## PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand

IN virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, Robert Graham, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, do hereby make the following regulation, and do hereby proclaim and declare, That from and after the First day of March, 1865, no cattle arriving in the Port of Auckland by sea, whether from places beyond or within the limits of the Colony, and for which a clean certificate shall have been issued in terms of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," shall be landed at any point on the Southern Shore of the Port or Harbour of Auckland, or on the Western Shore of the Tamaki River, except upon the Landing Place near the western head of the Tamaki River, between the spot known as the Ahu, or the Pinnacle, on the Tamaki River, and following the high-water mark northward and westward to the point known as Wakama Point, on the Waitemata Harbour, under a penalty of £50 for each head of cattle so landed. But nothing herein contained shall prevent the landing of cattle with a clean certificate at any point on the North Shore or to the eastward of the Tamaki River. The regulation on this subject, dated 28th January, 1865, is hereby revoked.

All those lands which lie between the Southern boundary of Mount Wellington District and the Otahuhu creek on the North, the Tamaki River on the South East, the eastern boundary of the Mangarei District on the South West, and the Manukau Harbour on the West, including all roads traversing the lands within the before mentioned boundaries.

## ROAD BILL.

IN THE TWENTY-EIGHTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY  
QUEEN VICTORIA.

## ANALYSIS:

<p>Title. Preamble. 1. Road in Schedule A to be closed. 2. Land may be granted to William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp.</p>	<p>3. Land described in Schedule B to be opened as Road. 4. Short Title.</p>
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*A BILL to close up a certain Road in the Parish of Wairoa in the Province of Auckland and to authorize the Governor to grant the Land occupied by the said Road to William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp and to open a new Line of Road over certain other Lands in the said Parish the property of the said William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp.*

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to close up the said Road mentioned and described in the Schedule A to this Act annexed and to open a new Road in lieu thereof over the Land described in Schedule B to this Act annexed. And whereas the said Road so to be closed up as aforesaid passes through certain Lands the property of William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp.

AND WHEREAS the land mentioned and described in the said Schedule B is the property of the said William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp who have consented that the same should be laid out as a Public Highway upon having the land occupied by the present Road as described in Schedule A annexed to this Act conveyed to them the said William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp their heirs executors administrators, and assigns upon the trusts and for the ends intents and purposes upon and for which the remaining or other portions of the allotments mentioned in the schedules hereto annexed are held according to the terms of the "Diversion of Roads Act, 1863."

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland by and with the advice of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :

I. From and after the passing of this Act the said Road mentioned and described in the Schedule A to this Act annexed shall be closed.

II. It shall be lawful for his Excellency the Governor of New Zealand to grant the land occupied by the said Road to the said William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp their heirs executors administrators and assigns upon the trusts and for the ends intents and purposes upon and for which the remaining or other portions of the allotments mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed are held by the said William Hampton Thorp and Edward Joseph Thorp.

III. From and after the passing of this Act the land mentioned and described in Schedule B to this Act shall be opened as a new line of Road and the same shall for ever thereafter be used as and be a Public Highway.

IV. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Road Act  
No. 186"

#### SCHEDULE A.

A Road One Hundred Links in width and Two Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy Links in length running from the Wairoa River to the Road leading to Papakura through allotments numbers Sixteen and Nine of the Parish of Wairoa bounded towards the north by part of said allotment Number Nine Eight Hundred Links towards the north-west and west by part of said allotment Number Nine

Four Hundred and Sixty Links and by parts of said allotments Numbers Nine and Sixteen Four Hundred and Seventy Links and again towards the north-west by part of said allotment Number Sixteen Six Hundred and Sixty Links and Four Hundred and Ninety Links towards the south-east by part of allotment Number

Nine Hundred Links towards the east and north-east by part of said allotment Number Nine Five Hundred Links and Four Hundred and Fifty Links again towards the east by part of said allotment Number Sixteen Six Hundred and twenty links and again towards the south-east by part of said allotment Number Sixteen Four Hundred Links as the same is delineated by the plan hereunto annexed and colored green.

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SCHEDULE B.

A Road One Hundred Links in width and Three Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty-five Links in length running from the Wairoa River to the Road leading to Papakura through allotments Numbers Sixteen and Nine of the Parish of Wairoa bounded towards the north by part of said allotment Number Sixteen Seven Hundred and Fifteen Links towards the north-west by parts of said allotments Numbers Sixteen and Nine Two thousand and Ten Links and towards the west by part of said allotment Number Nine Five Hundred and Thirty Links towards the east also by part of said allotment Number Nine Four Hundred Links towards the south-east by parts of said allotments Numbers Nine and Sixteen One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty Links and towards the south by part of said allotment Number Sixteen Six Hundred and Fifty Links as the same is delineated by the plan hereunto annexed and colored Red.
