Manukau District.—Kakaramea Block.

(Area 1035 Acres.)

Bounded on the North by Beard's Fence, 3470 links; on the East by Native land 7618,

1805, 3255, and 1040 links, and by a line, one chain, to the East of the present road from Auckland to Mangatawhiri, to where Mr. Ormsby's boundary line crosses the road at Rawhitiroa; on the West by the Ramarama Block, 17,400 and 5070 links to Pai-o-te-arai, from thence along the Auckland and Mangatawhiri Road to Beard's Fence at the Kumi-kumi.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

Manukau District.—Manukau Block.

Containing about 22,000 Acres.

The boundary commences at Te Ruawhai-arua; thence running in a South Westerly direction (bearing by compass 202°) to Wairua-Whakakai; thence to Waipohue, on to the West Coast (compass bearing 222° 45') thence along the Coast Southerly to Te Kawakawa, Turakiraki, Muriwhenua, Opongo, Hereputiputi, Waimataku, Arapo; thence Eastward (compass bearing 60° 50') to Te Ra-o-puninga, the Waiwata Swamp, the Ripekanga, thence in a straight line (compass bearing 52° 10') to its junction again with the Waiwata Swamp at Pukekowhai, thence down the Swamp to Matakawau Creek, and down the Creek to where it empties itself into Manukau Harbour at Otamaniwha; thence along the shore of Manukau Harbour to Kopyri, Kaitara, Tewharau, Kauritutahi, Tata-ngarau, Te Mori-a-whereo, Te Kauri-kaihau, Wairere, Te Mako, Te Aute, Te Ihu-kuri, Te Rua-o-whairoa; there the boundaries join.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

Whangarei District.—Whareora Block.

(Containing 4927 Acres.)

The boundary commences at Kahiwa, thence along the boundary line of the Parahaki Block till it reaches Pehiawiri, thence along the boundary line separating it from Pehiawiri, thence along a line on the ridge of hills on the Ngunguru road, thence to Whanui, and thence to Kahiwa.

Whangarei District.—Parahaki Block.

(Containing 4481 Acres.)

The boundaries commence on the boundary of Mr. Dent's farm at Awaroa, thence down the Awaroa river to its mouth, thence up the river Hatea to the Ahipupu, thence up the course of the said river, thence up the surveyed line running in an Easterly direction separating Pehiawiri, thence along the said line to the boundary line of the Whareora Block, thence along the said line to Kahiwa, thence along the boundary of the land sold to Gorrie till it reaches the land of Dent, thence along the boundary of Dent's land to the point of commencement; the portion on the Hatea river, not colored red on the plan annexed to the original deed, and included within the aforesaid boundaries, is reserved for the Natives.

Whangarei District.—Kaurehohore Block.

(Containing 4790 Acres.)

The boundary commences at the boundary of Paranui, thence up the course of the river Mangakino, thence on the surveyed line to the river of Mangahahuru, thence down the course of the said river Mangahahuru to the branch stream at Orai, thence to the great Swamp of the Wairua, thence along the edge of the great Swamp to Waihireri, thence to Kauri-hohore, thence along the surveyed line until it joins the boundary of the land sold to Mr. Mair, thence along the boundary of Mr. Mair's land to Paranui, where it ends at the point of commencement.

District of Coromandel Harbour.—Onekura, (Pagitt's Homestead.)

(Area 81 Acres, 3 Roods, 7 Perches.)

The boundaries commence at Puharakeke, thence in a North-Easterly direction 1120 links, and 1592 links, crossing and recrossing the Whangarahi Creek at Onekura; thence through a swamp to a survey line cut through the Kauri forest, and running in a South-Easterly direction 2300 links to a point inland of the Otumoho Creek; thence in a straight line, crossing and recrossing the Otumoho Creek 4339 links, and through the middle of a swamp along the survey line to a point at the South-East corner of the surveyed line to Puharakeke 1537 links, where the boundaries join.
