Notice of Intention to Apply for Leave to Introduce **Private Bill**

The Thomas Cawthron Trust Amendment Bill 1993

Notice is hereby given that the Cawthron Institute Trust Board intends to apply for leave to introduce into the House of Representatives in the present session of Parliament a Private Bill, under the Short Title of the "Thomas Cawthron Trust Amendment Bill 1993".

The objects of the Bill are as follows:

- 1. To remove the power of the Minister of Research, Science, and Technology to appoint 3 members of the Board.
- 2. To remove the power of the Governor-General in Council to appoint 4 members of the Board, after consultation with the Board.
- 3. To provide for the ex-officio members of the Board to appoint six members.

Fisheries Act 1983

Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-Off) Notice (No. 3) 1993 (No. 5257)

Pursuant to section 28zG of the Fisheries Act 1983, and a delegation made pursuant to section 41 of the State Sector Act 1988, the Director (Operations), MAF Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

Notice

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-off) Notice (No. 3) 1993.

(2) This notice shall come into effect on the 29th day of July 1993, and shall expire on the 15th day of October 1993.

2. Interpretation—In this notice:

(a) Any reference to Quota Management Area means the appropriate Quota Management Area as defined in the Fisheries (Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches and Catch History) Notice 1986*;

(b) Target species and bycatch species are specified by way of fishstock codes, being Fishstock Codes defined in the Second Schedule of the Fisheries (Reporting) Regulations 1990[†]; and

(c) Methods are specified by way of method codes, being Method Codes defined in the Second Schedule of the Fisheries (Reporting) Regulations 1990t.

3. Offering a lease of quota in lieu of paying deemed value—(1) As from the date this notice comes into effect, any commercial fisherman who could be required under section 28zD of the Fisheries Act 1983 to pay the deemed value of any fish that is specified as a bycatch species in this notice, may offer the Director-General a lease or sublease of the right to take fish, being fish that are specified in this notice as a target species in relation to that bycatch species, as specified in the tables below.

(2) The ratios, as specified, are the amounts of target species which may, in lieu of such payments, be accepted by way of lease or sub-lease in relation to the amount of the bycatch species for which the offer of quota is made, e.g. if a fisher could be required to pay deemed value for 1 tonne of LIN 5 and wishes to offer a lease of SCH 5 then the amount that can be offered is 1 tonne \times 1.13 = 1.13 tonnes of SCH 5.

(3) The bycatch species must have been taken while fishing for the target species using the method or any of the methods specified: e.g. in the case of the above example, the ELE3 bycatch must have been taken using the method of set netting.

(4) Any offers that relate to bycatch species as specified in this notice must relate to fishing that has occurred in the months of July, August or September 1993 respectively.

4. Revocation—The Fisheries (Bycatch Trade-Off) Notice (No. 2) 1993, Notice No. 5236 appearing in the New Zealand Gazette on 29th day of April 1993 at page 1078, is hereby revoked.

New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975

Standard Grade and Packaging for the Export of Apples and Pears Amendment Notice 1993 (Notice No. 5263; Ag. 12/2/14)

This notice amends the Standard Grade for the Export of Apples and Pears Notice 1987 (Notice No. 4263; Ag. 12/2/14) published in the Supplement to the *New Zealand Gazette*, Friday, 4 December 1987, Issue No. 215 at page 5559 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal notice").

Pursuant to regulation 13 of the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975^{*} and section 19 (2) (b) (ii) of the Apple and Pear Marketing Act 1971, the Director-General of

Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice of modification to the grade standards and packing and grading requirements respectively in respect of apples and pears intended for export from New Zealand such requirements being as specified in this notice.

Notice

1. Title—(1) This notice may be cited as the Standard Grade and Packaging for the Export of Apples and Pears Amendment Notice 1993.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. Title and Grade—Clause 4 of the principal notice is hereby revoked and the following clause substituted in its place:

"**4. Title and Grade**—The grade marks assigned to the standard grade for apples and pears intended by the board to be exported from New Zealand shall be "Class I" or "Class II" (hereinafter referred to as 'the grade' (Class I or Class II) as appropriate)."

3. Provisions Concerning Sizing—(1) Amend paragraph (b) of clause 7 of the principal notice by omitting the word "The" and substituting in its place the words "For Class I the".

(2) Amend clause 7 of the principal notice by inserting after paragraph (b) the following paragraph:

"(c) For Class II the minimum diameter sizes of apples and pears for export shall be:

Apples	mm
Large fruit varieties	60
Other varieties	50
Pears	mm

Large fruit varieties 55 Other varieties 45

4. SECOND SCHEDULE—Amend the SECOND SCHEDULE to the principal notice by:

(1) Inserting immediately below the words "SECOND SCHEDULE" the words:

"PART A. Class I".

(2) Inserting after clause 3 of Schedule B the following words:

"PART B. Class II

This class includes apples and pears which do not qualify for inclusion in Class I but satisfy the minimum requirements specified in the principal notice."

1. Allowances for Skin Defects

Defects in shape, are allowed provided that the fruit retains its essential characteristics as regards quality, the keeping quality and presentation. The stalk may be missing, provided that the skin is not damaged.

Skin defects are allowed for each fruit, within the following limits:

- 4 centimetre length for defects of elongated shape;
- 2.5 square centimetre total surface area for other defects with the exception of speckles, which must not extend over more than 1 square centimetre in area.

2. Colouring Criteria for Apples

Group A: Varieties with red colouring:

- at least 1/4 of the surface of the fruit to have red colouring.

Group B: Varieties with mixed red colour (the red colouring to be bright):

- at least 1/10 of the surface of the fruit to have red colouring.

Group C: Striped varieties, slightly coloured:

- no minimum area to have colouring.

3. Russeting Allowance for Apples and Pears

(i) Brown patches:

- may go beyond the stem or pistil cavities and be slightly rough.

(ii) Russeting—thin net-like:

- maximum of 1/2 of the surface area of the fruit permitted. (iii) Russeting—heavy:

- maximum of 1/3 of the surface area of the fruit permitted. Cumulative defects (with the exception of brown patches which are excluded from these cumulative defects):

- in no case may thin russeting and heavy russeting taken together exceed a maximum of 1/2 of the surface area of the fruit.

4. Quality Tolerances

10 percent by number of weight of apples and pears satisfying neither the requirements of the class nor the minimum requirements, with the exception of produce affected by rotting or any other deterioration rendering it unfit for consumption. A maximum of 2 percent is allowed by number or by weight of fruit which shows the following defects:

- serious attacks of cork (bitter pit) or water-core.

- slight damage or unhealed cracks."
