Education and Science

Summary of Bills Introduced

Education Amendment

This Bill amends the Education Act 1989.

Part I of the Bill replaces sections 11 and 12 of the principal Act, which relate respectively to limitations on enrolment at primary schools and enrolment schemes for secondary schools, with 7 new sections. Under the new provisions, enrolment schemes may still only be put in place to avoid overcrowding, but all schemes will be put in place by Boards of State schools instead of the Secretary of Education.

Part II of the Bill makes the following further amendments to the principal Act:

- (i) Amends section 82 of the Act to empower the Secretary of Education, if satisfied that a Board's financial management system is not working well enough, to require the Board to employ and pay a chartered accountant to oversee its financial management;
- (ii) Amends section 150 of the Act so that in future contributing schools will be contributing schools in general, rather than contributing schools of particular intermediate schools and departments. Therefore, students who leave a contributing school may (subject to enrolment schemes) enrol at any intermediate school or department, or at some full primary school, as their parents wish; and
- (iii) Inserts a new section 157A, which gives the Minister of Education an express general power to appoint a person to convene community education forums in relation to actions the Minister proposes to consider taking under Part XII of the principal Act. It also repeals section 157 (1) of the principal Act, which requires the Minister, before taking certain actions relating to schools, to appoint a community education convenor to organise community education forums. In particular it enables the recapitulation of contributing schools without the community forum process if the Minister thinks fit.

Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-off) Notice (No. 2) 1991, (No. 5076)

Pursuant to section 28zG of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

Notice

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-off) Notice (No. 2) 1991.

(2) This notice shall come into effect on the 1st day of May 1991 and shall expire on the last day of July 1991.

2. Interpretation—In this notice:

(a) Any reference to Quota Management Area means the appropriate Quota Management Area as defined in the Fisheries (Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches and Catch Histories) Notice 1986*; and

(b) Target species and bycatch species are specified by way of fishstock codes, being Fishstock Codes defined in the Second Schedule of the Fisheries (Reporting) Regulations 1990†.

3. Offering a lease of quota in lieu of paying deemed value—As from the date this notice comes into effect, any commercial fisherman who could be required under section 28zD of the Fisheries Act 1983 to pay the deemed value of any fish that is specified as a bycatch species in this notice, may offer the Director-General a lease or sublease of the right to take fish, being fish that are specified in this notice as a target species in relation to that bycatch species, as specified in the tables below. The ratios, as specified, are the amounts of target species which may, in lieu of such payments, be accepted by way of lease or sub-lease in relation to the amount of the bycatch species for which the offer of quota is made, e.g., if a fisher could be required to pay deemed value for 1 tonne of GUR1 and wishes to offer a lease of SCH1 then the amount that can be offered is 1 tonne \times 0.88 = 0.88 tonnes of SCH1.

Radio Regulations 1987

Radio Regulations (Modification of Citizen Radio Station Licences and of Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences) Notice 1991

Pursuant to regulation 15 (b) of the Radio Regulations 1987 ("the Regulations"), I, Hunter Macandrew Donaldson, General Manager (Communications), Ministry of Commerce, acting under delegated authority, hereby give the following notice.

Notice

1. Short title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Radio Regulations (Modification of Citizen Radio Station Licences and of Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences) Notice 1991.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1991.

2. Modification of terms, conditions and restrictions applying to Citizen Radio Station Licences and Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences—The terms, conditions, and restrictions which apply to—

(a) Citizen Radio Stations Licences granted under the Radio Regulations 1970, before the close of the 31st day of December 1987;

(b) Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences granted under the principle regulations on or after the 1st day of January 1988, are hereby modified by omitting the terms, conditions and restrictions applying to the licences immediately before the commencement of this notice (as substituted by clause 7 of the Radio Regulations (Modification of Radio Apparatus Licences) Notice 1988, dated 13 December 1988, and published in the *Gazette* of Thursday, 15 December 1988, Issue 219 at page 5474) and substituting the terms, conditions and restrictions set out in the Schedule to this notice.

Schedule

Terms, Conditions and Restrictions Applying to Citizen Radio Station Licences and to Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences

1. The licence permits the use of radio apparatus for the conduct of Radiocommunication in the Citizen Radio Service, within New Zealand, with base and mobile apparatus.

2. The apparatus, to which the licence relates, must be type approved or type accepted (Certificate of Compliance) and maintained to a specification issued by the Secretary and stated on the licence.

3. Nothing in the licence, the International Radio Regulations 1982, the Radiocommunications Act 1989, or the Radio Regulations 1987 prohibits any person in distress from using any means at that person's disposal to attract attention, indicate the person's position, and obtain assistance.

4. The apparatus, to which the licence relates, shall operate only on the frequency(ies), emission(s), and power(s) shown on the licence for the purpose specified on or annexed to the licence.

5. All reasonable care has been used in making radio frequency assignments. The nature of frequency assignments is such that no guarantee can be made that implementation and use will be trouble free. Accordingly, the Crown does not accept liability under any circumstances for any loss or damage of any kind. In the event that a frequency change is required, all costs are the sole responsibility of the licence.

6. The licence is valid for the period specified on the front of the licence. The licence may be revalidated upon payment of the prescribed fee as set out in the Third Schedule of the Radio Regulations 1987.

7. There is no restriction on the type of antenna that may be used but should interference occur, the provisions of Radio Regulation 39 will be enforced, i.e., the Secretary may require the person operating the interfering equipment to cease operating the equipment or to modify the operation of the equipment to prevent the interference.

Marine Mammals Protection Act 1978

Application to Capture and Keep in Captivity Dolphins and a Leopard Seal

The Minister of Conservation has received an application from Hawke's Bay marineland and Aquarium Board for a permit to capture and keep in captivity at the Napier Marineland the following animals:

- (a) 6 common dolphins (*Delphinus delphis*). 2 to be caught immediately and 4 (2 females and 2 males) at a later date to form the nucleus of a breeding herd when suitable breeding facilities have been established; and
- (b) 1 leopard seal (*Hydrurga leptonyx*).

More detailed information on the application, including methods of capture, and plans and specifications of the proposed dolphin breeding facility can be viewed at all Department of Conservation Conservancy offices and head office.

In accordance with section 5 of the Marine Mammals Protection Act 1978, the Minister of Conservation seeks written submissions in support of and objections against this application. Such submissions should be forwarded to: The Regional Conservator, Department of Conservation, P.O. Box 644, Napier, within 28 days of the publication date of this notice.

To assist analysis of submissions the public are requested to provide separate comment on the dolphin and leopard seal proposals, and to structure their submissions on both species under the following broad subject headings: Capture Methods; Existing and Proposed Facilities; Health and Welfare; Ethical Issues; and Other Matters.

Indecent Publications Act 1963

Decision

Pursuant to section 14 (2) of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, leave was granted to the applicant or a representative of his organisation to submit this publication to the Tribunal for classification under the Act.

A joinder application from M. R. Atkinson, inspector of the Mangonui Branch of the RNZSPCA, was granted in decision No. 62/90 which was issued on the 14th day of November 1990.

The distributor of this publication in New Zealand is Ross Haines & Son Ltd. from whom a written submission (in opposition to the society's application) has been received.

The oral and written submissions from Mr Boyd and Mr Atkinson urge the Tribunal to classify the publication as indecent.

The publication is of coffee table book size with hard backed cover, reinforced binding and illustrations in colour of the pit bull terrier. The contents of 288 pages contain numerous illustrations in both black and white and colour plus text. The price of the book is \$41.65.

The titles of the various chapters, some of them apparently employing the jargon of dog fighting and associated activities, give an unclear indication of the subjects covered. Suffice to say that prominence is given to activities such as training methods for fighting dogs, construction of pits for dog

fighting, rules of organised pit dog fights and descriptions of recorded dog fights. The latter is in Chapter VIII with the title "Classic Contests".

Under section 3 (c) of the Animals Protection Act 1960 it is an offence of cruelty to keep or use any place for the purpose of causing any animal to fight, or for the purpose of baiting or otherwise ill-treating any animal, or for managing or assisting in the management of any such place. Section 3 (d) of the same Act provides that it is an offence to be present for the purpose of witnessing the fighting of baiting of any animal, at any place used or kept for that purpose. And under section 3 (e) of that Act it is an offence in any manner to encourage, aid or assist in the fighting or baiting of any animal. This publication, then, deals in considerable detail, both by reference to exhaustive text and wide-ranging illustrations, of activities which very clearly are offences under the Animals Protection Act 1960.

The question to be asked, after taking into account the criteria in section 11 of the Act, is whether this book is indecent in that it describes, depicts or otherwise deals with matters of horror, crime, cruelty or violence *in a manner* (emphasis added) that is injurious to the public good.

The dominant effect of the book before us is actively to promote and encourage dog fighting. Several examples are given to support this contention. In Chapter V the schooling of young dogs is described. While the author blames animal welfare groups for emotive stories of kittens, cats and small dogs being used as bait for pit bulls, he acknowledges that there are many people on the fringes of the pit dog fraternity who apparently do follow this practice. The author goes on to describe how to "blood" a young dog for fighting, by allowing it to fight in a controlled situation, with an older and more experienced dog, and in the ultimate paragraph on page 69, the author recommends that fights should be spaced at least a month apart so as to allow plenty of time for healing. On the next page references are made to injuries received during training. On page 79 the author indicates that some legitimacy could be given to the comment of an experienced and respected dog man that "a pit bulldog is a killing machine with a hair trigger, and you never know what will set one off!" On page 90 there is a graphic description of a dog fight in which an injured dog was allowed to continue to fight. The author describes how this dog, with totally disabled front legs, was allowed to push its way across the pit using only its hind legs to get to its opponent. In the descriptions of training methods the book describes methods of "blooding" young pit dogs, and describes a device known as a "cat mill", which is designed to have a live animal or bird suspended in it as bait for the pit dog being trained. Vivid descriptions are also given of dogs being "blooded" by allowing them to attack and maul to death, a cat or chicken placed in a sack. While the author says he does not advocate this type of action, he concedes that some pit bull people do resort to such training methods. The author advocates the bribing of veterinary practitioners to treat animals that are injured in illegal dog fights, without reporting these activities to the police. Pages 198-199 clearly imply that a person should pay his or her vet to keep quiet, and should learn what he can from the vet about caring for what the author describes as a "battle sick" dog.

Written in a rambling anecdotal style, the literary or artistic merit of this publication is quite unremarkable. Neither in our view has it any medical, legal, political, social or scientific importance.

Under section 11 (f) of the Act the Tribunal is directed to take into consideration whether the book displays an honest purpose and an honest thread of thought or whether its content is merely camouflage designed to render acceptable any indecent parts of the book. In the foreword of this publication the author cautions the reader not to conclude that "I'd like to see you get involved with dog fighting." The author states that the reader should keep away from dog fighting in

any form because it is illegal in most of the places that the book will be read. Notwithstanding this supposed statement of principle it is our view that the author is in fact very much in favour of dog fighting as an acceptable activity despite its illegal nature in most parts of the world. The style of writing adopted by the author leaves us in no doubt that he is advocating dog fighting as an acceptable activity. In a very derisory manner the author refers to members of humane and animal welfare organisations such as the Royal Society for the Protection of Cruelty to Animals in Britain, and its counterpart American organisation, as "humaniacs" and "pacifists". The author expresses the view that responsible owners of American pit bull terriers "know their charges well enough to acknowledge the simple fact that letting them fight is about as cruel as allowing a bird to fly". Elsewhere he comments "once you know what you're looking at and seeing, a pit dog contest gives no more impression of brutality than a marathon race or, better yet, America's favourite sport, pro-football". In criticising humane and animal welfare groups the author opines that if they are really interested in the welfare of dogs, they should work towards legalisation (and regulation) of dog fighting. That way, he said, such groups would make a contribution towards improving the welfare of the dogs instead of worsening it, as they have in the past, with their efforts to stop dog fighting. The author's often expressed view that dog fighting is illegal and that nothing he has written should be construed as favouring dog fighting, is seriously at odds and outweighed by a consistent strain of commentary throughout this publication which indicates very clearly that the author is best described as a devotee or *aficionado* of dog fighting.

On summary conviction every person who commits an offence of cruelty under the Animals Protection Act 1960 is liable to a term of imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years or to a fine not exceeding \$2,000. That this publication describes activities which are offences under the Animals Protection Act 1960 is not, *per se*, a ground for classifying it as indecent. Rather it is the manner in which the book depicts, expresses or otherwise deals with acts of horror, crime, cruelty and violence which must be taken into account in determining whether the book is "indecent" within the meaning of the Act. In our view there is persuasive and overwhelming merit in the submissions of both Mr Boyd and Mr Atkinson that this book describes (in great detail) and actively encourages and promotes, and even lauds, an activity which is completely illegal in this country. In defending this publication Mr Haines argued that books about firearms and martial arts are freely available in retail stores all over New Zealand. He was also critical of the RNZSPCA for not calling into question books on other dogs breeds which are sometimes used in fighting such as rottweilers, bull mastifs and dobermans. These other publications are not the subject of the present application and consequently we are unable to comment on them. The Act directs the Tribunal to consider only the characteristics of the publication submitted to it for classification.

Based on a consideration of the definition of "indecent" in section 2 and the criteria contained in section 11 (1) of the Act it is our conclusion that matters of horror, crime, cruelty and violence are depicted in this publication in a manner that is so injurious to the public good that it should be classified as indecent. Accordingly we classify *The World of the American Pit Bull Terrier* by Richard F. Stratton as indecent.
