Summary of Bills Introduced

Masterton District Council (Rates Validation and Empowering)

This is a local bill which seeks:

- (a) To validate rates made by the Masterton District Council for the year ended 30 June 1991, with the exceptions of certain rates made and levied in the area known as the AB area;
- (b) To substitute for the rates not validated in the AB area, a rate at the same rate in the dollar as was made by the former Masterton District Council for the year ended 31 March 1990;
- (c) To deal with consequential overpayments of rates in the AB area for the year ended 30 June 1990. Overpayments will be credited to the relevant rate account, or on request, refunded to the person who paid rates;
- (d) To authorise the application of the proceeds of the General Capital Purposes Fund to any consequential funding shortfall for the year ended 30 June 1991;
- (e) To provide for a general rate in the rural rating area for the year ending 30 June 1992 on a differential basis; and
- (f) To confirm certain rating arrangements in the urban rating area.

Dunedin City Council (Sale of Liquor) Empowering

This is a local Bill which seeks to enable the Dunedin City Council to hold liquor licences in respect of the Town Hall, the Conference Centre, the Municipal Chambers and the Dunedin Public Library.

Invercargill City Council Vesting and Empowering (Gasworks Site)

The objects of this local bill are:

- (a) To free land from trusts, reservations, and restrictions imposed by the Invercargill Gasworks Site Act 1881;
- (b) To empower the Council to sell the land; and
- (c) To enable the Council to apply the net proceeds from the sale for the general purposes of the Council.

Northland Regional Council and Far North District Council Vesting and Empowering

This local bill seeks:

- (a) To vest in the Far North District Council certain assets and liabilities of the Northland Regional Council including certain harbour and maritime facilities, resource consents and approvals, and land vested in the Northland Regional Council under the Local Government (Northland Region) Reorganisation Order 1989;
- (b) To give the Far North District Council certain authorities and powers in respect of mooring charges; and
- (c) To repeal the Northland Harbour Act 1965.

Radiocommunications Act 1989

Statement of Government Policy and Directions to the Secretary of Commerce

To the Secretary of Commerce

I, Maurice Donald Williamson, Minister of Communications, acting pursuant to section 112 of the Radiocommunications Act 1989 ("the Act"), and pursuant to the policies of Government communicated to you in the Statement of Government Policy and Directions to the Secretary of Commerce dated 30 November 1990 and published in the *Gazette* of 6 December 1990 at page 4581, hereby amend my directions to you set out in that notice by revoking paragraph

(b) of those directions and substituting the following paragraph:

You shall not grant new radio apparatus licences for UHF television broadcasting services except where the granting of such licences is necessary for the purposes of—

- (i) Maintaining the services provided by existing licensees in relation to those frequencies; or
- (ii) The implementation of new television broadcasting services, the primary objective of which is the promotion of Maori language and culture, where transmissions of such services are licensed for no more than 3 months, provided that such licences may be renewed for subsequent periods not exceeding 3 months until such time as a record of management rights in relation to that frequency is recorded under the Act; or
- (iii) The implementation of new television broadcasting services undertaken otherwise than for profit.
- (iv) Establishing translators for the service known as TV3 at Paeroa range, Ngarara, Porirua and Towai.

The Traffic (Waikato District) Notice No. 2, 1991

Exemption From Seatbelt Requirements (Full Harness Restraint System Alternative)

Pursuant to regulation 36 of the Transport (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 1990, and in exercise of powers delegated to me, pursuant to section 41 (1) of the State Sector Act 1988, I, Peter W. Bowen, Senior Automotive Engineer, hereby exempt the specified class of vehicles from regulation 29 (1) (a), (2) (3) (4) and 30 (2) of the Transport (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 1990, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule below.

Pursuant to regulation 89 of the Traffic Regulations 1976, and in exercise of powers delegated to me, pursuant to section 41 (1) of the State Sector Act 1988, I, Peter W. Bowen, Senior Automotive Engineer, hereby exempt the specified class of vehicles from regulation 78A (a) of the Traffic Regulations 1976, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule below.

This exemption allows the fitting of full harness restraints for the front outer seating positions in motor sport vehicles. The administration and conditions of this exemption are policed by the Motorsport Association of New Zealand (MANZ).

This exemption may be withdrawn at any time.

Specified Class

The specified class of motor vehicle is:

Any vehicle that is registered with and complies with the Motorsport Association of New Zealand Inc requirements.

Schedule of Conditions

1. MANZ issue an "Authority Card" with both MoT and MANZ original logo's.

2. The "Authority Card" must be carried in the vehicle at all times and produced when requested by: Police, MoT, Vehicle Standards, or Warrant of Fitness Authorities.

3. The "Authority Card" shall identify the vehicle, vehicle owner, type of restraints fitted, and be of an acceptable format to the Ministry of Transport. The "Authority Card" is not transferable.

4. All safety harnesses and anchorages must be constructed and comply with a recognised standard or comply with any other current MANZ requirements.

5. If a harness has other than a simple single action buckle assembly, easy to follow instructions must be easily seen from the drivers seat.

6. In the event of the vehicle ceasing to comply with above items, the appropriate seatbelts and anchorages for road use must be fitted into the vehicle.

New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District Notice 1992

Pursuant to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, the National Rural Fire Authority hereby makes the following notice.

Notice

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District Notice 1992.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the day after its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
2. In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires, the "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977; the "Committee" means the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire Committee; "District" means the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District.

Constitution of the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District

3. The areas specified in the Schedule to this notice are hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district to be known as the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District.
4. The New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District shall be administered for the purpose of the Act by a rural fire committee known as the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire Committee.
5. The committee shall consist of four members as follows:
 - (a) Three persons appointed by the New Zealand Timberlands Limited, in writing, signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof, and of whom one shall be appointed as Chairperson; and
 - (b) One person appointed by the New Zealand Local Government Association Incorporated, in writing, signed on

behalf of that association by the president and the secretary thereof; and

(c) One person appointed, in writing, by the Director-General of the Department of Conservation.

6. The trees and other plants on the land, described in the Schedule to this notice, are hereby specified as the property for the protection for which the district is constituted.

7. The period between the 1st day of October in any year and the 30th day of September in the following year (both days inclusive) is hereby declared to be a restricted fire season in the district.

1. *Waipoua Forest*—3500 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Plan 65825, North Auckland Land District, and being Sections 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 16 and part Sections 2, 3, 6, 7, 11, 13, 14 and 15, Block I, Waipoua S.D., part Section 2, Block 11, Waipoua S.D., parts Section 1, Block V, Waipoua S.D., Section 2 and part Sections 1 and 5, Block VI, Waipoua S.D., Waipoua 2B3AIB, part Waipoua 2B3BIB, part Waipoua 2B3B2, Waipoua 2B3CI, part Waipoua 2B3DI, parts Waipoua 2B3E and parts Waipoua Block, more commonly known as Waipoua Forest.
2. *Glenbervie Forest and Hikurangi Agency*—9375 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Plan 65664 North Auckland Land District and a plan labelled Hikurangi Agency and being Lot 1, D.P. 136789, Lot 1, D.P. 136790, Lot 2, D.P. 136791, Lot 1, D.P. 136794, Lot 1, D.P. 136795, Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 136803, Lot 1, D.P. 137180, Lot 1, D.P. 137181, part Maruata 6 H and 7 B, parts Maruata 8, Lot 1 of Section 7, Sections 6 and 9, Block XVI, Hukerenui S.D. and part Allotment N.E. 49, Hikurangi Parish, more commonly known as Glenbervie Forest and Hikurangi Agency.
3. *Waitangi Forest and Waitangi Endowment Forest*—2800 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Plan 65663, North Auckland Land District and the plan labelled Waitangi Endowment Forest and being Lot 1, D.P. 136796, Lot 1, D.P. 137183, part Lot 1, D.P. 25368, Lot 1 and part Lot 2, D.P. 41211, Sections 7 and 20, Block III, Kawakawa S.D., part Sections 27 and 29 and Sections 28, 30 and 31, Block IV, Kawakawa S.D. and Allotment 42, Waitangi Parish, more commonly known as Waitangi Forest and Waitangi Endowment Forest.
4. *Mount Camel Lease Forest*—900 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on the plan labelled Mount Camel Lease and being part Houhora Block, more commonly known as Mount Camel Lease forest.
5. *Waiuku Forest*—1450 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Plan 65669, North Auckland Land District and being Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 136551, Allotment 362, Waiuku West Parish, Section 98, parts Section 99 and part Section 100, Block VII, Maioro Survey District, more commonly known as Waiuku Forest.

6. *Mangaokewa Forest*—1180 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Plan 59003, South Auckland Land District and being Lots 1, D.P. S. 49233, Lot 1, D.P. S. 56862, Lots 1 and 2, D.P. S. 56979 and Lots 1 and 2, D.P. S. 58593, more commonly known as Mangaokewa Forest.
7. *Pirongia Forest*—300 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of the plan labelled Pirongia Forest, South Auckland Land District and being Lot 1, D.P. S. 42253, Section 17 and part Sections 2 and 19, Block XIII, Pirongia Survey District and parts Sections 11 and 13, Block XIV, Pirongia Survey District, more commonly known as Pirongia Forest.
8. *Tawarau Forest*—1700 hectares approximately, being the land edged green on a copy of S.O. Order

1. Title—This order may be cited as the State-Owned Enterprises (Coal Corporation of New Zealand Limited Vesting Order No. 2) Order 1992.

2. Application—(1) This order applies to all the land described in the Schedule to this order, saving and excepting—

- (a) The bed of any lake whose bed has an area of 8 hectares or more:

(b) The bed of any river whose bed has an average width of 3 metres or more:

(c) Any land covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at mean spring tides.

(2) In subclause (1) of this clause, the terms "bed", "lake", and "river" have the meanings assigned to them by section 2 (1) of the Resource Management Act 1992.

3. Approval and vesting—Subject to section 24 of the Conservation Act 1987, the land to which this order applies—

(a) Is hereby approved for the purposes of section 24 (1) (b) of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986; and

(b) On the 9th day of April 1992, shall vest for an estate in fee simple in Coal Corporation of New Zealand Limited (a company duly incorporated under the Companies Act 1955, having its registered office at Wellington, and being a State enterprise),—

(i) Together with the appurtenant rights (if any) described in the Schedule to this order; but

(ii) Subject to the rights, interests, and encumbrances (if any), to which it is described in the Schedule to this order as being subject.
