CONSERVATION ACT 1987 FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1983

NOTICE

This Notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1998.

First schedule

Fishing conditions generally common to all Fish & Game regions.

Second schedule

Regional specific fishing conditions, bag limits, closed and open waters, and the like.

Third schedule

Licence classes and fees.

FIRST SCHEDULE

1. INTERPRETATION

Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in the Conservation Act 1987 or the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, shall be so defined.

"All year" means a 12 month period commencing on 1 October and concluding on 30 September of the following year, both days inclusive.

"Artificial fly" means any lure of feather, fur, wool or other material of any kind customarily used in the making of artificial flies; but shall not include any lure in the tying of which lead or other weight has been incorporated unless the hook incorporated in that lure does not exceed 14mm in length (exclusive of the eye) and the gape of the hook does not exceed 6mm.

"Bait", means:

Natural fly

Natural insect

Natural spider

Natural worm or worms

Natural crustacea

Natural fish (excluding fish ova, or any portion of a fish, or shellfish [mollusca])

Uncoloured bread dough

"Bait Assembly" means either a hook rigged with a number of baits, or a single bait rigged with a number of hooks.

"Bait Fishing" means to fish for sports fish with bait.

"Boat" means any manned floation device.

"Fishing" and "fish" in this Notice means;

- (a) The catching, taking, or harvesting of sports fish; and
- (b) Includes-

- (i) Any other activity that may reasonably be expected to result in the catching, taking, or harvesting of sports fish:
- (ii) Any attempt to catch, take or harvest sports fish:
- (iii) Any operation in support of, or in preparation for, any activity described in this definition.

"Foulhook" means to hook a sports fish otherwise than from within the mouth.

"Length" is the measurement from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail.

"Lure" means any authorised artificial fly, or spinner, or bait.

"Spinner" means any artificial lure other than an artificial fly.

"Spin Fishing" means to fish for sports fish with a spinner

"Sports fish" means those freshwater fish described in the First Schedule of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, namely;

Brown Trout
Rainbow trout
American brook trout or char
Lake trout or char
Atlantic salmon
Quinnat or chinook salmon

Sockeye salmon
Perch
Tench
Rudd (Auckland/Waikato Fish &
Game region only).

2. AUTHORISED TACKLE

- 2.1 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish except by using a rod and running line and authorised lure.
- 2.2 Nets:
 - 2.2.1 When playing a sports fish a landing net may be used to secure or land that fish.
 - 2.2.2 For keeping non-salmonid sports fish alive, a keep net may be used in the water from which the fish was caught.
- 2.3 No licence holder shall use more than one assembled rod and running line.
- No licence holder shall fish for sports fish unless within 15 metres of the rod being used.
- 2.5 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use more than one bait assembly.

3. FOUL HOOKING OF FISH

- 3.1 No licence holder shall attempt to foul hook any sports fish.
- Any licence holder who foul hooks a sports fish shall return it immediately to the water with as little injury as possible.

4. MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM LENGTH

Every licence holder who catches a sports fish which does not exceed the specified minimum length, or does exceed the specified maximum length, shall immediately return it with as little injury as possible into the water from which it was taken.

5. OPEN SEASON

No licence holder shall fish for any sports fish except during an open season.

6. DAILY LIMIT BAGS

- No licence holder shall continue to fish for a particular species of sports fish on any day in which he can she has already killed the limit bag for that species.
- 6.2 It shall be permissible to make up the difference between a lesser limit bag prescribed in one place and higher limit bag prescribed in another.

7. AUTHORISED LURES AND BAITS

Authorised lures and baits (subject to any regional restrictions specified in the Second Schedule) are: Artificial fly

Spinner

Bait

4. AUTHORISED TACKLE

- 4.1 No Licence holder shall fish for sports fish in the Northland Fish & Game Region except using a single rod an running line.
- 4.2 No Licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use
 - a) any lead or weight (other than hooks as permitted elsewhere in this notice attached as to hang below any lure)
 - b) any hook which has a gape greater than 14 mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank
 - c) any lure having more than one hook, or having a multiple hook, or any fixed hooks.
 - d) more than 2 lures
 - e) any lure treated with any medicinal preparation other than a substance used solely to give buoyancy to a artificial fly.
 - f) any downrigger or paravane;
 - g) any gaff or landing hook;
 - h) any unsportsmanlike device or gear;
 - i) any electric fishing gear except for the purposes of duly authorised scientific investigations or data collection;
 - j) any preparation to attract fish
 - k) any narcotic, poisonous substance or liquid injurious to fish;
 - l) any stroke hauling or foul hooking gear.
- 4.3 No Licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall have
 - a) any spear, spear gun or pointed missile (other than a bullet)
- 5. FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

No restrictions

6. BAIT FISHING WATERS

No restrictions

 - 2.2.2 For keeping non-salmonid sports fish alive, a keep net may be used in the water from which the fish was caught.
- 2.3 No licence holder shall use more than one assembled rod and running line.
- 2.4 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish unless within 15 metres of the rod being used.
- 2.5 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use more than one bait assembly.

3. FOUL HOOKING OF FISH

- 3.1 No licence holder shall attempt to foul hook any sports fish.
- 3.2 Any licence holder who foul hooks a sports fish shall return it immediately to the water with as little injury as possible.

4. MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM LENGTH

Every licence holder who catches a sports fish which does not exceed the specified minimum length, or does exceed the specified maximum length, shall immediately return it with as little injury as possible into the water from which it was taken.

7. USE OF BOATS

Anglers trolling from boats must stay at least 50 metres from any anglers fishing from the shore.

8. DAILY BAG LIMITS

No Licence holder shall on any one day kill more than five sportsfish

9. FISH LENGTH

2. CLOSED WATERS

Subject to Section 2.2. of this Schedule

2.1 No licence holder shall take sports fish from the following waters:

All rivers, streams and their tributaries which flow into but not including Lake Arapuni, Lake Waipapa, Lak Karapiro and that part of the Waikato River downstream from the Maraetai Dam to above the Karapiro Dam.

2.2 The closed waters restrictions in Section 2.1 of this Schedule do not apply to the following waters:

Waipapa River and tributaries

Pokaiwhenua Stream and tributaries

Mangawhio Stream and tributaries

Waikato River

Waipa Stream and tributaries

3. AUTHORISED TACKLE

No licence holder when fishing for sports fish in the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game Region shall use:

3.1 More than two lures.

- 3.2 Any lure having more than one hook or having a multiple hook, or any fixed assembly of hooks.
- 3.3 Any hook which has a gape greater than 14mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank.
- 3.4 Any lure treated with any medicinal or chemical preparation other than a flotation preparation used solely to give buoyancy to an artificial fly.
- 3.5 Any artificial fly which has lead or other weight incorporated unless the hook used does not exceed 14 mm in length (being the horizontal straight line distance from the rear of the eye, exclusive of the eye, to the rear of the bend) and the gape (being the distance from the point of the hook to the underside of the nearest part of the hook shank above the point) of the hook does not exceed 6 mm.
- Any lead or weight (other than hooks as permitted elsewhere in this notice) attached below or as to hang below any lure or bait.
- 3.7 Such restrictions in Sections 3.1 to 3.6 should apply notwithstanding any other restrictions, limitation or indulgence or licence granted by this Schedule.

4. VESSEL FISHING RESTRICTIONS

No licence holder shall fish for sports fish from any vessel in that part of the Waikato River between the Arapuni Dam and the upper limits of Lake Karapiro (as shown by the white marker post, situated 200 metres below the Huihuitaha Stream mouth) unless that vessel is securely anchored at all material times.

5. ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

- Artificial fly fishing in the Auckland/Waikato Region means to fish for sports fish with fly rod and fly reel and fly line and artificial fly, but with no additional weight to facilitate casting.
- 5.2 Artificial fly fishing is the only fishing method for sports fish allowed in the following waters and their tributaries: Wairoa River from its source to the Hunua Falls

Komata Stream

Maratoto Stream from its source to the ford of the old Whangamata Track

Kakahu Stream (north-east of Okoroire)

Waipapa River upstream from the first waterfall situated approximately 0.5km from Lake Waipapa

Mangatutu Stream from its source to the Lethbridge Road Bridge

Puniu River from its source to the Bayley Road Bridge

Kaniwhaniwha Stream

Ngakoaohia Stream from its source to the bridge on Pirongia-Kawhia roadway

Awakino River from its source to the Mahoenui Bridge

Waipa Stream (near Putaruru. also known as the Little Waipa Stream) from its source to the Horahora Road Bridge (which is deemed to be the mouth)

Waione Stream

Okauaka Stream

6. SPIN FISHING AND ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

Spin fishing and artificial fly fishing are the only fishing methods for sports fish allowed in the following waters: Mangatangi Reservoir

Mangatawhiri Reservoir

All rivers and streams, excluding any waters specified in Sections 5, 7 and 8 of this Schedule.

7. SPIN FISHING, ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING AND BAIT FISHING ONLY WATERS

Spin fishing, artificial fly fishing and bait fishing are the only fishing methods for sports fish allowed in the following waters:

Whanganui River downstream from its confluence with the Whakapapa River Ongarue River downstream from its confluence with the Waimiha Stream Moakurarua Stream downstream from Mulligans Bridge (Honikiwi Road)

8. COARSE FISHING WATERS

8.1 There is no restriction on lures or baits in the following waters:

Whangamarino River

Mangatawhiri River from the bridge on SH2, to its confluence with the Waikato River All lakes and ponds. excluding any water specified in Sections 6 and 7 of this part of this notice

- 8.2 In respect to all waters not specified in Section 8.1 of this notice, with the written authorisation of the Manager of the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game Council in the licence holders possession and available for production on demand, there is no restriction on lures or baits for a licence holder participating in a fishing competition for rudd, perch and tench, provided all other species of sports fish landed must be immediately returned to the waters and released
- 8.3 There are no restrictions on the numbers of rods and running lines that a licence holder fishing for perch, tench or rudd may have assembled provided only one of which shall be used for fishing at any one time.
- 8.4 A roach pole may be used to fish for and take perch, tench and rudd.

9. DAILY BAG LIMIT OF KILLED SPORTS FISH

Whakapapa River and its tributaries from its source to the confluence with the Piopiotea Stream
Awakino River
All other waters

2 trout or salmon 2 trout or salmon 5 trout or salmon 5 perch, rudd or tench

10. MINIMUM SIZE

10.1 The minimum size for trout or salmon taken in the following waters shall be 220mm:

Lake Pupuke Lake Moananui Lake Tomarata Lake Ototoa Lake Whatihua (Thomsons Lake) Lake Otamatearoa (Muirs Lake)

Waihou River Waimakariri Stream

In all other waters the minimum size shall be 300mm

10.2 Trout or salmon landed under the minimum size shall be immediately returned to the water and released.

EASTERN FISH AND GAME REGION

Reference to Description: Gazette No. 83 of 24 May 1990 at page 1861 (SO Plan 58495)

1. INTERPRETATION

"Fly fishing" in the Eastern Fish and Game Region means to fish for sports fish with fly rod, fly reel, fly line and artificia fly, but with no additional weight to facilitate casting.

"Landmark" means a black, yellow and white ringed post or buoy.

"Set rod" means any assembled rod that is not in physical contact with a licence holder when being used to fish for sports fish.

"Spinner" does not include any lure which exceeds 40 grams in weight.

"Sports fish" in the Eastern Fish and Game Region includes any hybrid of the the sports fish species described in the First Schedule.

3. CLOSED SEASON

No licence holder shall fish for sports fish at any time from the following waters;

- 3.1 all streams flowing into Lake Tarawera and that portion of the Tarawera River enclosed by landmarks at the Lak Tarawera Outlet and extending approximately 150m downstream to landmarks in the river, otherwise known a the Tarawera Outlet Spawning Sanctuary;
- 3.2 the Utuhina Stream above the Pukehangi Road bridge and all tributaries of this stream;
- 3.3 the following streams and their tributaries which flow into Lake Rotorua;
 - a) the Waiowhiro, Waiohewa, Waingaehe, Waimata and Waikuta Streams;
 - b) the Hamurana stream above the Hamurana Road bridge;
 - c) the Awahou Stream above the Hamurana Road bridge;
- 3.4 all springs, streams, and their tributaries which flow into Lake Waikareiti, and into or from lakes Rotoma Rotoehu, Rotomahana, Rerewhakaaitu, Rotokakahi, Okareka, Okataina and Rotoiti except the Ohau Channel and the Kaituna River;
- 3.5 the Rangataiki River for a distance of 80 metres below the Aniwhenua Barrage;

4. AUTHORISED TACKLE

- 4.1 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish with a set rod unless he or she is fishing from an unanchored boat.
- 4.2 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use
 - a) any lead or weight (other than hooks as permitted elsewhere in this notice) attached as to hang below any lure
 - b) any hook which has a gape greater than 14mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank
 - c) any lure having more than one hook, or having a multiple hook, or any fixed assembly of hooks
 - d) more than 2 lures
 - e) any lure treated with any medicinal preparation other than a substance used solely to give buoyancy to a artificial fly
 - f) any downrigger, paravane, other device or weight (other than a running line) designed to sink a lure while trolling;
 - g) any gaff or landing hook;
 - h) any unsportsmanlike device or gear;
 - i) any electric fishing gear, except for the purposes of duly authorised scientific investigations or data collection;
 - i) any preparation to attract fish;
 - k) any narcotic, poisonous substance or liquid injurious to fish;
 - l) any stroke hauling or foul hooking gear.
- 4.3 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall have any spear, spear gun or pointed missile (other than bullet).
- 4.4 Any metal cored or wire line may be used only in the waters of Lake Rotoma or those parts of Lake Okataina of Lake Tarawera which lie outside of a radius 200 metres from the centre of the mouth or mouths of every stream spring or river flowing into or out of either of these lakes, or that part of Lake Tarawera which lies outside a line the ends of which are shown by landmarks on the shore at Stoney Point and Kariri Point, running parallel to, and 200 metres from the shore.

5. FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

Artificial fly fishing only shall be used in the following waters;

The Ohau Channel:

The Tarawera River from Lake Tarawera (excluding the trout spawning sanctuary) to the Tarawera Falls;

The section of Rangiuru Bay defined by landmarks at Stoney Point and Kariri Point, and extending 200m offshored All waters contained within 200 metres are around the centre of every stream; spring, or river flowing into or out of lakes Rotoiti, Tarawera, Okataina, Rotoma; Rotoehu, Waikaremoana, Waikareiti and Rotorua excluding the Utuhina Stream downstream of the Lake Road bridge where spinners may also be used;

The Horomanga River and tributaries;

The Hopuruahine, Aniwaniwa, Korokoro, Mokau streams and all tributaries of these streams;

The Ruakituri and Hangaroa Rivers (including their tributaries) upstream from the base of the Te Reinga Falls;

The Wharekopae River;

The Waioeka River and Opato Stream (including tributaries) upstream from their confluence;

Lakes Whakamarino and Kaitawa (including all inflowing streams);

The Waimapu Stream.

6. BAIT FISHING WATERS

No licence holder shall use any bait except for natural fly, natural insect or natural crustacean (excluding koura) in any waters of the Eastern Fish and Game Region.

7. USE OF BOATS

- 7.1 No licence holder shall fish for trout from a boat in the following waters:
 - a) the Tarawera River from its outlet from Lake Tarawera to the Tarawera Falls situated approximately 2500 metres downstream:
 - b) that section of the Tarawera Outlet enclosed by landmarks;
 - c) in the designated winter shoreline fishing areas on lakes Tarawera, Rotoiti and Okataina (Schedule 2, Clause 2), from the 1st day of July to the 30th day of September;
 - d) the Ohau Channel and those sections in lakes Rotorua and Rotoiti that are within a 200 metre radius from the centre of the Ohau Channel as indicated by landmarks.
 - e) the area within a radius of 15 metres of the Wairua Stream mouth on Lake Tarawera.
- 7.2 No licence holder shall fish for trout from any boat in waters reserved for artificial fly fishing as specified in Schedule 2, Clause 5, or within waters contained within a 200 metres radius around the centre of the Utuhina Stream mouth, unless the boat is securely anchored with no more than two anchors;

8. DAILY BAG LIMITS

- 8.2 Any licence holder taking a male trout within 200m radius of the mouth of the Te Wairoa Stream, Lake Tarawera shall return it to the water immediately with as little injury as possible.
- 8.3 No licence holder shall kill more than 2 brown trout in a daily bag limit of 8 trout from Lake Waikaremoana.

9. MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM LENGTH TO BE TAKEN

Trout or salmon taken within the described experimental Catch and Release zones shall be immediately released with as little injury as possible back into the water from which it had been taken. No licence holder shall kill or possess sports fish taken from the following catch and release zones.

Oreti River and tributaries from the headwaters to the downstream limit of the "walk only zone" at map ref NZMS 260 D43 294185.

Mataura River and tributaries upstream of the road bridge at Garston.

8.2 Other waters

8.2.1 No licence holder shall on any one day kill or be in possession of more than 6 trout from one or more of the following waters:

Mataura River from the bridge on SH6 (Black bridge), 3 km north of Athol, to the sea;

Waikaia River downstream from the Glenary bridge on the Waikaia-Piano Flat road;

Oreti River from Rocky Point to the sea;

Aparima River from its confluence with the Hamilton Burn to the sea;

Waiau River from the Mararoa Weir to the sea;

Makarewa River from it's confluence with the Otapiri Stream to it's confluence with the Oreti River;

Pourakino River and its tributaries

All those waters draining to the sea between Fortrose and The Brothers Point.

8.2.2 No licence holder shall in any one day kill or be in possession of more than two trout from one or more of the following waters, including their tributaries

All rivers and streams flowing into Lakes Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai, Hauroko, and Hankinson, except for

the upper Waiau and the Mararoa River downstream of the SH94 bridge at The Key; Oreti River upstream of Rocky Point;

Mararoa River upstream of the SH94 bridge at The Key including the Mavora Lakes;

Whitestone River;

Wairaki River upstream of the electricity transmission lines;

Borland River;

Monowai River;

Lake Thomas;

Aparima River upstream of the Hamilton Burn confluence;

- 8.2.3 No licence holder shall on any one day kill or be in possession of more than four trout from any other waters in the region.
- 8.2.4 No licence holder shall in any one day kill or possess more than two salmon from any waters of the region.
