Education (Corporal Punishment) (John Carter)

Summary of Bills Introduced

Education (Corporal Punishment) Bill

Requires all Boards of Trustees to specify in school charters a policy on acceptance or otherwise of corporal punishment.

Also provides for amendment to the Crimes Act 1961 to permit the use of reasonable force against children by principals and any person delegated by a principal.

Mixed Member Proportional Representation Referendum Bill

Provides for the holding, in the year 1993, of a referendum on the reform of the electoral system to introduce mixed member proportional representation. The referendum is to be held on Saturday, 27 March 1993.

Many of the provisions are of a machinery nature relating to the taking of the referendum. However, clause 30 has a mechanism which puts an affirmative result for mixed member proportional representation in place for the 1993 General Election. Clause 29 provides for preparatory boundary work to be done by the Representation Commission.

The First Schedule gives a proposed form of mixed member proportional representation. The Second Schedule gives the form of the voting paper to be used in the referendum.

Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988

Termination of Dumping Investigation: Steel Reinforcing Bar from India

Pursuant to section 11 (1) of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, the Secretary of Commerce hereby gives notice of the termination of the dumping investigation in respect of a dumping complaint lodged by the New Zealand steel reinforcing bar industry against imports of steel reinforcing bar from India, as described in the Notice of Initiation of Dumping Investigation of 18 September 1992.

The Secretary is satisfied, as a result of investigations carried out, that the goods from India which were under investigation, being steel reinforcing bar imported from Tata Iron and Steel Co. Ltd., are not goods in respect of which a determination may be made under the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, for the reason that the New Zealand steel reinforcing bar industry has withdrawn its complaint. The Secretary is satisfied that there is insufficient evidence that material injury is being caused or threatened as a result of the importation from India of the goods subject to the investigation.

Broadcasting Act 1989

Direction to the Broadcasting Commission

To the Broadcasting Commission

Pursuant to section 44 of the Broadcasting Act 1989, I hereby give you notice that it is part of the general policy of the

Government in relation to broadcasting that sound radio broadcasting services should be available in Auckland that promote Maori language and culture primarily to rangatahi (young Maori).

Pursuant to that policy I direct that, in the year ending with the close of 30 June 1993, you shall provide funding support to a total value of \$400,000 (excluding goods and services tax) for the operational expenses of the sound radio broadcasting service known as Mai FM88. Of that amount, \$200,000 (excluding goods and services tax) shall be provided in lieu of the total amount that, but for this direction, you would have provided for Mai FM88 in its third year of operation.

Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977

Waimea Rural Fire District Notice 1992

Pursuant to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, the National Rural Fire Authority hereby makes the following notice.

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Waimea Rural Fire District Notice 1992.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the 28th day after notification in the New Zealand Gazette.
- 2. Interpretation—In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977:
 - "Committee" means the Waimea Rural Fire Committee:
 - "District" means the Waimea Rural Fire District:
 - "Zone" means such lands as are so delineated in the Schedule:

Constitution of the Rural Fire District

- 3. Declaration of Rural Fire District—(1) The seven zones, and the areas enclosed therein specified in the Schedule to this notice, are hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district to be known as the Waimea Rural Fire District.
- (2) The Waimea Rural Fire District shall be administered for the purpose of the Act by a rural fire committee known as the Waimea Rural Fire Committee.
- (3) The committee shall consist of eleven members as follows:
- (a) Two persons appointed by the Baigent Forest Industries Limited, in writing, signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof; and
- (b) Two persons appointed by Tasman Forestry Limited, in writing, signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof; and
- (c) One person appointed in writing, by the Tasman District
- (d) One person appointed, in writing, by the Nelson City Council; and
- (e) Two persons appointed, in writing, Director-General of the Department of Conservation; and
- (f) One person resident in the district to represent the interests of other residents and ratepayers and appointed, in writing, by the Tasman District Council; and
- (g) One person appointed, in writing, by the Federated Farmers of New Zealand (Nelson Province) Incorporated; and
- (h) One person appointed, in writing, by the Chief Executive of the New Zealand Fire Service.
- 4. Operations of the committee—(1) The committee shall hold a annual general meeting in August of each year.
- (2) The committee shall elect a chairperson at the annual general meeting.
- (3) The committee shall hold a general meeting every three
- 5. Fire officer appointments—(1) The office of the principal rural fire officer shall be appointed at the annual general meeting each year.
- (2) If any committee member is appointed to the office of the principal rural fire officer the representative's organisation

may appoint a person to replace the member on the committee.

6. Restricted fire season—The period between the 1st day of October in any one year and the 30th day of September in the following year (both days inclusive) is hereby declared to be a restricted fire season in the district.

Amendment of Rural Fire District—(1) The notice constituting the New Zealand Timberlands Rural Fire District made on 28th day of February 1992 (e) (hereinafter in this clause together with all amendment thereto, referred to as the principal notice) is hereby amended by revoking clause 5 of the notice, and substituting the following clause:
- "5. The committee shall consist of five members as follows:

Notes to the Financial Statements for the period ended 31 March 1992

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The ASB Bank Community Trust ("the Trust") was formed on 30 May 1988 through the creation of a trust deed in compliance with the Trustee Banks Restructuring Act 1988. Under the terms of the trust deed the Trust was settled with 60 million \$1 fully paid ordinary shares in ASB Bank Limited representing 100% of the issued capital. As at 31 March 1988 the

net tangible asset backing of those 60 million shares was \$147,655,000. Subsequently 45 million shares were sold in 1989 to the Commonwealth Bank of Australia for \$252,000,000 which was then donated to the ASB Charitable Trust.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The measurement basis adopted is that of historical cost adjusted for the revaluation of certain assets. Reliance is placed on the fact that the Trust is a going concern. Accrual accounting is used to match income and expenditure.

PARTICULAR ACCOUNTING POLICIES Bank

Bank is stated as the balance in the bank account rather than the balance as per the cash book.

Depreciation

Office equipment and furniture were depreciated on a diminishing value basis.

Dividends

Dividends are recognised as income when they are received by the Trust, and include imputation tax credits if any.

Donations

Donations are accounted for as they are distributed or committed to be distributed to eligible organisations as approved by the Trustees except that where donations approved are payable over a number of accounting periods the future donations payable are accounted for in the year in which they are paid.

Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets were valued at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Investments

Investments in shares are valued at the net tangible asset backing as disclosed in the latest published accounts. Any revaluation difference is transferred direct to an investment revaluation reserve.

Taxation

Taxation includes both current and deferred tax. Deferred tax is calculated using the liability method.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have not been any material changes in accounting policy during this accounting period.

ASB CHARITABLE TRUST

Notes to the Financial Statements for the period ended 31 March 1992

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The ASB Charitable Trust ("the Trust") was formed on 31 May 1989 through the creation of a trust deed by the ASB Bank Community Trust and a donation of \$252,000,000.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The measurement basis adopted is that of historical cost adjusted for the revaluation of certain assets. Reliance is placed on the fact that the Trust is a going concern. Accrual accounting is used to match income and expenditure.

PARTICULAR ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Bank is stated as the balance in the bank account rather than the balance as per the cash book.

Currency Hedges

All hedging contracts are revalued using the New Zealand dollar rate at balance date and all realised and unrealised gains and losses are recognised in income and expenditure for the period.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided over the useful life of the assets. The rates used

Buildings 2.5% straight line basis
Vehicle, office equipment & furniture 20% diminishing value basis

Dividends

Dividends are recognised as income when they are received by the Trust and exclude imputation tax credits.

Donations

Donations are accounted for as they are distributed or committed to be distributed to eligible organisations as approved by the Trustees. Where donations approved are payable over a number of accounting periods the future donations payable are accounted for in the year in which they are paid.

Expenses

Some expenses are shared jointly with the ASB Bank Community Trust. Whilst each Trust bears its own specific costs, the joint expenses are allocated between the Trusts on the basis of the number of applications processed by each.

Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Foreign Currencies

All amounts denominated in foreign currencies are converted to New Zealand dollars at balance date and all realised and unrealised gains and losses are recognised in income and expenditure for the period.

Investments

Investments are stated at market value. Any unrealised gains or losses are recognised in income and expenditure for the period.

Investment transactions are recorded by the Fund Managers on a settlement date basis. Unsettled transactions are disclosed in the Notes as commitments.

Reserves

The Investent Fluctuation Reserve consists of unrealised gains, which are recognised as income for the period. Transfers to all other Reserves from the Unallocated Surplus are made at the discretion of the Trustees.

Taxation

The Trust has been accorded tax exempt status in New Zealand and Australia but is liable to taxation on investment income in some other overseas countries. Tax on overseas income is accounted for as a reduction of that income.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have not been any material changes in accounting policies in this accounting period.
