WHEREAS a Writ under the hand of John Williamson, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, bearing date the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, hath been directed to me, Theodore Minet Haultain, Esquire, Returning Officer of the Pensioner Settlements, requiring and commanding me to cause to be elected by and from amongst the voters duly qualified for that purpose, freely and indifferently, and in manner and form by law prescribed, one person to serve as a member of the Provincial Council for the Province of Auckland, for the electoral district called and known by the name of the Pensioner Settlements, in place of Joseph Greenwood, Esquire, who has duly resigned. in the event of a Poll being demanded by or on behalf of the candidates, or any of them, such polling shall take place on Tuesday, the seventh day of April next, at such Court House aforesaid; the voting to commence at any time after nine o'clock of the forenoon of the said day, and to close at four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.
