Wildlife Act 1953 Wildlife Regulations 1955 The New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp Regulations 1993

Open Season for Game in Fish and Game Regions

The Minister of Conservation declares an open season for game in the Fish and Game Regions, subject to the schedule of game licenses and fees prescribed in the Wildlife Regulations 1955 (as amended by the Wildlife Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 13) and set out for public information in the Third Schedule hereto) and subject to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule of this notice, except in the closed game areas published in the supplement to the New Zealand Gazette of 28 March 1985 and later.

New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp

A game bird habitat stamp must ¹ be affixed to every licence to hunt or kill game. The following form of the 1997 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp is approved ².



NEW ZEALAND FISH AND GAME COUNCIL \$10

The 1997 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp has a face value of ten dollars (\$10.00). Only a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be payable³ in respect of every game bird habitat stamp supplied in respect of a licence to hunt or kill game.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Except where all game is labelled with the following details:

- (a) The name and address of the person by whom the game was taken:
- (b) The number of the licence to hunt or kill game held by the person by whom the game was taken;
- (c) The name of the Fish and Game Region by which that licence was issued:
- (d) The name of the Fish and Game Regions in which the game was taken; and

(e) The date on which the game was taken;

No person shall have in possession on any one day game, more than:

Saturday 3 May 1997: The number of game birds specified as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken.

Sunday 4 May 1997: Twice the number of game birds specified for Saturday 3 May 1997.

Every subsequent day: The number of game birds specified as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken.

Waiver of Restrictions on Baiting, and Methods of Taking Game Baiting for Waterfowl

Persons 4 may hunt or kill game of the family Anatidae (waterfowl) during the open season for game in all Fish and Game Regions where food has been cast, thrown, placed or planted during the current open season for game or during the thirty (30) days immediately prior to the open season for game.

Magazine Shotguns

Persons ⁵ may hunt or kill game birds, as specified, within the Fish and Game Regions named below, with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type not adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding more than one shell.

A. This approval shall apply only in the following Fish and Game regions for the hunting of all game birds from and inclusive of 3 May 1997.

Fish and Game Regions of: Nelson/Marlborough West Coast Central South Island Otago

B. This approval shall apply in the North Canterbury Fish and Game Region from 31 May 1997 for the purpose of hunting only Canada Geese. To be in possession of any game bird other than Canada Geese while possessing, using or being in charge of a magazine shotgun not adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding more than one shell, is to be in breach of the Act. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

Fish and Game Region of: North Canterbury

C. This approval shall apply only during that period of the open season for game following 30th July 1997 for the purpose of hunting Canada Geese. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

Fish and Game Regions of: Southland

D. This approval shall apply only during that period of the open season for game following 6 February 1998 for the purpose of hunting Canada Geese and Paradise Shelduck only. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

Fish and Game Regions of: Wellington

Shotgun Calibre

Persons⁶ may hunt or kill Canada Geese within the following Fish and Game Regions, with any shotgun of a calibre 10 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act. This approval shall apply only from, and including, the 5thJuly 1997:

Fish and Game Regions of: Auckland/Waikato

Camouflaged Rowboats

Persons⁷ may hunt or kill game within the following Fish and Game Regions, from unmoored camouflaged rowboats, subject to the conditions specified below. Fish and Game Regions of:

Northland Nelson/Marlborough

Otago

Southland

Taranaki

West Coast

Eastern - applicable only to the estuarine waters of the Tauranga Harbour.

Wellington - applicable only for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 5 May 1997.

Central South Island - applicable only for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 5 May 1997.

Pegging day

- 1. A person, following purchase of a 1997 game bird hunting licence can reclaim the stand claimed during the 1996 Game Season at any time prior to 10.00am on
 - 6 April 1997 in all Fish & Game regions, except Auckland/Waikato and North Canterbury
 - 19 April 1997 in the North Canterbury Fish & Game region only
 - 20 April 1997 in the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game region only

Otherwise unclaimed stands can only be claimed any time after 10.00am on; 6 April in all Fish & Game regions, except Auckland/Waikato and North Canterbury 20 April in the North Canterbury, and Auckland/Waikato, Fish & Game regions only. Stands are claimed by completing and attaching to the stand or a stake or board at the stand site, the claim tag provided with the licence.

- 2. No one can claim more than one stand.
- A stand cannot be claimed closer than 90 metres to a stand already claimed by another person without that person's consent.
- 4. Any stand not claimed by the claimant within one hour after the opening hour of hunting, on any day, can be occupied by another licence holder.

Conditions

- 1. These approvals shall not derogate from the principal conditions specified for each Fish and Game Region under the Second Schedule, which shall apply.
- 2. These approvals will expire at the end of the open season for game specified under the Second Schedule for each Fish and Game Region.

Shooting hours: 6.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m., except that from 12.00am (midnight) 20 May to 12.00am (midnight) 24 May 1997 (both days inclusive) and from 12.00am (midnight) 19 June to 12.00am (midnight) 23 June 1997 (both days inclusive), Canada Geese may be hunted or killed 24 hours per day.

Decoy limit: No limit.

- 1. From the 3 May to the 29 June 1997 inclusive no person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Waikare, any drifting or temporarily moored floating stand or any stand, hide or maimai which is permanently fixed to the lake bed except within 180 metres of the outer margin of the lake, or the shoreline of Motu Nuia Island (Grape Island).
- 2. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Ngaroto any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai except within 85 metres of the margin of the lake.
- 3. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Rotokauri any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai on any open water of the lake.
- 4. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground any game bird(s) shot or parts of any game birds shot.
- 5. It shall be an offence for any person to herd or drive Black Swan(s) for the purpose of hunting or killing them.

- 6. It shall be an offence to shoot game from any unmoored boat on the Waikato River north of the boat ramp at the confluence of the Mangawara Stream and the Waikato River at Taupiri on any of the first three days or the second weekend of the open season.
- 7. No person shall possess a firearm in or on any unmoored vessel, except a rowboat, unless the firearm is dismantled or secured in a case, gunslip or other secure compartment, except when in use to retrieve wounded game.

Definition of Areas

The following descriptions refer to Local Authority Boundaries described on the Infomap 242B-2 Department of Survey and Land Information for the Eastern Region Fish and Game Council region.

Area A1: Tauranga District, Western Bay of Plenty District, that part of the South Waikato District within the Eastern Fish and Game region and east of State Highway 1, Rotorua District, Kawerau District, Whakatane District, and Opotiki District.

Area A2: Those parts of the South Waikato District west of State Highway 1 within the Eastern Fish and Game region, Taupo District, and Ruapehu District, which lie within the Eastern Fish and Game region.

Area B1: Gisborne District

Area B2: That part of Wairoa District within the Eastern Fish and Game region.

Shooting hours: 6.15 a.m. to 6.15 p.m., except that in Areas A1 and A2 from 14 July to 31 August 1997 inclusive Canada Goose may be hunted or killed 24 hours per day.

Decoy limit: No limit

Unmoored Boats

Hunting from unmoored boats is prohibited over opening weekend (3 May to 4 May incl.)

Maimais

- 1. No maimai shall impede the use of navigable channels in the Tauranga Harbour, Ohiwa Harbour, Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua and Lake Taupo.
- 2. Maimais erected in the Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua, Ohiwa Harbour, Stump and Waihi bays of Lake Taupo must be dismantled and removed within two weeks of the close of the season (i.e. by 14 September 1997).

Closed Game Area

The following area is declared a Closed Game Area:

Waewaetukuki Wildlife Refuge

All that area within 90 metres of the boundary of the former Waewaetutuki Wildlife Refuge being Waewaetutuki 8B Block, situated in Block 1, Waihi South Survey District and comprising all of certificate of title 3D/627.

Area D: These parts of Areas B and C contained by a line commencing at Opunake and following the Opunake-Eltham Road to Eltham, then by straight line to Rataiti, then by Ongo Road to the eastern boundary of the region. Then southerly by that boundary and the sea coast to Opunake.

Wairau Lagoons: That area defined as all open waters, islands and the peninsula between Chandlers Lagoon and Big Lagoon, south of the Wairau River mouth, including Te Aropipi Channel and north of the White Bluffs.

Pheasant Area: The area west of the Bryant Range, north of SH63 from St. Arnaud to Kawatiri Junction and east of the Hope and Arthur ranges.

Area A (Paradise Shelduck, Black Swan and Canada Geese): That area east and south of the system of roads commonly called the 'Line Road', which, from the south is SH No.77 to the Rakaia Gorge and east and north to SH No. 73; thence along SH 73 to the Waimakariri Gorge Road junction; and thence along the Waimakariri Gorge - Depot Gorge - Oxford Rangiora - Rangiora Woodend Roads to SH No. 1; and south of Woodend Beach Road.

Area B (Paradise Shelduck, Black Swan and Canada Geese): The remainder of the Region excluding "area A".

Shooting hours: 6.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. or any period within these hours, except that during the period 1 June 1997 to 26 April 1998 inclusive, Canada Geese may be hunted or killed 24 hours per day during the specified open season.

Decoy limit:

Duck decoys: (a) 3 May to 11 May, both days inclusive, no person, or persons sharing a stand, shall use more than 30 duck decoys. No duck decoys shall be placed within 50 metres of those placed by any other hunter or stand.

(b) 12 May to 20 July - no limit.

Goose, Black Swan and all other game species: No limit

- 1. No hut, mudhole, stand, hide, shelter, maimai, boat, or cylinder or other contrivance shall be used for the hunting or killing of game in any part of Lake Ellesmere at which the water is of a depth greater than 60 cm, excepting such areas as may be decided upon by the North Canterbury Fish and Game Council, provided that nothing in this special condition shall prevent any person using any vessel for the purpose of retrieving game that has been legally killed or wounded.
- 2. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground the bodies or parts of bodies of Black Swan or other game shot in the North Canterbury Fish and Game Region.
- 3. Staking of maimais in the North Canterbury Fish and Game Region is 2 weeks before opening weekend, except on boundary areas where 4 weeks applies.
- 4. It shall be lawful for hunters to hunt and kill game over fed areas within the North Canterbury Fish & Game region this season.
- 5. The use of unpinned magazine shotguns is allowed within the North Canterbury Fish & Game region between 1 June 1997 and 23 November 1997, and 31 January 1998 to 26 April 1998 for the hunting of Canada Geese only, with the proviso that any person commits an offence who is in possession of an unpinned magazine shotgun and any species of gamebird other than Canada Geese during this period.

- 2. It shall be an offence for any person to leave on the hunting ground the bodies or parts of bodies of Black Swan or other game shot in the Otago Fish and Game Region.
- 3. Shooting from a boat is prohibited on the Clutha River on the opening weekend only.
- 4. Chukar hunting is prohibited in the area of the Taieri Ridge north and east of the railway line from Mosgiel to Hyde.
- 5. Canada Geese can be hunted in some areas during the December January closed season if an authorisation is obtained from the Otago Fish & Game Council and the hunting will not affect management activities or moulting waterfowl.

THIRD SCHEDULE

Game Licences and Licence Fees

This schedule notifies the definitions and classes of game licenses and fees payable in respect of each class of licence and the conditions attached thereto as set out in Regulation 13 and the Fifth Schedule of the Wildlife Regulations 1955.

The \$1 game bird habitat stamp component of the following total licence fees is set by regulation 4 of the New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp Regulations 1993.

The holder of any game licence for the 1997 game season shall be subject to the conditions and daily possession limits for each Fish and Game Region in which the hunting or killing of game takes place, as specified under the Second Schedule of the notice in the New Zealand Gazette in which the Minister of Conservation declared the 1997 open season for game.

The provisions of the Arms Act 1983 apply with respect to firearms used in accordance with the licence.

Definitions

Adult: Any person 20 years of age or older as at 3 May 1997.

Young Adult: Any person 16 years of age or older but not having obtained 20 years of age as at 3 May 1997.

Junior: Any person under the age of 16 years as at 3 May 1997.

Child: Any person under the age of 12 years as at 3 May 1997.
