### **Summary of Bills Introduced**

#### Appropriation (No. 7)

Provides for the issue and supply of certain sums of public money, and authorises expenses to be incurred in relation to certain classes of outputs and categories of other expenses, for the year ending 30 June 1993.

#### Imprest Supply (No. 7)

Provides for the issue and application of certain amounts of public money towards the service of the year ending 30 June 1994, and authorises expenses to be incurred in that year.

#### Palmerston North Reserves Empowering Amendment

Amends the Palmerston North Reserves Empowering Act 1966 by allowing the Palmerston North City Council to sell land vested in the Corporation of the City of Palmerston North by section 3 of the principal Act, and for the sale of land described in the Third Schedule of that Act. The proceeds of the sale of land listed in that Schedule is to be paid to the Palmerston North Reserves Sale Account and used in the acquisition, establishment and maintenance of a horticultural nursery for use in relation to reserves, parks, domains and gardens administered by the Council.

Methodist Church Property Trust Amendment

Amends the Wesleyan Methodist Church Property Trust Act 1887 by removing the term "Wesleyan" from the principal Act and subsequent amendment Acts. The bill also seeks to validate the holding of land by the church which has been held in ways other than by trustees under the Wesleyan Methodist Model Deed of New Zealand 1887. The bill would authorise the present and future holdings of lands either by trustees under the Model Deed, or with the approval of the Conference of the Church, by any church board incorporated under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957, or in any such other manner as approved by the conference.

## Overseas Investment Commission

### Overseas Investment Regulations 1985

### The Overseas Investment Exemption Notice 1993 No. 1

Pursuant to the Overseas Investment Regulations 1985, the Overseas Investment Commission hereby gives the following notice.

#### Notice

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Overseas Investment Exemption Notice 1993 No. 1.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- **2.** Interpretation—(1) In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - "Specified person" means any company which is an overseas person which would not be an overseas person if Carter Holt Harvey Limited were not an overseas person:
  - "The regulations" means the Overseas Investment Regulations 1985.
- (2) Terms or expression used in this notice shall have the same meaning as they have in the regulations.
- 3. Exemption from Part I of the Regulations—Every person is exempt from the provisions of Part I of the regulations in respect of the issue of shares to, or the allotment of shares subscribed for by:
  - (a) A specified person, or
  - (b) Carter Holt Harvey Limited.
- 4. Exemption from Parts II or III of the Regulations—
  (1) Carter Holt Harvey Limited and every specified person is exempt from the provisions of Part II (except regulation 16) and Part III of the regulations.
- (2) Every person is exempt from the provisions of regulation 16 of the regulations in respect of the provision of any contract or agreement which provides for the transfer of shares in a company to:
  - (a) A specified person, or
  - (b) Carter Holt Harvey Limited.

#### **Explanatory Note:**

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, exempts persons who issue or allot shares to any specified person, or to Carter Holt Harvey Limited from Part I of the Overseas Investment Regulations 1985. The term "specified person" is defined to mean a company which is an overseas person under the regulations but which would not be an overseas person if Carter Holt Harvey Limited were not an overseas person.

The notice exempts Carter Holt Harvey Limited and specified persons from the requirements of Part II (except regulation 16) of the regulations (which relates to takeovers by overseas persons) and from Part III of the Regulations (which relates to the acquisition by an overseas person of assets used in carrying on a business).

The notice also exempts persons from compliance with regulation 16 in relation to any contract or agreement which provides for the transfer of shares in a company to a specified person or to Carter Holt Harvey Limited.
