**Private Bills****Ngati Rarua - Atiawa Iwi Trust Empowering Bill**

Notice is hereby given by the Trustees of the Ngati Rarua - Atiawa Iwi Trust of their intention to apply for leave to introduce into the House of Representatives a private bill, under the Short Title of "The Ngati Rarua - Atiawa Iwi Trust Empowering Act 1993", during the present session of Parliament.

The objects of the Bill are as follows:

- i. To give effect to a resolution by the Nelson Diocesan Synod of the Anglican Church to vest the assets of the Whakarewa School Trust Board (also spelt as Wakarewa School Trust Board) in a trust for the descendants of the

original Maori owners from whom those assets were acquired being the Ngati Rarua - Atiawa manawhenua ki Motueka iwi.

- ii. To vest certain funds received by the Whakarewa School Trust Board after the land was acquired in 1853 which were not derived from the said land, in the Nelson Diocesan Trust Board for charitable social service purposes.

- iii. To enable the consequential dissolution of the Whakarewa School Trust Board.

- iv. To ensure an ongoing entitlement for any other hapu or iwi to be included as beneficiaries of the trust if a decision

in their favour is able to be obtained from the Waitangi Tribunal, Maori Appellate Court, the High Court or any other Court of competent jurisdiction and to retain the right of any hapu or iwi to bring or continue any such claim before such Tribunal or Court seeking an entitlement.

#### Background:

- a. In 1853 certain lands comprising in total 1078 acres or thereabouts were the subject of Crown grants and were vested in the then Bishop of New Zealand of the Anglican Church for the purpose of establishing a school on certain terms.
- b. No compensation was paid to the then Maori owners for the appropriation of the land the subject of the grants.
- c. No school has ever been erected on the land. A school operated intermittently supported by income from the land but not since the last century.
- d. Whakarewa School Trust Board was incorporated as an Anglican Church Trust in 1907.
- e. The Whakarewa School Trust Board administers the original land assets and other assets and bequests acquired by the Church or it subsequent to the said grants.
- f. The Synod of the Diocese of Nelson has resolved that it is now just and desirable to vest the lands and other assets derived from the lands in a charitable trust for the benefit of the descendants of the original Maori owners of the lands.
- g. The full names of the original Maori owners were contained in judgments in the Maori Land Court delivered in 1892 and 1893 and comprised Ngati Rarua and Atiawa manawhenua ki Motueka iwi.
- h. There is no legal power to alter the objects of the Whakarewa School Trust Board to a wider extent than that contained in the Anglican Church Trusts Act 1981.
- i. The Anglican Church Trusts Act 1981 only provides for a scheme of arrangement to transfer land assets and not significant other assets or funds held by the Board.
- j. The descendants of the original Maori owners being the Ngati Rarua and Atiawa manawhenua ki Motueka iwi have incorporated a charitable trust in which it is desired to vest the remaining land and funds derived from the land.
- k. Provision has been included in the Bill to protect the right of any other hapu or iwi to make or continue a claim to entitlement by whakapapa or otherwise to the original owners of the land in 1853 by claims to the Waitangi Tribunal, Maori Land Court, the High Court or any other Court of competent jurisdiction and to give effect to any decision which might be made in favour of such claimant subsequently.
- l. The Bill further vests a power of review in the High Court of any decision made by the trustees as to who is to be entitled to be a beneficiary of the trust.
- m. Consequent upon the passage of the Bill a provision is included for the dissolution of the Whakarewa School Trust Board.
- n. Some of the funds held by the Whakarewa School Trust Board are acknowledged by the descendants of the original owners as not being derived from the lands and are to be vested in the Nelson Diocesan Trust Board for charitable purposes.
- o. A large number of properties to be vested in the new trust pursuant to the Bill are subject to long term leases in respect of the houses built upon them. The provisions of the Bill provide that the assets vested in the new trust are subject to any liabilities or obligations existing at the date of such vesting i.e. the lessees of those properties will not

be affected by the vesting. All that will occur is that there will be a different charitable trust as lessor but on exactly the same terms.

#### Notice of Private Bill

### **Agriculture and Fisheries**

#### **Animals Act 1967**

##### **Area Movement Control: Tuberculosis Notice (No. 5258)**

I hereby give notice, pursuant to section 13A of the Animals Act 1967, declaring the whole of New Zealand to be a Movement Control Area and I require all cattle or deer 03 months of age or older being moved either from their herd of origin (which term for the purposes of this notice means all cattle or deer managed as one unit and with which the cattle or deer in question has, for the time being, been depastured) to any other herd, or to a place of slaughter, or being offered for sale to be accompanied by a signed and dated document by the owner or his/her agent stating in respect of tuberculosis, the status assigned in writing by an Inspector to the herd of origin as at the date of the statement.

I further give notice that within the Movement Control Area, designated areas be established requiring that all cattle or deer 12 months of age or older depastured in a designated area either being moved from their herd of origin to another herd within that designated area, or leaving that designated area, must be accompanied by a signed and dated document by the owner or his/her agent stating:

- (i) that, except for animals going directly to be slaughtered, within 90 days prior to the date of movement the animals have undergone a test approved by the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries for tuberculosis, carried out by an Inspector or veterinarian, with negative results and;
- (ii) in respect of tuberculosis, the status assigned in writing by an Inspector to the herd of origin as at the date of the statement.

In exceptional circumstances only, an owner may apply to an Inspector for a variation from the requirements relating to the Movement Control Area and/or the designated areas established by this Notice. If granted, the Inspector's

permission shall be in writing and that document shall accompany animals being moved instead of the owner's statement.

NOTE: Any Inspector may seize any animal that is moved in contravention of this restriction and may require it to be returned to the property of origin or any other place the Chief Veterinary Officer may designate; and no compensation shall be payable in respect thereof.

All costs and expenses of and attendant upon any such seizure, returning or re-direction shall be borne by the owner thereof and shall be recoverable from him/her as a debt due to the Crown.

### **Reason for this Notice**

To enable buyers or occupiers of the place of receipt to be informed as to the status of the herd of origin of the animals and, to reduce the risk of tuberculosis being spread to other herds or areas by movement of domestic stock.

This Notice revokes and replaces Notice No. 5177 Area Movement Control: Tuberculosis, published in *Gazette*, No. 154 at page 3202 on the 24th day of September 1992.

### **Designated Areas**

The following designated areas are established:

#### **The South Kaipara Designated Area**

All land on the South Kaipara peninsular north and west of a line from the west coast at Muriwai Beach township along Muriwai Beach Road to the Kaipara River at Waimauku. Along the western bank of the Kaipara River in a northerly direction to the Kaipara Harbour.

#### **The Central North Island Designated Area**

The 'Designated Area' is all that land encompassed by the following peripheral line:

From the outlet of the Waikato River at Lake Taupo north along State Highway One to the Atiamuri Bridge. From Atiamuri Bridge along the western bank of the Waikato River to the Waipapa Dam. From the Waipapa Dam north on the Waipapa Road to Huirimu Road. Along Huirimu Road to Aotearoa Road, along Aotearoa Road north to Wharepapa Road. Following Wharepapa Road west to Panetapu and from Panetapu south along Bailey Road onto Hingaia Road south to Wharepungu Road. West along Wharepungu Road to the junction with Mangatutu Road. South west down Mangatutu Road to junction with Paewhenua East Road. South along Paewhenua Road continuing on along Chindie Road to junction with Tauraroa Road. West along Tauraroa Road to Toa Bridge. From Toa Bridge North west along Waipa River to NZMS 1 Grid Reference N74 81659490 3rd Edition 1974, from there in a straight line south to the Road junction of Waipa River Road and Barber Road. South along Barber Road, continuing as Rangitoto Road to the Rangitoto Road Block Road East intersection and then in a straight line to NZMS 1 Grid Reference N83 74206870 2nd Edition 1982, from there along State Highway 30 to its junction with Waimiha Mangapehi Road onto Waimiha Ongarue Road to its junction with State Highway 4 to Taumarunui. (The Movement Control Area will also include all the farm properties that are adjacent to the western side of the line from Mangapehi to Taumarunui on the Waimiha Road—State Highway 4 section of the line).

From Taumarunui west along River Road to junction with Saddler Road, from there in a straight line South East to the Wanganui River. Then following eastern most bank of the Wanganui River south to Pipiriki. From Pipiriki east along the Pipiriki Raetihi Road to the Raetihi junction of State Highway 4 and State Highway 49. Then moves south down State Highway 4 to the junction with Oruakukura Road east along Oruakukura Road to INFOMAP 262-6 Grid Reference 71761870 2nd Edition 1987, from there in a straight line

south south west to Trig 778 (see INFOMAP 262-2 Grid Square 7118) from there in a straight line south to NZMS 1 Grid Reference N131 715230 (on Field Tracks Road) 1st Edition 1969 from there along Fields Track Road eastward to Colliers Bridge then continues North along the Whangaehu River to its junction with SH49, east along SH49 to its junction with SH1 then south along SH1 through Waiouru till the junction of SH1 with Te Moehau Road. East along Te Moehau Road to its junction with Moawhango Road. From that junction east to NZMS 1 N132 Grid Reference 370297 1st Edition 1970. From there east to NZMS 260 Grid Reference 669763 T21 1st Edition. (S bend on short road). From there east to NZMS 260 T21 Grid Reference 678765 1st Edition (on Mangahaoata Stream). From there east down the northern bank of the Mangahaoata Stream to its junction with the Rangitikei River then following the east bank of the Rangitikei River South to its junction with the Whakaurekou River. From there east in a straight line to Trig 4334 (Potae) then north north east in a Straight line to Trig 1089 then in a straight line to its junction with the Ngaruroro River. From that junction follow the west bank of the Ngaruroro River north to NZMS 1 N113 Grid Reference 638813 3rd Edition in 1981. From there north west to Trig 4513 (Pikiawatea) from there in a straight line to Mission Pt on Lake Taupo. From there north along the eastern shore of Lake Taupo to the Waikato River outlet.

#### **The South East North Island Designated Area**

The 'Designated Area' is all that land encompassed by the following peripheral line:

From the Akitio River mouth along the Akitio River Road to Huiarau. From Huiarau in a southwesterly direction to the end of Settlement Road at Pinehill. South west along Settlement Road to Coast Road. South along Coast Road to Crosshills. From Crosshills along the southern boundary of Crosshills Station to Waihoki. West along Huia Road to State Highway 52 and then in a north east direction along State Highway 52 to its junction with Rimu Road. Downstream along the eastern bank of Kaitawa to its junction with Te Aupapa Road. North west along Te Aupapa Road to Kaitawa. South west from Kaitawa in a direct line to the end of Rock Road and then south west in a direct line to Rongamai. From Rongamai, south west along the Mangaone Valley Road to Central Mangaone Road. North west along Central Mangaone Road to State Highway 2. South along State Highway 2 to North Road and then west along North Road to its junction with Nireaha-Hukanui Road. From this junction north west in a direct line to Kakariki, then west north west in a direct line to the Opp/W Trig. From the Opp/W Trig in a general south westerly direction following the boundary of the Tararua Forest Park to Featherston. From Featherston to Pakuratahi Forks at Kaitoke following the boundary of the Tararua Forest Park. From Pakuratahi Forks north west in a direct line to Saddle Trig (Akatarawa Saddle). From Saddle Trig west in a direct line to the Maungakawa Trig then following the Wharemauku Stream downstream to the Coast at Raumati beach south along the coast to Plimmerton. From Plimmerton south east following the Plimmerton-Pauatahanui Road to Pauatahanui. From Pauatahanui south east following the Pauatahanui-Haywards Road to Hutt Road at Haywards. South along the Hutt Road to the Petone foreshore. From the Petone foreshore following the coastline to Pencarrow Head, to Turakirae Head, to Cape Palliser, to Castlepoint to the Akitio River Mouth.

### The Waipawa Designated Area

The 'Designated Area' is all that land encompassed by the following peripheral line:

From the south side of the Otane township follow Stock Road to SH2 and Argyll Road. Follow the Argyll Road to the junction of Argyll Road and College Road. Follow College Road to the north east Boundary of Section 3, Block III Waipukurau Survey district, then north west to Section 5, Block III Waipukurau Survey district and north west along that Boundary to the Mangatahi Stream and along the farm road leading to Te Onepu Road. Follow Te Onepu Road in a Northerly direction to the junction with the north east boundary of Part Section 4, Block XIV Maraekakano Survey district, then westerly along the northern boundary to Section 1, SO 10098, then north east to its northern boundary. Proceed westerly along the northern boundary to the Manganuku Stream and follow it to the junction with Mangamate Stream. Follow the Mangamate Stream in a westerly direction to SH50 then follow SH50 in a southerly direction to the junction with Kereru Road. Follow the Kereru Road to Glenselwyn Road, then Glenselwyn Road until it meets Poporangi Road. Follow Poporangi Road to Allen Road to a point approximately 0.3 km north of Shunt Road, then down the East Boundary of Lot 1, DP 21615 and Section 3, Block XI, Wakarara Survey district in a southerly direction to the Mangamauka Stream. Follow the north side of the stream in a north west direction to Allen Road and then across part of the Wakarara Range to the southern most part of the forestry road known as the Wakarara Road. Proceed in a south west direction to the Makaroro River and follow the Makaroro River south easterly until its confluence with the Waipawa River. Then join the Whakaroro Road and follow it in a south easterly direction until it meets Highway 50. Follow Highway 50 in a south west direction until it meets the Tuki Tuki River then follow the Tuki Tuki River to the junction with the Kahahakuri Stream. Follow a north east line across farmland crossing Lindsay Road and follow the South side of Lindsay Road to a point marked Caringill on Info Map 260 V22, then in an easterly direction to cross SH2 at Trig AI (157 m) to join Taipuru Road at the east boundary, Section 21, Block XI Waipukurau Survey district. Follow Taipuru Road to Trig XXVII A (154 m) and follow a south east line to the Tuki Tuki River. Proceed south east to the confluence with the Waipawa River and then downstream to a point approximately 2.2km from the confluence. Follow a north west line to the junction of the Pourere Road and an unnamed road leading to a quarry, and then follow that unnamed road to the old bed of the Waipawa River. Follow the old bed of the Waipawa River to the end of the Homewood Road. Follow Homewood Road to Racecourse Road and proceed east to White Road and follow White Road to the Southern Border of the Otane township.

### The Clarence/Waiiau Designated Area

The 'Designated Area' is all that land encompassed by the following peripheral line:

Those properties within an area enclosed by a line from the Flaxbourne River mouth to State Highway 1, then along a straight line north-west to the Upton Downs Road/Richmond Brook Road junction then in a straight line to Mount William then to Mount Upton, then to Colonel Gully Stream/Medway River junction then up the Medway River to the Deep Stream junction, then along a straight line to Conical Hill, then across Awatere River, follow Awatere River up to Burr Stream Junction, then to Mount Hall then in a straight line south-west to the northern end of Lake Tennyson then west to Mount Princess, then down Waiiau River to junction with Henry River, then up Henry River to Opera Range then south down Opera Range to Organ Range east of Glynn Wye, then south to the Hurunui River east of Esk Head, then south-west to the Puketeraki Range, then direct line south to 2150/90 then south-east to Lees Valley Road then east to southern boundary of Okuku Hills, then down Okuku River then south-east to

To: Temporary Safeguard Authority

Pursuant to section 6 (1) (d) of the Temporary Safeguard Authorities Act 1987, I, Philip Burdon, Minister of Commerce advise that, in considering whether an industry has suffered or is likely to suffer material injury as a result of the importation of used tyres, you should have regard to the following Government policies:

Levels of industry assistance are being progressively reduced to encourage greater levels of international competitiveness.

In relation to tyres, this policy has been reflected in the removal of import licensing on 1 April 1989 and the staged reduction of the ad valorem duty from 22.5 percent in 1991 to 15 percent by 1 July 1996. The level of industry assistance afforded the tyre industry is scheduled for review in 1994.

The determination of any injury and any appropriate temporary remedies should be compatible with New Zealand's international obligations under Australia New Zealand Closer Economic Relations Trade Agreement (ANZCERTA), the South Pacific Regional Trade and Economic Cooperation Agreement (SPARTECA) and the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT).

### Social Security Act 1964

#### Direction by the Minister of Social Welfare

In the matter of the section 5 of the Social Security Act 1964

To: The Director-General of Social Welfare

Pursuant to section 5 (2) of the Social Security Act 1964, I, Jennifer Mary Shipley, Minister of Social Welfare, HEREBY DIRECT that in relation to the exercise of your powers contained in section 86A of the Act to recover moneys as debts due to the Crown under section 86 of the Act:

1. That where a debt has been established, you will send a written notice to the debtor, stating that the debt has been established, specifying the amount of the debt, asking the debtor to contact the department so that arrangements for recovery can be made, and advising the debtor of his or her review and appeal rights.

2. If no satisfactory response is received within 1 week, you will send a further notice asking the debtor to contact the department so that arrangements for recovery can be made.

3. If no satisfactory response is received within two weeks of that second notice being sent, you will send a third notice informing the person that he or she has 10 days to contact the department and make satisfactory arrangements for the repayment of the debt, and that if he or she does not do so then a deduction notice may be issued.

4. You will send deduction notices to employers in preference to banks, unless recovery through the latter is the only realistic option available in the circumstances.

5. Deductions from bank accounts will be lump sum deductions. The level of the deduction will be based on the level of debt, and in setting the amount to be deducted, you will take into account the balance in the various accounts that the debtor has, the outgoings of that person (such as essential automatic payments, home mortgage repayments, etc.) that are known to you, and the amount that the debtor could reasonably be assumed to require to live on for 1 week.

6. If a debtor approaches the department claiming that a deduction notice is causing hardship, you shall review the issue of the deduction notice taking into account any alternative method of payment offered by the debtor.

7. Nothing in this direction shall prevent you from carrying out your duty to consider each case on its own individual circumstances, and in special circumstances to not follow this direction eg where a debtor is about to leave the country.

8. This direction shall not apply if at any stage the person has given his or her written consent to a deduction notice being issued.

9. You shall not issue a deduction notice if the debtor has filed an application for a review or an appeal which has not yet been decided.
