ANGLERS NOTICE FOR FISH AND GAME REGIONS

CONSERVATION ACT 1987 FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1983

Pursuant to section 26R(3) of the Conservation Act 1987 the Minister of Conservation approves the following Anglers Notice, subject to the First, Second and Third Schedules of this Notice, for the following Fish and Game Regions;

NOTICE

This Notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1999.

First schedule	Fishing conditions generally common to all Fish & Game regions.
Second schedule	Regional specific fishing conditions, bag limits, closed and open waters, and the like.
Third schedule	Licence classes and fees.

FIRST SCHEDULE

1. INTERPRETATION

Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in the Conservation Act 1987 or the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, shall be so defined.

"All year" means a 12 month period commencing on 1 October and concluding on 30 September of the following year, both days inclusive.

"Artificial fly" means any lure of feather, fur, wool or other material of any kind customarily used in the making of artificial flies; but shall not include any lure in the tying of which lead or other weight has been incorporated unless the hook incorporated in that lure does not exceed 14mm in length (exclusive of the eye) and the gape of the hook does not exceed 6mm.

"Bait", means:

Natural fly
 Natural insect
 Natural spider
 Natural worm or worms
 Natural crustacea
 Natural fish (excluding fish ova, or any portion of a fish, or shellfish [mollusca])
 Uncoloured bread dough

"Bait Assembly" means either a hook rigged with a number of baits, or a single bait rigged with a number of hooks.

"Bait Fishing" means to fish for sports fish with bait.

"Boat" means any manned flotation device.

“*Fishing*” and “*fish*” in this Notice means ;

- (a) The catching, taking, or harvesting of sports fish; and
- (b) Includes-
 - (i) Any other activity that may reasonably be expected to result in the catching, taking, or harvesting of sports fish:
 - (ii) Any attempt to catch, take or harvest sports fish:
 - (iii) Any operation in support of, or in preparation for, any activity described in this definition.

“*Foulhook*” means to hook a sports fish otherwise than from within the mouth.

“*Length*” is the measurement from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail.

“*Lure*” means any authorised artificial fly, or spinner, or bait.

“*Spinner*” means any artificial lure other than an artificial fly.

“*Spin Fishing*” means to fish for sports fish with a spinner

“*Sports fish*” means those freshwater fish described in the First Schedule of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, namely;

Brown Trout	Sockeye salmon
Rainbow trout	Perch
American brook trout or char	Tench
Lake trout or char	Rudd (Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game region only).
Atlantic salmon	Quinnat or chinook salmon

2. AUTHORISED TACKLE

- 2.1 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish except by using a rod and running line and authorised lure.
- 2.2 Nets:
 - 2.2.1 When playing a sports fish a landing net may be used to secure or land that fish.
 - 2.2.2 For keeping non-salmonid sports fish alive, a keep net may be used in the water from which the fish was caught.
- 2.3 No licence holder shall use more than one assembled rod and running line.
- 2.4 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish unless within 15 metres of the rod being used.
- 2.5 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use more than one bait assembly.

3. FOUL HOOKING OF FISH

- 3.1 No licence holder shall attempt to foul hook any sports fish.
- 3.2 Any licence holder who foul hooks a sports fish shall return it immediately to the water with as little injury as possible.

4. MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM LENGTH

Every licence holder who catches a sports fish which does not exceed the specified minimum length, or does exceed the specified maximum length, shall immediately return it with as little injury as possible into the water from which it was taken.

5. OPEN SEASON

No licence holder shall fish for any sports fish except during an open season.

6. DAILY LIMIT BAGS

- 6.1 No licence holder shall continue to fish for a particular species of sports fish on any day in which he or she has already killed the limit bag for that species except in Otago (see second schedule).
- 6.2 It shall be permissible to make up the difference between a lesser limit bag prescribed in one place and a higher limit bag prescribed in another.

7. AUTHORISED LURES AND BAIT

Authorised lures and baits (subject to any regional restrictions specified in the Second Schedule) are:

- Artificial fly
- Spinner
- Bait

4. **AUTHORISED TACKLE**
- 4.1 Licence holders shall fish for sports fish in the Northland Fish & Game Region, using a single rod, reel, and running line.
5. **AUTHORISED LURES AND BAIT**
- 5.1 Licence holders shall fish for sports fish in the Northland Fish & Game Region, using artificial fly, spinner or bait only (as defined in the First Schedule), except that bait may not be used in any rivers or streams.
6. **EXPRESSLY FORBIDDEN TACKLE**
- 6.1 No Licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use:
- a) any lead or weight, fixed or running, except where an authorised lure or bait is attached to a terminal trace of a minimum length of 600 mm.
 - b) any hook which has a gape greater than 14 mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank
 - c) any lure having more than one hook, or having a multiple hook, or any fixed hooks.
 - d) more than 2 lures
 - e) any lure treated with any medicinal preparation other than a substance used solely to give buoyancy to an artificial fly.
 - f) any downrigger or paravane;
 - g) any gaff or landing hook;
 - h) any unsportsman like device or gear;

- i) any electric fishing gear except for the purposes of duly authorised scientific investigations or data collection;
- j) any preparation to attract fish
- k) any narcotic, poisonous substance or liquid injurious to fish;
- l) any stroke hauling or foul hooking gear.
- m) any spear, spear gun or pointed missile.

7. USE OF BOATS

- 7.1 Anglers trolling from boats must stay at least 50 metres from any anglers fishing from the shore.

8. DAILY BAG LIMITS

8.1 All Rivers and Streams

No Licence holder shall on any one day kill more than two sportsfish.

8.2 All Lakes and Reservoirs

No Licence holder shall on any one day kill more than three sportsfish.

9. FISH LENGTH

- 9.1 The minimum length for trout 300 mm
 9.2 The minimum length for other sportsfish No limit

2. CLOSED WATERS

Subject to Section 2.2. of this Schedule

- 2.1 No licence holder shall take sports fish from the following waters:

All rivers, streams and their tributaries which flow into but not including Lake Arapuni, Lake Waipapa, Lake Karapiro and that part of the Waikato River downstream from the Maraetai Dam to above the Karapiro Dam.

- 2.2 The closed waters restrictions in Section 2.1 of this Schedule do not apply to the following waters:
Mangawhio Stream and tributaries
Pokaiwhenua Stream and tributaries
Waipa Stream and tributaries
Waikato River
Waipapa River and tributaries

3. AUTHORISED TACKLE

No licence holder when fishing for sports fish in the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game Region shall use:

- 3.1 More than two lures.
 3.2 Any lure having more than one hook or having a multiple hook, or any fixed assembly of hooks.
 3.3 Any hook which has a gape greater than 14mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank.
 3.4 Any lure treated with any medicinal or chemical preparation other than a flotation preparation used solely to give buoyancy to an artificial fly.
 3.5 Any lead or weight (other than hooks as permitted elsewhere in this notice) attached below or as to hang below any lure or bait.
 3.6 Such restrictions in Sections 3.1 to 3.6 should apply notwithstanding any other restrictions, limitation or indulgence or licence granted by this Schedule.

4. VESSEL FISHING RESTRICTIONS

- 4.1 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish from any vessel in that part of the Waikato River between the *Arapuni Dam and the upper limits of Lake Karapiro* (as shown by the white marker post, situated 200 metres below the *Huihuitaha Stream* mouth) unless that vessel is securely anchored at all material times.

5. ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

- 5.1 Artificial fly fishing in the Auckland/Waikato Region means to fish for sportsfish with fly rod and fly reel and fly line and artificial fly, but with no additional weight to facilitate casting.
- 5.2 Artificial fly fishing is the only fishing method for sports fish allowed in the following waters and their tributaries:
Awakino River from its source to the Mahoenui Bridge
Hikutaia River from its source to the ford on the old Whangamata Track
Kakahu Stream (north-east of Okoroire)
Kaniwhaniwha Stream
Komata Stream
Mangatutu Stream from its source to the Lethbridge Road Bridge
Ngakoahia Stream from its source to the bridge on Pirongia-Kawhia roadway
Okauaka Stream
Puniu River from its source to the Bayley Road Bridge
Waione Stream
Waipa Stream (near Putaruru, also known as the Little Waipa Stream) from its source to the Horahora Road Bridge (which is deemed to be the mouth)
Waipapa River upstream from the first waterfall situated approximately 0.5km from Lake Waipapa
Wairoa River from its source to the Hunua Falls

6. SPIN FISHING AND ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

Spin fishing and artificial fly fishing are the only fishing methods for sports fish allowed in the following waters:

- Mangatangi Reservoir*
Mangatawhiri Reservoir

All rivers and streams, excluding any waters specified in Sections 5, 7 and 8 of this Schedule.

7. SPIN FISHING, ARTIFICIAL FLY FISHING AND BAIT FISHING ONLY WATERS

Spin fishing, artificial fly fishing and bait fishing are the only fishing methods for sports fish allowed in the following waters:

Waikato River

Lake Arapuni

Lake Karapiro

Lake Moananui

Lake Otamatearoa (Muir's)

Lake Ototoa

Lake Parkinson

Lake Tomarata

Lake Waipapa

Lake Whatihua (Thomson's)

Ohinemuri River downstream from the Victoria Street Bridge at Waihi

Ongarue River downstream from its confluence with the Waimiha Stream

Marokopa River downstream from its confluence with the Mangatuahau Stream

Moakurua Stream downstream from Mulligans Bridge (Honikiwi Road)

Waihou River downstream from the Okoroire Falls

Waipa River downstream from the State Highway 3 Bridge at Otorohanga

Whanganui River downstream from its confluence with the

Whakapapa River

8. COARSE FISHING WATERS

8.1 There is no restriction on lures or baits in the following waters:

Mangatawhiri River from the bridge on SH2, to its confluence with the Waikato River

Whangamarino River

All lakes and ponds, excluding any water specified in Sections 6 and 7 of this part of this notice

8.2 In respect to all waters not specified in Section 8.1 of this notice, with the written authorisation of the Manager of the Auckland/Waikato Fish & Game Council in the licence holders possession and available for production on demand, there is no restriction on lures or baits for a licence holder participating in a fishing competition for rudd, perch and tench, provided all other species of sports fish landed must be immediately returned to the waters and released.

8.3 There are no restrictions on the numbers of rods and running lines that a licence holder fishing for perch, tench or rudd may have assembled provided only one of which shall be used for fishing at any one time.

8.4 A roach pole may be used to fish for and take perch, tench and rudd.

9. DAILY BAG LIMIT OF KILLED SPORTS FISH

9.1 No more than two trout per day:

Awakino River

Waipa River and its tributaries upstream from the State Highway 3 bridge at Otorohanga

Whakapapa River and its tributaries upstream from the confluence with the Piopotea Stream

9.2 No bag limit except that only two trout may exceed 30 cm in length:

Waihou River and its tributaries upstream from Okoroire

Waimakariri Stream and its tributaries

9.3 No more than five trout, perch, rudd or tench per day:

All waters except those specified in Section 9.1 and 9.2 of this Schedule

10. MINIMUM LENGTH

10.1 The minimum length for trout taken shall be 30 cm in all waters except in the Waihou River upstream from Okoroire and the Waimakariri Stream where there is no minimum length.

10.2 Trout landed under the minimum size shall be immediately returned to the water and released.

EASTERN FISH AND GAME REGION

Reference to description: *Gazette*, No 83 of 24 May 1990 at page 1861 (SO Plan 58495)

1. INTERPRETATION

"Fly fishing" in the Eastern Fish and Game Region means to fish for sports fish with fly rod, fly reel, fly line and artificial fly, with no additional weight to facilitate casting.

"Fly line" in the Eastern Region means any floating or sinking line used to facilitate casting that is greater than 5 metres in length.

"Landmark" means a black, yellow and white ringed post or buoy.

"Set rod" means any assembled rod that is not in physical contact with a licence holder when being used to fish for sports fish.

"Sports fish" in the Eastern Fish and Game Region includes any hybrid of the sports fish species described in the First Schedule.

"Wild rainbow trout" means any rainbow trout not having a fin clip mark or tag.

2. OPEN SEASON

Lakes Maraetai, Whakamaru, Atiamuri, Ohakuri, Aratiatia up to Huka falls;	All year
The Tiniroto and Putere Lakes;	All year
Lake Rotorua except those waters leading into Ohau Channel which are inwardly bound by landmarks;	All year
Lakes Okareka, Rotoehu, Rerewhakaaitu, Okaro, Ngahewa, Ngapouri, Rotomahana, Tikitapu;	All year
Lake Rotoma except for the winter shoreline spawning areas situated between landmarks at Anaputa Point and Matahi Lagoon, and the area marked in Manawahe Bay, both extending 200m offshore;	All year

All other waters except Closed Season Waters;	1 st October to 30 th June

3. CLOSED SEASON

No licence holder shall fish for sports fish at any time from the following waters;

- 3.1 all streams flowing into Lake Tarawera and that portion of the Tarawera River enclosed by landmarks at the Lake Tarawera Outlet and extending approximately 150m downstream to landmarks in the river, otherwise known as the Tarawera Outlet Spawning Sanctuary;
- 3.2 the Utuhina Stream above the Pukehangi Road bridge and all tributaries of this stream;
- 3.3 the following streams and their tributaries which flow into Lake Rotorua;
 - a) the Waiowhoro, Waiohewa, Waingaehe, Waimata and Waikuta Streams;
 - b) the Hamurana stream above the Hamurana Road bridge;
 - c) the Awahou Stream above the Hamurana Road bridge;
- 3.4 all springs, streams, and their tributaries which flow into Lake Waikareiti, and into or from lakes Rotoma, Rotoehu, Rotomahana, Rerewhakaaitu, Rotokakahi, Okareka, Okataina and Rotoiti except the Ohau Channel and the Kaituna River;
- 3.5 the Rangataiki River for a distance of 80 metres below the Aniwhenua Barrage;
- 3.6 the section of the Ruahihi Canal between the landmarks at the southern end of the canal which enclose the artificial spawning bed.

4. AUTHORISED TACKLE

- 4.1 No licence holder shall fish for sports fish with a set rod unless he or she is fishing from an unanchored boat.
- 4.2 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall use:
 - a) any hook which has a gape greater than 14mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank
 - b) any lure having more than one hook, or having a multiple hook, or any fixed assembly of hooks
 - c) more than 2 lures
 - d) any lure treated with any medicinal preparation other than a substance used solely to give buoyancy to an artificial fly
 - e) any downrigger, paravane, other device or weight (other than a running line) designed to sink a lure while trolling;

- f) any gaff or landing hook;
 - g) any unsportsmanlike device or gear;
 - h) any electric fishing gear designed to take fish, except for the purposes of duly authorised scientific investigations or data collection;
 - i) any preparation to attract fish;
 - j) any narcotic, poisonous substance or liquid injurious to fish;
 - k) any stroke hauling or foul hooking gear.
- 4.3 No licence holder when fishing for sports fish shall have in their possession any spear, spear gun or pointed missile (other than a bullet).
- 4.4 Metal cored or wire lines can be used in all lakes in the Eastern Region except Lakes Waikaremoana and Waikareiti. Metal cored or wire lines are not permitted in any lake areas that at any time of the year have been designated to be artificial fly only.

5. FLY FISHING ONLY WATERS

The following waters are restricted to artificial fly fishing only;

- 5.1 The Ohau Channel and waters within 200m radius from the Lake Rotorua end of the channel and 300m radius of the Lake Rotoiti end of the channel;
- 5.2 The Ngongotaha, Waiteti, Awahou, Hamurana Streams and within 200m radius of their stream mouths on Lake Rotorua, and the Utuhina Stream above the Lake Road bridge
- 5.3 Within a 200m radius of the stream mouths at Tapueakura (Coles Bay) Bay, Hauparu Bay, Ruato Bay, Waiiti Stream and the Pipe at Northern Hinehopu on Lake Rotoiti from April 1 to September 30.
- 5.4 Within 200m radius of the stream mouths at the Log Pool and Rayners 1 and Rayners 2 streams on Lake Okataina from April 1 to September 30.
- 5.5 Within 200m radius of the stream mouths at Te Wairoa, The Landing, Waitangi Stream, Tarawera Outlet, Wairua Stream and Twin Creeks on Lake Tarawera.
- 5.6 The Hopuruahine, Aniwaniwa, Korokoro, Mokau Streams and their tributaries and within a 200m radius of their river mouth landmarks in Lake Waikaremoana.
- 5.7 Within 200m radius of the Ngawhakairara Stream mouth in Lake Waikareiti.
- 5.8 The Tarawera River from Lake Tarawera (excluding the trout spawning sanctuary) to the Tarawera Falls;
- 5.9 The Horomanga River and tributaries;
- 5.10 The Ruakituri and Hangaroa Rivers (including their tributaries) upstream from the base of the Te Reinga Falls;
- 5.11 The Wharekopae River;
- 5.12 The Waioeka River and Opato Stream (including tributaries) upstream from their confluence;
- 5.13 Lakes Whakamarino and Kaitawa (including all inflowing streams);
- 5.14 The Waimapu Stream above the waterfall 1 km east of the Oropi Road -Hereford Road junction.

6. BAIT FISHING WATERS

No licence holder shall use any bait except for natural fly, natural insect or natural crustacean (excluding koura) in any waters of the Eastern Fish and Game Region.

7. USE OF BOATS

- 7.1 No licence holder shall fish for trout from any unanchored boat,
 - (a) in waters that at any time of the year are reserved for artificial fly fishing,
 - (b) in waters that are within a 200 metre radius around the centre of the Utuhina Stream mouth,
 - (c) in waters that are within the section of Rangiuru Bay defined by landmarks at Stoney Point and Kariri Point and extending 200m offshore,
 - (d) boats should be securely anchored with no more than two anchors.
- 7.2 Notwithstanding Clause 7.1, no licence holder shall fish for trout from a boat, irrespective of whether it is anchored, in the following waters;
 - a) the Tarawera River from its outlet from Lake Tarawera to the Tarawera Falls situated approximately 2500 metres downstream;
 - b) that section of the Tarawera Outlet enclosed by landmarks;

- c) the Ohau Channel and those immediate areas around the channel mouths in lakes Rotorua and Rotoiti that are designated as artificial fly only waters;
- d) the area within a radius of 15 metres of the Wairua Stream mouth on Lake Tarawera.

All waters flowing into Lakes Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai, Hauoko and Poteriteri excluding Mararoa River downstream of the Key Bridge.

7. USE OF BOATS

- 7.1 No person shall fish from any boat other than a row boat in Lake Thomas
- 7.2 No person shall fish from any boat or launch in that part of Lake Waituna which lies on the seaward side of a line between two white signposts indicating the restriction sited on directly opposite shores near what is the outlet channel when the channel is open to the sea.
- 7.3 No person shall fish from any boat, canoe, pontoon, or any form of flotation device in:
- the Mataura River upstream from the Mataura Island bridge
 - the Waikaia River
 - the Mararoa River
 - the Oreti River upstream of the SH94 bridge just north of Lumsden
 - the Eglinton River
 - the Waiiau River from the confluence of the Monowai River to the Mararoa Weir.

8. DAILY LIMIT BAGS

- 8.1 Catch and Release zones
- Trout or salmon taken within the described experimental Catch and Release zones shall be immediately released with as little injury as possible back into the water from which it has been taken. No person shall kill or possess sports fish taken from the following catch and release zones.

Oreti River and tributaries from the headwaters to the downstream limit of the "walk only zone" at map ref NZMS 260 D43 294185.

Mataura River and tributaries upstream of the road bridge at Garston

8.2 Other waters

- 8.2.1 No person shall on any one day take, kill or be in possession of more than 6 trout from one or more of the following waters:
 Mataura River from the bridge on SH6 (Black bridge), 3 km north of Athol, to the sea;
 Waikaia River downstream from the Glenary bridge on the Waikaia-Piano Flat road;
 Oreti River from Rocky Point to the sea;
 Aparima River from its confluence with the Hamilton Burn to the sea;
 Waiau River from the Mararoa Weir to the sea;
 Makarewa River from its confluence with the Otapiri Stream to its confluence with the Oreti River;
 Pourakino River and its tributaries
 All those waters draining to the sea between Fortrose and The Brothers Point.
- 8.2.2 No person shall in any one day take, kill or be in possession of more than two trout from one or more of the following waters, including their tributaries:
 All rivers and streams flowing into Lakes Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai, Hauroko, and Hankinson, except for the upper Waiau and the Mararoa River downstream of the SH94 bridge at The Key;
 Oreti River upstream of Rocky Point;
 Mararoa River upstream of the SH94 bridge at The Key including the Mavora Lakes;
 Whitestone River;
 Wairaki River upstream of the electricity transmission lines;
 Borland River;
 Monowai River;
 Lake Thomas;
 Aparima River upstream of the Hamilton Burn confluence;
 Lake Waituna
- 8.2.3 No person shall on any one day take, kill or be in possession of more than four trout from any other waters in the region.
- 8.2.4 No person shall in any one day take, kill or possess more than one salmon from any waters of the region.
- 8.2.5 No person shall on any one day take, kill or be in possession of more than 6 sports fish.

This schedule notifies the definitions and classes of fish licences and fees payable in respect of each class of licence.

- Family:** (In respect of the Eastern and North Canterbury Regions). Includes a primary adult licence holder, one adult partner and any dependants under the age of 20 as at 1 October 1999.
- Whole season:** A Whole Season Fish Licence shall enable the holder to fish for and take sports fish in all Fish & Game regions, from 1 October 1999 to 30 September 2000.

Family: (In respect of the Eastern and North Canterbury Regions). A family licence is the equivalent of an adult whole season fish licence for the primary adult holder. It enables him or her to fish for sports fish in all Fish and Game regions from 1 October 1999 to 30 September 2000. It enables the other family members named on that licence to fish for sports fish only when accompanied by the primary adult licence holder and only within the Fish and Game region issuing the licence.
