**Open Season for Game in Fish and Game  
Regions**

**North Island and South Island**

Pursuant to the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation declares an open season for game in the Fish and Game Regions, subject to the Third Schedule (Game Licences and Licence Fees) hereto; and subject to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule hereto, except in the closed game areas published in the supplement to the *New Zealand Gazette* of 28 March 1985, and subject to any amendments in any subsequent *Gazette* notice and in this notice.

The attention of gamebird hunters and others is drawn to the daily game possession limits set forth in the First Schedule hereto and to the provisions of the Wildlife Act 1953 and the Wildlife Regulations 1955.

**New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp**

Pursuant to section 19A (1) of the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation requires that a game bird habitat stamp be affixed to every licence to hunt or kill game.

Pursuant to section 19A (2) (a) (i) and 19A (2) (a) (ii) of the Wildlife Act 1953 the Minister of Conservation approves the following form of the 1994 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp;



The 1994 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp has a face value of ten dollars (\$10.00). Pursuant to regulation 4 of the New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp Regulations 1993 only a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be payable in respect of every game bird habitat stamp supplied in respect of a licence to hunt or kill game.

**First Schedule**

Except where all game is labelled with the following details:

- The name and address of the person by whom the game was taken;
- The number of the licence to hunt or kill game held by the person by whom the game was taken;
- The name of the Fish and Game Region by which that licence was issued;

(d) The name of the Fish and Game Regions in which the game was taken; and

(e) The date on which the game was taken;

No person shall have in possession on any one day game in excess of the following numbers:

**North and South Island**

Saturday 7 May 1994: The number of game birds specified in the Second Schedule of this notification as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken. Sunday 8 May 1994: Twice the number of game birds specified for Saturday 7 May 1994.

Every subsequent day: The number of game birds specified in the Second Schedule of this notification as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken.

**Waiver of Restrictions on Baiting, and Methods of Taking Game**

**Baiting for Waterfowl**

Pursuant to section 17 of the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation approves persons to hunt or kill game of the family Anatidae (waterfowl) during the open season for game in the Fish and Game Regions named hereto, where food has been cast, thrown, placed or planted during the current open season for game or during the thirty (30) days immediately prior to the open season for game, subject to the conditions specified below.

**Magazine Shotguns**

Pursuant to section 18 (1) (c) (iii) of the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation approves persons to hunt or kill Canada geese within the Fish and Game Regions named hereto, with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type not adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding more than one shell. This approval shall apply only during that period of the open season for game following 24 July 1994 for the purpose of hunting Canada geese. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

**Shotgun Calibre**

Pursuant to section 18 (1) (c) (v) of the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation approves persons to hunt or kill Canada geese within the Fish and Game Regions named hereto, with any shotgun of a calibre 10 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act. This approval shall apply only from, and including, the 4th July 1994 in the Fish and Game Regions named hereto.

*Camouflaged Rowboats*

Pursuant to section 18 (1) (f) (vi) of the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Conservation approves persons to hunt or kill game within the Fish and Game Regions named hereto, from unmoored camouflaged rowboats, subject to the conditions specified below.

*Conditions*

1. These approvals shall not derogate from the principal conditions specified for each Fish and Game Region under the Second Schedule, which shall apply.
2. These approvals will expire at the end of the open season for game specified under the Second Schedule for each Fish and Game Region.

*Special Conditions*

1. From the 7 May to the 3 July 1994 inclusive no person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Waikare, any drifting or temporarily moored floating stand or any stand, hide or maimai which is permanently fixed to the lake bed except within 180 metres of the outer margin of the lake, or the shoreline of Motu Nuia Island (Grape Island).

2. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Ngaroto any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai except within 85 metres of the margin of the lake.

3. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Rotokauri any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai on any open water of the lake.

4. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground any game bird(s) shot or parts of any game birds shot.

5. It shall be an offence for any person to herd or drive black swan(s) for the purpose of hunting or killing them.
6. It shall be an offence to shoot game from any unmoored boat on the Waikato River north of the boat ramp at the confluence of the Mangawara Stream and the Waikato River at Taupiri on any of the first three days or the second weekend of the open season.
7. No person shall possess a firearm in or on any unmoored vessel, except a rowboat, unless the firearm is dismantled or secured in a case, gunslip or other secure compartment, except when in use to retrieve wounded game.

#### (8) WESTERN ARM LAKE WHANGAPE

That area within (lakeward) a boundary created by straight lines between white posts and more specifically;

In straight lines commencing from the white post numbered '1' to be found on the lake edge approximately 350 metres to the west of the Herbert Road road end; south for approximately 600 metres along the shore line to the white post numbered '2'; directly (across the bay) west to the spit and the white post numbered '3' located there; south for approximately 500 metres along the shore to the white post numbered '4'; inland in a south-easterly direction for approximately 150 metres to the white post numbered '5'; inland in a sou-south-westerly direction for approximately 600 metres to the white post numbered '6'; towards the lake shore in a northerly direction to the white post numbered '7'; directly across the inlet in a nor-west direction to the white post numbered '8'; northwards along the shore for approximately 1400 metres to the white post numbered '9'; across the western arm in a nor-easterly direction to the white post numbered '10'; south for approximately 400 metres along the shore to the white post numbered '11'; directly across the inlet to the white post numbered '1'.

#### Definition of Areas

The following descriptions refer to Local Authority Boundaries described on Infomap 242B-2 Department of Survey and Land Information for the Eastern Region Fish and Game Council (ERFGC) hunting areas.

Area A1: Tauranga District, Western Bay of Plenty District, that part of the South Waikato District within the ERFGC boundaries and east of State Highway 1, Rotorua District, Kawerau District, Whakatane District, and Opotiki District.

Area A2: Those parts of South Waikato District west of State Highway 1, and Taupo District, and Ruapehu District which lie within the ERFGC Boundaries.

Area B1: Gisborne District

Area B2: That part of Wairoa District within the ERFGC boundaries.

Note: all above areas are shown on the map held by the Eastern Region Fish and Game Council Office, corner Amohia and Haupapa Streets, Rotorua, and Game licence agents, entitled "Eastern Region Fish and Game Council Bird Hunting Areas".

Shooting hours: 6.15 a.m. to 6.15 p.m. except that during the period 20 June to 31 August 1994 inclusive, Canada goose and black swan (areas A1 and A2) may be hunted or killed 24 hours per day in areas A1 and A2 only.

#### Special Conditions

1. With the exception of freehold waters, it shall be an offence to hunt or kill game from unmoored boats during the opening weekend only, being Saturday 7 May 1994 and Sunday 8 May 1994.

2. In the Tauranga Harbour, Ohiwa Harbour, Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua and Lake Taupo no maimai shall be erected that will impede the use of navigable channels and waterways of the harbour, estuary or lake.

3. Maimais erected in the Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua, Ohiwa Harbour, Stump and Waihi bays of Lake Taupo must be dismantled and removed within two weeks of the close of the season (i.e. by 17 September 1994).

Thence along the boundary to that point where Area A intersects the boundary. Thence along the western boundary of Areas A and B to the point of commencement. 4 March - 19 March 1995 incl. 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 p.m. Daily bag limit: 5.

Area D: Those parts of Areas B and C contained by a line commencing at Opunake and following the Opunake-Eltham Road to Eltham. Thence by a straight line to Rataiti. Thence by Ongo Road to the eastern boundary of the region. Thence southerly by that boundary and the sea coast to Opunake.

Area A: High Country: Kaikoura Land District and that part of the Canterbury Land District which contains the Conway River; the Awatere Catchment and all that land lying south to the boundary of the Kaikoura Land District; the Acheron Catchment; the Waihopai River watershed upstream of the Power House on the Waihopai River; the Wairau River watershed upstream of its junction with Marchburn Stream and Bartletts Creek.

Area B: Low Country: All that area in the Nelson/Marlborough Fish and Game Region excluding that area defined in Area "A".

Area C: Upland Game: All that area in the Nelson/Marlborough Fish and game region excluding the Waimea and Wairoa rivers up to the junction of the Lee River, and the Wai-iti River up to State Highway No.6 (Wai-iti Bridge), and excluding a 200 metre strip on both banks of these rivers within the said area.

Area D: Waimea: The area contained in the Waimea, Wairoa and Wai-iti Rivers including a 200 metre strip on both banks, as specified in Area C.

Area E: Pheasant: The area west of a line following the Bryant and St Arnaud Ranges and the Spenser Mountains within the Nelson/Marlborough Fish and Game Region.

Area F: Grey Duck: That area west of a line following the Arthur Range to Separation Point; the Buller Catchment.

Area G: Wairau Lagoons: That area defined as all open waters, islands and the peninsular between Chandlers Lagoon and Big Lagoon, south of the Wairau River mouth, including Arapipi Channel, and east of SH1 and north of the White Bluffs.

- Ruataniwha Inlet: herein after named Ruataniwha Inlet Open Game Area and being an area enclosed between the boundary of the Nelson-Marlborough Fish and Game Region and a line passing through Gibbstown and Taimatea Point.
- Whanganui Inlet: herein after named the West Haven Open Game Area and being an area that is enclosed between the boundary of the Nelson-Marlborough Fish and Game Region and a line connecting the points on that boundary passing through Melbourne Point and Moki Point.

*Conditions:*

1. Game may only be hunted in the D'Urville, Waimea/Moutere, Ruataniwha and West Haven Open Game Area(s) in compliance with conditions specified for the Nelson-Marlborough Fish and Game Region 1994 open season for game.

2. Any licence authorising the holder to hunt or kill game within the Nelson-Marlborough Fish and Game Region for the 1994 open game season shall similarly authorise the holder to hunt or kill game in the D'Urville, Waimea/Moutere, Ruataniwha and West Haven Open Game Areas(s).

#### Third Schedule

##### Game Licences and Licence Fees

Pursuant to regulations 5 and 13 of the Wildlife Regulations 1955, the Minister of Conservation hereby approves the licence fees set and payable in respect of each class of game licence and the conditions attached thereto or hereunder.

The \$1 game bird habitat stamp component of the following total licence fees is set by regulation 4 of the New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp Regulations 1993.

The holder of any game licence for the 1994 game season shall be subject to the conditions and daily possession limits for each Fish and Game Region in which the hunting or killing of game takes place, as specified under the Second Schedule of the notice in the *New Zealand Gazette* in which the Minister of Conservation declared the 1994 open season for game.

The provisions of the Arms Act 1983 apply with respect to firearms used in accordance with the licence.

##### Definitions

Adult: Any person 20 years of age or older as at 7 May 1994.

Young Adult: Any person 16 years of age or older but not having obtained 20 years of age as at 7 May 1994.

Junior: Any person under the age of 16 years as at 7 May 1994.

Child: Any person under the age of 12 years as at 7 May 1994.

##### Class: New Zealand Whole Season Game Licence

Conditions: A New Zealand Whole Season Game licence shall enable the holder to hunt or kill game in all Fish and Game Regions of New Zealand.

##### Fees:

Adult: Fifty four dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of fifty five dollars (\$55.00 GST inclusive).

Young Adult: Twenty seven dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of twenty eight dollars (\$28.00 GST inclusive).

##### Class: One Week Game Licence

##### Conditions:

(1) A one week licence may be issued and be available for use on or after the tenth day (16 May 1994) of the open season for game for a period of seven (7) days from the date specified on the licence.

(2) The licence shall enable the holder to hunt or kill game in the region of issue only.

##### Fees:

Adult: Twenty seven dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of twenty eight dollars (28.00 GST inclusive).

Young Adult: Thirteen dollars and fifty cents licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of fourteen dollars and fifty cents (\$14.50 GST inclusive).

Junior: Five dollars and fifty cents licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50 GST inclusive).

Child: One dollar game bird habitat stamp fee only, a total of one dollar (\$1.00 GST inclusive).

*Class: One Day Game Licence*

Conditions:

(1) A One Day Licence may be issued and be available for use on or after the tenth day (16 May 1994) of the open season for game for a period of one day as specified on the licence.

(2) The licence shall enable the holder to hunt or kill game in the region of issue only.

Fees:

Adult: Eleven dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of twelve dollars (\$12.00 GST inclusive).

Young Adult: Five dollars and fifty cents licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50 GST inclusive).

Junior: Two dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of three dollars (\$3.00 GST inclusive).

Child: One dollar game bird habitat stamp fee only, a total of one dollar (\$1.00 GST inclusive).

*Class: Part Season Goose Licence*

Conditions:

(1) A Part Season Goose licence may be issued to authorise the holder to hunt or kill Canada geese on or after

1 September 1994 in any Fish and Game region wherein for the remaining period of the open season for game in that region, Canada geese may be taken.

(2) The holder of the licence shall be subject to the conditions for each Fish and Game Region in which the hunting or killing of game takes place, as specified under the Second Schedule of the notice in which the Minister of Conservation declared the 1994 open season for game.

Fees:

Adult: Twenty seven dollars licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of twenty eight dollars (28.00 GST inclusive).

Young Adult: Thirteen dollars and fifty cents licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of fourteen dollars and fifty cents (\$14.50 GST inclusive).

Junior: Five dollars and fifty cents licence fee plus one dollar game bird habitat stamp fee, a total of six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50 GST inclusive).

Child: One dollar game bird habitat stamp fee only, a total of one dollar (\$1.00 GST inclusive).

The notice published in the supplement to the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 36, 22 March 1993, page 737 to 738, Third Schedule, Game Licences and Licence Fees is hereby revoked.
