- (d) whether the West Coast Regional Council has the capacity to adequately fund those required activities, taking into account all the funding options currently available to it; and
  - (i) if not, the extent of the funding shortfall, or
  - (ii) if the Regional Council does have that capacity,

how best it could adequately fund those activities; and

- (e) such other matters, including the Region's socio-economic profile, which in the opinion of the Commission are relevant to the West Coast Regional Council's ability to fully fund its functions.

The Commission shall consult:

- (a) the West Coast Regional Council;
- (b) the Buller, Grey and Westland District Councils;
- (c) the Departments of Conservation and Internal Affairs and the Office of the Controller and Auditor-General;
- (d) other Departments which administer legislation under which the West Coast Regional Council carries out its statutory functions; and
- (e) such other individuals and organisations as the Commission considers appropriate.

The Commission shall report to me by 30 September 1995.

## **Research, Science and Technology**

### **Foundation for Research, Science and Technology Act 1990**

#### **Statement of Science Priorities for Public Good Science and Technology: 1996/97 to 2000/2001**

The Minister of Research, Science and Technology (hereinafter called "the Minister") is required under the Foundation for Research, Science and Technology Act 1990 and as subsequently amended, to "... advise the Foundation of the priorities that the Foundation shall adhere to in carrying out its functions ..." in the allocation of funds for the production of public good science and technology outputs.

This advice is to be conveyed to the Foundation via this formal statement and its associated appendices.

This statement covers the five year period from the financial year 1996/97 to the financial year 2000/2001. However, it may be supplemented or modified as and when circumstances warrant.

#### **Strategic goals for New Zealand science**

The Government believes that decisions on the funding of public good science need to be made in the context of clearly defined strategic goals. These goals are intended to supplement rather than replace those set out in previous priority statements. Goals applying in previous priority statements which are to continue to apply are set out in Appendix I. A set of overall goals are contained in the Strategic Statement released by the Government in December 1994 entitled "*Science and Technology: The Way Forward*". They are now formally endorsed and are also set out in Appendix I.

#### **Output Framework**

Public good science and technology funding allocated by the Foundation (i.e. excluding non-specific output funding) is to be divided into 17 outputs for the period covered by this statement. The outputs are defined in Appendix II. Funding targets are set out below for each output. When considering proposals for funding, the Foundation is to ensure that proposals are categorised against the output or the mix of outputs which most accurately reflect the content and intent of the research set out in the proposal. Where the most appropriate location of a programme is not clear from the application of the definitions, the Foundation shall determine the most appropriate location but will ensure that any precedents thus created are publicised to science providers, advised to the Ministry of Research, Science and Technology, and are then implemented consistently in regard to other programmes.

#### **Funding Targets**

This priority statement sets five year funding targets for that part of public good science and technology funding which is allocated by the Foundation, i.e. that funding described as "Public Good Science and Technology" in the Estimates. It excludes "Non-Specific Output Funding for Public Good Science and Technology".

Because a precise overall funding level is not known for the fifth year, i.e. 2000/01, the present priority statement is based on a benchmark level of funding for that year which is \$330 million. This benchmark is consistent with the funding announced in the 1995 Budget, and will be adjusted as and when necessary to conform with the content of future Budget announcements. Adjustment processes and criteria will be separately announced i.e. are not contained within this priority statement.

Appendix III sets out the funding targets for each of the

17 outputs for the year 2000/01, which together make up the benchmark total of \$330 million.

The Foundation is to manage the allocation of funding, including the formulation of research strategies so that these targets are able to be smoothly achieved through the funding of relevant research of satisfactory scientific and/or technological merit.

#### **Discretion in funding variations over the five year period**

The Foundation should fund within the range of the 1995/96 funding and the 2000/2001 funding targets for each output in each year, given that research programmes which fulfil the funding criteria are available. The only circumstances in which funding within any output falls below the 1995/96 level shall be if insufficient proposals of adequate quality or relevance are available.

#### **Cross-output Themes**

There are goals, issues and principles which cannot be addressed satisfactorily in the context of single outputs, and which need to be given effect to over a range of outputs. A set of cross-output themes covering matters of this nature is laid out in Appendix IV.

The Foundation is required to develop a strategic statement covering each cross output theme. The requirements for these statements are detailed in Appendix V.

The list of cross-output themes set out in Appendix IV includes topics which are already or are likely to be the subject of National Science Strategies (NSSs). This list shall automatically be extended to include new NSS topics when these are formally approved and announced by the Minister.

#### **National Science Strategies**

The Government's policy is to nominate areas of research as National Science Strategies (NSS) where these areas of research meet specified criteria. The two existing NSSs relate to climate change, and the control of possums and bovine tuberculosis.

The Foundation is to take account of the strategies produced by the National Science Strategy Committees when formulating output research strategies, strategic statements for cross-output themes and when selecting programmes for funding.

The Foundation is also to ensure that research included within the auspices of an NSS has separately identifiable and costed components either within research programmes or as separate programmes.

The Foundation is to report its expenditure on NSS-related programmes for each NSS topic after each funding round.

#### **Development of Output Research Strategies**

The Foundation is to develop long-term research strategies, covering research in each output.

The research strategies are a primary means of managing the allocation of funding over the five-year period so as to achieve the target funding levels in the most effective and productive way. Strategies are to be developed through a process of widespread consultation with science providers, users of research in each science area and the associated sectors.

A key consideration in developing research strategies should be the impact of funding from other sources, especially the private sector.

Output research strategies should be formally advised to me, as they become available and prior to their promulgation, in particular so that the Government can be assured that the implications of funding changes are well understood and can be effectively managed.

Detailed requirements for the development and

implementation of research strategies are set out in Appendix V.

#### **Guidelines for allocating funds**

Detailed guidelines for the allocation of funding, are set out in Appendix VI. These guidelines are intended to ensure that the allocation of funding follows a coherent set of principles and that overall strategic directions are adequately translated into the purchase of appropriate science and technology outputs.

Amongst other things the guidelines require the Foundation to be proactive in ensuring that the allocation of funding reflects the Government's strategic goals. This may require the Foundation to foster the development of capability in areas of strategic importance but where there is a lack of activity for historical or other reasons.

#### **Boundaries of the PGSF**

The Government's Strategic Statement of December 1994 set out the characteristics of public good science and technology and defined its boundaries with public sector operational research and with private sector research and development. The Foundation will ensure that its funding decisions reflect the principles set out in the Strategic Statement, as contained in Appendix VII.

#### **Reporting**

The Foundation is to report after each funding round on how funding has been allocated within each of the 17 outputs and on the extent to which funding allocations are in accordance with the requirements of this priority statement.

#### **Monitoring**

The implementation of this priority statement is to be monitored by the Ministry of Research, Science and Technology. Monitoring shall occur through the preparation by the Ministry of analyses which comment on the reports prepared by the Foundation pursuant to this priority statement, and which in particular examine the extent to which these reports demonstrate the Foundation's performance in meeting the requirements of the priority statement.

This statement of science priorities and the strategies flowing from it are to be conveyed to science providers so that the Government's science priorities are given maximum effect in each funding round.

### **Appendix I—Strategic Goals and Key Factors for Priority Setting**

#### **1 Strategic goals from 1992 Priority Statement**

The Government wishes the following general goals, which were first set out in the 1992 Priority Statement, to continue to apply:

- 1 An harmonious and complementary relationship between Government research and development investment and that of the private sector shall be developed. Increased private sector research and development expenditure will not be a reason for reductions in Government support in the same area; rather it will be treated as a positive factor in setting funding levels by output for public good science and technology outputs. The private sector should play a full role in contributing to the development of output research strategies.
- 2 There should be a balance in research emphasis between cost reductions and volume increases in primary production and adding value by other means, such as improving the quality of primary products,

market oriented processing, and product development. It must be recognised that value can be added at any point in the value chain. Research effort should be directed to those points where net value added is potentially greatest.

- 3 Public good science and technology should be concentrated on research in economic sectors which already have or can develop competitive advantage. Caution should be exercised in the case of "sunrise" industries and diversification where there is not yet a private capacity to fund the research and where private production, distribution, financing and the marketing infrastructure required to exploit research results is limited.

#### **2 Goals from the Government's 1994 Strategic Statement**

The following additional goals are to apply:

##### *Science Goals*

- 4 Develop and maintain science capabilities, including skills and knowledge needed to ensure that the priorities set for public good science and technology can continue to be achieved in the long term.
- 5 Maintain and strengthen international scientific and technological networking and collaboration, to ensure an adequate knowledge of, and access to, external research knowledge and skills, databases and technologies.

##### *Economic Goals*

- 6 Maximise the contribution of research, science and technology to enhancing the quality of life in New Zealand.
- 7 Enhance international competitiveness through research on generic technologies throughout the value chain from production of raw material to finished product in the market, including approaches to management and innovation, leading to new and differentiated products and services.
- 8 Ensure service, production and processing industries (including biological, extractive, manufacturing and tourism) are economically, environmentally and socially sustainable.
- 9 Achieve a balance, related to market potential, between research into new and differentiated products and services and research into improved efficiency of producing existing products and services.
- 10 Improve competitiveness through increased knowledge and understanding of New Zealand's competitive advantages and disadvantages.

##### *Environmental Goals*

- 11 Enhance protection of the environment through action based on an improved understanding of biodiversity, biological and physical systems and the impacts of human activities.
- 12 Ensure sustainable resource management (protection and use) through an adequate knowledge of natural systems, including ecosystems and their sustainable limits.
- 13 Increase understanding of natural physical and biological hazards.
- 14 Improve knowledge of technologies for sustainable resource use to ensure waste minimisation, cleaner production and efficient energy use.

##### *Social Goals*

- 15 Improve understanding of key issues affecting acquisition of skills and knowledge necessary for full

engagement of individuals in the economy and society.

16 Improve knowledge of the social and cultural dimensions and trends of a competitive economy.

17 Support Maori development aspirations.

18 Integrate social research, in particular research relevant to changes in the economy, resource use, the environment, human health and wellbeing and uptake of research, science and technology into the broader public good science and technology research portfolio to support equity of opportunity and social cohesion.

### 3 Key factors for priority setting

Shown below are six key factors which, amongst other relevant factors, the Government requires to be considered in the development of priorities, both between and within outputs:

#### 1 Strategic Importance

(the potential contribution of the output to achieving the Government's economic, environmental and social goals)

#### 2 Potential of Science in each Output

(The likelihood that research will achieve results)

#### 3 Potential of Users to Capture Benefits

(The extent to which users of research in the output will capture its benefit, and their timeliness in doing so)

#### 4 Research Capacity

(The quantity and quality of resources available in New Zealand to support current and future research)

#### 5 Research Intensity

(The extent to which the sector is dependent on investing in research for its success)

#### 6 Appropriateness of Public Good Science and Technology Funding

(The extent to which research in the output should be funded from funds for Public Good Science and Technology compared to other sources)

### Appendix II—Output Definitions for 17 Output Framework

The output definitions expressed below are broad statements of purpose, rather than detailed taxonomies of the nature of research in each output. It is the role of the Foundation for Research, Science and Technology to provide detailed descriptions of the science and technology funded in each output to assist those making bids for funds. The italicised comments below output definitions are not a formal part of the definitions but are intended to assist in their interpretation. Although the comments provide examples of research included in each output, research is not limited to only the examples given.

#### 1. Animal Industries

Science and technology contributing to innovative and efficient industries focused on (non-dairy) animals, including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included are science and technology related to the sheep, beef, equine, deer, goat, poultry and pig industries, but not excluding other animal industries that may exist or emerge. Research may contribute to a specific industry sector, or be of a generic, underpinning nature. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### 2. Dairy Industries

Science and technology contributing to an innovative and efficient dairy industry, including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included are science and technology related to all aspects of the dairy industry. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### 3. Forage

Science and technology focused on the production of the high-quality and low cost forage needed by New Zealand's pastoral industries, including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included are science and technology related to forage seed propagation, and the study of fertilisers, soils, and landform processes relevant to New Zealand's pastoral agriculture industries. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### 4. Horticultural, Arable and Other Food and Beverage Industries

Science and technology contributing to innovative and efficient horticultural, arable and other food and beverage industries, as well as industry activities focused on the growing of ornamental, amenity, shelter and conservation plants. Also included is science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included is science and technology related to the production, processing and transporting of foods. This includes, but is not restricted, to science and technology related to: stone, pome and citrus fruits, grapes, vegetables, nuts, edible fungi, cereal crops, oilseeds and grain legumes; seed and other propagation methods of species associated with these industries, and the study of soils used or associated with the above purposes. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### 5. Forestry and Forest Product Industries

Science and technology contributing to innovative and efficient forestry and forest product industries. Also included is science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included is science and technology related to both exotic and indigenous plantations and systems; the protection of the forest estate; species and provenance testing and tree improvement research; forest nutrition and site productivity; seed and other propagation methods associated with the industry sector; development of systems for the evaluation of management alternatives; the processing of wood for production of solid wood products and pulp and paper. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### 6. Fishing and Aquaculture Industries

Science and technology contributing to innovative and efficient fishing and aquaculture industries, including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included is science and technology related to relevant ecosystems, enhancement and harvesting of natural fish*

*stocks; the harvesting, processing and transportation of aquatic plants, fish, shellfish and crustaceans; customary fisheries; as well as all aspects of the aquaculture industry. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### **7. Manufacturing Industries and Industrial Technology**

Science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included are science and technology related, but not limited to: electronics; computing; agricultural and industrial chemicals; pharmaceuticals and other high value biotechnological products; fabricated metal products; textiles; leathersgoods; footwear; and apparel. Research may be aimed at a specific industry sector, or may be aimed at a broad range of manufacturing and processing industries. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### **8. Tourism, Commercial and other Services**

Science and technology contributing to innovation and growth in the tourism, leisure, financial, business, retail, trade and other service industries, and including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.

#### **9. Information & Communications Networks and Services**

Science and technology contributing to information and communications infrastructures which meet the needs of New Zealanders directly and indirectly, including science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.

*Information technology that is an input into other industries should be funded within the appropriate output class for that benefiting industry.*

#### **10. Construction**

Science and technology contributing to construction industries and services which meet the economic, social and environmental goals of New Zealanders. Also included is science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included is science and technology related to materials and products including stone and clay, cement and concrete, and construction using glass, timber, metal products and plastics; construction, planning and design, products and services including earthquake engineering for residential, non-residential, civil and industrial construction including road and bridge engineering and construction. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### **11. Energy**

Science and technology focused on energy exploration and assessment, extraction, conversion, distribution and management and the development of non-traditional, renewable energy sources, aimed at meeting the economic, social and environmental goals of New Zealanders. Also included is science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of industry activities on the natural environment and on society.

*Included is geological research that has as its primary purpose the development of viable energy resources. Other*

*geological research where benefits diffuse more widely should be funded from the Earth Resources Output. Research specific to the social dimensions and information needs of the industry may be included.*

#### **12. Transport and Distribution Systems**

Science and technology contributing to an infrastructure of transport/storage/distribution systems and services aimed at meeting the economic, social and environmental goals of New Zealanders and New Zealand enterprises. Also included is science and technology oriented towards understanding and ameliorating the impacts of transport and distribution systems on the natural environment and on society.

#### **13. Society and Culture**

Science and technology contributing to the social wellbeing, national identity, and security of New Zealanders, and to the development of international understanding.

*Included is science related to: New Zealand and Pacific history; population demographics; Te Ao Maori; the Treaty of Waitangi; aspects of New Zealand culture and society. Also included is science related to: government, public administration and political processes, justice, law and human rights; the New Zealand economy and its dynamics; work, working relationships and labour markets; employment and working conditions; wealth generation and distribution; international relations; urban and rural planning; and the social and cultural implications of economic and political change. Science related to education and training processes; research and knowledge production; the management and communication of knowledge; and the social and cultural implications of knowledge change are also included in this output.*

#### **14. Earth Resources and Processes**

Science and technology focused on the structure, composition, geological history and physical processes relevant to New Zealand's unique geological setting, and an understanding of the causes, consequences and mitigation of natural and man-made hazards.

*Included is the identification and assessment of: mineral and subsurface water resources, and earth resources research that feeds into multiple outputs; geological influences on the environment, human habitation and global change; and deeper sediments in aquatic environments.*

#### **15. Land and Fresh Water Eco-systems**

Science and technology contributing to the understanding of land, and freshwater eco-systems, and to the analysis and amelioration of the environmental impacts of social development and economic activities.

*Included is science and technology related to: the physical, chemical and biological properties and potential uses of New Zealand's lands and soils, the native and introduced flora and fauna, and the ecosystems of which they are a part; freshwater eco-systems, and their underlying substrate, flora and fauna; and the environmental planning of urban and rural areas. Also included is science and technology focused on reducing the impacts of human and other activity on the natural environment. Science and technology focused on ameliorating the impacts of industry or other human activity specific to a sector aligned output should be funded from that output.*

#### **16. Marine Environments, Climate and Atmosphere**

Science and technology contributing to the understanding of marine and estuarine eco-systems, the climate and atmosphere, and to analysis and amelioration of the environmental impacts of social development and economic activities.

*Included is science and technology related to: the physical, chemical, and biological processes and characteristics of the marine waters of New Zealand, and their underlying substrate, flora and fauna; and the atmosphere, climate, the interaction of the atmosphere with the hydrosphere and biosphere. Also included is science and technology related to the amelioration of the impacts of human and other activities on marine environments, the climate and atmosphere.*

### 17. Antarctic Research

Science and technology focused on the physical and biological nature of Antarctica, including the geology, natural ecosystems and climate.

*Included is all science and technology physically carried out in Antarctica, including social research.*

### Appendix V—Output Research Strategies and Strategic Statements for Cross Output Themes

#### 1 Research Strategies

The Foundation is required to develop strategies to guide the allocation of funding within each of the 17 outputs. Each strategy should identify:

- 1.1 The indicative funding levels applying to broad research topics within each output, where the Foundation considers specification of such topics to be appropriate.
- 1.2 Funding trajectories for the output as a whole and for any identified topics over the five-year period beginning in 1996/97 which will enable the five-year funding target for the output to be smoothly achieved.
- 1.3 Important infrastructural resources which are to be maintained or enhanced, such as databases and collections, and the funding implications of this.
- 1.4 The relevance and significance of work in the output to cross-output themes (see Appendix IV).

The Foundation is to develop research strategies in consultation with science providers and science users. The methodology used to determine the appropriate balance of funding between topic areas within outputs should, where appropriate, include consideration of the key factors set out in the Government's Strategic Statement of December 1994 (see Appendix I).

A complete set of initial research strategies is to be completed by no later than 30 September 1995.

Output funding targets may be adjusted in future years to reflect changes in total funding for Public Good Science and Technology.

Research strategies may need to be modified subsequent to initial publication, either on the initiative of the Foundation or in response to amendments to this priority statement by the Minister. Such amendments will not necessarily be restricted to changes in output funding targets. As and when such changes are announced by the Minister, the Foundation shall, no more than 6 months after the date of the announcement but otherwise as soon as is practicable, modify, advise to the Minister, and then publish, revised research strategies for those outputs affected. Revised strategies must be formally advised to the Minister, published and promulgated in the same manner as newly-developed research strategies. The provisions for monitoring set out in the last paragraph of this Appendix V shall also apply to all revised strategies.

#### 2 Incorporation of Priorities within Output Research Strategies

Because the output framework has been aggregated into only 17 outputs there is now an increased need to consider whether priorities should be stipulated within outputs, with this applying on a case-by-case basis. The following instructions are to apply on an interim basis. An amendment to the priority statement may be issued prior to the publication of final research strategies by the Foundation, which extends these instructions.

**2.1 For:***Output 1 (Animal Industries):**Output 2 (Dairy Industries):**Output 4 (Horticulture, Arable and Other Food and Beverage Industries):**Output 5 (Forestry and Forest Product Industries):**Output 6 (Fishing and Aquaculture Industries):*

In these outputs the research strategy is to give appropriate weight to all segments of activity, from primary production through to processing and product specification and delivery, in supporting research which maximises added value. Funding guidelines should be set within each output that reflect the potential for research-driven added value at each stage. The requirements to consider added value should be balanced against the need to consider other goals or strategic issues within these outputs, such as sustainability.

**2.2 For Output 4 (Horticulture, Arable and Other Food and Beverage Industries)**

This output is very diverse and the needs and opportunities of the sectors encompassed within the output need to be separately considered. Components to be separately considered should at least include horticulture, arable production, and any food processing research which is not appropriately vertically integrated with production research. Funding guidelines should be established for each component which (amongst other things) take account of the significance of private sector funding and in particular the need to assist a smooth profile for total investment in those areas of research where new sources of private sector funding are still in the process of being introduced.

**2.3 For Output 7 (Manufacturing Industries and Industrial Technology):**

The strategy for this output is to give particular attention to the identification of areas of research which are linked to underpinning needs across or within the associated sectors. To this end explicit input is to be sought from the sectors. The strategy should have explicit regard for the interaction between public good science and technology, work funded through technology policy instruments such as Technology for Business Growth, and research funding from the private sector.

**2.4 For Output 8 (Tourism, Commercial and other Services):**

This output aggregates activities which are only loosely related. Tourism in particular is to be treated as a separate component and a strategy for this component developed. In developing the component strategy the Foundation is to especially recognise the possible need to be proactive in ensuring that good quality research proposals are brought forward to take up increased funding.

**2.5 For Output 13 (Society and Culture):**

This output aggregates activities which are only loosely related. Research on Maori issues is a particular priority for the Government. The support of research on Maori issues is to be allocated a target level of funding within the output which is never less than the existing 1995/96 level of funding in any year. However, the actual allocation of funding shall as in all other cases be subject to the availability of proposals of acceptable quality and relevance. The Foundation is to annually advise the Minister as to how research within this output is contributing to knowledge and understanding of Maori issues. This advice should be included in the evaluation referred to in section 7.2 of Appendix VI.

Particular attention is to be given to the smooth

inter-linking of public good science and technology and policy-related research funded by Government departments, while recognising the clear limitations on the scope of public good science and technology.

**3 Cross-output themes**

The Foundation is required to prepare strategic statements covering each cross-output theme set out in Appendix IV. From a funding point of view, these statements are to be consequent upon the research strategies and not an input to them. These statements should identify:

- The strength and relevance of the theme in each of the 17 outputs.
- The indicative funding significance of the work associated with the theme, with this being the outcome of combining the indications in the 17 output level research strategies.
- Cross-output topics and/or issues associated with the theme which will assist in more clearly achieving the goals set out in this priority statement (rather than describing the disciplines or inputs to be used in delivering outputs).

An indicative and summary statement for each theme is to be produced in accordance with the same timetable as for research strategies i.e. by 30 September 1995. These summaries should represent the Foundation's own view.

In the case of cross-output themes which are created as a consequence of announcing new National Science Strategy (NSS) topics, the Foundation shall produce a strategic statement no later than 6 months after being so advised by the Minister, and the statement shall take effect for the funding round which follows the subsequent date of 30 September.

The provisions covering revision of cross-output statements shall be the same as those for revision of output research strategies.

**4 Monitoring**

The preparation of research strategies and strategic statements for cross-output themes is to be monitored by the Ministry of Research, Science and Technology. To enable monitoring to occur the Foundation is to provide copies of penultimate drafts of each document to the Ministry at least two weeks prior to their final consideration by the Foundation, and will keep the Ministry fully informed of issues or changes which emerge subsequent to the provision of those drafts. The Ministry will be required to provide a brief critique of each document to the Minister. All Ministry critiques shall be made available to the Foundation.

However, the Foundation will not be required to obtain Ministerial approval for the content of strategies and statements. That decision will be the responsibility of the Foundation, for which it will be accountable.

**Appendix VI—Guidelines for Allocating Funds****Management of allocations in strongly growing outputs:**

1. Strongly growing outputs are those in which the target level of funding in the year 2000/2001 is at least 30% greater or \$5m larger in absolute terms, than the level of funding in 1995/96. For these outputs:
  - 1.1 A significant part of the additional funding should be allocated to new research endeavours rather than to the extension of funding for existing work.
  - 1.2 Any barriers to the participation of non traditional providers i.e. those not already funded through the output, should, where possible, be removed.

**Access and contestability**

2. The following guidelines are intended to ensure that all potential providers have access to funding and that funding allocations are contestable, in the context of the other criteria set out in this priority statement.

2.1 All science providers should have equal opportunities to put forward research proposals for consideration, and should be treated in an equal way in regard to the release of information. This should not prevent the Foundation from developing a long-term relationship with providers who have the capability to deliver outputs with long-term strategic benefits.

2.2 The criteria and processes used for making investment decisions should be transparent and applied uniformly to all proposals and providers in all outputs without bias or favour.

2.3 Any barriers which reflect the cultural or other background of applicants, particularly but not exclusively Maori, should where possible be removed by the Foundation, but not at the expense of compromising the fair application of selection criteria.

#### Assessment criteria

3. The primary criterion for the assessment of proposals shall be "fitness for purpose" incorporating consideration of scientific or technological merit and the potential contribution to achieving the goals set out in the priority statement (relevance). However, in assessing "fitness for purpose", the Foundation should set benchmarks for satisfactory standards of scientific or technological merit within each output, and so that selection between proposals of satisfactory merit is made primarily on the basis of relevance.

4. Proposals shall be required to describe the potential benefits of the research to New Zealand, in terms of the contribution to the achievement of the goals set out in this priority statement.

5. In assessing relevance to goals (or the benefits of proposed research) the Foundation shall as far as possible use defined methods, which are transparent and able to be applied in a consistent way across all proposals.

#### Science assets

6. Nationally important science assets, comprising databases and/or collections, are funded as a part of public good science and technology. In relation to these assets:

6.1 The Foundation shall be required to review the existing list of nationally important science assets to see whether it should be extended or modified. This review shall be carried out in consultation with science providers and the criteria used in the review should be published. The review should include consideration of all databases and collections which are in part or in whole supported through purchase of public good science and technology outputs. The review should be completed by 30 September 1996 and the results incorporated in research strategies for implementation as from the 1998/99 funding year.

6.2 For the existing list of nationally important assets and for the modified list when it is completed, identified assets are to be cross-referenced into the research strategies for the outputs from which they receive support.

6.3 In cases where insufficient funding is allocated to programmes to enable nationally important assets to be maintained, the Foundation may directly fund the maintenance of such assets as separate programmes.

#### Linkages between outputs and research outcomes

7. The linkages between Public Good Science and Technology outputs and the outcomes sought by the Government, should be given more direct expression through the application of the following guidelines:

7.1 All funded proposals are to include provision, as a separate objective where appropriate, for the transfer to users or into the public domain of the technology or scientific knowledge created by the research.

7.2 A process is to be set in place by the Foundation no later than 30 June 1996, which monitors and evaluates the contribution of the total package of programmes within each output to the achievement of the goals set out in this priority statement. The evaluation shall be published annually with the first evaluation to cover programmes funded in 1995/96 and with each evaluation to be published no later than 6 months after the completion of the financial year to which it refers.

#### Management of the overall process to improve effectiveness

8. Providers should be encouraged to submit proposals which demonstrate or promote interlinkages with other sources of research funding, where this helps to deliver science outputs with better fitness for purpose.

9. Where insufficient proposals of satisfactory "fitness for purpose" are received to meet the requirements of an output research strategy, and this is considered by the Foundation not to be due to a deficiency in the Government's Priority Statement or in the research strategy itself, the Foundation should take the following steps:

9.1 Investigate the reasons for this insufficiency and then report to the Minister as part of the scheduled report on the funding round, on the extent and nature of the insufficiency and on how the Foundation proposes to overcome the insufficiency in future funding rounds.

9.2 The Foundation shall where appropriate consider proactive measures such as inviting tenders for defined pieces of work, or developing prescriptions for possible programmes, or other measures.

10. Collaborative and cross-output research should be encouraged where this contributes to the purchase of more effective science outputs. In particular:

10.1 The Foundation shall ensure that its assessment and selection processes do not disadvantage such research.

10.2 The number of cross-output and collaborative proposals funded as a proportion of the total of such proposals submitted shall be monitored.

10.3 Where, in the Foundation's judgement, collaboration between two competing proposals is likely to lead to more effective research than the separate funding of the proposals, then the providers should be required to collaborate. 11 International networking should be recognised and promoted where it has the potential to result in the purchase of higher quality science outputs than would otherwise be the case. In particular:

11.1 Significant linkages with research to be carried out in other countries should be identified in all funded proposals.

11.2 The Foundation shall ensure that its assessment and selection processes do not disadvantage proposals which contain a significant international component.

**Balancing of research within outputs**

12. The portfolio of research within every output should reflect the need for this research to contribute toward all stated goals i.e. economic, environmental and social. A broad assessment of potential contributions should be prepared and provided to the Minister no later than 31 December 1995. Conditions associated with the publication and critiques of the content of these assessments shall be the same as for research strategies (see section 4 in Appendix V). The estimated contributions of those programmes funded are to be monitored against this assessment as a part of the annual evaluation referred to in paragraph 7.2 in the Appendix VI.

**Appendix VII—Boundaries of the PGSF**

The PGSF interfaces with a number of other funding mechanisms. Positive and constructive management of the interactions across those interfaces is essential to the effective application of the PGSF investment. Key elements of the management of the interactions between the various S&T funding sources include the need to ensure that:

- The boundaries are well defined so that the goals and accountability of the funding agencies are clear-cut and provider institutions are clear about the eligibility of proposals. Failure to establish clear boundaries creates risks of inefficient duplication of bidding, and of important work going unfunded.
- The establishment and encouragement of the principle of partnership between funding sources is clearly signalled, to maximise the value of the total research and development effort to the nation. Partnership also should be reflected through a shift in an industry's strategic perspective towards an increased science and technology focus or a greater alignment of the PGSF with the real needs of users to enhance its strategic value.

Two boundaries are of particular importance in the context of priority setting. These are:

**The Boundary with public sector operational research**

The PGSF should not displace public sector operational research. Other agencies will be expected to maintain their

research base and investment. However, there should be scope for PGSF funding to contribute to integrated programmes where public sector agencies are unable to establish arrangements to capture research benefits, or the research produces broad background information or expertise.

**The Boundary with private sector research and development**

The PGSF is not intended to subsidise research which creates clear and appropriable benefits for a private sector investor. Neither should the PGSF displace private sector investment, i.e. fund projects which the private sector would otherwise have funded by itself. PGSF funding should be aimed at situations where firms are unable to make private arrangements to capture research benefits because the costs of such arrangements means that they are not commercially worthwhile. PGSF funding should also be available to fund the non-appropriable elements of integrated public/private sector research programmes.

**Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 1995**

**1. Statement of Accounting Policies**

*General Accounting Policies*

The following general accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

- (i) Trust Bank Canterbury Community Trust Inc. was incorporated as a charitable trust in accordance with the provisions of the Trustee Banks Restructuring Act 1988. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable financial reporting standards.
- (ii) The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost, except for the revaluation of investments. Reliance is placed on the fact that the trust is a going concern.
- (iii) The matching of revenue earned and expenses incurred using accrual accounting concepts.

*Specific Accounting Policies*

**Depreciation**—Depreciation has been charged in the financial statements using rates which will write off the cost of assets less their estimated residual value over their estimated economic lives. The depreciation rates used are:

Office equipment .....	6–30 percent c.p.
Motor vehicles .....	18–20 percent c.p.

**Fixed Assets**—Fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

**Investments**—Investments held as managed funds are shown at market value. Net income including realised and unrealised gains or losses from holding or trading these investments are recorded in the income and expenditure account.

Other investments represent assets to be held to maturity or as long term strategic investments and are shown at market value.

Unrealised gains or losses from holding such investments are transferred directly to the revaluation reserve. These unrealised gains or losses when realised on subsequent disposal of investments are transferred from the revaluation reserve direct to the capital fund. Differences between the book value and sale proceeds of investments realised are recorded in the income and expenditure account.

*Donations, Special Projects and Community Loans*—Donations, special projects and community loans are accounted for on an accruals basis.

*Dividend Income*—Dividend income is included in the income and expenditure statement when it is received.

*Taxation*—No provision has been made for taxation.

*Goods and Services Tax*—The trust is not registered for G.S.T. purposes and therefore the financial statements have been prepared on a G.S.T. inclusive basis.

*Basis of Consolidation*—The Trust Bank Canterbury Community Trust and Canterbury Community Trust Charities Limited have been consolidated using the purchase method of consolidation.

*Changes in Accounting Policies*—There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in the previous year.

## 2. Investments
