# Wildlife Act 1953 Wildlife Regulations 1955 The New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp Regulations 1993

#### **Open Season for Game in Fish and Game Regions**

The Minister of Conservation declares an open season for game in the Fish and Game Regions, subject to the schedule of game licenses and fees prescribed in the Third Schedule of this notice and subject to the conditions specified in the First and Second Schedule of this notice, except in the closed game areas published in the supplement to the New Zealand Gazette of 28 March 1985 and later.

#### New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp

A game bird habitat stamp must <sup>1</sup> be affixed to every licence to hunt or kill game. The following form of the 1998 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp is approved <sup>2</sup>.

The 1998 New Zealand Game Bird Habitat Stamp has a face value of ten dollars (\$10.00). A fee of one dollar (\$1.00) only shall be payable<sup>3</sup> in respect of every game bird habitat stamp supplied in respect of a licence to hunt or kill game.

# FIRST SCHEDULE

Except where all game is labelled with the following details:

- (a) The name and address of the person by whom the game was taken;
- (b) The number of the licence to hunt or kill game held by the person by whom the game was taken;
- (c) The name of the Fish and Game Region by which that licence was issued;
- (d) The name of the Fish and Game Regions in which the game was taken; and

(e) The date on which the game was taken;

No person shall have in possession on any one day, more than:

Saturday 2 May 1998: The number of game birds specified as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken.

Sunday 3 May 1998: Twice the number of game birds specified for Saturday 2 May 1998.

Every subsequent day: The number of game birds specified as the daily bag limit for the Fish and Game Region in which the game is taken.

# Waiver of Restrictions on Baiting, and Methods of Taking Game Baiting for Waterfowl

Persons<sup>4</sup> may hunt or kill game of the family Anatidae (waterfowl) during the open season for game in all Fish and Game Regions where food has been cast, thrown, placed or planted during the current open season for game or during the thirty (30) days immediately prior to the open season for game.

# **Magazine Shotguns**

Persons<sup>5</sup> may hunt or kill game birds, as specified, within the Fish and Game Regions named below, with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type not adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding more than one shell.

A. This approval shall apply only in the following Fish and Game regions for the hunting of all game birds from and inclusive of 2 May 1998. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

Fish and Game Regions of: Nelson/Marlborough West Coast North Canterbury Central South Island Otago Southland

B. This approval shall apply in the following Fish andGame regions during that period of the open season for game following 5 February 1999 and only for the purpose of hunting Canada Geese and Paradise Shelduck. The approval is subject to the conditions specified below.

# Magazine shotguns - restricted capacity

#### (a) Three shot

From 2 May 1998 and for the duration of the 1998 game season, persons <sup>6</sup> may hunt or kill all game bird within the following Fish & Game regions with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding no more than two shells;

Fish and Game Regions: Auckland/Waikato Hawke's Bay

#### (b) Five shot - Canada goose only - Auckland/Waikato

Persons<sup>7</sup> may hunt or kill Canada geese within the Auckland/Waikato Fish and Game region with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding no more than four shells, during the following periods:

7.00pm 8 May 1998 to 11.45pm 14 May 1998

7.00pm 6 June 1998 to 11.45pm 12 June 1998

7.00pm 4 July 1998 to 11.45pm 22 July 1998 (subject to public notification of this season)

#### (c) Five shot - 10 gauge - Canada goose only - Auckland/Waikato

Persons<sup>8</sup> may hunt or kill Canada geese within the Auckland/Waikato Fish and Game region with any shotgun of a calibre 10 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding no more than four shells, during the following periods:

7.00pm 4 July 1998 to 11.45pm 22 July 1998 (subject to public notification of this season)

# (d) Two shot - all game - Eastern

From 2 May 1998 persons <sup>7</sup> may hunt or kill all game bird within the Eastern Fish and Game region with any shotgun of a calibre 12 gauge or less having a magazine of any type adjusted in accordance with regulations made under this Act, and capable of holding no more than two shells, <u>provided</u> that a shotgun with its magazine so adjusted will at anytime hold no more than two shells.

(Explanatory note: While the magazine adjustment enables a magazine shotgun to hold three shells, no person can have three shells in the shotgun at any one time.)

#### **Camouflaged Rowboats**

Persons<sup>9</sup> may hunt or kill game within the following Fish and Game Regions, from unmoored camouflaged rowboats, subject to the conditions specified below.

Eastern - applicable for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 4 May 1998.

Wellington - applicable only for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 4 May 1998.

North Canterbury - applicable only for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 11 May 1998.

Central South Island - applicable only for that remaining period of the open season for game in the Region, commencing from 4 May 1998.

#### Pegging day

 A person, following purchase of a 1998 game bird hunting licence can reclaim the stand claimed during the 1997 Game Season at any time prior to 10.00am on 5 April 1998 in all Fish & Game regions, except Auckland/Waikato

19 April 1998 in the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game region only

Otherwise unclaimed stands can only be claimed any time after 10.00am on;

5 April in all Fish & Game regions, except Auckland/Waikato

19 April in the Auckland/Waikato, Fish & Game region only.

Stands are claimed by completing and attaching to the stand or a stake or board at the stand site, the claim tag provided with the licence.

- 2. No one can claim more than one stand.
- 3 A stand cannot be claimed closer than 90 metres to a stand already claimed by another person without that person's consent.
- 4. Any stand not claimed by the claimant within one hour after the opening hour of hunting, on any day, can be occupied by another licence holder.

#### Conditions

- 1. These approvals shall not derogate from the principal conditions specified for each Fish and Game Region under the Second Schedule, which shall apply.
- 2. These approvals will expire at the end of the open season for game specified under the Second Schedule for each Fish and Game Region.

#### **Special Conditions**

1. From the 2 May to the 28 June 1998 inclusive no person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Waikare, any drifting or temporarily moored floating stand or any stand, hide or maimai which is permanently fixed to the lake bed except within 180 metres of the outer margin of the lake, or the shoreline of Motu Nuia Island (Grape Island).

2. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Ngaroto any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai except within 85 metres of the margin of the lake.

3. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Rotokauri any fixed stand, pontoon, hide or maimai on any open water of the lake.

4. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground any game bird(s) shot or parts of any game birds shot.

5. It shall be an offence for any person to herd or drive Black Swan(s) for the purpose of hunting or killing them.

6. It shall be an offence to shoot game from any unmoored boat on the Waikato River north of the boat ramp at the confluence of the Mangawara Stream and the Waikato River at Taupiri on any of the first three days or the second weekend of the open season.

7. No person shall possess a firearm in or on any unmoored vessel, except a rowboat, unless the firearm is dismantled or secured in a case, gunslip or other secure compartment, except when in use to retrieve wounded game.

Closed Game Area, No. 133, Southern Lake Waikare, as listed for the former Auckland Acclimatisation Society, is revoked.

# **Definition of Areas**

The following descriptions refer to Local Authority Boundaries described on the Infomap 242B-2 Department of Survey and Land Information for the Eastern Region Fish and Game Council region.

Area A1: Tauranga District, Western Bay of Plenty District, that part of the South Waikato District within the Eastern Fish and Game region and east of State Highway 1, Rotorua District, Kawerau District, Whakatane District, and Opotiki District.

Area A2: Those parts of the South Waikato District west of State Highway 1 within the Eastern Fish and Game region, Taupo District, and Ruapehu District, which lie within the Eastern Fish and Game region.

Area B1: Gisborne District

Area B2: That part of Wairoa District within the Eastern Fish and Game region.

**Shooting hours:** 6.15 a.m. to 6.15 p.m., except that in Areas A1 and A2 from 13 July to 30 August 1998 inclusive Canada Goose may be hunted or killed 24 hours per day.

# **Unmoored Boats**

Hunting from unmoored boats is prohibited over opening weekend (2 May to 3 May incl.)

# Maimais

1. No maimai shall impede the use of navigable channels in the Tauranga Harbour, Ohiwa Harbour, Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua and Lake Taupo.

2. Maimais erected in the Little Waihi Estuary, Lake Aniwhenua, Ohiwa Harbour, Stump and Waihi bays of Lake Taupo must be dismantled and removed within two weeks of the close of the season (i.e. by 14 September 1998).

# Magazine Capacity

The magazine of a shotgun may be adjusted to hold a maximum of two shells, however no shotgun shall hold more than two shells at any one time.

The holder of any game licence for the 1998 game season shall be subject to the conditions and daily possession limits for each Fish and Game Region in which the hunting or killing of game takes place, as specified under the First and Second Schedules of the notice in the New Zealand Gazette in which the Minister of Conservation declared the 1998 open season for game.

The provisions of the Arms Act 1983 apply with respect to firearms used in accordance with the licence.

#### **Definitions**

Adult: Any person 20 years of age or older as at 2 May 1998.

Young Adult: Any person 16 years of age or older but not having obtained 20 years of age as at 2 May 1998.

Junior: Any person under the age of 16 years as at 2 May 1998.

Child: Any person under the age of 12 years as at 2 May 1998.
