PROCLAMATION.

By His Honour WILLIAM BROWN,
Esq., Superintendent of the
Province of Auckland.

By virtue and in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf by the provisions contained in the thirteenth section of the Regulations issued on the eighth day of February last, by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, for the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Province of Auckland, in the said Colony, I, the Superintendent of the said Province do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, proclaim and declare that the block of land hereinafter described shall be open for sale in the said colony on and after the fourteenth day of July next ensuing, that is to say;

All that Block of Land, set apart for special occupation, situate in the Parish of Karaka, in the County of Eden; containing about 1,920 acres, and delineated on the map or plan of the said parish, in the office of the Surveyor-General of the colony aforesaid.

CONDITIONS.

Samples of the various articles will have to be submitted for inspection.

The Contractors will be required to deliver the different supplies from time to time, at such places and in such quantities as may be indicated by the Superintendent.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any of the tenders sent in.

Payment for any of the above supplies will be made at the end of each month.

Tenders to be sealed, and endorsed “Tenders for Supply of [name of article.]”

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies, as to the quality, be the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the service. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of a proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

In cases, where the article is of a perishable nature, or in which, from some other cause, injury would be sustained by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge for whom the supplies are to be received shall have power to reject any article of a quality inferior to the approved sample, and to purchase others at the expense of the contractor.

The tenders (forms of which may be obtained at this office) to contain the names and places of residence at length of the persons tendering, and to be signed by two respectable sureties, engaging to become bound in a penalty of £100 for the fulfilment of the contract, if the tender be accepted.
