PROCLAMATION.

By DANIEL POLLEN, Esq., Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Local Legislature of the Province of Auckland, passed in the nineteenth Session thereof, intituled, "An Act to Consolidate and Amend the Laws relating to Slaughter-houses," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette from time to time to constitute and define Slaughterhouse Districts and to appoint one or more Public Slaughter-houses for each of such Districts and the limits of such Districts, and the appointment of such Slaughter-houses from time to time to alter or revoke, as occasion may require.

And whereas the Superintendent did on the 23rd day of April, 1866, proclaim, constitute, and define all that portion of the Hundred of Auckland bounded on the NORTH by the Waitemata Harbour and the Hauraki Gulf to the Tamaki River; on the EAST by the Tamaki River aforesaid, and the Otahuhu Creek to the Otahuhu Portage; on the SOUTH by the Otahuhu Portage aforesaid and the Manakau Harbour to the Whau Portage; and thence on the

West by the Whau Portage aforesaid and the Whau Creek, to be a Slaughter-house District within the Meaning of said Act, and whereas it is expedient to appoint an additional Slaughter-house to be a public Slaughter-house within such District, now, therefore, in exercise of the power so vested in the Superintendent on that behalf, I do appoint the building and yards erected by Mr. John Bycroft in the town of Onehunga within the said District, to be a Public Slaughter-house for the said District within the Meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION,

By DANIEL POLLEN, Esquire Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS a disease known as Pleuro Pneumonia has broken out amongst the cattle in the Province of Auckland, and it is desirable to check the spread of such disease:

And whereas by a warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the fourteenth day of September, 1864, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, delegated to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, certain powers conferred upon him by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," subject to certain regulations to be made by the Governor in Council under the said recited Act:

Now therefore, I, DANIEL POLLEN Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in pursuance of such delegation, hereby revoke the Proclamation issued by His Honour the Superintendent upon the 31st August, 1865, in so far as it defines the limits of the Infected Districts, as I do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, that part of the Province of Auckland lying South of the Northern boundary of the County of Marsden, shall be and be deemed to be an Infected District within the meaning of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And in further pursuance of such delegations, I, the said Deputy Superintendent, do hereby make and ordain the following regulation, which shall be in force in the said district of the Province of Auckland.

REGULATION.

No person shall drive, or permit to be driven, or transport, or remove any cattle whatever from the said Infected District to that part of the Province of Auckland lying to the North of the said boundary, under a penalty not exceeding £200.

UNDER and in pursuance of the powers vested in the Superintendent in that behalf, by "The Sheep Act, 1863," of the Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland, I, the Deputy Superintendent, do hereby appoint and constitute all that portion of the said Province, bounded on the North by a right line from the source of the Horotiu River, on Lake Taupo, to the North Westernmost point of the Waikari Lake, and thence in a straight line to Point Marau, on the East coast; on the East, by the East Coast from Point Marau aforesaid, to the Southern boundary of the Province of Auckland; thence, on the South, by the said Southern boundary, to the Waikato River; and on the West by the Waikato River and the Eastern margin of Lake Taupo aforesaid, to the point of commencement, to be a district for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of "The East Coast Sheep District."
