PROCLAMATION.

By JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

WHEREAS by the "Thistle Act, 1857," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland from time to time, by proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, to declare that the said Act should come into operation within any district, and thereby to proclaim the limits of the district.

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested, I, the said Superintendent, *Do hereby proclaim and declare* that the said "Thistle Act, 1857," shall, on and after the first day of May next, come into operation within the Auckland District; and that the limits of the said District shall be—On the North, the harbour of Waitemata and the sea; on the East, the Wairoa River; on the South, the division line known as Hewling's line, extending from the Wairoa River to the Papakura Creek, and the waters of the Manukau; on the West, the Eastern boundary of the Wahu Portage, and the Wahu Creek.
