PROCLAMATION.

Superintendent of the Province
of Auckland.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the then Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to empower Owners and Occupiers of Land within certain Districts to repair and maintain Highways and Public Works within the same, and to make and levy rates for defraying the expenses thereof," it was enacted that if the major part of the persons qualified to become Electors (in the manner in the said Ordinance mentioned) within any District, should apply in writing to His Excellency the Governor, distinctly setting forth the boundaries of such District, and requesting that the same might be declared to be a District within the provisions of the said Ordinance, his Excellency might by Proclamation declare the same to be such District, and by such Proclamation should prescribe a period within which all claims to the right of voting at the Election of the first and every succeeding Board of Commissioners for such District should be made: AND WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, intituled "An Act to transfer certain powers and duties from the Governor and Colonial Treasurer of New Zealand to the Superintendent and Pro-

vincial Treasurer of the Province of Auckland respectively," it was amongst other things enacted that all the Acts authorized or required to be performed by and all the powers given to the said Governor by the said recited Ordinance should thenceforth cease to be performed by the said Governor, and should and might thereafter be performed and exercised as fully and effectually for all intents and purposes within the Province of Auckland by the Superintendent thereof as the same could be done before the passing of the said Act be done and exercised by the said Governor: AND WHEREAS the major part of the persons entitled to become Electors within the District hereinafter set forth have applied to me in manner in the said Ordinance directed to declare the same to be a District within the provisions of the said Ordinance.

Now therefore in pursuance of the said powers and authorities in me vested, I, the said Superintendent, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that portion of the Parish of Manurewa in the County of Eden, bounded on the East by the Great South Road, from the road to Mr. Robert Robertson's house to the Tamaki Bridge, thence by the Western Bank of the Tamaki River to the Pukaki Portage Road, thence by the Pukaki Portage Road to the Manukau, on the South by the Manukau, on the West by the Manukau, and on the North by the Manukau to a Creek running to Mr. John Fairburn's Farm, thence along the boundary between Messrs. Hall and R. Robertson to the Great South Road including the Island known as Weekes' Island, but excepting lands held by Natives in the Settlements of Pukaki,

Ihumata, and Mangarei, shall form a District within the provisions of the said Ordinance, to be called the Mangarie District, and that the period within which all claims to the right of voting at the Election of the first and every succeeding Board of Commissioners for such District shall be made, shall be between the twentieth day of April and the twentieth day of May in each and every year.

THE Government of New Zealand is prepared, subject to the undermentioned conditions, to give rewards to the amount of £4000, for the discovery of efficient means for rendering the Flax, and other fibrous plants of New Zealand, available as articles of export, viz. :—

£2000

To the person who shall, by some process of his own invention, first produce from the *Phormium Tenax*, or other fibrous plant indigenous to New Zealand, one hundred tons of Merchandize.

£1900

To any person, other than the person entitled to the first reward, who shall by some process of his own invention, next produce from the *Phormium Tenax*, or other fibrous plant indigenous to New Zealand, one hundred tons of Merchandize.

£1000

Viz. :—£200 to each of the first five persons, other than those entitled to the first and second rewards, who shall by any process, whether of his own invention or not produce from the *Phormium Tenax*, or other fibrous plant indigenous to New Zealand, twenty-five tons of Merchandize.

The Merchandize must be saleable as an article of Export from the Colony of New Zealand, and have been produced at a cost not exceeding 75 per cent. of its value at the Port of Entry from which it is exported; and the process used must be fully made known with a view to the discovery being at once made available to the public.

His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand will from time to time appoint Commissions, to consist of not less than three persons, to act at such places as circumstances may require, and each claim for reward will be referred to such Commission as may be considered the most convenient for its proper investigation. The acts of the majority will be deemed the acts of the Commission.

Each Commission shall be at liberty to adopt such means as it may deem most fit for determining the value and cost of production of the Merchandize, for ascertaining the process employed, and for fully investigating in all

respects and reporting upon the validity of any claim.

Every claim for reward must be preferred in writing before the 1st January, 1861, to the principal officer of Customs at the port of entry nearest to the place where it is desired that the examination of the merchandize shall take place, who will at once proceed to ascertain whether the full quantity in respect of which the reward is claimed, is ready for examination, and if such quantity is ready, he will give a certificate to that effect, dated on the day on which he shall have ascertained the fact, and such day shall be deemed to be the day on which the merchandize was produced.

Whenever any officer of Customs is required to go more than three miles from his residence, his travelling expenses must be paid beforehand by the person requiring his attendance, and he cannot be required to attend a second time if the quantity was found deficient on the first occasion.

One-half of any reward will be paid at once to any person whom a Commission shall report and the Governor shall have determined to be entitled to the same—after which no other claim to the same reward will be entertained—and the other half upon satisfactory proof being given to the Governor of the *bonâ fide* sale of the merchandize in Europe, at an advance of not less than 20 per cent. upon the *bonâ fide* actual cost of the article landed in Europe.

SIR,—Accepting the renewed publication of the Governor's offer of reward of December 20th, 1856, (as intimated in the letter from the Honourable the Colonial Secretary, dated 18th instant, of which your Honor has forwarded me a copy,) as a pledge that the persons by whose discoveries certain desired ends shall be attained shall become entitled to the said rewards, I have the honor to submit to your Honor such information as will enable you to determine whether I was justified in stating that "three hundred persons thus employed would load all the ships which seek return cargoes from this port."

I have not attempted to improve upon my Mill process, for it answered perfectly. The Mill was taken from me, and I have produced a substitute. The only addition required by the Mill flax was passage through a water process, time having proved that I was right in supposing that the vegetable matter still remaining might produce a certain degree of must, all fear of which is completely removed

by the present mode of preparation. The Mill process required an establishment—the Instrument now used weighs three or four pounds, and can be employed anywhere. The flax thus made is of a light straw colour, perfectly gumless, and free from all that may have a tendency to must. It is fit for exportation to any part of the world, but, like European hemp and flax, it requires time to cure.

The following is the mode of production :—

I employ a splitter of particular make, combining strength and efficiency, by means of which water reaches the fibres.

The reduced flax is laid in still water (small ponds or dams across small gullies, to save the cost of tanks). Here it is allowed to ret. In five or six weeks it is perfectly cured. It is then submitted to a brake to rid the flax from impurities; after which it is well shaken by handfuls, in clean water, and dried upon the ground or upon sticks or lines. In fine weather it dries in half a day; if bad weather comes, it suffers no injury, and may be left in the rain on the spot till the return of a fine day.

A willing hand can split 8 cwt. of leaves per day, which will make 2 cwt. of flax, *ergo*—

10 men can make 1 ton,

100 men 10 tons,

300 men 30 tons per day, equal to 180 tons per week, or 720 tons per month. 720 tons of flax at 1½ ton measurement per ton weight would require storage equal to 1080 tons per month.

The production of these 720 tons of flax would cost under £5000. The producers would receive £8640, and the shipping interest would benefit to the amount of upwards of £8000 per month; calculating the expenses on a ton of flax sent home at £12.

I propose giving—labourers 9d. per cwt. for splitting; equal to 6s. per day;

A girl or boy to attend each splitter 2s. per day;

£1 per converted ton to the owner of the flax field; and 6d. per cwt., equal to 4s. or 5s. per day, to natives for cutting.

With hired labour the expenses will be for 1 ton :—

Any number of men, working for themselves amidst their own flax, may, if assisted by their children, earn 18s. to 24s. per day, without other outlay than 15s. to 20s. for a splitter and brake.

The entire time consumed, in what may be termed the preparation of the crop, is at most 6 weeks; the harvest is then gathered daily; but whilst the crop is preparing the quantity goes on accumulating, and the man who renders 2 cwt. per day will find, at the end of 36

working days, that he has made upwards of 3½ tons of material, representing a capital of £42.

This is, in great truth, Flax for the million!

One of the leading firms of this City is willing to take any quantity of this flax at £12 per ton, and assures me that the quantity cannot be too great,—“It cannot be overdone.” £12 per ton is all I ask, nor will I hold out for more for what I may make. I might probably, obtain £20 per ton by competition, but my desire is to facilitate a profitable export, the good effect of which may be felt throughout the Colony, and to enable a large body of immigrants to secure a living or independence. Old and young, men and women, and girls and boys can work at flax; the business may be learnt without difficulty, and, under brush sheds, can be carried on in any weather and any locality. Judicious preparations have nevertheless to be made, and I would willingly devote my time in assisting the making of them, and setting people to work, but for the expenses to which I must be exposed. To-morrow I am to instruct a settler at his own place, near town, and I have promised instructions to two others, but situated as I am I cannot afford to make myself as useful as I would wish.

Ere long settlers will deplore the unwise destruction of so many vast flax fields, and those wiser and more fortunate ones who yet possess their many broad acres of plants will pride themselves upon their wealth. These are New Zealand's best gold fields, and who needs be poor when, with the investment of a few shillings, every man who is possessed of flax can send his bales to market, and receive cash in hand; and what man shall speak ill of the country when, as a labourer, he can earn 6s. per day, and more if he chooses to work hard. Not a merchant in New Zealand will refuse to purchase flax at a paying price.

On the subject of flax a wealthy London Firm wrote me by the last mail as follows.—“The supply of flax is very inadequate to the demands of this country, and there is no doubt whatever that the New Zealand products only require to come forward regularly and in sufficient quantities to meet the demand which would spring up to insure their adoption as a permanent substitute for the fibres now used, and for mixing to economize those that cannot compete with them in price. The less the fibre requires dressing and cleaning here of course the better price it will fetch.” Again, “There is an ample demand for the above, but owing to the small and uncertain supplies it is not much used at present, and is chiefly applied in making rope and string and coarse yarn. It has been spun after reduction to a fine fibre into a very fine yarn capable of being manufactured into a fine lawn. People have embarked in machinery here in order to render this product available in a large way for fine manufacturers, and mixing with other products for which there would probably soon be a large demand, but owing to the want of a constant supply they have been compelled to abandon

their attempts, and put up with the expense of altering their machinery for other purposes.”

I will conclude by stating that I shall be happy to impart every information desired to parties who may wish to go to flax making, and further that I place the statement here made at your Honor's disposal, begging that any use may be made of it which you may deem proper.
