## NOTIFICATION.

QUEEN-STREET WHARF.

IN pursuance of the authority vested in me by the "Wharf Regulations Act, 1858," I have added to the regulations now in force the following viz:—

"From and after the 4th day of July, 1865, no clay, or earth, or rubbish, shall be shipped as ballast on board any Vessel laying at the Queen Street Wharf; and no clay, or earth, or rubbish, shall on any pretence whatever be carted up or down the said wharf without the express permission of the Wharfinger."

And I hereby give notice that the same will come into operation at the expiration of one month from the date hereof.
