Summary of Bills Introduced

Imprest Supply Bill (No. 4)

This bill enables the issue and application of certain amounts of public money towards the service of the year ending with the 30th day of June 1993 and to authorise costs to be incurred towards the service of that year.

Lake Pukaki Water Level Empowering Bill

The purpose of this bill is to provide statutory authority for the Electricity Corporation of New Zealand Ltd to lower Lake Pukaki below the minimum level fixed in the Corporation's current water permit, for a limited period. When this period expires the Act will be deemed to be repealed and any alteration to the minimum level will be dealt with under the Resource Management Act 1991.

Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988

Final Determination and Imposition of Anti-Dumping Duty: Lead Acid Batteries from the Philippines

Pursuant to section 13 (1) of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), I, Philip Burden, Minister of Commerce, hereby give notice that I have made a final determination that the goods specified in the First Schedule to this notice (hereinafter referred to as "subject goods") imported or intended to be imported into New Zealand, are goods in respect of which I may direct the imposition of anti-dumping duty in accordance with section 14 of the Act.

I hereby give notice that I am satisfied in relation to the importation, or intended importation, into New Zealand of the subject goods that—

- (a) The subject goods are being dumped; and
- (b) By reason thereof material injury to the New Zealand lead acid battery industry is threatened,—

and state that section 14 of the Act applies to the subject goods, and that there shall be charged, collected and paid on demand of the Collector of Customs anti-dumping duty on the subject goods. The anti-dumping duty so imposed shall be the appropriate amount specified in the Second Schedule to this notice in relation to the source and supplier of the importation.

First Schedule

Lead acid automotive replacement batteries for the passenger motor vehicle market and marine applications (excluding DIN batteries and deep cycle marine batteries), originating in the Philippines.

Pursuant to section 15 of the Broadcasting Act 1989, notice is hereby given that the Broadcasting Standards Authority has made the following decisions on complaints referred to it for investigation and review.

(i) In Decision 17/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr Michael Buck of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an episode of the programme *Never Come Back* on 13 October 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to avoid the gratuitous use of violence.

(ii) In Decision 18/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Murray Shaw of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *Frontline* on 18 August 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made or reasonable opportunities are given to present significant points of view, to deal justly and fairly with any person taking part in a programme, to show balance, impartiality and fairness in dealing with questions of a controversial nature and to present all significant sides of a controversial public issue in as fair a way as possible.

(iii) In Decision 19/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr Bruce Clements of Auckland that the broadcast by Radio New Zealand Limited of an item on 89FM in Auckland on 19 November 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to maintain standards consistent with the privacy of the individual. The Authority ordered Radio New Zealand to pay compensation to Mr Clements in the amount of \$1,000.

(iv) In Decision 20/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mrs Jocelyn Fish of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of the programme *New Zealand Today* on 29 November 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that advertisements will be clearly distinguishable from other programme material.

(v) In Decision 21/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Dr Miles Wislang of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on the *Holmes* programme on 13 August 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, various sections in the community, to maintain standards of good taste and decency, to be mindful of the effect of a programme on children, and to avoid themes involving the humiliation of children.

(vi) In Decision 22/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Roger Cole of Nelson that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *One Network News* on 24 December 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste in language and behaviour.

(vii) In Decision 23/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Society for the Protection of the Unborn Child that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *Frontline* on 10 November 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made or reasonable opportunities are given to present significant points of view, to be truthful and accurate on points of fact, and to show balance, impartiality and fairness in dealing with issues of a controversial nature.

(viii) In Decision 24/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Kerry Sharp of Palmerston North that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *Frontline* on 10 November 1991, breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to show balance, impartiality and fairness in dealing with issues of a controversial nature.

(ix) In Decision 25/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr Kerry Sharp of Palmerston North that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of the programme *Love and Hate* on 16 December 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters to take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste in language and behaviour, and to ensure that violence in a drama can be justified.

(x) In Decision 26/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr Ray Smith of Auckland that Aotearoa Radio failed to hold a recording of a talkback programme broadcast on 6 February 1992 for 28 working days.

(xi) In Decision 27/92, the Authority in all the circumstances declined to determine a complaint from Mr Charles Noble of Wanganui that the broadcast by Radio New Zealand Limited of an item on *Morning Report* on 10 October 1991 failed to maintain standards consistent with the observance of good taste and decency.

(xii) In Decision 28/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Senior Sergeant M.B. Meyrick of Huntly that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of an item on *3 National News* on 4 February 1992 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters to maintain standards consistent with the observance of good taste and decency, with the maintenance of law and order, and to be truthful and accurate on points of fact.

(xiii) In Decision 29/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Charles Rosa of Wellington that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of an advertisement for Vaseline Intensive Care Lotion on 16 November 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to maintain standards consistent with the observance of good taste and decency.

(xiv) In Decision 30/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Ms Carol McIntosh of Nelson that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a Lion Red sponsorship advertisement on 29 November 1991 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters that liquor sponsorship advertisements should not be directed at minors and that liquor is not portrayed as a necessary component of sporting success.

(xv) In Decision 31/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an advertisement for "Steinlager" beer on 1 February 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to show advertisements which cause undue offence to a significant section of the community.

(xvi) In Decision 32/92, the Authority declined to uphold a

complaint from Mr Bruce Clements of Auckland that the broadcast by Radio New Zealand Limited of an item on 89FM in Auckland on 19 November 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to maintain standards consistent with the observance of good taste and decency.

(xvii) In Decision 33/92, the Authority declined in all the circumstances to determine a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of an advertisement for DB Export Lager on a number of occasions in February 1992 breached a number of the responsibilities placed on broadcasters about liquor advertisements.

(xviii) In Decision 34/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mrs Lindsay Brock of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a music video on *Pepsi RTR Top 40* on 18 January 1992 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters to take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste in language and behaviour, and to be mindful of the effect of programmes on children.

(xix) In Decision 35/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a Dominion Breweries sponsorship advertisement breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor sponsorship advertisements should not employ aggressive themes.

(xx) In Decision 36/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Canterbury Television Limited of a Dominion Breweries advertisement in December 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that advertisements shall not be misleading or deceptive.

(xxi) In Decision 37/92, the Authority declined to accept a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that advertisements broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited in May 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to broadcast advertisements which contained the no-alcohol option message.

(a) If the owners shall have obtained a permit (either in writing or in such other manner as the Crown may from time to time in its absolute discretion determine) from the Crown authorising him to carry out any particular work on the pipeline easement and in the course of carrying out such work in compliance with the conditions set forth in such permit such damage shall occur then the owner shall not be liable for the costs of and incidental to the repairing of such damage.

(b) If prior to commencement of any work on the pipeline easement the owners shall fail to obtain a permit in writing from the Crown and if having obtained such permit as aforesaid fails to comply with the terms and conditions set forth therein or otherwise imposed by the Crown in respect thereof and if such damage shall occur during the course of such work then the owners shall be liable for the first two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) only in the cost of making good such damage and incidental loss which may have been suffered by the Crown provided that the aforesaid limitation of liability to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to be borne by the owner as aforesaid shall be adjusted upwards automatically on an annual basis by relating the same to movements in the general consumer prices index (CPI) for New Zealand published from time to time by the New Zealand Department of Statistics to establish at any given time in the future the then value of the aforesaid sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
