Summary of Bills Introduced

Electoral Amendment (No. 3)

Amends the Electoral Act 1956, arising from recommendations made by the Electoral Law Committee in its report on the inquiry into the 1990 General Election (I. 17B).

Amendments include:

- (a) Reducing from 17 years 9 months to 17 years of age at which a person may make a provisional enrolment;
- (b) Changing in the deadline for enrolment from 4 p.m. on the day before polling day to writ day;
- (c) Altering the exception that applies in relation to the offence of processing, manipulating, or otherwise changing electoral information;
- (d) Increasing from \$200 to \$300 in the deposit payable by a candidate;
- (e) Requiring that public schools used as polling places be reimbursed for the cost of heating and lighting on polling day;
- (f) Altering the provision relating to blind, disabled, and illiterate voters so that any person to whom the provision applies may receive assistance in marking the ballot paper;
- (g) Increasing from \$200 to \$1,000 in the deposit payable when an application is made for a recount of votes; and
- (h) New procedures for the counting of votes.

Energy Legislation Amendment

Amends the Crown Minerals Act 1991 and the Ministry of Energy (Abolition) Act 1989. The more significant amendments are:

- —The bill ensures that private mineral owners will be given the same rights as owners and occupiers of surface land for activities greater than minimum impact activities.
- —The bill amends the Crown Minerals Act to enable a permit holder to be authorised to carry out geophysical surveys over unpermitted land adjacent to the permit.
- ----The bill allows enforcement officers under the Crown Minerals Act to enter unpermitted land to investigate illegal mining of Crown owned minerals.

War Pensions (Grounds for Payment)

Provides for the War Pensions Act 1954 to be amended to extend grounds for payment of war pensions to members of the Armed Forces injured as a result of New Zealand's participation in peacekeeping and peacemaking operations.

Greytown District Trust Lands Amendment

Seeks to reorganise the district of the trust to fit into the new boundaries resulting from the local government electoral boundary and ward changes. To this end, the bill provides for:

- -a transitional membership of the trust to be set up;
- -land to be held in trust for the purposes of physical and social welfare;

-members attending meetings to be paid a fee;

- -the exchange of lands to include lands outside the trust district; and
- -the capital received from the sale of trust's land to be held in a special reserve account.

Appropriation (Financial Review)

Provides for the sanction, validation and confirmation of financial matters relating to the financial year ended to the 30th day of June 1992.

Wildlife Amendment

Amends the Wildlife Act 1953 and facilitates the establishment of a game bird habitat stamp programme modelled on the United States programme. The sale of stamps, which are not postage stamps, is to be managed by the New Zealand Fish and Game Council and district fish and game councils. The New Zealand Bird Habitat Trust Board is also to be established. This board is to be charged with holding and allocating stamp revenue in accordance with regulations.

Air Facilitation

Amends the Customs Act 1966 and the Immigration Act 1987 to enable customs and immigration checks to be made on internationally ticketed passengers flying on international flights travelling between two New Zealand Customs airports, and which form part of the domestic sector of their travel.

The Methodist Church Property Trust Amendment Bill

Notice to Introduce Bill

Radio Regulations 1987

Radio Regulations (General Licence for Citizen Radio Apparatus) Notice 1993

Pursuant to regulation 11 of the Radio Regulations 1987 ("the principal regulations"), acting under delegated authority from the Secretary of Commerce, I hereby give the following notice:

Notice

1. Short title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Radio Regulations (General Licence for Citizen Radio Apparatus) Notice 1993.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1993.

2. General licence—A general licence under regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby granted in respect of the installation, operation, and use, by persons in New Zealand, for the purpose of communication with one another over short distances, of radio apparatus intended for the transmission and reception of radiocommunications within New Zealand on frequencies between 26.30 MHz and 26.80 MHz.

3. Terms, conditions and restrictions—(1) The frequencies available for use under this licence shall be those specified in the Schedule to this notice.

(2) The following technical conditions apply:

Designation of Emissions:

2K80J3EJN-SSB (Single-sideband, suppressed carrier); or

2K80R3EJN—SSB (Single-sideband, reduced carrier); or

6K00A3EJN-DSB (Double-sideband)

Maximum Power:

SSB 12 watts peak envelope power (pX)

DSB 4 watts carrier power (pZ)

(3) This licence applies only to apparatus which complies with technical specification RFS23 (Issue 3, December 1988) and in respect of which a Certificate of Compliance (Type Approval or Type Acceptance) has been issued by the Secretary.

(4) Operators of radio apparatus pursuant to this licence shall, during transmissions, clearly identify themselves. The Secretary may, on request of an operator, provide a suitable callsign.

4. Period of Validity of Licence—This licence shall expire on 31 March 1998.

5. Consequential revocation of licences—Citizen Radio Station Licences and Citizen Radio Apparatus Licences granted under the principal regulations on or after the 1st day of January 1988, and before the close of the 31st day of March 1993 are hereby revoked.

Social Security Act 1964

Direction by the Minister of Social Welfare

In the matter of section 5 of the Social Security Act 1964:

To: The Director-General of Social Welfare.

Pursuant to section 5 (2) of the Social Security Act 1964, I, Jennifer Mary Shipley, Minister of Social Welfare, HEREBY DIRECT that in the exercise of your discretion to grant a special benefit under section 61G, and without derogating from your duty to have regard for the particular financial circumstances and commitments of the applicant—

I. If, (except in the case of a person to whom clauses II and III apply)—

(a) Either:

- (i) in the case of a single person, the applicant possesses cash assets of a value of not more than the equivalent of four times the maximum weekly invalid's benefit rate payable to a single person; or
- (ii) in the case of a married couple or a sole parent, the applicant possesses cash assets of a value of not more than the equivalent of four times the maximum weekly invalid's benefit rate payable to a married couple; and

(b) the applicant's chargeable income, after the deduction of his or her fixed costs is less than the appropriate standard income;

you shall be satisfied that payment of a special entitlement to a special benefit is justified if the weekly amount of the special benefit is within the following limits:

(c) an amount equal to the difference between-

(i) the applicant's weekly chargeable income less the applicant's weekly fixed costs; and

(ii) the standard income less \$20 a week (except if you determine there are special circumstances, when the \$20 per week may be disregarded); or

(d) an amount equal to 30 percent of the applicant's fixed costs—

whichever is the lesser amount, but if you determine that exceptional circumstances exist, an amount of special benefit that exceeds 30 percent of the applicant's fixed costs shall be considered justified.

II. In the case of a person with psychiatric or physical disabilities who is in residential care and whose chargeable income is less than the specified amount, you shall be satisfied that a special entitlement of an amount equal to the difference between the specified amount and that person's chargeable income a week less a personal allowance is justified;

III. In the case of a person receiving training benefit who incurs additional costs because he or she is training away from home, you shall be satisfied that a special entitlement is justified of an amount equal to the extra weekly accommodation costs incurred while training away from home or 100 per week, whichever is the lesser.

For the Purposes of This Direction-

"Cash assets" are assets which can be readily converted into cash and include:

(a) Shares, stocks, debentures, bonus bonds and other bonds;

(b) Bank accounts, including fixed and term deposits and any money invested with a bank or other institution;

(c) The net equity held in any property or land not used as a home;

(d) Building society shares;

(e) Mortgage investments and long term loans;

(f) Shares in partnerships;

but do not include:

- (a) a motor car;
- (b) a caravan, boat or other vehicle-
- (i) the net equity of which is less than \$2,000; or
- (ii) which is being used by a person or his or her family for day to day accommodation;
- (c) personal effects;

"Chargeable income" in relation to an applicant means:

(a) any benefit granted under Part I of the Social Security Act 1964; and

(b) any war disability pension granted under the War Pension's Act 1964; and

(c) National superannuation granted under the Social Welfare (Transitional Provisions) Act 1990; and

(d) veteran's pension granted under the Social Welfare (Transitional Provisions) Act 1990; and

(e) income as defined under section 3 of the Social Security Act 1964.

"Child" has the same meaning as that given to it under the Social Security Act 1964.

"Fixed costs" means any essential expenses of a fixed weekly, monthly or annual amount which cannot readily be avoided or varied and includes—

(a) actual accommodation costs including arrears, provided that any arrears incurred while the person was in receipt of the accommodation benefit or the rent rebate shall be excluded; and

(b) hire purchase or other types of regular payments for washing machines, refrigerators, televisions and essential household furniture; and

(c) disability related expenses; and

(d) attachment orders if a variation, suspension or discharge has been finalised; and

(e) for non-beneficiaries public transport to work, compulsory union fees and child care; and

(f) car repayments and running costs where chronic illness or disability exists in the applicant's family or if no public transport is available; and

(g) for beneficiaries' car repayments if the arrangement to purchase on terms was entered into prior to the applicant applying for a benefit;

"Personal allowance" means-

(a) 63.32 in the case of a person with physical disabilities; and

(b) 24.32 in the case of a person with psychiatric disabilities; and

(c) in the case of a person with both physical and psychiatric disabilities—

Standard

- (i) \$63.32 if that person's disabilities are predominantly physical; and
- (ii) \$24.32 if that person's disabilities are predominantly psychiatric.

"Residential care" in respect of a person means care received as a resident in a home either registered under section 18 of the Disabled Persons Community Welfare Act 1975 or approved by the Director-General as meeting the standards required for registration as a home under that Act.

"Specified amount" means-

(a) \$313.71 in the case of a person who requires daily supervision but not the constant presence of a caregiver; and

(b) \$394.76 in the case of a person who requires 24 hour a day supervision and care; and

(c) \$459.61 in the case of a person who requires 24 hour a day supervision and care plus active support and therapy such as day programmes and rehabilitation programmes.

"Standard income" means the appropriate amount set out in the Schedule to this Direction.

In the case of a married couple (including a married couple where one of the spouses is unlawfully resident in New Zealand) the chargeable income, fixed costs and cash assets of the applicant shall include those of his or her spouse.

This Direction shall apply in respect of applications for that benefit received on or after the 1st day of April 1993, and in respect of any renewals of that benefit on or after that date.
