Animals Act 1967

Notice Controlling the Movement of Dredge or Bluff Oysters (Notice No. 5186)

For the purpose of controlling the spread of the disease *Bonamia* sp, a disease affecting dredge or Bluff oysters (*Tiostrea chilensis*)

I HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, pursuant to section 13A of the Animals Act 1967, prohibiting all or any movement of live, in-shell dredge or Bluff Oysters (*Tiostrea chilensis*) into each area described in the First Schedule to this notice from any other area described in the First and Second Schedules to this notice, for a period of 1 year from the date of publication of this notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

I FURTHER GIVE NOTICE, pursuant to section 13A of the Animals Act 1967, prohibiting all or any movement of live, in-shell dredge or Bluff oysters (*Tiostrea chilensis*) from the area described as Area 13 in the Second Schedule to this notice for a period of 1 year from the date of publication of this notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING TO THE CONTRARY IN THIS NOTICE live, in-shell dredge or Bluff oysters may be moved into the area described as Area 6 in the First Schedule to this notice if and only if the oysters are taken from the area described as Area 14 in the Third Schedule to this notice and PROVIDED THAT the oysters may only be taken:

- (i) between the months of December to August inclusive; and
- (ii) with the permission of the Regional Manager Central of the MAF Fisheries division of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries who shall be satisfied, on the advice of a Marine Pathologist of the Fisheries Research Directorate division of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, that the oysters being moved are not affected with or do not harbour *Bonamia* sp.

Movement within any of the areas specified in the First, Second and Third Schedules is not prohibited.

First Schedule

Area 1:

Kermadec Islands

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters around the Kermadec Islands enclosed by a line commencing at a point 34° 34.3' S and 179° 51.0' W on the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone; and then proceeding generally in an easterly, northerly, westerly and southerly direction along the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone to a point 34° 22.1' S and 179° 29.6' E on the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone; and then proceeding in a straight line to the first-mentioned point.

Area 2:

Tirua Point to Cape Runaway

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38° 23' S and 174° 38.5' E); then proceeding in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to a point 37° 35' S and 170° 03' E on the outer boundary of the exclusive

economic zone; then proceeding in a northerly and south-easterly direction along the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone to a point 33° 25' S and 177° 59.4' E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then in a straight line due south to Cape Runaway (at 37° 32' S and 177° 59.4' E); and then proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction along the line of the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all inland waters lying north of a straight line drawn from Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38° 23' S and 174° 38.5' E) proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to Mt Ngauruhoe (at 39° 09.6' S and 175° 38' E); then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction to Mt Raukumara (at 37° 45.9' S and 178° 07.6' E); then proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction to Cape Runaway (at 37° 32' S and 177° 59.4' E); then proceeding in a generally north-westerly and southerly direction along the line of the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement.

Area 3:

Cape Runaway to Cape Palliser

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at 37° 32' S and 177° 59.4' E); then proceeding due north to a point 33° 25' S and 177° 59.4' E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction along the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone to its intersection with the 42° 10' S parallel of latitude; then proceeding due west along latitude 42° 10' S to a point 42° 10' S and 175° 17' E; then proceeding due north to Cape Palliser on the south coast of the North Island at 41° 37' S and 175° 17' E; then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters east of a line commencing at Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at 37° 32' S and 177° 59.4' E) proceeding in a generally south easterly direction to Mt Raukumara at 37° 45.9' S and 178° 07.6' E; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction to Mt Ngauruhoe at 39° 09.6' S and 175° 38' E; and east of a line commencing at Mt Ngauruhoe at 39° 09.6' S and 175° 38' E; proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to Cape Palliser on the south coast of the North Island (at 41° 37' S and 175° 17' E).

Area 4:

Cape Terawhiti to Tirua Point

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Terawhiti on the south coast of the North Island (at 41° 17' S and 174° 37' E); proceeding due south along longitude 174° 37' E to a point 41° 43.8' S and 174° 37' E; then proceeding in a generally north westerly direction to the eastern most point of Brothers Islands at 41° 06.2' S and 174° 26.5' E; then proceeding in a north-westerly direction to the northern most point of Stephens Island at 40° 39.9' S and 174° 00' E; then proceeding north westerly to a point 37° 35' S and 170° 03' E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38° 23' S and 174° 38.5' E); then proceeding in a generally southerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters south and west of a line commencing at Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38° 23' S and 174° 38.5' E) proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to Mt Ngauruhoe at 39° 09.6' S and 175° 38' E; then proceeding in a generally south-

easterly direction to a point $41^{\circ} 0.0' S$ and $175^{\circ} 23' E$; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction to Cape Terawhiti on the south coast of the North Island (at $41^{\circ} 17' S$ and $174^{\circ} 37' E$).

Area 5:

Cape Koamaru to Clarence Point

All New Zealand Fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Koamaru on the north coast of the South Island (at $41^{\circ} 05.5' S$ and $174^{\circ} 23' E$); then proceeding in a south-easterly direction to the eastern most point of Brothers Island at $41^{\circ} 06.2' S$ and $174^{\circ} 26.5' E$; then proceeding in a south-easterly direction to a point $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $174^{\circ} 42' E$; then proceeding due west along latitude $42^{\circ} 10' S$ to Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$); then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the mean high-water mark to West Head at $41^{\circ} 12.9' S$ and $174^{\circ} 18.9' E$, then proceeding north-east to East Head at $41^{\circ} 12.8' S$ and $174^{\circ} 19.4' E$; then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments that are north of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$) and proceeding south-west to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $168^{\circ} 03' E$).

Area 6:

Cape Stephens to Cape Koamaru

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Stephens on the north coast of the South Island (at $40^{\circ} 41.7' S$ and $173^{\circ} 57.5' E$); then proceeding in a north-easterly direction to the southern most point of Stephens Island at $40^{\circ} 40.6' S$ and $173^{\circ} 59.4' E$; then proceeding in a generally northerly direction along the mean high-water mark on the eastern side of Stephens Island to the northern most point of Stephens Island at $40^{\circ} 39.9' S$ and $174^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding in a south-easterly direction to the eastern most point of Brothers Islands at $41^{\circ} 06.2' S$ and $174^{\circ} 26.5' E$; then proceeding in a north west direction to Cape Koamaru at $41^{\circ} 05.5' S$ and $174^{\circ} 23' E$; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the mean high-water mark to East Head at $41^{\circ} 12.8' S$ and $174^{\circ} 19.4' E$; then proceeding in a south-westerly direction to West Head at $41^{\circ} 12.9' S$ and $174^{\circ} 18.9' E$; then proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the Channel Point Light at $40^{\circ} 55.5' S$ and $173^{\circ} 50.1' E$; then proceeding in a northerly direction to Reef Point at French Pass on the east coast of D'Urville Island at $40^{\circ} 55.2' S$ and $173^{\circ} 50.1' E$; then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the mean high-water mark on the east coast of D'Urville Island to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments that are north of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$) and proceeding south west to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $168^{\circ} 03' E$).

Area 7:

Cape Farewell to Cape Stephens

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Pillar Point on Cape Farewell on the north coast of the South Island (at $40^{\circ} 30' S$ and $172^{\circ} 43' E$); then proceeding due north along longitude $172^{\circ} 43' E$ to a point $39^{\circ} 39' S$ and $172^{\circ} 43' E$; then proceeding in a south-westerly direction to the northern most point of Stephens Island at $40^{\circ} 39.9' S$ and $174^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding in a generally southerly direction along the high water mark on the eastern side of Stephens Island to the southern most point of Stephens Island at $40^{\circ} 40.6' S$ and $173^{\circ} 59.4' E$; then

proceeding south-west to Cape Stephens at $40^{\circ} 41.7' S$ and $173^{\circ} 57.5' E$; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the mean high-water mark to Reef Point at French Pass on the east coast of D'Urville Island at $40^{\circ} 55.2' S$ and $173^{\circ} 50.1' E$; then in a southerly direction to the Channel Point Light at $40^{\circ} 55.5' S$ and $173^{\circ} 50.1' E$; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments that are north of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$) and proceeding south-west to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $168^{\circ} 03' E$).

Area 8:

Awarua Point to Cape Farewell

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $168^{\circ} 03' E$); then proceeding due west along latitude $44^{\circ} 16' S$ to the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone to a point $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $162^{\circ} 13' E$; then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone to a point $37^{\circ} 35' S$ and $170^{\circ} 03' E$; then proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to a point $39^{\circ} 39' S$ and $172^{\circ} 43' E$; then proceeding due south along longitude $172^{\circ} 43' E$ to Pillar Point on Cape Farewell on the north coast of the South Island (at $40^{\circ} 30' S$ and $172^{\circ} 43' E$); then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments that are north of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$) and proceeding south west to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at $44^{\circ} 16' S$ and $168^{\circ} 03' E$).

Area 9:

Clarence Point to Waimakariri River

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $173^{\circ} 56' E$); then proceeding due east to the point $42^{\circ} 10' S$ and $176^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding due south to a point $43^{\circ} 23.6' S$ and $176^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding due west to Waimakariri River (at $43^{\circ} 23.6' S$ and $172^{\circ} 42.6' E$); and then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the line of the mean high-water mark of the coast to the point of commencement.

Area 10:

Waimakariri River to Nugget Point

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Waimakariri River (at $43^{\circ} 23.6' S$ and $172^{\circ} 42.6' E$); then proceeding due east to the point $43^{\circ} 23.6' S$ and $176^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding due south to the point $46^{\circ} 00' S$ and $176^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding in a south-westerly direction to the point $46^{\circ} 27' S$ and $174^{\circ} 40' E$; then proceeding due west to Nugget Point (at $46^{\circ} 27' S$ and $169^{\circ} 49' E$); and then proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the line of the mean high-water mark of the coast to the point of commencement.

Area 11:

Nugget Point to Awarua Point

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Nugget Point (at $46^{\circ} 27' S$ and $169^{\circ} 49' E$); then proceeding due east to the point $46^{\circ} 27' S$ and $174^{\circ} 40' E$; then proceeding in a north-easterly direction to the point $46^{\circ} 00' S$ and $176^{\circ} 00' E$; then proceeding due east to the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone along the

latitude 46° 00' S; then proceeding along the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone to the point 44° 16' S and 162° 13' E; then proceeding due east to Awarua Point (at 44° 16' S and 168° 03' E); and then proceeding along the line of the mean high-water mark of the coast in a generally easterly direction to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments south of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at 42° 10' S and 173° 56' E) and proceeding in a south west direction to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at 44° 16' S and 168° 03' E).

Area 12:

Chatham Islands

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at 42° 10' S and 176° 00' E; then proceeding due east to the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone along the latitude 42° 10' S; then proceeding in a generally southerly direction along the outer limits of the exclusive economic zone to a latitude of 46° 00' S; then proceeding due west to the point 46° 00' S and 176° 00' E; and then proceeding in a northerly direction to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments.

Second Schedule

Area 13:

Cape Palliser to Cape Terawhiti

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Palliser on the south coast of the North Island (at 41° 37' S and 175° 17' E); then proceeding due south along longitude 175° 17' E to the 42° 10' S parallel of latitude; then due west along latitude 42° 10' S to the 174° 42' E line of longitude; then proceeding in a north-westerly direction to a point 41° 17' S and 174° 29.4' E; then proceeding due east to Cape Terawhiti on the south coast of the North Island at 41° 17' S and 174° 36.6' E; then proceeding in a generally easterly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters west and south of a line commencing at Cape Palliser on the south coast of the North Island (at 41° 37' S and 175° 17' E) proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction to a point 41° 0.0' S and 175° 23' E; then proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction to Cape Terawhiti on the south coast of the North Island (at 41° 17' S and 174° 37' E).

Separation Point to Cape Farewell

All New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at the light on Separation Point on the north coast of the South Island (at 40° 47.0' S and 172° 59.9' E); then proceeding in a northerly direction to the light on Bush End Point on Farewell Spit at 40° 32.9' S and 173° 00.6' E; then proceeding in a generally west and south direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all those inland waters that flow into this area and that part of their catchments that are north of a line commencing at Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at 42° 10' S and 173° 56' E) and proceeding south

west to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at 44° 16' S and 168° 03' E).

Fisheries Act 1983

Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-Off) Notice 1992, No. 2 (No. 5185)

Pursuant to section 282G of the Fisheries Act 1983, and delegation made pursuant to section 41 of the State Sector Act 1988, the Acting Director (Operations), MAF Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

Notice

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-off) Notice 1992, No. 2.

(2) This notice shall come into effect on the 1st day of November 1992, and shall expire on the 30th day of September 1993.

2. Interpretation—In this notice:

(a) Any reference to Quota Management Area means the appropriate Quota Management Area as defined in the Fisheries (Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches and Catch History) Notice 1986*;

(b) Target species and bycatch species are specified by way of fishstock codes, being Fishstock Codes defined in the Second Schedule of the Fisheries (Reporting) Regulations 1990†; and

(c) Methods are specified by way of method codes, being Method Codes defined in the Second Schedule of the Fisheries (Reporting) Regulations 1990†.

3. Offering a lease of quota in lieu of paying deemed value—As from the date this notice comes into effect, any commercial fisherman who could be required under section 282D of the Fisheries Act 1983 to pay the deemed value of any fish that is specified as a bycatch species in this notice, may offer the Director-General a lease or sublease of the right to take fish, being fish that are specified in this notice as a target species in relation to that bycatch species, as specified in the tables below. The ratios, as specified, are the amounts of target species which may, in lieu of such payments, be accepted by way of lease or sub-lease in relation to the amount of the bycatch species for which the offer of quota is made, e.g., if a fisher could be required to pay deemed value for 1 tonne of ELE 3 and wishes to offer a lease of SCH 3 then the amount that can be offered is 1 tonne × 2.07 = 2.07 tonnes of SCH 3. The bycatch species must have been taken while fishing for the target species using the method or any of the methods specified.

Social Welfare

Social Security Act 1964

Direction by the Minister of Social Welfare

In the matter of section 5 of the Social Security Act 1964:

To: The Director-General of Social Welfare.

Pursuant to section 5 (2) of the Social Security Act 1964, I, Jennifer Mary Shipley, Minister of Social Welfare, HEREBY DIRECT that in the exercise of your discretion to grant a special benefit under section 61G, and without derogating from your duty to have regard for the particular financial circumstances and commitments of the applicant—

I. If, (except in the case of a person to whom clauses II and III apply)—

(a) Either:

(i) in the case of a single person, the applicant possesses cash assets of a value of not more than the equivalent of four times the maximum weekly invalid's benefit rate payable to a single person; or

(ii) in the case of a married couple or a sole parent, the applicant possesses cash assets of a value of not more than the equivalent of four times the maximum weekly invalid's benefit rate payable to a married couple; and

(b) the applicant's chargeable income, after the deduction of his or her fixed costs is less than the appropriate standard income;

you shall be satisfied that payment of a special entitlement to a special benefit is justified if the weekly amount of the special benefit is within the following limits:

(c) an amount equal to the difference between—

(i) the applicant's weekly chargeable income less the applicant's weekly fixed costs; and

(ii) the standard income less \$20 a week (except if you determine there are special circumstances, when the \$20 per week may be disregarded); or

(d) an amount equal to 30 percent of the applicant's fixed costs—

whichever is the lesser amount, but if you determine that exceptional circumstances exist, an amount of special benefit that exceeds 30 percent of the applicant's fixed costs shall be considered justified.

II. In the case of a person with psychiatric or physical disabilities who is in residential care and whose chargeable income is less than the specified amount, you shall be satisfied that a special entitlement of an amount equal to the difference between the specified amount and that person's chargeable income a week less a personal allowance is justified;

III. In the case of a person receiving training benefit who incurs additional costs because he or she is training away from home, you shall be satisfied that a special entitlement is justified of an amount equal to the extra weekly accommodation costs incurred while training away from home or \$100 per week, whichever is the lesser.

For the Purposes of This Direction—

"Cash assets" are assets which can be readily converted into cash and include:

(a) Shares, stocks, debentures, bonus bonds and other bonds;

(b) Bank accounts, including fixed and term deposits and any money invested with a bank or other institution;

(c) The net equity held in any property or land not used as a home;

(d) Building society shares;

(e) Mortgage investments and long term loans;

(f) Shares in partnerships;

but do not include:

(a) a motor car;

(b) a caravan, boat or other vehicle—

(i) the net equity of which is less than \$2,000;

(ii) which is being used by a person or his or her family for day to day accommodation;

(c) personal effects;

"Chargeable income" in relation to an applicant means:

(a) any benefit granted under Part I of the Social Security Act 1964; and

(b) any war disability pension granted under the War Pension's Act 1964; and

(c) National superannuation granted under the Social Welfare (Transitional Provisions) Act 1990; and

(d) veteran's pension granted under the Social Welfare (Transitional Provisions) Act 1990; and

(e) income as defined under section 3 of the Social Security Act 1964.

"Child" has the same meaning as that given to it under the Social Security Act 1964.

"Fixed costs" means any essential expenses of a fixed weekly, monthly or annual amount which cannot readily be avoided or varied and includes—

(a) actual accommodation costs including arrears, provided that any arrears incurred while the person was in receipt of the accommodation benefit or the rent rebate shall be excluded; and

(b) hire purchase or other types of regular payments for washing machines, refrigerators, televisions and essential household furniture; and

(c) disability related expenses; and

(d) attachment orders if a variation, suspension or discharge has been finalised; and

(e) for non-beneficiaries public transport to work, compulsory union fees and child care; and

(f) car repayments and running costs where chronic illness or disability exists in the applicant's family or if no public transport is available; and

(g) for beneficiaries' car repayments if the arrangement to purchase on terms was entered into prior to the applicant applying for a benefit;

"Personal allowance" means—

(a) \$62.50 in the case of a person with physical disabilities; and

(b) \$24.00 in the case of a person with psychiatric disabilities; and

(c) in the case of a person with both physical and psychiatric disabilities—

(i) \$62.50 if that person's disabilities are predominantly physical; and

(ii) \$24.00 if that person's disabilities are predominantly psychiatric.

"Residential care" in respect of a person means care received as a resident in a home either registered under section 18 of the Disabled Persons Community Welfare Act 1975 or approved by the Director-General as meeting the standards required for registration as a home under that Act.

"Specified amount" means—

(a) \$309.62 in the case of a person who requires daily supervision but not the constant presence of a caregiver; and

(b) \$389.62 in the case of a person who requires 24 hour a day supervision and care; and

(c) \$453.62 in the case of a person who requires 24 hour a day supervision and care plus active support and therapy such as day programmes and rehabilitation programmes.

"Standard income" means the appropriate amount set out in the Schedule to this Direction.

In the case of a married couple (including a married couple where one of the spouses is unlawfully resident in New Zealand) the chargeable income, fixed costs and cash assets of the applicant shall include those of his or her spouse.

This Direction shall apply in respect of applications for that benefit received on or after the 22 October 1992, and in respect of any renewals of that benefit on or after that date.
