District of Kaipara,
Waikiekie Block,
Containing 33,800 Acres.
Boundaries.

Commencing at the junction of the Manganui and Tauraroa rivers, and following the course of the Tauraroa to the western boundary of Ruarangi block, thence along the boundary of Ruarangi block to the boundary line of Mareretu block, surveyed by Mr. Charles Knight, thence by a right line to the Manganui river, thence along the Manganui river to its junction with Tauraroa, the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the Parliament holden in the

fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to fix such place or places within the limits of the Province and such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Provincial Council as he may think fit.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority in me vested in that behalf, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, do hereby proclaim and declare that the seventeenth session of the Provincial Council shall be holden at Auckland, and shall commence on Friday the thirtieth day of September next; and the members of the said Council are hereby warned to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION.
