- 4th. For making a small Culvert across the road which passes by the College allotment.

RESOLUTION No. 3.

"That when the Bench attaches any conditions to the issue of a Licence, the Transferee of such Licence will be held by the Bench liable for their fulfilment."

RESOLUTION No. 4.

"That the Bench of Magistrates having had under its serious consideration the fact of breaches being committed of the 'Sale of Spirits Ordinance' by the supply of spirituous liquors to the natives of New Zealand, resolves not to renew a licence to

any publican, or issue a licence to any person, under any circumstances whatever, who shall have been convicted of having committed, or of being accessory to a committal of such breach of the law."

SIR,

In reply to your Honor's letter of the 29th ult., transmitting the copy of a resolution of the Waste Lands Board of the Province of Auckland requesting to be informed in what way the boundaries of those blocks noted in the Returns forwarded in my letter of the 16th ultimo as "not surveyed" have been "satisfactorily defined," I have the honour to state that it is considered the description of the boundaries contained in the Deeds of Purchase of such lands from the Natives will be found sufficient for the disposal of them by the Board in order to meet the very urgent demands of the public, as has hitherto been the practice under the General Government, whilst complete surveys of the boundaries are being made.

I beg leave further to state that the Surveyor-General has been instructed to have such surveys of the blocks in question made with the least possible delay, and when they have been completed, they will be available for the information of the Waste Lands Board.
