QUEEN-STREET WHARF.

Superintendent's Office,
Auckland, August 3rd, 1859.

IN pursuance of the authority vested in me by the "Wharf Regulations Act, 1858," I have made the following Regulations with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and I hereby give notice that the same will come into operation at the expiration of one month after a copy thereof shall have been published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*.

1. If any vessel shall be hauled alongside the Wharf or Jetty known as the Queen-street Wharf without the master or owner thereof having first obtained permission from the Harbour-Master or Wharfinger, or being alongside the Wharf shall be hauled off without giving due notice thereof, either to the said Harbour Master or to the said Wharfinger, the master of such vessel shall be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.
2. The master of every vessel hauled alongside the Wharf shall, if required, lay out an anchor or anchors (well buoyed) as directed by the Harbour-Master or Wharfinger, and make fast to the Wharf as may be directed by the Harbour-Master or Wharfinger, or in default thereof be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.
3. The Master owner or any other person in charge of any vessel so moored who shall refuse to slack down any Bower or Stream Chain or any warp, or line, or to get in any anchor, or to rig in any boom, strike any yard or topmast or top any yard, or furl or lower any sail when so ordered by the Harbour Master or Wharfinger, shall for every such offence be liable to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.
4. The Master or Owner of every registered vessel occupying a berth alongside the said Wharf, shall pay for the said vessel the sum of 2d. a ton for every day the said vessel shall so occupy the said berth, and the Master or owner of every vessel not being registered occupying a berth alongside the said Wharf, shall pay for the said vessel the sum of 2d. a

ton Builder's Measurement for every day the said vessel shall so occupy the said berth.

5. The following charges shall be made for the use of the said Wharf:—

For every cart or other vehicle drawn by one horse, the sum of.....	6
And an additional sum for each additional horse, of.....	6
For every barrow or truck the sum of	3
For every horse not drawing any cart or other vehicle, the sum of...	6
For every head of great cattle, the sum of.....	3
For every sheep or goat, the sum of	1
For every pig, the sum of.....	1

6. Every carter taking a cart on the said Wharf shall walk at the head of the shaft horse whilst on the said Wharf; and no carter shall allow his horse to move along the said Wharf at a pace faster than a walk, under a penalty for every such offence, not exceeding £20.

7. All charges payable under these Regulations shall be payable to such person as the Superintendent shall appoint to receive the same and may be recovered in a summary way, when payable by or on account of any vessel, from the master or person in charge or from the owner or agent of such vessel, and all charges payable on account of any vehicle or animal may be recovered in a summary way from the owner or person in charge.

8. If any fire shall be ignited or allowed to burn on board any vessel lying alongside the said Wharf, between the hours of 9 p.m., and of 5 a.m., the master of such vessel shall be liable to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

9. If any person without permission from the Wharfinger shall permit any goods to remain on the said Wharf more than 24 hours, or if any person shall remove any goods from off the said Wharf, except by permission of the Collector of H. M. Customs, between sunset and sunrise he shall be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

10. If the master or person in charge of any vessel lying alongside the said Wharf shall permit the same to be fumigated or smoked for the extermination of vermin or for any other purpose he shall be liable to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

11. Every penalty incurred for any breach of these regulations shall be recovered in a summary way.

12. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as in any manner altering or in affecting the Regulations now in force for the Port and Harbour of Auckland.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Land hereinafter mentioned has been acquired by purchase from the aboriginal inhabitants of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the acquisition thereof should be notified by Proclamation accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim and notify that the Native Title has been extinguished over the Block of Land whereof the boundaries are mentioned or described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, at Auckland, this fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND. DISTRICT OF KAIPARA.

Pukekaroro Block, containing 8,458 acres.

BOUNDARIES.

The boundary commences at Kaiwaka, at the place where the Ika-a-ranganui boundary-line crosses that river, thence following the course of Kaiwaka to Koangatoko to the boundary of Mr. Grahame's claim, thence by line bearing 354° 283'00 links, and straight on to the Wairau river; thence, along the Wairau in an Easterly direction to Mr. Wilson's survey line; thence, by a number of short survey lines, bearing as follows:—355° 30' 1030 links, 34° 408 links, 330° 21' 500 links, 333° 300 links, 346° 980 links, 348° 30' 240 links, 286° 54' 351 links, 247° 30' 706 links, 237° 25' 310 links, 272° 30' 532 links, 235° 468 links, 271° 9' 396 links, 236° 30' 500 links, 282° 51' 537 links, 234° 1160 links, 297° 51' 475 links, 310° 15' 405 links, 268° 30' 546 links, 37° 42' 1000 links, 353° 10' 281 links, 31° 21' 982 links, 353° 45' 332 links, 23° 20' 720 links, 35° 305 links, 63° 48' 480 links, 202° 403 links, 241° 51' 352 links, 212° 30' 333 links; thence by a line bearing 306° 445, 163 83 links, to the boundary-line of Ika-a-ranganui, thence, by that boundary-line bearing 51° 45' 336'60 links, to Matawerohia, thence by the line bearing 12° 8' 3975 links, to Kaiwaka, where the boundary closes.

At a meeting of the Wardens of the Hundred of Howick, it was agreed as a Bye-Law, That any person or persons allowing Cattle to run at large within the said Hundred (without being duly licensed), shall forfeit and pay the sum of Ten Shillings (10s.) for each and every head of Great Cattle, and Five Shillings (5s.) for each and every head of Small Cattle.
