## PROCLAMATION.

By JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province  
of Auckland.

WHEREAS, by the "Thistle Act, 1858," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland from time to time by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, to declare that the said Act should come into operation within any District, and thereby to proclaim the limits of the District.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested, I, the said Superintendent, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said "Thistle Act, 1858," shall, on and after the first day of December next, come into operation within the Drury and Waiuku District, and the limits of the said District shall be—on the North by the waters of the Manukau, and the division line known as Hewling's line, between the parishes of Wairoa and Papakura, on the one side, and Hunua and Opaheki on the other; on the East the Wairoa, Mangawheau and Mangatawhiri Rivers; on the South, the Waikato River to its mouth, and on the West, the sea.

Given under my hand, at Auckland, in the said Province, the 29th day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

## THISTLES.

Superintendent's Office,

### No. 1, North Shore.

Bounded on the N. E. by the Sea; on the N. W. by the Wairau stream, by the middle line of a road running between lots 104 and 105 of the Parish of Takapuna, in a South Westerly direction to the Lucas' Creek road; on the W. by the middle of the Lucas' Creek road, by the middle of Callan's Bay road to the Harbour; on the South by the Harbour of Waitemata.

### No. 2, Mount Albert.

On the N. by the Waitemata Harbour; on the E. by the middle of the Epsom road from Mechanics' Bay, Southward to Onehunga to the beach at Commercial Hotel (not to include the Government Domain); on the S. by the Manakau Harbour; on the W. by the Wahu Portage and Wahu Creek.

### No. 3, Mount Smart.

On the N. by the middle of the Tamaki

road at Newmarket to St. John's College, by the middle of the Panmure road to Point England road, by the middle of Point England road to the Tamaki; on the E. by the Tamaki and the Otahuhu Portage; on the S. by the Manakau Harbour to the beach at the Commercial Inn, Onehunga; on the W. by the middle of the Auckland road to Newmarket.

No. 4, *Orakei.*

On the N. by the Sea, Waitemata harbour; on the E. by the Tamaki to Point England road; on the S. by the middle of the Point England, St. John's College, and Auckland roads to Newmarket, by the middle of Parnell road to Mechanics' Bay.

No. 5, *Otahuhu and Mangarei.*

On the N. by the Hundred of Howick, down Otara Creek to the Tamaki, crossing the Tamaki to Otahuhu by the Otahuhu Portage, and by the Manakau harbour; on the W. and S. by the Manakau, to the S.E. boundary of Clendon's Grant; on the S.E. and E. by the boundary of Clendon's Grant, and by the boundary of the Hundred of Otahuhu.

No. 6, *Howick.*
