Summary of Bills Introduced

Summary Proceedings Amendment Bill (No. 3)

Amends Part I of the First Schedule to the Summary Proceedings Act 1957 by inserting in that Part of that Schedule, as from the commencement of 11 July 1986, a reference to section 140A of the Crimes Act 1961. That Part of that Schedule lists the indictable offences under the Crimes Act 1961 that are triable summarily.

Health and Disability Services Bill

Gives effect to a number of major changes in the funding and delivery of health and disability services.

The Bill provides for the establishment of new agencies of the Crown that will enable:

- (a) The separation of responsibility for providing secondary health services from responsibility for allocating funding for such services;
- (b) The separation of the purchase of public health services from the purchase of personal health and disability services; and
- (c) The integration of funding for primary and secondary health services.

The new purchase agencies are regional health authorities and the Public Health Commission. The new provider organisations are Crown health enterprises.

Parts I to III establish the new agencies and provide for their objectives, powers, functions, funding, and accountability mechanisms.

Parts IV to VII are concerned with transitional provisions, consequential repeals and consequential amendments. Part V amends the Health Act 1956, including the insertion into that Act of new provisions relating to information. Part VI amends the Hospitals Act 1957. The amendments are largely consequential upon the dissolution of area health boards. Part VII amends the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992.

Fisheries Amendment Bill (No. 3)

Establishes a quota management system for the Southern Scallop Fishery and amends the Fisheries Act 1983 and the Maori Fisheries Act 1989 for this purpose.

The Bill provides for the allocation of quota to the Maori Fisheries Commission and to existing quota holders.

The Bill also amends provisions of the Fisheries Act 1983 relating to the obligation to pay to the Crown the deemed value of fish taken without the authority of or in excess of quota.

Broadcasting (Liquor Advertising) Bill

Amends the Broadcasting Act 1989 by inserting new sections requiring health messages to accompany liquor advertisements broadcast on radio and television.

Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988

Preliminary Determination: Automotive Oil Filters from the United States of America

Pursuant to section 12 (1) of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, I, Philip Burdon, Minister of Commerce, hereby give notice that I have made a preliminary determination on the basis of the information made available during the investigation, that there is reasonable cause to believe that the goods subject to the investigation described in the Schedule to this notice, and imported or intended to be imported into New Zealand, are goods in respect of which I may direct the imposition of an anti-dumping duty in accordance with section 14 of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988.

Description of goods subject to investigation

Country of Origin

Automotive oil filters for use on internal combustion engines exceeding 20 horse power (HP).

United States of America

The goods are currently classified under Tariff Item and Statistical Key 8421.23.0000D of the Tariff of New Zealand. This Tariff Item and Statistical Key is provided for convenience and Customs purposes only, the written description being dispositive.

Definitions of Fish and Game Regions Boundaries Notice 1990, Amendment No. 2

Pursuant to section 26A (1) (c) (i) of the Conservation Act 1987 (as inserted by section 17 of the Conservation Law Reform Act 1990), I, Denis Marshall, Minister of Conservation, hereby amend the 1990 notice titled "Definitions of Fish and Game Boundaries", published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 24 May 1990, on page 1861.

1. The title of the notice titled "Definitions of Fish and Game Boundaries" is amended to read as the "Definitions of Fish and Game Regions Boundaries Notice 1990".

2. This amending notice may be cited as the Definitions of Fish and Game Regions Boundaries Notice 1990, Amendment No. 2 and it shall be read together with and deemed part of the Definitions of Fish and Game Regions Boundaries Notice 1990 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal notice").

3. This amending notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1992.

4. Paragraph 8, in the principal notice defining the North Canterbury Fish and Game Region is amended by deleting the reference to S.O. Plan 18341 and substituting the following reference: "S.O. Plan 18900".

5. Paragraph 9, in the principal notice defining the Central South Island Fish and Game Region, (previously named South Canterbury Fish and Game Region in paragraph nine of the principal notice but renamed by the amending notice "Name Changes for Fish and Game Regions" published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, of 29 August 1991, No. 129 on page 2786) is amended by deleting the reference to S.O. Plan 18342 and substituting the following reference: "S.O. Plan 18901".

6. *Explanatory Note:* The common boundaries of the North Canterbury Fish and Game Region, and the Central South Island Fish and Game Region are altered in accordance with new S.O. Plans 18900 and 18901 which place Lake Heron and the majority of the Lake Stream (from the vicinity of Downs Hut) within the Central South Island Fish and Game Region.

Broadcasting Standards Authority

Broadcasting Act 1989

Broadcasting Standards Authority—Decisions No.: 39/92, 40/92, 41/92, 42/92, 43/92, 44/92, 45/92, 46/92, 47/92, 48/92, 49/92, 50/92, 51/92, 52/92, 53/92, 54/92, 55/92 and 56/92

Pursuant to section 15 of the Broadcasting Act 1989, notice is hereby given that the Broadcasting Standards Authority has made the following decisions on complaints referred to it for investigation and review:

- (i) In Decision 39/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a Dominion Breweries sponsorship advertisement on 21 March 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not employ aggressive themes.
- (ii) In Decision 40/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Ian Ross of Upper Hutt that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *One Network News* on 3 February 1992 breached the responsibility, among others, placed on broadcasters to maintain standards of good taste and decency.
- (iii) In Decision 41/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr P.G. Curran of Levin that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of items on *One Network News* on 24 December 1991 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to show balance, impartiality and fairness in current affairs.
- (iv) In Decision 42/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Dr Richard Talbot of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an advertisement for Strepils in winter in 1991 breached the responsibility

placed on broadcasters that advertisements shall not be misleading.

- (v) In Decision 43/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an advertisement for Gordons Gin in March 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not imply that the consumption or presence of liquor is a necessary component of social and sexual success.
- (vi) In Decision 44/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mrs Margaret Jackson of Cambridge that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an advertisement of Steinlager beer breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not cause undue offence to sections of the community.
- (vii) In Decision 45/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of a Dominion Breweries sponsorship advertisement on 10 March 1992 breached two of the responsibilities placed on broadcasters about liquor advertisements.
- (viii) In Decision 47/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Kristian Harang of Auckland that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *One Network News* on 12 February 1992 breached the responsibility, among others, placed on broadcasters to maintain standards of good taste and decency.
- (ix) In Decisions 46/92, 48/92, 49/92, 50/92 and 51/92 the Authority upheld complaints from Mr J. E. Whyte of Paraparaumu, Mrs Valerie Craymer-Alexander of Dunedin, Mr L. G. Sanders of Tauranga, Tradition Family Property (New Zealand) of Wellington and Mrs Frances Burt of Gisborne that the broadcast by Television New Zealand Limited of an item on *Holmes* on 12 February 1992 breached the responsibilities placed on broadcasters

to abide by the classification codes and to be mindful of the effect of a programme on children. The Authority ordered Television New Zealand Limited to broadcast a brief summary of the decision on a *Holmes* programme before 3 August 1992.

- (x) In Decision 52/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr Craig Creevey of Auckland that the broadcast by Independent Broadcasting Company (1990) Limited of an item of Auckland's 91FM breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to maintain standards of good taste and decency.
- (xi) In Decision 53/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from the Group Opposed to Advertising of Liquor of Hamilton that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of a DB Export Dry beer advertisement on 1 February 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that liquor advertisements shall not suggest that the consumption of liquor is associated with a significant change of mood.
- (xii) In Decision 54/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Harry Rickit of Auckland that the broadcast by Independent Broadcasting Company (1990) Limited of an item on Auckland's 91FM breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters not to encourage the denigration of, or discrimination against, a section of the community on account of race.
- (xiii) In Decision 55/92, the Authority upheld a complaint from Mr John Carter M.P. that Television New Zealand Limited breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters to broadcast a correction at the earliest opportunity and that the action taken by the broadcaster, having upheld the complaint, was insufficient.
- (xiv) In Decision 56/92, the Authority declined to uphold a complaint from Mr Kerry Sharp of Palmerston North that the broadcast by TV3 Network Services Limited of an item on *60 Minutes* on 8 March 1992 breached the responsibility placed on broadcasters that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made or reasonable opportunities are given to present significant points of view.

The reason for some donations being unpaid at balance date is either, because certain conditions upon which the donation becomes payable are not yet fulfilled by the donee, or payment is to be spread over future years. By entering into arrangements to pay some donees over a period of years, the trust has been able to assist some larger projects in a more practical way. While payment of future years donation installments is not legally binding upon the trust, undertakings of this nature are closely monitored by the trustees relative to the trust's projected income.

A full list of donations made during the year can be obtained from the secretary.

National Disaster Relief Fund

Our trust operates in conjunction with all other regional trust bank community trusts towards the maintenance of a national disaster relief fund. No payments were made from this fund during the year.

Review of Financial Results

The income of the trust has increased again this year, largely as a result of the continuing excellent performance of the trust's major asset, being its 13.5 percent shareholding in Trust Bank New Zealand Limited. Dividends received from the bank comprise the major part of its income.

Expenses have remained similar to last year, except for secretarial and professional fees. This year secretarial fees cover a full year, whereas last year they related to a 6-month period only, from the date of the commencement of the secretary. Professional fees fluctuate according to the degree of expert opinion sought each year.

Trustees consider that the affairs of the trust are sound.

Acknowledgments

During the year, the trust lost the services of one of its trustees, Mr Bruce Malcolm. His contribution was extremely valuable and sincerely appreciated by all trustees. Messrs John Edgecombe of Dunedin and Dave Pasley of Oamaru were appointed as trustees by the Associate Minister of Finance in May 1991.

Notes to and Forming Part of the Financial Statements for the 12 Months Ended 31 March 1992

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

General Accounting Policies

The general accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

- The measurement base adopted is the historical cost basis.
- Reliance has been placed on the fact that the entity is a going concern.
- Revenues earned and expenses incurred are matched using accrual accounting, except that dividends received are accounted for on a receipts basis.

Particular Accounting Policies

The following are the particular accounting policies which have a material effect on the measurement of results and the financial position:

- (a) Dividend income from Trust Bank New Zealand Limited is included in the income and expenditure account when it is received.
- (b) Donations made are included in the income and expenditure account when paid.
- (c) Investments, which comprise shares held in Trust Bank New Zealand Limited are stated at cost.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

2. Dividends

Dividends were received from Trust Bank New Zealand Limited comprised:

- (a) 1991 final dividend of \$891,000 received 5 July 1991.
- (b) 1992 interim dividend of \$427,680 received 3 December 1991.

3. Investment

Shares in Trust Bank New Zealand Limited, which are stated at cost, have a market value of not less than cost, in the opinion of the trustees.

4. Taxation

For taxation purposes, the trust is deemed to be a charitable organisation. Its income is not subject to taxation.

The trust is not registered for goods and services tax purposes. Accordingly, these financial statements are stated on a GST inclusive basis.

The trust has been registered as exempt from interest and dividend PAYE and holds a current certificate of exemption.

5. Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities at 31 March 1992 (1991: \$0).

6. Contingent Asset

Donations made during the year include a payment of \$125,000 to the Otago Excursion Train Trust. In the event that the OETT, within the next 10 years, ceases to function and operate as it does currently, then a specified proportion is refundable on demand. The Dunedin City Council act as guarantors in respect of this arrangement.

Auditor's Report, Trust Bank Otago Community Trust Inc.

We have examined the accompanying balance sheet, income and expenditure account and statement of cashflows and have obtained all the information and explanations we have required.
