- 3 All submissions objecting to a request for the withdrawal of a concession should include:
- reasons why the local product on which protection is sought is not a suitable alternative;
 - full technical details of the goods against which tariff protection is sought.
- 4 Where further information is required in order to make a submission an objector should contact the applicant in writing and refer a copy of the enquiry to the Ministry of Commerce quoting the details in paragraph 1 above.

Harmonised System Tariff Changes

Significant changes are being made to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System, effective from 1 January 1996. These changes affect approximately 10% of commodity classifications.

The HS changes, which New Zealand is obliged to implement, are at tariff heading (4 digit) and sub-heading (6 digit) level, but will affect the tariff item (8 digit) level as well.

No tariff rates should increase or decrease because of these HS changes.

A new Tariff document, incorporating both the HS changes and the 1997 - 2000 tariff phasing programme, is currently in preparation.

The following is a summary of areas affected by the HS changes.

- (a) The subject goods are being dumped; and
- (b) By reason thereof material injury to the New Zealand abrasive discs and wheels industry has been and is being caused.

Notice is also hereby given that, acting pursuant to subsections 14 (1) and 14 (4) of the Act, I have determined the rates of anti-dumping duty to be imposed on the subject goods to be the rates set out in the Second Schedule to this notice.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Description of Goods

Phenolic resin bonded reinforced agglomerated abrasives (excluding agglomerated diamond abrasives of either natural or synthetic form), of the following types and dimensions:

- Cut off wheels or discs with diameters up to 409 mm.
