PROCLAMATION.

By JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esquire,
Superintendent of the Province
of Auckland, in the Colony of
New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "The Town Boards Act, 1862," it is amongst other things enacted that the Superintendent shall define and declare the limits of the Town or City of Auckland, within which the provisions of this Act shall come into force from the first day of July, 1862.

Now therefore I, the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said "Town Boards Act, 1862" the limits of the City or Town of Auckland, within which the said Act shall come into force from the first day of July, 1862, shall be as follows:—

THE CITY OF AUCKLAND

As bounded, on the North, by the Waitemata Harbour; on the East, by Suburban section No. 96, by the middle of Stanley-street from the south-western angle of section No. 11 of the City of Auckland to the junction of Stanley-street and Grafton Road, by the middle of Grafton Road from the junction of Stanley-street to the northern boundary of lot No. 41 of Suburban section No. 3, by the northern boundary of lot No. 41 of Suburban section No. 3, and the northern boundary of lot No. 8, of Suburban section No. 15; by the middle of Symonds-street, from the north-western angle of lot No. 8 of Suburban section No. 15, to the junction of Karangahape Road; on the South, by the middle of Karangahape Road, from Symonds-street to the junction of Ponsonby Road, and by the middle of Ponsonby Road; and on the West, by the middle of Franklin-street.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by sub-section No. 20 of clause No. 2 of the "Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1862," I do hereby give notice that I have appointed and set apart the undermentioned places within the City of Auckland to be used as stands for carts and other vehicles plying for hire, and that such places respectively shall, from and after the sixth day of June instant, be used as stands for the number of vehicles hereinafter mentioned—

AS A STAND FOR CARTS :

On Custom House Street, for a distance of Two hundred yards East of Queen Street, and not encroaching on the road-way for more than Eighteen feet.

AS STANDS FOR CABS :

By St. Paul's Church, for a distance of Fifty yards from the entrance gate on the Western side thereof, and not encroaching on the road-way for more than Fifteen feet.

In the centre of the road-way on that portion of Queen Street commencing at a point in a line with the North side of the Supreme Court House, and extending therefrom South for a distance of Fifty yards; and not encroaching on the road-way for more than Twelve feet.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the "Thistle Act, 1858," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland from time to time by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, to declare that the said Act should come into operation within any District, and thereby to proclaim the limits of the District.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested, I, the said Superintendent, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said "Thistle Act, 1858," shall, on and after the ninth day of June next, come into operation within the Mahurangi District, and the limits of the said District shall be,—on the north, the summit of the mountain range from Pae-kauri to the source of the west branch of the Matakana river; on the East the West branch of the Matakana river, and the Matakana harbour to the sea, and the sea; on the South, the Native land on the South head of Mahurangi harbour, the Native land on the Puka Puka, the source of the Puka Puka creek or stream, and Southern boundary of the Parish of Ahuroa; and on the West by the Onchunga stream to Pae Kauri, inclusive of lot No. 14 of the Parish of Kowawhero.

The Contractors for supplies will be re-
 quired to deliver the same from time to time
 at such places, and in such quantities, as may
 be indicated by the Superintendent.

The Contractors for the performance of any
 work or service will be required to perform
 the same, as it may be ordered for the Provin-
 cial Government by some officer authorized
 by the Superintendent in that behalf.

The Government does not bind itself to
 accept the lowest or any of the tenders sent
 in.

Any of the contracts may be annulled upon
 the expiration of one calendar month's notice,
 in writing, of an intention to discontinue the
 same, to be given by the Contractor on the
 one part, or by the Superintendent, or by
 some person authorized by him, on behalf of
 the Provincial Government, on the other
 part.

Payment for any of the above supplies, works, or services will be made monthly, after the bills have been rendered in a complete state by the Contractor, and passed.

Tenders to be sealed and endorsed "Tender for (name of article or service)."

In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the Officer receiving the supplies, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Superintendent. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of a proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing which it will be procured by the department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or in which, from some other cause, injury would be sustained by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge, for whom the supplies are to be received, shall have power to reject any article of an inferior quality, and to purchase others at the expense of the Contractor.

In the event of the Contractor for the performance of any work or service being dissatisfied with the decision of the officer in condemning the same, the Superintendent will, upon the written request of the Contractor, made immediately after such decision, and the Superintendent may also, at any time, without such request, summon a Board of Survey to examine any work; and if such Board of Survey shall declare any such work to be inferior in quality to the work contracted for, or otherwise improperly done, the Contractor, upon notice thereof, shall immediately replace such work by other, satisfactory to the Board of Survey; and in default thereof, the Superintendent, or some other officer authorized by him in that behalf, is hereby authorized to procure such work to be replaced in any manner he may think fit, and the Contractor shall bear and pay to the Provincial Government all costs, charges, and expenses attendant thereon, as well as any excess of price for the same, together with a sum of money, by way of penalty, equal to one-fourth of such costs, charges, and expenses, and excess of price, all which are hereby made chargeable on any sum which may be due from the Provincial Government to the Contractor.

The tenders (forms of which may be obtained at this office) to contain the names and places of residence, at length, of the persons tendering, and to be signed by two respectable sureties, engaging to become bound in a penalty of £100 for the fulfilment of the contract if the tender be accepted, and no tenders will be received unless upon such forms.

All contract bonds must be signed by the Contractor and his sureties before the date of entering upon the contracts.

No tender can be withdrawn, or altered. Any person tendering and failing to execute

the usual bond, when required, will render himself ineligible to tender for any work, service, or supply, required by the Provincial Government in future.

No person whatever holding any situation of profit or emolument under Her Majesty's Government of New Zealand, or under the Government of this Province, shall be a party, directly or indirectly, to any contract.
