological and genetic characteristics of flora and fauna, particularly unique indigenous species; accessible, coordinated network systems enabling access to data bases.
- b Description and analysis of the properties, potentials, interactions, and limitations of natural land resources and natural and modified eco-systems and their biota; their interactions with other systems; improved environmental monitoring; the past and present impact of natural degradation or human intervention and their implications for present and future sustainable management of natural and physical resources.
- c Description and analysis of the adaptive ecology of introduced flora and fauna and their impact on indigenous biota, for purposes of management and evaluation of proposed future imports of organisms.
- d Classification and recording of inadequately researched groups of indigenous flora and fauna.
- e Description and analysis of biodiversity in indigenous ecosystems and the management requirements for effective maintenance of their genetic resources.

*Output Class 32: Marine and Fresh Waters*

- a Integrated, multidisciplinary studies of the key biological and physical processes taking place within the water environments of the New Zealand region including interactions with the atmosphere and land; energy flows between key biota; the relationships between primary productivity and new and recycled inorganic nutrients.
- b Description and analysis of the relationship between key environmental processes and human impacts, including the recovery of water-based ecosystems from pollution episodes and other effects.
- c The biosystematics and biodiversity of benthic organisms, particularly taxa which are abundant, speciose or ecologically significant.
- d Description and analysis of the hydrology and hydraulics of gravel-bed, braided river systems; including research predicting flood risk and mitigating flood damage.
- e Development of a national information resource compiling new and existing inventories of data on aquatic systems.

*Output Class 33: Climate and Atmosphere*

- a Description and analysis of stratospheric ozone and of other gases aimed at understanding the chemistry determining ozone concentrations in the atmosphere; ultraviolet measurement and analysis including detailed spectral measurements.
- b Description and analysis of sources, sinks, chemistry (including isotopic studies), physics and radiative effects of tropospheric gases, aerosols and clouds which contribute directly or indirectly to radiative forcing of the atmosphere.
- c Description and analysis of climate and weather dynamics and past climates (including paleoclimate research), and development and validation of climate and weather modelling techniques, aimed at describing and understanding past and present New Zealand and South Pacific climate and weather, and predicting future variations in atmospheric circulation.
- d The monitoring and recording of climate and the development of accessible databases containing high quality climate information.
- e Description and analysis of interactions between the atmosphere and land and sea surfaces, including the biosphere, with an emphasis on the impacts on the atmosphere.

*Output Class 34: Properties, Uses and Technologies for Space*

- a Maintenance, advancement and application of astronomical knowledge for the benefit of New Zealand's social and economic development.
- b Identification, maintenance, advancement and application of current and proposed space based projects to advance New Zealand's economic and environmental interests.

*Output Class 35: Antarctica*

- a Description and analysis of the physical properties, dynamics and chemical constituents of the Antarctic atmosphere, sea ice and ocean.
- b Description of the Antarctic pristine environmental state and the changes occurring in order to recognise, evaluate and predict local and global human impact.
- c Description and analysis of the history and structure of the Antarctic lithosphere and relationships to the other southern continents, particularly New Zealand.
- d Description and analysis of the Antarctic weather, climate and climate change in the recent and geological past.
- e Description and analysis of the biota and functioning of the ecosystems of the Antarctic.

Note: These themes apply from the 1993-94 funding round onwards.

**Cross-Output Themes***1. Control of Possums and the Threat of Bovine Tb*

- a The epidemiology of Tb in farmed and feral animal species and control of Tb through biological means.
- b The ecology of possums and other feral animals which may be vectors for Tb.
- c Development of systems for controlling the possum population in New Zealand emphasising biological control systems and toxins alternative to 1080.

*2. Climate Change**a Fundamental Climate Knowledge:*

- (i) improving understanding of physical and chemical processes and constituents in the atmosphere and oceans, including long term research, monitoring and modelling of atmospheric and climate variables; (output 33, although some work on oceans may fall within output 32)
- (ii) investigating interactions between the atmosphere and land and ocean surfaces including the biosphere; (various outputs)
- (iii) collection and use of instrumental, historical, and proxy data in the New Zealand, South Pacific and Antarctic Region to assess climate variability; (various outputs)
- (iv) collaboration in developing and validating computer models for predicting regional scale changes; (output 33)
- (v) trace gas budgets for radiatively active molecules and aerosols, including their sources and sinks in terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems and soil (output 33).

This work is a priority both nationally, regionally and globally, and priority should be given to those programmes which are part of larger efforts directed at increasing fundamental knowledge of climate change parameters, both locally and internationally. Fundamental climate knowledge is the basis for all climate change research.

*b Adaptation to Climate Change:*

- (i) impact studies, including sensitivity and adaptive responses of natural and managed ecosystems and responses by the agricultural, horticultural and forestry sectors; (various sector specific outputs)
- (ii) assessment and mitigation of climatically influenced hazards (various sector specific outputs).



Adaptation and impact studies are listed as a second priority because it is necessary to understand the likely nature of climate change, based on a better understanding of climate process and the impacts of rising levels of greenhouse gases to define adaptation and impact studies. Preference should be given to funding of broad, co-ordinated programmes aimed at increasing knowledge of the local situation.

Note: The Climate Change and Tb/Possum cross-output themes are the subjects of National Science Strategies. Committees representing these two areas have recently been formed. The scope and content of themes in these areas may change after further consideration by the relevant National Science Strategy Committee.

#### **Annex 4: Guidelines for Long-Term Funding Allocations**

The aggregate long term funding should not exceed 60% of that part of the Public Good Science Fund allocated by the Foundation (ie excluding NSOF) for 1992/93 only, and with no specific limit for each output class. Long term funding is considered as funding committed for more than one year.

#### **Annex 5: Criteria for the Selection of Research Proposals**

In selecting research proposals for funding, the Foundation should:

a ensure that the following pre-conditions are satisfied:

- i the proposal comprises public good science outputs as defined in the Foundation for Research, Science and Technology Act 1990,
- ii proposers supply all the information requested by the Foundation and Ministry of Research, Science and Technology, and associate the research with the correct output class.

b apply the following criteria;

- i the extent to which the research will produce benefits to New Zealand as identified in the Government outcomes for science
- ii the degree of scientific and technical merit
- iii the inclusion, where practicable and appropriate, of collaboration between research providers
- iv contribution to the fulfilment of the Government's priorities
- v the capability of the science provider to deliver the public good science outputs to the standards required
- vi relevance to indicative research strategies and topics developed as part of the National Science Strategy policy

#### **Annex 6: Technology Transfer**

For the 1992/93 funding round:

- i technology transfer associated with Public Good Science Fund programmes should be explicitly identified as a necessary component of each public good research programme supported by the Public Good Science Fund.
- ii programmes which are exclusively technology transfer and which do not contain a research component should not be eligible for funding from the Public Good Science Fund.
- iii technology transfer should be assessed on a case by case basis i.e. without quantitative guidelines.

#### **Annex 7: Outcomes for the Public Good Science Fund**

1. Stimulate economic growth which does not compromise New Zealand's environment, social development, available natural resources or international relations for future generations.
2. Improve New Zealand's export performance through increased understanding of international markets and the development of competitive strategies.

3. Stimulate greater innovation in New Zealand including workplace culture and business strategies.
4. Ensure that education and training systems provide the skills needed to meet evolving workforce requirements.
5. Add value to existing primary products.
6. Diversify into new primary products.
7. Increase the competitiveness of secondary industries through product innovation and the management of quality.
8. Develop new secondary industries around the primary production sector.
9. Increase the efficiency of secondary industries.
10. Manage and protect New Zealand's natural environment.
11. Increase efficiency and effectiveness in the delivery of business services (including tourism), goods and utilities.
12. Increase the efficiency and effectiveness of transportation and storage systems.
13. Increase the effectiveness of communication and information systems to meet commercial, governmental, scientific, social and cultural requirements.
14. Increase efficiency in the use of energy sources and develop alternative sources.
15. Increase the efficiency of primary production.
16. Ensure equal opportunity in employment and education and enable individuals to develop to their full potential.
17. Ensure Maori cultural, economic and social development.
18. Increase knowledge and understanding of New Zealand society in its global context.
19. Contribute to the world's store of fundamental knowledge.
20. Increase knowledge of New Zealand's biological and physical systems.
21. Develop strategies to anticipate hazards and limit their impact on the safety and security of the people and environment of New Zealand.
22. Increase efficiency, effectiveness and equity in the provision of social services.
23. Increase cultural tolerance and understanding in New Zealand society.
24. Improve the quality of public sector administration, planning and decision making, particularly at the local and regional level.

- The manufacturer's name or mark and the serial number of the container.
- The date of the original container inspection and the identification mark of the inspection authority which carried out the inspection.
- The date of any periodic container test and the identification mark of the cylinder testing station which carried out the test.
- The container test pressure.
- The nominal water capacity of the container.

## Water Recreation Regulations 1979 State Sector Act 1988

1. The area shall be marked by:

(a) Two 2.5 metre transit posts painted with 300 mm bright orange and black bands erected in line with each side of the access lane, the first post being sited at high water mark.

(b) A set of 4 marker buoys, painted bright orange with a vertical black stripe, moored not more than 50 metres apart in line with each set of transit posts.

2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this notice, no person who is permitted by any such provision to propel or navigate a small craft at a speed through the water exceeding 5 knots shall do so in any manner that is likely to endanger or unduly annoy any person who is, in, on, or using the waters or fishing, or undertaking any recreational activity in the vicinity of the small craft.

3. All persons in charge of a vessel shall adhere to and keep the provisions of all Acts and regulations not specifically exempted by this notice.

## Authorities and Other Agencies of State

### Broadcasting Standards Authority

#### Broadcasting Act 1989

#### Broadcasting Standards Authority—Decisions No. 48/91, 49/91, 50/91, 51/91, 52/91, 53/91, 54/91, 55/91, 56/91, 57/91, 58/91, 59/91, 60/91, 61/91, 62/91, 63/91, 64/91, and 65/91

Pursuant to section 15 of the Broadcasting Act 1989, notice is hereby given that the Broadcasting Standards Authority has made the following decisions on complaints referred to it for investigation and review.

(i) In decision 48/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Mr Bill Rout of Hamilton that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of items on *3 National News* on 16 July 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters about the portrayal of violence.

(ii) In decision 49/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Mr C. Rosa of Wellington that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an Orthodoxical advertisement in June 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters to maintain standards requiring good taste and decency and that advertisements should not use sexual appeal in an exploitive or degrading manner.

(iii) In decision 50/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Mr Robert Wardlaw of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a trailer for the programme *One Foot in the Grave* on 16 June 1991, and the broadcast of the programme itself on 18 June, breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters about taste and decency, about the classification codes, about the protection of children and not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, various groups.

(iv) In decision 51/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by Mrs P. G. Greer of Nightcaps that the news broadcast by Radio 4ZA in Invercargill on the morning of 8 April 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to show balance, impartiality and fairness.

(v) In decision 52/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by Mrs Gay Collins of Wellington that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of part of the programme *Catching Up* on 1 March 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to deal justly and fairly with any person referred to.

(vi) In decision 53/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor that the

broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an advertisement on 15 June 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters which prohibits the advertising of competitions which require the purchase of liquor to participate.

(vii) In decision 54/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by Ms Lucille Young of Palmerston North that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on the programme *Funny Business* on 16 May 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters about taste and decency.

(viii) In decision 55/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Dr Jane Ritchie of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of the programme *For the Love of Mike* on 20 June 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters about taste and decency and not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, various groups.

(ix) In decision 56/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *One's World of Sport* on 3 June 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not include references to brand names, other than to the name of the advertiser, or to the qualities of alcoholic liquor.

(x) In decision 57/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Dr Jane Ritchie of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a So Good advertisement on 7 April 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to broadcast advertisements containing misleading claims or representations.

(xi) In decision 58/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Mr B. F. Shepherd of Whangarei that the action taken by Television New Zealand Limited when upholding Mr Shepherd's complaint about an item on the *Holmes* programme on 29 May 1991 about war veterans in Crete was inadequate.

(xii) In decision 59/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by the One New Zealand Foundation that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *Frontline* on 4 August 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters that, when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made or reasonable opportunities are given to present significant points of view, and to show balance, impartiality and fairness in dealing with political matters, current affairs and all questions of a controversial nature.

(xiii) In decision 60/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by Mr Bill Rout of Hamilton that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited on 29 July 1991 of a trailer for the

programme *The Ralston Group* breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to avoid the gratuitous use of violence for the purposes of heightened impact.

(xiv) In decision 61/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Ms Airini McClure of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on the *Holmes* programme on 9 September 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, various groups.

(xv) In decision 62/91, the Authority dismissed as trivial a complaint by the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited on 14 September 1991 of one in a series of "The Boys in Black" advertisements breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not include references to brand names, other than to the name of the advertiser, or to the qualities of alcoholic liquor.

(xvii) In decision 63/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Ms Janne Wilcox-Clarke of Invercargill that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a Dominion Breweries Limited advertisement on 27 July 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to imply a link between liquor consumption and sporting success.

(xvii) In decision 64/91, the Authority upheld a complaint by the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor that the broadcast by Kiwi FM of Hamilton of an advertisement on 20 June 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to broadcast advertisements which are in conflict with the principle of moderation.

(xviii) In decision 65/91, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint by Dr J. E. Effron of Wellington that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on the programme *Fair Go* on 12 March 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, various groups.
