## CIRCULAR 40.

Colonial Secretary's Office,  
Auckland, 21st Dec., 1863.

SIR,—The General Assembly has appropriated out of the Colonial Revenue for this year the sum of Two Thousand Pounds (£2000), towards a Patriotic Fund for the support of the wives and families of those of Her Majesty's Regular and Colonial Forces who have fallen and may hereafter fall, in the course of the present war in this Colony.

I am sure that the Inhabitants and Legislatures of each Province will be anxious to contribute to a fund which has for its benevolent object the succour and relief of those who, by the loss of their husbands and parents in battle, or by death on active service in the present war, are unable to maintain or support themselves.

I gladly, therefore, invite your Honor's co-operation in this matter, by requesting you to be good enough to give general publicity to the intention of the General Assembly, and to take such other steps as may appear to your Honor to be calculated to give it additional effect.

*Bills of Provincial Council left to their operation.*

## PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province  
of Auckland.

**W**HEREAS by the "Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it was amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been passed by the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify either by speech or message to the

Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province, that such bill had been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor had assented to the same. And whereas a Bill was passed by the Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland, on the 15th October, 1863, intituled the "Empowering Act, 1863, Amendment Act," and the same was reserved by me for the signification of the pleasure of the Governor thereon.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, do hereby proclaim that the said Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that he has been pleased to assent to the same.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand.

**WHEREAS** by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might by Warrant under his hand, from time to time, delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony of New Zealand, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or Governor in Council, by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit; and might from time to time rescind such delegation: and whereas the said Governor did with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegate to John Williamson, Esq., so long as he should hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, 1861, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made; And whereas the said John Williamson, in pursuance and by virtue of such powers so vested in him did on the 28th day of February, 1862, proclaim and declare that after the date thereof the several Colonies of Australia, that was to say the Colony of New South Wales, of Victoria, of South Australia, of Western Australia and Queensland, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, should be deemed to be for the purpose of the said recited Act, affected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and no cattle were allowed to be imported from the above mentioned Districts

into the Province of Auckland, until further notice; And whereas the said John Williamson has ceased to hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Auckland; And whereas the said Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority did by his Warrant under his hand delegate to Robert Graham, Esq., so long as he should hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, the several powers vested in him by the said recited sections of the said Act, subject to be rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued on the fifteenth day of September, 1862, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made; And whereas it is expedient to remove the restriction on the importation of cattle from certain Districts included in the said recited proclamation of the 28th day of February, 1862:

Now, therefore, I, the said Robert Graham, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that from the date hereof, and until further notice, it shall be lawful for all persons to import cattle into the Province of Auckland, from the following places, viz.:—The Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, Tasmania, South Australia, Two-fold Bay, Jervis Bay, Port Stephens, Newcastle, Port Grafton, Clarence River, Sydney, N.S.W., and Queensland: And I further proclaim and declare that the said proclamation of the 28th day of February, 1862, is to remain in full force and effect save and excepted as altered hereby.
