THE following letter, received from the Manager of the New Zealand Steam Navigation Company (Limited) is published for general information.

Auckland, 23rd August, 1864.

SIR,—I have the honour to express the regret felt by the Directors of the New Zealand Steam Navigation Company (Limited) that as yet the steamer contracted with the Provincial Government has not arrived in Auckland. I beg, however, to state that immediately the 'Storm Bird' has had her boiler placed in her, she will be despatched to take up the service.

The Company expect this will be done, and all repairs in a month from this time, and that the vessel will be here within five weeks from present date.

But, as is very likely, another steamer may before this be at the disposal of the Company, in which case, you may be assured, she will commence the service without delay,

Permit me to add that the delay which has occurred in this matter, has been caused by unforeseen circumstances, over which the Company had not the slightest control, and which has produced great disappointment and loss to the Company.

## PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the Vaccination Act, 1863, of the General Assembly of New Zealand, it is enacted that the Superintendent of each province in New Zealand shall divide such province, or such part of the province as he shall think fit, into convenient DISTRICTS for affording increased facilities for VACCINATION:

Now, therefore, I, ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, do hereby declare the following Districts to be Districts in the province of Auckland for the purposes of the said Act; and that the Medical Officers appointed under the said Act will attend for the purpose of performing vaccination at the times and places hereinafter set forth, or at such other times and places as they may find convenient.

Given under my hand, at Auckland this third day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

## DISTRICT OF AUCKLAND.

This district shall comprise the Electoral Districts of the City of Auckland West, city of Auckland East, Parnell, and Newton respectively.

Provincial Hospital, Grafton Road, every Tuesday between the hours of 3 and 4 o'clock p.m., and at the Old Market-house on Wednesday, at the same time.

#### DISTRICT OF FRANKLIN.

This district shall comprise the Electoral District of Franklin, together with the villages of Howick and Panmure, as defined for the Electoral District of the Pensioner Settlements.

Dr. BEALE, at Howick, every Tuesday morning before 11 o'clock, at his own house.

At Panmure, first and second Monday in the months of September, 1864; January, March, and June, 1865, at 10 o'clock in the morning.

Papakura, first and second Monday in the months of September, 1864, and March, 1865, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

#### DISTRICT OF RAGLAN.

This district shall comprise the Electoral District of Raglan, together with the village of Otahuhu, as defined for the Electoral District of Pensioner Settlements.

Mr. JAMES P. KING, Otahuhu, the first Monday in each month, at 10 o'clock in the morning.

#### DISTRICT OF ONEHUNGA.

This district shall comprise the Electoral District of the town of Onehunga.

Dr. PURCHAS, at his own house, every Monday, at 10 o'clock in the morning.

#### DISTRICT OF THE NORTHERN DIVISION.

This district shall comprise the Electoral District of the Northern Division.

Dr. SMITH, at Matakana and Mahurangi, Southgate's Hotel.

Waikato District, at Dr. SMITH's house, at Orewa and Stokes' Point.

Waitemata District, Henderson's Mill.

#### DISTRICT OF MARSDEN.

This District shall comprise the Electoral District of Marsden.

Dr. BELL, Oruāwharo, first Monday in November, 1864; February and May, 1865; at Mr. Cray's store, 10 o'clock in the morning.

At Arai, first Monday in October and December, 1864; March and June, 1865; at Mr. Close's house, at 2 o'clock in afternoon.

At Mangawai, the same days; at Captain Moir's house, at 3:30 afternoon.

At Kaiwaka, first Monday in October, 1864; January, April, and July, 1865; at Mr. Chalton's, at 12 noon.

Ikaranganui, same days, at Mr. Hull's, at 3:30 afternoon.

Wairau, first Tuesday in October, 1864; January April, and July, 1865; at 12 noon.

Paparoa, on arrival of ferry boat, second week in November, 1864; February and May, 1865; at Mr. Haines's.

Matakohe, same days, at Mr. Thompson's.

Dr. PERSTON, Wangarei; at his house.

Waipu, at the Church.

Wangarei Heads, at the School.

Mangapai and Maungakaramea, at the Presbyterian Church. Mangapai days and hours to be fixed by the Public Vaccinator.

#### DISTRICT OF BAY OF ISLANDS.

This District shall comprise the Electoral District of the Bay of Islands.

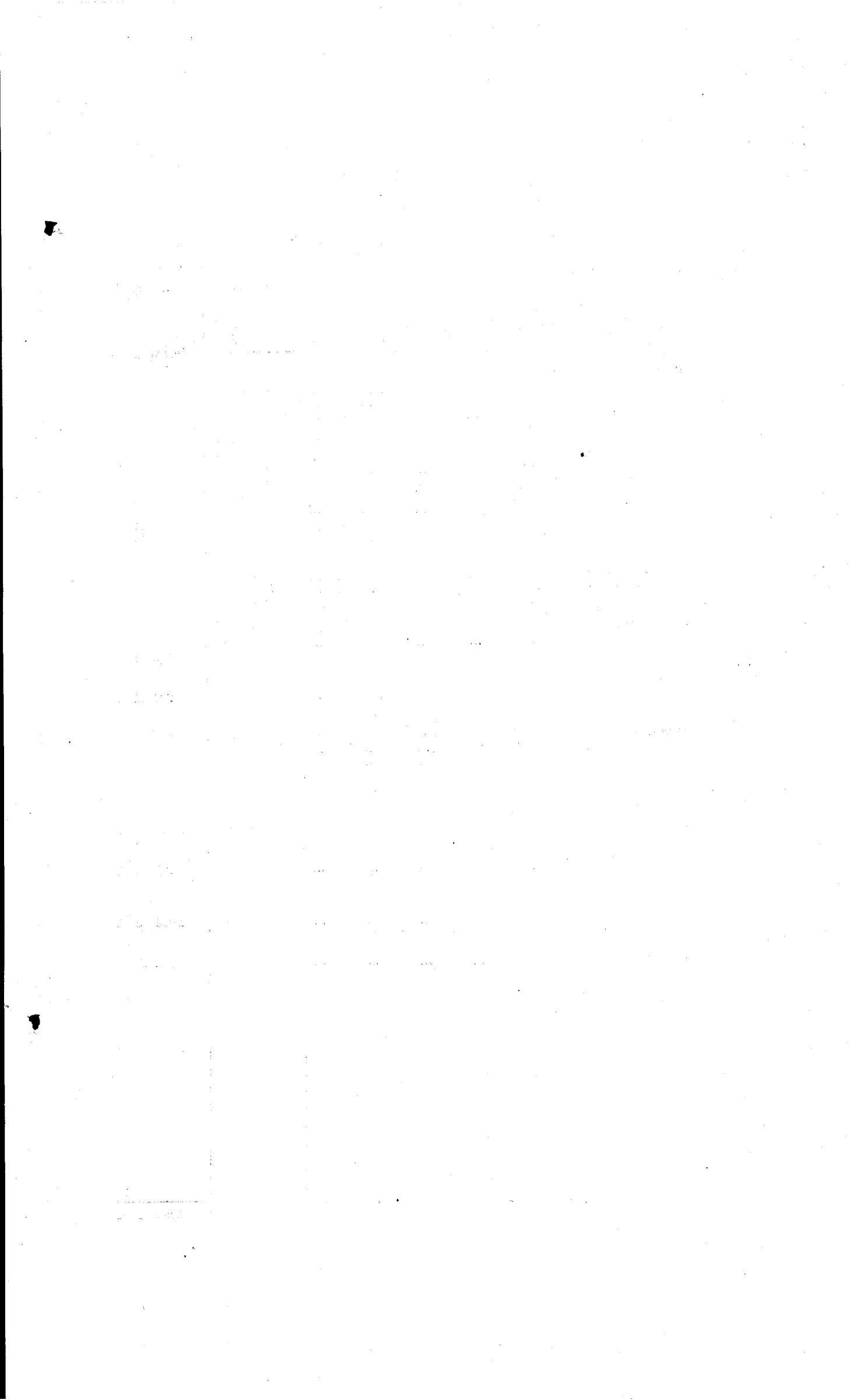
