Summary of Bills Introduced

Ozone Layer Protection Amendment (No. 2)

Amends the Ozone Layer Protection Act 1990, to give effect to decisions made in Copenhagen in November 1992 to adjust the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer. Effect has already been given to some of those decisions by way of Orders in Council made under the principal Act. Most of the bill is to come into force on assent.

The principal effects of the bill are as follows:

- (a) The establishment of a new procedure to enable the importation of "used or recycled" bulk controlled substances without an import permit:
- (b) A requirement that imports and exports of "used or recycled" bulk controlled substances be notified to the Minister of Commerce:
- (c) New rules to control the importation of bulk halons, to take effect from 1 January 1994.

Finance Bill (No. 7)

Contains provisions relating to the indexation of excise duties for alcoholic beverages and tobacco products (Part I), the establishment of a new system for setting excise and tariff duties on beer (Part II), the validation of certain increases in rentals payable in respect of tenancies of State housing land (Part III), and the audit of the accounts of the New Zealand Dairy Board (Part IV).

By leave this bill was divided into two bills: Finance Bill (No. 7), consisting of Parts III and IV; and Finance Bill (No. 8), consisting of Parts I and II and the Schedules. Finance Bill (No. 8) was referred to the Finance and Expenditure Committee.

Antarctica (Environmental Protection)

Implements the Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty. The enactment of this bill will enable New Zealand to ratify the Protocol.

The bill seeks to ban prospecting, exploration and mining in Antarctica. It will require organisers of all expeditions to inform the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade, and for the Minister to give directions in respect of an expedition's proposed activities. Also contained is the general requirement that an environmental impact assessment be prepared for expeditions, and rules relating to waste disposal and the prevention of marine pollution.

The bill will also apply to both New Zealanders and non-New Zealanders in the Ross Dependency, and elsewhere in Antarctica subject to certain criteria.

Arts Council of New Zealand

Provides for the disollution of the Queen Elizabeth the Second Arts Council of New Zealand and for the establishment of the Arts Council of New Zealand and two arts boards, the Arts Board and Te Waka Toi. The purpose of the Council and the boards includes the support of the arts in New Zealand for the benefit of all New Zealanders, recognition of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the people of New Zealand, and the role of Maori as tangata whenua in the arts.

The bill also outlines the membership, functions, powers and funding of the Council and arts boards.

Crimes Amendment (No. 5)

Amends the Crimes Act 1961 to provide that the maximum term of imprisonment for all forms of sexual violation, as defined in section 128 (1), will be 20 years.

Approving Amendments of the Bylaws of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy

CATHERINE A. TIZARD, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 28th day of June 1993

Present:

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Whereas by Letters Patent of Her Majesty The Queen, dated the 16th day of September 1955, the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy (hereinafter called the Institute) was, by Charter passed under the Great Seal, established, created, and incorporated into a body corporate and public: And whereas by clause 15 of the said Charter it is provided that the majority of the corporate members present in person or by proxy and voting at a general meeting of the Institute specially called for the purpose of which due notice has been given shall have power from time to time to make such bylaws as shall seem requisite and convenient for the regulation, government, and advantage of the Institute its members and property and for the furtherance of its objects and purposes, and from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend any bylaw or bylaws previously made but so that the same be not repugnant to the Charter or to the laws and Statutes of Australia and New Zealand or any State or Territory thereof: And whereas it is further provided by clause 15 of the said Charter that no such bylaws, revocation, alteration, or amendment shall take effect until approved by the Governors-General-in-Council of Australia and New Zealand: And whereas certain bylaws were made in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter on the 30th day of November 1956 and were approved, as required by the Charter, on the 25th day of September 1957: And whereas the said bylaws subsequently have been amended from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter and the amendments approved, as required by the Charter: And whereas the said bylaws as so amended were further amended in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter by resolution of general meetings of the Institute specially called for the purpose of which due notice had been given and held on the 16th day of August 1989 and the 17th day of July 1992.

Now therefore, Her Excellency the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby approves the said further amendments of the bylaws of the Institute as set out under each respective heading in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule

Bylaw 10 (c)-

(c) have held a position of major responsibility in the mining and/or metallurgical industries, government, educational or research organisations for a minimum of 15 years during which time he has achieved distinction by some definite personal contribution to the science and practice of these industries either through personal participation in technical activities or through administrative direction and leadership of qualified technical personnel, and be not less than forty-five years of age.

Bulaw 24-

24. Every person or organisation shall become a member of The Institute in the grade to which they are elected upon receipt of ballots as defined in Bylaw 23.

Bylaw 28-

- 28. (1) In this Bylaw, "Ethics complaint" means a complaint that a member of The Institute has breached the Code of Ethics or Code for Consultants prevailing at the relevant time and "Ethics Committee" means a committee of not less than five members of the Council appointed by the Council from time to time to hear and determine ethics complaints.
 - (2) An ethics complaint shall be referred to the Ethics Committee for hearing and determination as expeditiously as is reasonable.
 - (3) A member against whom an ethics complaint is made shall be entitled to notice in writing of the grounds of the complaint and to a reasonable opportunity to be heard in respect of such complaint before the Ethics Committee, and the procedure to be adopted in respect of an ethics complaint shall be in the discretion of the Ethics Committee.
 - (4) At the conclusion of the hearing of an ethics complaint, the Ethics Committee may find that the complaint has not been established, or may find that the complaint has been established, in which case the Ethics Committee may decide to take no further action, or it may warn or reprimand the member concerned or suspend the membership of the member

- concerned for a period not exceeding 12 months, or resolve that the member be expelled from The Institute.
- (5) A resolution of the Ethics Committee that a member be expelled shall not take effect until such resolution is confirmed by an ordinary resolution of the Council of The Institute, and the member concerned shall be given the opportunity to be heard by the Council before it decides whether or not to adopt any such resolution of the Ethics Committee.
- (6) A member who is dissatisfied with a decision on an ethics complaint by the Ethics Committee adverse to that member may by notice in writing delivered to the Chief Executive Officer of The Institute within sixty days of the giving of such a decision (or within such later time as the Council may by ordinary resolution allow) appeal against such decision.
- (7) The Council shall proceed to hear and determine an appeal from a decision of the Ethics Committee as expeditiously as is reasonable. The member appealing shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard on the appeal, but otherwise the procedure to be adopted shall be in the discretion of the Council. The Council shall decide the appeal by ordinary resolution, and shall in reaching a decision as to what should be the outcome of the ethics complaint giving rise to the appeal have all of the powers of the Ethics Committee, and may, within those powers, decide to vary the penalty that was imposed by the Ethics Committee.
- (8) On the hearing of an appeal by the Council, and in considering whether or not to confirm a resolution of the Ethics Committee that a member be expelled, the Council shall be provided with a record of the proceedings before the Ethics Committee, including the evidence, and shall be bound by any findings of fact made by the Ethics Committee, unless it is persuaded that it would be manifestly unjust for it to do so, and it shall not be necessary for the evidence before the Ethics Committee to be recalled before the Council.
- (9) In any proceeding under this Bylaw neither the Ethics Committee nor the Council shall be bound by the rules of evidence and each shall proceed with as little formality and technicality and as much expedition as a fair consideration permits.
- (10) The Ethics Committee or the Council may direct that any finding made by the Ethics Committee or the Council (as the case may be) made against a member as a result of an ethics complaint be reported to members in a publication of The Institute, or be reported to appropriate regulatory authorities.
- (11) A member about whom an ethics complaint has been made and which is subsequently dismissed may publicise that dismissal to the same extent as any publicity given the lodging of the ethics complaint.
- (12) The Council may from time to time make or amend Guidelines to assist members in the implementation of this Bylaw. Such Guidelines must not be inconsistent with this Bylaw.
- (13) All members are bound by a determination of the Ethics Committee or the Council made pursuant to this Bylaw.
- (14) Notwithstanding the above, if a member against whom the Council has made an adverse resolution in respect of an ethics complaint is dissatisfied with that resolution, the member shall have the right to appeal to the President of The Institute of Arbitrators Australia to appoint an arbitrator to make a determination in accordance with the procedures of that Institute. The determination of the arbitrator

- shall be accepted by the Council and by every person concerned
- (15) A member about whom an ethics complaint is made may be represented at any hearing of that ethics complaint or any appeal by a duly qualified legal practitioner.

Bylaw 31—

31. Entrance and transfer fees and annual subscriptions shall be fixed on the recommendation of Council. Council may increase subscriptions in any one year by up to 10 percent without calling an Extraordinary General Meeting of the membership. Should Council resolve to increase subscriptions by more than 10 percent it shall seek approval of the membership.

A member who has reached the age of 60 years and has a combined age plus years of paid subscription amounting to 95 may apply to pay a reduced annual subscription equal to 25 percent of the annual subscription payable by the grade of member to which he belongs. In special cases the Council may waive these requirements.

A member with at least five years service who has reached the age of 55 years and has retired or substantially retired may apply to pay a reduced annual subscription equal to 50 percent of the normal annual subscription for the grade of membership. Substantial retirement means that professional income is less than ten percent of the pre-retirement professional income.

Bylaw 59-

59. The Council may appoint a Finance and Audit Committee as a sub-committee of the Executive Committee. It shall consist of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, the Honorary Treasurer, the Chief Executive Officer and one Councillor. The Finance and Audit Committee shall submit its recommendations for approval at the next meeting of the Executive Committee unless already charged by the Executive Committee to take that decision.

Bylaw 72—

72. Voting for Candidates—The names of all candidates for election to the Council shall be listed on the ballot paper in random lot. A voter shall strike out the names on the list of such persons for whom he does not intend to vote. Any ballot paper which has been returned showing more names than there are vacancies shall be deemed invalid.

Bylaw 75-

75. Any ballot paper received after forty (40) days from the date of posting from The Institute shall be deemed to be invalid. All ballot papers received within forty (40) days shall be opened and examined by two scrutineers appointed by the Council who shall report the results to the Council. The ballot papers shall be destroyed by the Scrutineers after they have certified the results and Council has ratified this decision.

Objectives of the Trust: To receive income and allocate such income for charitable, cultural, philanthropic, recreational and other purposes, being purposes beneficial to the community principally in the Bay of Plenty area.

Policies and Structure of the Trust: A charitable trust designed to administer capital and distribute income for charitable purposes in the Bay of Plenty area.

Activities of the Trust: As in previous years, the trust has continued the policy of selecting a number of projects in each region to receive large donations and providing smaller amounts to many other organisations. Although income for the year was less than in the previous year the total amount distributed was up slightly. In all, \$432,258 was donated to community organisations throughout the Bay of Plenty.

Review of Results and Financial Position of the Trust: Dividends of \$702,675 were received from Trust Bank New Zealand during the year. By comparison with the previous year, interest income increased whilst operating expenditure was held to a similar level. Donations increased from 59 percent of income to just over 61 percent, with the remaining funds being invested to provide an operating income and contingency reserve. The net surplus for the year was \$275,605, bringing the accumulated trust fund to \$9,978,165.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

General Accounting Policies

The general accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

- The measurement base adopted is the historical cost basis.
- Reliance has been placed on the fact that the entity is a going concern.
- The matching of revenues earned and expenses incurred using accrual accounting except that dividend income is accounted for on a receipts basis.

Particular Accounting Policies

The following are the particular accounting policies which have a material effect on the measurement of results and financial position:

- (a) Dividend Income: Dividend income from Trust Bank New Zealand Limited is included in the income and expenditure account when it is received.
- (b) Donations: Donations made are included in the income and expenditure account when paid.
- (c) Investments: Shares held in Trust Bank New Zealand Limited are stated at cost.

Government stocks are stated at cost less discounts or premiums amortised over the term of the investment on a straight-line basis.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in the previous year.

Notes to the Financial Statement for the Year Ended 31 March 1993

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

General Accounting Policies

The following general accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

- (i) The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost, except for the revaluation of fixed interest Government and local authorities securities. Reliance is placed on the fact that the trust is a going concern.
- (ii) The matching of revenue earned and expenses incurred using accrual accounting concepts.

Specific Accounting Policies

Depreciation—Depreciation has been charged in the financial statements using rates which will write off the cost of assets less their estimated residual value over their estimated economic lives. The depreciation rates used are:

Plant and equipment 20 percent cp Motor vehicles 20 percent cp . . 20 percent cp Computer

Fixed Assets—Fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Dividend Income—Dividend income from Trust Bank New Zealand Limited is included in the income and expenditure statement when it is received.

Donations—Donations are generally included in the income and expenditure statement when paid. Exceptions are made where a one-off commitment is to be paid soon after balance date, and its funding size warrants disclosure in the current year's results.

Investments—Shares held in Trust Bank New Zealand Limited are stated at cost. Government and local authorities securities are shown at market value.

Taxation—For taxation purposes the trust is deemed to be a charitable organisation. Its income is not subject to taxation.

Goods and Services Tax—The trust is not registered for G.S.T. purposes and therefore the financial statements have been prepared on a G.S.T. inclusive basis.

Changes in Accounting Policies-There have been no changes in accounting policy. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in the previous year.
