NOTICE is hereby given that in consequence of alteration of the Sands at the Waikato River, the Channel over the Bar has shifted further to the Southward. The direction for crossing the Bar being altered accordingly, viz. :—

Two white crosses (or beacons) have been erected a short distance inside the North Head, which, kept in one bearing N.E. (magnetic), will lead over the Bar, and when the large white beacons are brought in line follow the old direction up to the anchorage.

Masters of vessels are requested to pay particular attention to any signals that may be made from the Flag Staff and keep the lead going; they are also advised to take the Bar at nearly high water.

## SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

### WALAROO AND TIPARA BAYS.

All bearings are magnetic, variation  $4^{\circ} 30'$  E.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after the 1st first day of April next (1865), the floating beacon now moored on the Tipara Reef will be replaced by a temporary light-ship, which will be moored close under the rocky patch near the southern extremity of the Tipara Reef, with the following bearings:—Elizabeth Point, S.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S.; Long Point, N.E. by E. The lightship has two masts, is painted red, and exhibits during the day a red ball at the mainmast head.

*Lights.*—From sunset to sunrise will be exhibited the following lights:—A white light from the mainmast (24) twenty-four feet above the sea level, visible from all points of the compass at a distance of (7) seven miles in clear weather. A red light from the foremast (12) twelve feet above the sea-level, visible from N. to S, round by W., at a distance of (3) three miles, in clear weather.

Vessels making the Light from the N.N.W. should not stand towards the northern extremity of the reef, whilst the red light is

visible, by observing the direction a ship will be well clear of the reef.

Should the weather be hazy, and the red or less intense light be obscured, no vessel should approach the reef with the white light bearing S.S.E., under (7) seven fathoms.

The following description of the Tipara, and sailing directions for Wallaroo or Tipara Bays, are published for the guidance of Mariners.

The Tipara Reef is an extensive shoal, the southern extremity being four and a-half ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ) miles N.W. from Elizabeth Point.

The reef consists principally of sand, but there is a rocky patch of small extent near the southern extremity which dries at low water; it is under the shelter of this patch where the lightship, referred to above, will be moored.

From the rocky patch, the reef extends in a northerly direction, about two (2) miles, the outer edge trending to the N.N.W.; whilst the S.E. part takes a N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. direction; the extreme breadth from east to west nearly two (2) miles.

The soundings on the reef vary:—in some places their being a fathom and a-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ), whilst in others—particularly to the N.N.E. part of shoal—there are only two (2) or three (3) feet. From the northern extremity of the reef, the buoy off Long Point, referred to in this notice, bears N.E. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.

Vessels rounding the south part of the reef should not bring Elizabeth Point to bear to the southward of S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; whilst those intending to pass to the northward of the danger, into or out of Tipara Bay, should not bring the buoy off Long Point to bear to the eastward of E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.

A red nun buoy has also been placed of Long Point in three (3) fathoms with the following bearings:—Elizabeth Point, S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; Long Point, E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.

To pass outside or to the westward of the Tipara Reef, do not approach the lightship from the westward under six (6) fathoms, or come within a mile of the same; from this position, when to the westward of the reef, steer an N.N.W. course, in which the same soundings will be maintained.

When the buoy of Long Point bears east, a course of N.E. may be shaped, taking care as the Long Point Buoy is brought to bear S.E., not to come under four and a-half ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ) fathoms.

When Long Point bears south, a course of E. by N. may be shaped, when the Pilot and Harbour Master will come off, and conduct the vessel to the anchorage or jetty.

At night no vessel in the vicinity of Tipara Reef should come under (7) seven fathoms, or attempt to enter the Bay until the lights from the Smelting Works are clearly defined bearing E. by N., when that course may be shaped for the anchorage; taking care not to come

under (6) fathoms, unless the commander is sufficiently well acquainted with the Bay to take the ship in, or the pilot has taken charge.

The tides in the vicinity of the reef and Long and Elizabeth Points, are irregular and rapid; care must therefore be exercised to guard against the influence of the tides when in the stream of the reef, or near the points referred to.

It is high water at Port Wallaroo at 5h. 45m. F. & C.; rise and fall four (4) feet eight (8) inches at ordinary springs.

To pass inside Tipara Reef give Elizabeth Point a berth of a mile and a-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ), to avoid the shoal rocky patch which extends nearly a mile from the Point in a north-westerly direction.

With the Point bearing S.E., distant a mile and a-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) steer due N., which course will lead through the inner passage in not less than four (4) fathoms.

In beating through, keep the lead going, and do not, in a vessel drawing more than seventeen (17) feet, when standing in shore, bring Long Point Buoy to bear to the westward of W.N.W.

In standing off, when to the southward of the north end of the reef, do not bring the Long Point Buoy to bear to the eastward of N.N.E., by which the eastern part of the reef will be avoided.

Small vessels may pass inside the Long Point Buoy, taking care not to bring Elizabeth Point to bear to the westward of S. by W., so as to avoid the Walrus Rock. With the above bearing a vessel will be in two (2) fathoms at low water, spring tides, with the Walrus Rock distant about half a-mile.

The Walrus Rock lies nearly a mile of Long Point, when bearing S.E. by S., and is nearly dry at low water.

N.E. a mile and a half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) from the Walrus Rock lies the Bird Reef, which is a wash at low water.

Coasters should give this danger a wide berth, not bringing the Long Point Buoy to bear to the westward of S.W. With this bearing a vessel will be in two (2) fathoms at low water.

In the Bay there is excellent anchorage in four (4) fathoms, with the jetty end bearing E.S.E. distant about two (2) cables' lengths.

Small vessels can anchor in three (3) fathoms, with the end of the jetty bearing S.S.E. to S.

Alongside the jetty will be found good berths, from eight (8) to fourteen (14) feet, shoaling towards the shore.

REGULATIONS FOR GUIDANCE OF  
LICENSED SURVEYORS UNDER  
N.Z. ACT.

Native Land Court Office,  
April 10, 1865.

ALL Boundaries of Blocks must be defined  
by cut lines at least 3 feet wide. All  
angles of boundaries to be defined by posts of  
not less than 3 x 4 inch hard wood, well  
driven into the ground, and projecting at least  
15 inches above the surface.

In all open places a lock spit, one yard long  
and one spit deep, is to be dug from the post  
in the direction of either boundary line.

The post to be branded with the number of  
the block, or with some letter or mark indi-  
cative of it.

The measurement to shew the horizontal  
distances, trigonometrical stations, if lying near  
the work, to be measured up to. In the ab-

sence of trig-stations, natural features, such as junctions of streams, crossing places, &c.

*Maps.*

For peices of land of 5 acres and under maps to be on a scale of 4 chains to 1 inch.

For peices of land of upwards of 5 acres maps to be on a scale of 10 chains to 1 inch.

The block of land surveyed to be indicated on the plan by a pink tint.

The boundary lines to be drawn in black, and their linkage denoted in black.

Traverse and other construction lines to be drawn in red.

The natural features within the survey, such as woods, swamps, hills, and paths to be drawn; and the name of every stream, creek, or harbour within the survey to be shown.

Panmure, 1st March, 1865.

*Bye-Laws for the Hundred of Panmure,  
for the year 1865.*

At a meeting of the Wardens for the  
Hundred of Panmure, held on the 20th  
February, 1865, the following Bye-Laws were  
agreed to :—

1st. That each License holder be allowed  
to run eight head of great cattle in the Waste  
Lands of the Hundred, or Public Roads of  
Panmure, for the year 1865. Three head of  
small cattle being considered equal to one head  
of great cattle. One horse being considered  
equal to two head of great cattle. Foals not  
to reckon as stock until 12 months old, then  
to be rated as one head of great cattle until two  
year old, and then as horses.

2nd. No person shall be allowed to let at  
large on the Waste Lands or Public Roads of  
the hundred of Panmure, an Entire Beast, if  
an Entire Horse £2 sterling for every offence,  
if a Bull £1 sterling for every offence.

3rd. Any Pig found on the Run without  
a ring to prevent its rooting, will be charged  
to the owner two shillings and sixpence for  
every offence.

4th. The cattle of any unlicensed person  
found trespassing on the Waste Lands of the  
hundred or Public Roads of Panmure shall pay  
for every head of cattle impounded the sum  
of ten shillings and six pence in addition to  
poundage fees.

5th. Any sheep found trespassing on the  
Run will be impounded, and the owner thereof  
shall pay to the Wardens or Rangers the sum  
of two pence per head.

6th. Any person found guilty of worrying  
Cattle with dogs, on the Waste Lands of the  
Hundred of Panmure, shall pay for every such  
offence the sum of two pounds sterling, exclusive

or the amount of any damage done to such  
cattle, which may be recovered by the owner  
thereof by law.

7th. That GEORGE GILL be appointed  
Ranger, with an assistant to prevent the Run  
from trespass of unlicensed cattle, &c.

SIR,—The Wardens of the Hundred of Howick  
beg to inform you that they have made the  
following appointments for the year 1865, with  
a view to their being gazetted.

License holders occupying land within the  
Hundred of Howick, will be allowed to depasture  
up to 20 acres of land, five head of great cattle  
from 20 acres and up to fifty acres seven head  
of great cattle, and from fifty acres and  
upwards ten head of great cattle.

Persons depasturing a greater number of  
cattle than the above apportionments are to pay  
to the Wardens two shillings per head per  
annum for great cattle, and one shilling per  
head for small cattle, under a penalty of one  
pound for each and every offence.

Four head of small cattle to be allowed in  
lieu of one head of great cattle.

No Entire Cattle of any description above  
the age of one year to be allowed on the run,  
without the permission of the Warden's in  
writing, under a penalty of one pound for each  
and every offence.

On or before the 31st March next, all persons  
holding Depasturing Licenses are to send in  
writing to the Secretary to the Wardens, a  
return of the number of acres they occupy, and  
the number of cattle which they have upon the  
Run, under a penalty of five shillings for every  
day such return be neglected to be sent in.

The Wardens have appointed Mr. ANTHONY  
CONLON to be their Treasurer, and Mr. JAMES  
WHITE to be their Secretary.
