  - full technical details of the goods against which tariff protection is sought.
- 4 Where further information is required in order to make a submission an objector should contact the applicant in writing and refer a copy of the enquiry to the Ministry of Commerce quoting the details in paragraph 1 above.

**TARIFF CONCESSION SHORTFALL POLICY**

The Ministry of Commerce has recently completed a review of the policy provisions which exist for Part II tariff concessions to be considered under reference 99 for goods in shortfall.

As a result of the review, the provisions for concession approval have been split between shortfalls of "manufacturing inputs" and shortfalls of "other than manufacturing inputs". In the case of the former, approval will be limited to a specific quantity to those manufacturers who normally source their inputs locally and who have suffered as a direct consequence of the shortage. In the case of the latter, concessions will be generally available for use by all traders during the period of proven shortfall.

The revised policy is as follows:

(a) **Shortfalls of Manufacturing Inputs**

Applications from manufacturers<sup>1</sup> for shortfall concessions will be considered if an input into the manufacturing process is not able to be supplied in normal quantities due to an unforeseen and unusual particular identifiable event and they are unable to obtain alternative supplies from within New Zealand. All applications will require the support from the traditional suppliers – grower/processor/manufacture (if they themselves are not the applicant). Concessions issued under this category will be limited to those manufacturers who have suffered as a direct consequence of the shortfall, they will be for an agreed period of time, and be restricted to the quantity which is in shortage.

(b) **Shortfalls of other than Manufacturing Inputs**

Applications for shortfall concessions will be considered under this category where there is a shortage of other than manufacturing inputs as a result of an unforeseen and unusual particular identifiable event. All applications will require support from the traditional suppliers to verify the shortfall – grower/processor/manufacture (if they themselves are not the applicant). Concessions issued under this category will be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, Customs Edition as being generally available, and issued for limited periods of time.

<sup>1</sup> Manufacturers may not always be in a position to apply directly. Therefore applications can be lodged on a manufacturer's behalf by an agent/importer/distributor.

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#### Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand, Amendment No. 5 (Duty Reassessment)

Pursuant to section 14 of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988 ("the Act"), the Minister of Commerce, having carried out a reassessment of anti-dumping duty in respect of imports into New Zealand of certain plasterboard from Thailand and having determined a new anti-dumping duty applicable to those goods, gives the following notice.

#### Notice

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This notice may be cited as the "Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand, Amendment No. 5", and shall be read together with and deemed part of the notice entitled "Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand" dated 21 December 1989 and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 11 January 1990 (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice), and of the notice entitled "Final Determination of Dumping Investigation: Certain Other Plasterboard from Thailand" dated 29 March 1996 and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 4 April 1996 (hereinafter referred to as the second principal notice).

(2) The reassessed anti-dumping duty, set out in the Schedule to this notice, shall apply to imports of the goods specified in the said Schedule with effect from 1 July 1996.

**2. Amendment to anti-dumping duty applicable**—The first principal notice (as amended by the notice in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 8 March 1990 entitled "Final

Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand, Amendment No. 1", and by the notice in *New Zealand Gazette* of 18 April 1991 entitled "Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand" Amendment No. 2 (Duty Reassessment)", and by the notice in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 7 March 1996 entitled "Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard from Thailand, Amendment No. 4 (Duty Reassessment)") is hereby amended by omitting the Schedule and substituting the Schedule to this notice. The second principal notice is hereby amended by omitting the First and Second Schedules and substituting the Schedule to this notice.

**3. Consequential revocation**—The notice entitled "Final Determination: Dumping Investigation in Respect of Plasterboard From Thailand, Amendment No. 4 (Duty Reassessment)", and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 7 March 1996, is hereby revoked.

##### Amount of Anti-Dumping Duty

The amount of anti-dumping duty to be paid on demand in respect of each importation of plasterboard, imported or intended to be imported into New Zealand from Thailand, shall be equal to the amount by which the free-on-board value (Being "Customs value" as defined in section 2 (1) of the Customs Act 1966) is less than the non-injurious free-on-board import price of NZ\$2.1245 per square metre."
