## PROCLAMATION.

By ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province  
of Auckland, in the Colony of  
New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the twenty first year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled the "Auckland Waste Land Act, 1858," it is among other things enacted, That it should be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation, to declare that a certain block of land therein described should be set apart and reserved for certain Immigrants expected to arrive from the United Kingdom or elsewhere, other than the Australian Colonies.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, do hereby proclaim that all that block of Land, comprising Lots Nos. one hundred and two (102) to one hundred and nine (109) of the parish of Awitu inclusive, estimated to contain seven hundred and thirteen (713) acres, shall be re-

served and set apart for certain Immigrants expected to arrive from the United Kingdom.

*Costs of Management of the Auckland Gold Fields, to be regulated by Acts of Provincial Council.*

**AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND, THE 29TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1864.**

Present:—

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.**

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Gold Fields' Act 1862," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by Sections Nineteen, Thirty-one, Thirty-two, Thirty-three, and Sixty-one thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

And whereas it is further provided that whenever the Governor shall have delegated to the Superintendent of any province all or any of the aforesaid powers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Council, to appoint and declare that all costs, charges, and expenses incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields within such province shall be regulated by Acts or Ordinances to be passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of such Province:

And whereas by an instrument in writing, of even date herewith, issued under the Seal of

the Colony, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in exercise of the before recited power, hath delegated to

ROBERT GRAHAM, ESQUIRE,

as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the said Colony, all the aforesaid powers, excepting those before recited to be excepted, to hold and exercise the said powers within the Province of Auckland aforesaid:

Now, therefore, his Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for this purpose by the said Act conferred, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, appoint and declare that all the costs, charges, and expenses incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields within the Province of Auckland, shall be regulated by Acts to be passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the said Province.

## R O A D A C T , 1 8 6 5 .

IN THE TWENTY-EIGHTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY  
QUEEN VICTORIA.

SESSION XVIII., 1865.

*A BILL to close up certain Roads in the Province of Auckland to authorise the issue of Crown Grants for the Land occupied by such Roads and to open up new Lines of Road in lieu thereof.*

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to close up the various roads referred to in Schedule A to this Act annexed and to open up new lines of Road in lieu of such Roads respectively over the lands described in Schedule B to this Act annexed And whereas the respective Roads to be closed up pass through the respective lands of the various persons whose names are set forth in said Schedule A and it is expedient to authorise the issue of Crown grants in fee simple of the lands occupied by the Roads so to be closed to the various persons named in the said Schedule A as the owners of the adjoining lands and to their heirs or assignees in lieu of the respective parcels of land described in the said Schedule B hereto annexed.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—

1. From and after the passing of this Act the Roads or parts of Roads mentioned in Schedule A to this Act annexed shall be closed.

2. It shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor to grant to the several persons mentioned in Schedule A to this Act annexed the several lands set forth in said Schedule and to issue grants therefor.

3. From and after the passing of this Act the Lands mentioned in Schedule B to this Act annexed shall be opened as new lines of Road and the same shall for ever thereafter be used as and be public highways and the solum thereof shall vest in the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland in trust as public highways.

4. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Roads Act 1865."

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### SCHEDULE A.

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#### OLD LINES of ROADS to be Closed up and Crown Grants issued therefor.

No. 1.—Site of old road, 100 links wide traversing land, the property of Mr. A. Sinclair, known as allotment No. 38, Parish of Opaheke, County of Eden, and colored yellow on plan, No. 1005.

No. 2.—Site of old road, 100 links wide, traversing land, the properties of Alex. Farmer and John Piper Richardson, and known as allotments Nos. 14, 16, and 51, in the Parish of Wangarei, County of Marsden, and colored yellow on plan, No. 1006.

No. 3.—Site of old road, 100 links wide, traversing land, known as Hospital Reserve, and being situate in Section 12, Suburbs of Auckland, in the Parish of Waitemata, County of Eden, and colored yellow on plan, No. 1007.

No. 4.—Site of old road, 100 links wide, traversing lands, the property of A. K. Taylor, and known as allotments Nos. 38, 39, and 40, in the Parish of Titirangi, County of Eden, and colored yellow on the plan, No. 1008.

No. 6.—Site of old road, 100 links wide, traversing lands, the properties of the Rev. Jas. Francis Mandeno, John Howe Mandeno, J. J. Wilson, Jas. Francis Mandeno, and William Morrin, and known as Allotments Nos. 23, 24, 25, 72, and 73 in the Parish of Mangatawhiri, County of Eden, and also through Native Confiscated Land, in the same Parish, and colored pink on plan, No. 1010.

No. 3.—Site of New Road, 100 links wide, traversing the property of R. Graham, and known as allotment No. 7, of Section No. 12, of the Suburbs of Auckland, in the Parish of Waitemata, County of Eden, and colored pink on plan, No. 1007.

No. 4.—Site of New Road, 100 links wide, traversing the properties of A. K. Taylor and others, and known as allotments Nos. 13, 152, 170, and 171, of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland, in the Parish of Waitemata, County of Eden, and also allotments, Nos. 38, 39, and 40, in the Parish of Titirangi, County of Eden, and colored pink on plan, No. 1008.

No. 5.—Site of New Road, 100 links wide, traversing land, the property of Duncan McKenzie, known as allotment No. 33, in the Parish of Kaukapakapa, County of Marsden, and colored yellow on plan, No. 1009.

No. 6.—Site of New Road, 100 links wide, traversing lands, the properties of the Rev. James Francis Mandeno, John Howe Mandeno, J. J. Wilson, Jas. Francis Mandeno, and William Morrin, known as Allotments Nos. 23, 24, 25, 72, and 73, in the Parish of Mangatawhiri, County of Eden, and, also through Native Confiscated Land in the same Parish, and colored yellow on plan, No. 1010.
