QUEEN STREET WHARF.

I N pursuance of the authority vested in me, I do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, make the following additional Regulations for the management of the Queen Street Wharf :—

1. In addition to the charges enumerated in Section 25 of the existing Regulations, there shall be made the following charges :—

For every Four-wheeled Vehicle drawn by one horse (One Shilling)	1 0
For each additional horse (Sixpence).....	0 6
2. Carts and other vehicles used solely for conveying water for the purpose of watering the streets shall be exempt from toll.
3. Custom-House Quay, and the Wharves or Jetties running therefrom, shall, for the purpose of the above regulations, be considered to be a portion of Queen street Wharf.
